City adds 350 more e-buses; 3rd biggest fleet in world: govt.

Chief Minister Arvind Kejri-wal and Lieutenant-Gover-nor V.K. Saxena on Wed-nesday flagged off 350 electric buses, taking the number of such buses in the city to 1,650.

The national capital ranks third in the world after two other cities – Chi-na's Shenzhen and Santia-

na's Shenzhen and Santiago in Chile—in terms of the size of its e-bus fleet, according to beling government.

The government intends to induct around 8,000 electric buses by 2025, which will constitute 80% of Delhi's over total fleet strength.

Court says a 'middle ground' must be found; it adds that committee will evaluate environmental concerns and suggest additional conditions, if any, for reopening of Sterlite plant at Thoothukudi

he Supreme Court on Wednesday proposed forming "non-partisan" committee to objectively evaluate environmental concerns and to suggest additional conditions, if any, for reo-pening the Vedanta Ster-lite's copper plant at Thoothukudi.

nite's topper paint at Thoothukudi.

The copper smelting plant was permanently shut down on the orders of the Tamil Nadu government six years ago on grounds of pollution. The 2018 closure of the plant was preceded by nearly 30 years of local protests, which had even led to an incident of police firing.

"We have to find a way forward... We have to reach a win-win solution by which the concerns of the State as a custodian of the health of the people will be protected, your [Vedanta] concern as an inves-

Govt. taking steps to issue OBC certificates to eligible Marathas'

Advocate-General Birendra Saraf told a Division Bench that though it had not even been 20 days since the State government issued a draft notification stating that eligible Marath-as would be included in the OBC category, Mr. Jarange-OBC category, Mr. Jarange-Patil had "already Patil had "already launched a hunger strike".

The court was hearing a petition filed by activist Gunaratan Sadavarte over Gunaratan Sadavarte over the disruption of law and order due to Mr. Jarange-Patil's ongoing agitation. "The government is tak-ing all steps to amend the

process.

The demolition, said Mr. The demolition, said Mr. Khurshid, was carried out only four days after a notice was served to the petitioner, even though, as per the process of law, a total of 15 days must be granted

to file a reply.

The noted lawyer argued the case via video conferencing on behalf of the petitioner, Safiva Ma the petutioner, Sahya Ma-lik, who is the wife of Ab-dul Malik, the main ac-cused in the Haldwani violence. Ms. Malik in her petition had asked the court to stop the demolition.

demolition.

The court, however, had not intervened in the matter, and the demolition was executed on the grounds that the construction in question stood upon Nazul land, which is primarily owned by the government.

A single-judge Bench of Justice Manoj Kumar Tivari questioned the petitioner as to how construction was carried out at the site when the property in ques-

when the property in ques-tion had been leased out by the government as agri-cultural land.

cultural land.
However, without going into the question of whether the lease was valid or not, the court called for a counter affidavit by the government, and posted the case for further hearing in the second week of May.

The Centre must address grievances of farmers through talks

armers from Punjab, in their thousands, have assembled at three points along the border with Haryana, where they have been stopped from marching to Delhi. The protesters are demanding legally guaranteed MSP for crops, debt waiver, cancellation of international agreements impacting the agriculture sector, and a minimum pension of ₹5,000 for farmers and agriculture labour. protesting fail acquisition for power claibes. The original SKM and several trade unions have called for a national rural and industrial strike on February 16, with overlapping and additional demands that include the repeal of four labour codes.

The government has opened talks with the Punjab farmers, but a legal guarantee of MSP appears unlikely. The police in Haryana and Delhi have stopped the farmers more than 200 km away from Delhi as they are resolute that the farmers will not be allowed near the border of the national capital where they had laid siege in 2021-22. The MSP-based procurement by the FCI has been the bedrock of food security, but the case for its reform is strong. Surplus producers of grain have benefited from the MSP scheme, but the scheme bypasses subsistence farmers in poorer regions. This uneven geographical spread of procurement has also led to unsustainable farm practices in some areas, while farmers in other regions of the country are always on the edge of penury. All this calls for a revamping of the public support for farming, which is essential for reasons that include national food security. This can be achieved better through wide political consultation and by encouraging the beneficial undertones of the protest on the eve of the Lok Sabha election also cannot be overlooked. The farm sector needs a new model of public support. It cannot be left to the mercy of the market. The government should lead the efforts to create a national consensus on this question.

he recommendation of the Central Board of Trustees of the Employees' Provident fund Organisation (EPFO) for a 0-1-percentage-point increase in provident fund (PF) details in tume with what the EPFO did last year. However, the recommended rate of 8.2% is 0-4-percentage points lower than in 2018-19, a pre-election year like 2023-24. If cleared by the Union Finance Ministry, it will involve the transfer of a record \$1,07,000 crore to EPF members. But the development has not pleased those with a long-standing demand for an increase in the minimum pension of \$1,000. When in the opposition, the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party had demanded that the pension be raised to \$3,000 (the UPA government had proposed \$1,000 a month). On coming to power in 2014, the BJP carried out faithfully, with effect from September 2014, what was finalised by its predecessor, benefitting approximately 20.5 lakh pensioners. Months ago, the Finance Ministry had rejected a proposal to double the minimum pension amount, citing a "huge rise" in the budgetary support needed under the Employees' Pension Scheme (EPS), 1995. There is one more component in the budgetary support which refers to the Central government's contribution at 1.16% of wages up to an amount of \$15,000 a month. For FY2024-25, the Ministry

one more component in the budgetary support which refers to the Central government's contribution at 1.6% of wages up to an amount of t15,000 a month. For FY2024-25, the Ministry has projected ₹10,950 crore as budgetary support against the revised estimate of ₹9,760 crore for the current year. The Finance Ministry calculates that a 100% rise in the minimum pension would be more than the proportionate increase in the overall budgetary support as numerous pensioners had received much less than ₹1,000 as monthly pension till 2014.

Describing the EPS as a "Defined Contribution-Defined Benefit" social security scheme, the government said in the Rajva Sabha that all benefits were paid out of accumulations through contributions, and as per the fund's valuation as on March 31, 2019, there was "an actuarial deficit." However, this argument has been virtually demolished in the EPFO's annual report (2022-23). Notwithstanding its reasons not to hike the minimum pension, the government must note that the difference between the minimum and original pension was about ₹970 crore for 2022-23. So, the doubling of minimum pension is no strain. There are other key issues too such as equating the amount of \$9,000e pension on a par with what a member-pensioner gets. In the case of higher PF pension, the rules have been framed after the 2022 Supreme Court judgment wherein most of the pre-2014 retirees would not be covered; there are around four lakh such applications for higher pension and are will help senior citizens.

Rescuing grace from disgrace

he words 'customary' , 'ceremonial' and 'ritual' are employed to describe the addresses of the President of India to our Parliament at its opening sessions each year and, likewise, to characterise those of Governors when they address the Legislative Assemblies in their State capitals. India being the land of largely unquestioned custom, ceremonials and rituals, these addresses of the Head of State have also become part of the life of our polity. The President of India and Governor arrive with 'due' fanfare, perform the ceremony of which the officiating 'priest' is the Speaker or Chairman, and depart feeling greatly relieved that it is over.

speaker of Chairman, and depart feeling greatly relieved that it is over.

The speeches or addresses of the Head of State for these occasions, following British practice, are drafted by the government of the day. They are not written by the President of India or Governor, but only read out by them. The drafts for these are received in their offices generally very close to the event and require them to be gone through against a tight time frame. This in itself makes the suggesting of changes by them difficult.

A thought that was worth pursuing
R. Venkataraman, the President of India from
1987 to 1992, was fond of saying, with his
characteristic smile, to staff (I was his Joint
Secretary), "When I am asked to read these
Addresses, I feel like saying 'Rashtrapati Bhavan'
and sitting down!" He went through the drafts of
the Addresses he got from the Government of the
day line by line and word by word. And he — not
so much we on his staff — would mark out those
he felt needed modification. I do not recall a
single occasion when his responses were not
accepted in toto. But there was one 'move' of his
which did not go through. which did not go through. He asked us, shortly after he assumed office, to

He asked us, shortly after he assumed office, to contact the Indian High Commission in London to find out what the form of Her Majesty's "Throne Speech", delivered at the opening of the sessions of the two Houses each year or immediately after a general election, was like. It was his distinct impression, he said, that the speech prepared by Her Majesty's Government is very brief, merely outlining the outer contours of policy and the legislative business proposed for the session ahead – and nothing more. That, he said, is how it should ideally be with the opening of Parliament in India, in place of the long speech that is read out in extense to a progressively tired gathering of Hon'ble Members of Parliament, followed by an equally long translation into Hindi followed by an equally long translation into Hindi or English as the case may be. President Venkataraman's chief concern was the saving of time and the avoiding of tedium. But he was also aware of the gain from such a reform in terms of the avoiding of interruptions and the other phenomenon which has come so unfortunately to be associated with legislatures' opening ceremonies – tension between the writer and

(2004-2009), it was my privilege to suggest, on a
few occasions, some changes to draft Addresses

accepted them. On the first such occasion, when
he had accepted the suggestion at once, there
was a slip. On the night before the ceremony, I
noticed, to my dismay, that the printed text

ne to bring it to Buddhababu's attention over the
telephone. He said to me, T am to blame. Let me
see what I can do but rest assured it will be
done." Was there enough time to re-print
hundreds of copies of the Address? There was
not. The Chief Minister did the next best thing.
He had a piece of paper pasted over the

overnight.

This, of course, drew more attention to the paragraph than its appearance in print would have done and Opposition Members of the Legislative Assembly found cause to explode. Buddhababu told me later that day, "If the matter comes up formally in the House I will say frankly that you had suggested an important change, that I had agreed to it, but due entirely to my oversight it could not be carried out in time and the next best thing was done... Occasion arose for me to officiate as the Governor of Bihar (January to June 2006). Exactly as now, Nitish Kumar was Chief Minister, heading a coalition of the Janata Dal (United) and the Bharatiya Janata Party, with Rabri Devi being Leader of the Opposition. The draft for the Governor's Address was unexceptionable and written in flawless Hindi which was, for me, a pleasure to read out. There was not one

interruption (which I was expecting) and I noticed throughout when I looked in her direction that Rabri Devi was listening attentively and with the greatest dignity. After the ceremony was over, Nitishbabu said to me that it was the first time in his experience that a Governor's Address to the Assembly had gone off without a single interruption, and he thanked me for it. "Why are you thanking me?" I said to him. "The speech was not mine, it was yours." I will not detain the reader with his rather overwhelming reply.

Where the problem lies
The root of the problem lies in the foundational dichotomy of one agency writing the speech and another reading it. Professor A.R.

Venkatachalapathy published not long ago a fine book, Who Owns That Song? — about the rights to Subramania Bharatis' hationalised' works. One may, following that, ask of the Governor's Address 'Who Owns that Speech?' The one who writes it or the one who reads it out? Subject to correction by constitutional experts, I believe that the Address of the Head of State to the Legislature is an ornament of convention, not a condition precedent for Bills becoming law. If it was, then the business of a House that has not had the Governor's Address read out in full, or in tokenistic part, would become invalid. That is not the case. Address or no Address, the Legislature continues its work. continues its work.

continues its work.

Since political polarisation between the Centre which appoints Governors and the State which elects the Chief Minister is, to all appearances, set to accelerate in the visualisable future, a way out has to be found. I believe President Venkataraman's suggested solution gives us that way out. If all concerned agree that the Head of State need read out just the bare outline of the legislative business ahead, the Address will then belong to neither its drafter nor its reader but to its rightful owner-listener, namely, the collective body of Legislators. Presidents and Governors will, I think, be relieved with such a rearrangement.

A demand that could hamper gender equality

he Sabrimala temple issue was one that ruled our collective consciousness. It was unfathomable that menstruating women were deemed 'unfit' to enter a temple. Echoes of were deemed 'unfit' to enter a temple. Echoes of 'menstruation' is not a disease, but a natural phenomena' could be heard all around. This was a case that highlighted the ongoing struggle to eliminate discriminatory practices related to menstruation, and to promote gender equality. The demand for paid leave for menstruation works to undermine it. Menstrual cycles can be challenging – almost debilitating for some – but to collectively label all those belonging to a gender without considering the potential adverse effects, is trivialising the women empowerment movement.

On the global gender gap
The World Economic Forum's Global Gender Gap
Report 2021 says that the gender global gap has
widened (instead of shrinking). In the current
situation, it would take the world 135.6 years to achieve gender equality. Looking at it specifically at the workforce level, a woman earns 84 cents at the worktorice level, a woman earths 84 cents for every dollar that a man makes. The participation of women in the labour force is significantly lower than that of men, and even fewer women hold leadership positions. If one adds mandatory paid leave for periods to this, it would end up further dissuading companies from hiring women.

If the government ratifies 'special status' for menstruating women, it validates the social stigma around menstruation. It would exacerbate period shaming in a country where large swathes of people (both men and women) consider

The most recent National Family Health Survey (NFHS) report has highlighted how approximately 50% of women between the ages of 15 to 24 in India continue to rely on the use of cloth for menstrual protection. Experts caution that reusing cloth can increase the risk of contracting multiple infections, attributing this practice to a combination of insufficient awareness and societal taboo around menstruation. Girls are often compelled to leave school or face social exclusion during their menstrual cycles. Arguments in favour of paid leave for menstruation will claim that granting special status to menstruation would aim to create subject awareness. But this would only magnify it. It could turn out to be another well-meaning step, but one that ends up widening the gender gap inadvertently.

The case of Japan

There are countries such as Japan that provide leave for painful unused. Women claim that they are reluctant to avail this leave and 'broadcast' that they are on their period, for the fear of sexual harassment. This is the situation (today), even though this policy was introduced in Japan more than seven decades ago. Data show(s) that a mere 0.9% of women in the workforce avail menstrual leave days in Japan. As per the World Economic Forum's ranking in 2019, Japan ranked 121 out of 153 in terms of gender equality. It has slipped to the 125th position in 2023. It is interesting to not that though young women in Japan have higher education levels than men, it is in the workforce There are countries such as Japan that provide

that disparities creep in. Women in Japan are less

that disparities creep in. Women in Japan are less likely to be employed (even with the same credentials) than men, and are often paid lesser. Let us assume that we have in place paid leave for periods. Now comes the implementation. Who is to say when such leave would be taken rightfully, and when they would be misused? Further, who is to say which enforcement methods would be acceptable, when used by the employer? In 2020, 66 girl students in an institute in Bhuj in Kutch, Gujarat, were forced to strip to check who was menstruating. This mirrors an incident in 2017 in Muzzaffarnagar, where 70 girls in a residential school were compelled to undress by staff to check for menstruation.

A fight that continues

A fight that continues In the recent past, women have fought to be on the front line in a war. The Supreme Court of India even urged the government to enable equal evaluation of women, and to have them undergo the same standards of testing as men. In response, the government argued that women are not suitable for ground combat roles. Women in corporate organisations are fighting for pay that is the equivalent to that drawn by their male

counterparts.

As a woman, I understand the issue and am As a woman, I understand the issue and am empathetic towards period pain and symptoms. But I am averse to terming it a blanket biological disadvantage. Recognising the diverse nature of menstrual experiences is essential. Tailoring support and being accommodative on a case-by-case basis promotes inclusivity, while also addressing the individual needs of those navigating their (difficult) periods.

Does trust in national government matter?

lobally, there are many countries where low levels of trust coexist and several others where distrust is so pervasive that democracy barely survives or simply dies. India as the word's largest democracy faces a trust deficit but opinion is divided on the survival of democracy. We argue that the current Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) may damage democracy in India.

democracy in India. Under NDA rule, persistent questioning of the survival of democracy has dominated the political discourse in recent years. Specifically, with the aggressive pursuit of Hindurva, unprovoked brutality against minorities, especially Muslims and Dalits, and heavy-handed suppression of the freedom of speech and press have undermined the trustworthiness of democracy. A related question is whether the loss of trust has reduced well-being. A third is whether these inferences are valid and whether India's democracy is at risk. With the national election looming in the horizon, these questions have high priority. Specifically, with the aggressive

Chart 3 shows the results of the RBI's survey that captures the growth in the services and infrastructure sectors. The latest data are for October-December 2023. In the survey, 528 companies were asked to comment on their turnover. The chart plots the net response – the difference between those who said it increased and those who said it increased. The opacity of the state is instrumented by controlling the media, suppressing dissent, and withdrawing national surveys that raise concerns about rising economic distress and cast doubts on the exaggerated achievements of the government. Soon after its findings were published, the Director of the International Institute of Population Studies, the Institute of Population Studies, the nodal agency to provide coordination and technical guidance to the NFHS, was suspended, and subsequently suspended, and subsequently resigned. Similarly, the results of the National Sample Survey on consumption expenditure in 2017-18 were scrapped as leaked data revealed that the real monthly per capita expenditure had actually fallen.

Equally worrying are the shocks to democratic functioning of Parliament. In December, 146 MPs were suspended from Parliament after they demanded that the government, specifically the Home government, specifically the Home Minister, speak about the security breach in the Lok Sabha. Without these MPs, three draconian criminal Bills were passed

could be curbed by an independent judiciary, this has not happened, as was seen in the Supreme Court's ruling on Ayodhya and its rejection of a probe by a Special Investigation Team or the Central Bureau of Investigation of Adani's acts of malfeasance, in favour of the SEBI probe moving at a snail's pace. Another critique points to damage of the economy and polity by the NDA, but also measures that partly offset the negative

that partly offset the negative impact and likely impart short-term legitimacy. These include new welfare schemes for the poor – of which the Ujjwala scheme and the Swachh Bharat Mission have had the most significant impact – as well as continuing the most popular schemes of the Manmohan schemes of the Manmohan Singh-led governments for food distribution, rural employment, and affordable housing. Whether short-term legitimacy was accomplished is not self-evident as there were glaring shortfalls.

Life evaluation

None of these studies, however, focus on trust as the mediator between autocratic policies and survival of democracy. Trust in the NDA is high, presumably because of an overwhelming majority of Hindus in India, but declined between 2018 and 2021. Besides, our analysis, based on the Gallup World Poll Survey for India our analysis, based on the Gallup World Poll Survey for India covering 2018-21, shows that the decline in trust reduced life evaluation. Specifically, a unit reduction in trust is associated with a 0.77 reduction in life evaluation. As income growth decelerated and food prices and unemployment rose, the political crisis deepened – a case in point is the failure to resolve the political crisis in Manipur. While some scholars are adamant that Indian democracy is already dead or dying, and others are cautious or dying, and others are cautious or uncertain, we believe that, unless these repressive and autocratic policies are reversed – a daunting challenge – the survival of democracy seems bleak.

A scheme that is bleeding hospitals dry

ublic hospitals in Kera-la are paying a heavy price for the State go-vernment's administrative in-efficiency in running Ayush-man Bharat-Karunya Arogya Suraksha Padhati (KASP), the health insurance scheme cohealth insurance scheme co-vering nearly 42 lakh families.

The scheme that wins Kera la laurels from the Union Health Ministry every year for providing free medical treat-ment to the maximum numment to the maximum num-ber of people is draining the State's coffers and leaving pu-blic hospitals severely short of funds. According to a state-ment by the government in the Assembly last week, it wees private and public hospi-tals ₹1,128.69 crore as reimbur-sement for free treatment gi-ven to KASP beneficiaries. The State's finances have been in the red for several months now. Public hospitals have been experiencing an

have been experiencing an acute shortage of drugs, con-sumables, and implants such as stents, as pending pay-ments running into hundreds of crores have forced pharma companies to stop all supplies to public hospitals. Private hospitals are exiting the scheme in the face of mount-

scheme in the face of mounting bills that the government is yet to reimburse. Earlier, public hospitals could tide over such exigencies by utilising a hospital development society's funds for the local purchase of drugs. But now, due to the fiscal crisis in the State and the overdues from the government under KASP, hospitals have no der KASP, hospitals have no funds to purchase drugs or for development activities

Superintendents of hospi-tals say they are helpless as patients are forced to buy medi-

Kerala has the State Health Agency (SHA) had the necessary technical expertise to run KASP, or that were adequate checks and balances.

The Comptroller and Auditor General's recent audit report on Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) pointed out that KASP was being run by SHA without proper medical, death, or claim audits and no financial discipline, resulting in huge cost overruns and a high rate of overdue claims. Kerala had been efficiently running its own health financ-

running its own health financ-ing schemes, inclusive of good tertiary care packages too, in the insurance mode since 2008 through its own agency, the Comprehensive Health Insurance Agency of Kerala. AB-PMJAY was launched by the Centre in 2018. When the State chose to re-launch KASP in alignment with AB-PMJAY in 2019, there was concern that given the low share of the Centre, Kerala would end up paying a huge premium, especially because of its high morbidity burden and strong health-seeking behaviour. Kerala's troubles with KASP began in 2020 when the go-

began in 2020 when the go-vernment agreed to SHA's proposal to move the scheme from the insurance mode to the trust/assurance mode, wherein the financial liability the trust/assurance mode, wherein the financial liability of settling claims falls on the government in the absence of an insurance company. The claims expenditure, which used to be contained at around 7700 crore in the insurance mode, touched \$1,563\$ crore in 2021-22 and \$1,623\$ crore in 2022-23. The State ends up spending 82% of this total health insurance expenditure because the National Health Agency gives a fixed premium to all States (\$138\$ crore-\$150\$ crore to Kerala) without taking into account inter-State differences in health service delivery. Also, while the Centre pays the premium for some 22 lakh BPL families, the State extende health insurance benefits to an additional 20 lakh families. Public health experts point the text of the content of the co

an additional 20 lakh families. Public health experts point out that the problem is not with KASP as such, but the unprofessional manner in which SHA is running the scheme. A robust claims monitoring mechanism, a high level of technical expertise, and financial discipline are necessary to run any health insurance scheme in a sustainable manner. The in a sustainable manner. The government is ignoring the fact that KASP is unsustainable in its present form and is pushing public hospitals to the brink of financial ruin.

Confidence in the economy just shy of pre-pandemic levels

Over 40% feel the economic situation is worse, with a similar share pessimistic about employment scenario

he share of urban consumers who were pessimistic about the Indian economy continued to decline in January 2024, with less than half of them

2024, with less than half of them saying the economic situation has worsened compared to a year ago.

Chart 1A shows the responses from a Reserve Bank of India (RBI) survey conducted across 19 major cities between January 2 and 11. When asked to comment on their current perception about the economic situation, 40.2% said it has worsened. This is the lowest share since the pandemic outbreak. The share was mostly similar to the 37.5% who said the economic situation has improved (not plotted on the graph). These levels are much closer to the figures before the pandemic. the pandemic.

Chart 1B shows that 41.3% of

the respondents were pessimistic about their current employment scenario. Notably, since November 2022 the share has remained be

2022 the share has remained below the 50% mark. Due to the economic slowdown in 2019 and the pandemic that followed, a majority had remained pessimistic since July 2019, but that has changed.

Chart 1C shows that 22.1% of the respondents were pessimistic about their current income levels. This is the lowest share since the pandemic outbreak, and is only marginally higher than the prepandemic levels.

Worryingly, over 90% of the res-

Worryingly, over 90% of the respondents continued to say that the price levels of commodities have increased (Chart 1D). This share has remained above the 90% mark


has remamed above the 90% mark for three years now. Optimism among consumers is now almost touching pre-pandem-ic levels as the degree of pessi-mism about the economy, jobs, and income levels has declined. High prices, though, are still a sore robot.

In a brief statement to reporters after his arrival at the week-end retreat of the German Nobel Prize winner, Mr. Heinrich Boell, Mr. Solzhenitsyn said he had no previous information that he wewld he teicher to West Germany. said he had no previous information that he would be taken to West Germany.

After making his statement to more than 100 reporters and television cameramen, he smiled broadly and waved both his hands, clasped

together, like a prize-winning boxer.

The illusion of change in Pakistan

While the election results may favour Imran Khan and the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party, the Establishment will have its way again, holding the turf and encouraging the formation and functioning of a unified government

The story so far:

akistan's recent election was considered a crucial one that would lead to a stable would lead to a stable government with a clear mandate, end political instability, and start a process of political healing at the national level, especially in Punjab. The Establishment (the military-dominated deep state) expected the elections would end the Imran revolt and the Pakistan Tehreeke-Imsaf (PTI) experiment. People expected the election process, polling and the final announcement to be free, fair and transparent. The 2024 elections were anything but the above.

According to the results of the National Assembly, the PTI-backed independent candidates have won 93 seats, followed by the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) (54), the Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) (54), the Muttahida Qaumi Movement (MQM)-P (T) and the rest by smaller parties and electrocorders. The NBM 1, DRD and electrocorders.

and the rest by smaller parties and independents. The PML-N, PPP and MQM-P may gain a few more reserved seats (60 for women and 10 for seats (60 for women and 10 for minorities) depending on the seats they have won. Unfortunately for the PTI, it would not get that share, as its candidates contested as independents. What do the above numbers mean for the Parliament and national politics?

The vote belongs to Imran Khan
The first key takeaway from the elections
is that the vote belongs to the PTI and Mr.
Khan, even though the party did not have
a level playing field. Mr. Khan has been
arrested and charged with numerous
cases and just before the elections, two
court verdicts barred him from contesting
in elections. The Establishment, pursuing
methods to discriptine Mr. Khan for the methods to discipline Mr.Khan for the May 9 riots in 2023, forced most of the second-rung PTI leaders to leave the party. In Punjab, Jahangir Tareen launched the Istehkam-e-Pakistan Party launched the Istehkam-e-Pakistan Party (IPP) to dent the PTT's presence in Pakistan's largest province. Similarly, in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) region, Pervez Khattak, another confidant of Mr. Khan and PTT's former defence minister, formed a faction. In a final blow, the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) debarred the PTI from contesting as a party (on the pretext of the party's failure to hold intra-party elections), and removed the "bat" symbol. With most of his trusted lieutenats leaving, multiple cases charged against him, and he himself cases charged against him, and he himself incarcerated, it was an arduous task for Mr. Khan to find candidates to contest, keep up morale and ask his cadres to

Despite all the above odds, the PTI-backed candidates won 93 seats for the National Assembly, 18 more than the PML-N. The PTI has secured over half of PML-N. The PTI has secured over hair of these seats from Punjab (around 50), supposedly the PML-N's home ground. Ir KP also, the PTI has swept, with other political parties securing seats in single digits. Though the PTI may not form the government, the 2024 election clearly belongs to Mr. Khan and the party.

What the Establishment wants, it gets The election results should see the Establishment's best-laid plans crashing. The mandate is clearly against what it wanted. Many in Pakistan consider the pro-Imran vote as that against the Establishment. The Establishment would have wanted the PML-N to win, especially in Punjab, and expected its pre-election political engineering to dent the widespread support for Mr. Khan and the

PTI. However, both these things have not

happened.

This brings us to the second factor of This brings us to the second factor of these elections – that the Establishment will still call the shots. Ironically, it should still be happy that the PML-N has no absolute majority and has to work on a coalition to form the government in Islamabad and Lahore. An element of political instability will work in the Establishment's favour. Whether the vote is what it wanted, or against its plan, the Establishment will continue its political engineering. And political parties will fall in line; those who refuse, will face the wall and the jalls, as Mr. Khan's case shows us.

Nawaz's diminishing returns
The third aspect of the elections is the
Nawaz factor, or rather the lack of it.
Nawaz Sharif came back to Pakistan on the Establishment's approval. The plan was that Mr. Sharif's return would increase the PML-N's chances and dent PTI's, especially in Punjab. However, the return of Mr. Sharif has not catapulted the return of Mr. Sharif has not catapulted the PML-N back into the driver's seat – either at the national level or in Punjab. Except for a few seats in Balochistan and KP, most of the seats won by the PML-N come from Punjab. Even in Punjab, the PTI has won almost equal seats for the national and provincial assemblies. The PML-N will be unable to form a government in Punjab without the others' support. At the national level, discounting the reserved seats, the PML-N had won only ten more seats in 2024, vis-à-vis the 2018 elections.

While one could understand the
PML-N's performance in the 2018
elections with Mr. Sharif exiled and the
Establishment favouring Mr. Khan then, its 2024 performance, especially in Punjab, needs introspection. Compare it with the PTI and PPP, both of which have their home turfs - the KP and Sindh -

intact and are likely to form a government independently in these two provinces.

Continuing political instability The fourth takeaway is that the political instability of 2023 will continue into 2024. During 2021-22, the PML-N and PPP came together with a few other parties to form the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) to overthrow the PTI government. (PDM) to overthrow the PTI government. Eventually, the coalition overthrew Mr. Khan's government in April 2022, resulting in Shehbaz Sharif becoming the Prime Minister, with support from the PPP and others. The PTI took to the streets against the PDM, recating political instability in Pakistan.

However, the situation hasn't changed much. Now the PPP and PML-N have agreed to form a government at the national level, along with other political parties minus the PTI. The outcome of this deal, looks more like PDM 2.0. The PTI, the Jamaate-elslami (JI) and a few other regional parties have already

other regional parties have already announced filing cases in courts, renouncing the results, and taking to the

Eventually, the Courts will have to

Eventually, the Courts will have to interfere in cases on the election results. With the PMLN and PPP in government, PTI in the streets, cases in the courts, and the Establishment to decide a unified government, it is not just PDM 2.0, it will be 2023 2.0, a continuation of the political instability of 2023. The fifth factor is regarding provinces. In KP and Sindh, there is clarity in verdict. People have voted for Mr. Khan and the PTI in KP. Similarly, in Sindh, the PPP has swept the province for national and provincial assembly seats, while MQM-P has retained its stronghold in Karachi. Balochistan, as usual, has seen Karachi, Balochistan, as usual, has seen mixed results, with no single party having substantial numbers – both for the national and provincial assemblies. For the provincial assembly, the PPP and JUI-F have secured II seats each, followed by the PML-N (10), PTI-backed independents (6) and others (13). Regional parties have been protesting against the results on charges of rigging.

Regional parties losing relevance
Sixth is the curious case of regional and religious political parties in the 2024
elections. At the national level, except for the MQM-P (14 seats for the national assembly and 28 for the Sindh provincial assembly, no other regional party from the Sindh, Balochistan and KP have made an impact. The Grand Democratic Alliance (GDA), Awami National Party (ANP), Balochistan National Party (ANP), Balochistan National Party (BNP), and others from the three provinces have made little or no impact. The PML-Q from Punjab could win only three for the national assembly.

Equally important is the case of religious political parties – II, Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam (JUI-F) and the newly formed Tehreeke-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP). The JI could not win a single seat for the national assembly in the JII-F has survived with a few seats for the national assembly (33), and a few for the provincial assemblies of KP and Balochistan. The TLP could secure only one seat – that too for the provincial assembly in on Provincial.

To conclude, the Establishment will hold the turf. Despite the PTI-backed candidates gaining more seats, a cursory overview of the elections will reveal the same at both the national and provincial level.

The first key takeaway from the Pakistan elections is that the vote belongs to the PTI and Mr. Khan, even though the party did not have a level playing field.

Despite the odds, the PTI-backed candidates won 93 seats for the National Assembly, 18 more than the PML-N. The PTI has secured over half of these seats from Punjab (around 50), supposedly the PML-N's home ground.

However, whether the vote is against its plan or not, the Establishment will continue its political engineering. And political parties will fall in line; those who refuse, will face the wall and the jails, as Mr. Khan's case shows us.

Emergency, then and now: the long reach of unbridled power

As is clear in the case of Prabir Purkayastha, Fahad Shah, Aala Fazili and scores of others, mere acts of dissent are leading to arrest under stringent laws. India may not be under a declared Emergency now, but it feels like 1975 all over again

t has been more than 126 years since the famous "open letter" titled, "J'Accuse" by journalist and writer Emile Zola was published in the newspaper L'Aurore on its front page which pointed to the unlawful arrest of which pointed to the unlawful arrest of French Army General Staff officer Alfred Dreyfus over trumped up charges of espionage. Zola was later prosecuted for libel and had to flee to England to avoid being arrested.

The letter, the article and Zola still serve as inspiration to those committed to question the all-powerful state in its demonising of dissent and its use of power to browbeat and punish those who are critical of it.

Just last Tuesday, a telling statistic was released by the government. As many as 5,023 cases of sedition were filed between

released by the government. As many as 5,023 cases of sedition were filed between 2018 and 2022 under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. If trends from 2018 to 2020 are considered – of the 4,690 people arrested, only 149 were convicted – a case can be made that this was less for prosecution for the said crime was less for prosecution for the said crit and more persecution and this trend extended to the next two years. We use the term "persecution" because getting bail for cases filed under the UAPA is enormously difficult.

enormously difficult.

Draconian provisions
Take the example of Fahad Shah, editor of the website 'Kashmir Walla', who was not only granted bail but cases against whom were set aside by the Jammu and Kashmir High Court in November 2023. He was in custody after charges were framed under many offences including the UAPA. Shah and another scholar, Aala Fazili, were booked under the UAPA in a "narrative terrorism" case which alleged that a write-up they came up with in 2011 was aimed at "spreading terrorism and creating a false narrative".

The J&K High Court tore the case apart, observing that there was no material to suggest that "the article has any content

that provokes people to take arms and resort to violence". It also made observations on how UAPA was being applied and made remarks on the need

applied and made remarks on the need for circumspection by agencies of the state when enforcing this provision. It was not uncommon for the British colonial state to arrest dissidents, even members of the press, who were critical of it in India. That several prominent Indian public figures who were subject to this harassment were also connected to the freedom movement, led to the reasonable "freedom of expression" being guaranteed in India's constitution and also undergirded press and media freedoms. But these came under the severest threat during the Emergency.

The turning point Quite a few books have been written about the Emergency, but a fairly recent one deserves mention. Gyan Prakash's Emergency Chronicles: Indira Gandhi and Democracy's Turning Point, published in 2019, drew from archival records, published material, films and interviews to capture the political crisis in Indian democracy that led to the Emergency. The book sets itself apart by not looking at Emergency as an anomaly in India's post-Independence democratic history, but links it to the dynamics of India's popular democracy as it played itself out since Independence. It makes the case that the Emergency marked a turning point in India's political history, eventually paving the way for caste politics and the rise of Hindutva. Interestingly, the book begins with the ordeal faced by a then Left student activist in Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), Prabir Purkayastha, during the Emergency, on September 25, 1975. He published material, films and interviews

Emergency, on September 25, 1975. He was "abducted" by the Delhi Police in what was a case of mistaken identity – wuat was a case of mistaken identity – th police had set out to arrest the then JNU Students Union President Devi Prasad Tripathi after receiving a complaint from no less than then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's son Sanjay Gandhi. His wife, Maneka, was a student at the School of Languages at JNU and when she had gone to attend classes the same day, she was asked by the student union leaders to bycott classes in protest against the Emergency. Despite the Additional Division Magistrate initially declining to issue a warrant for this "arrest", the then Lieutenant Governor instructed him to issue a warrant because the issue involved the "PM's house". This led to the arrest and incarceration of Prabir Purkayastha for over a year, under the draconian Maintenance of Internal Security Act (MISA), first in Delhi's Tihar Central Jail and then in Agra where he spent nearly a month in solitary confinement. she was asked by the student union

Remembering the ordeal Prabir recalls this ordeal in greater detail and goes on to recount the days spent in jail during the Emergency in his memoir, *Keeping up the Good Fight* that was published recently. After his release from jail, Prabir went on to become a successful power engineer while also wearing several hats as a publicly minded Left activist. He was one of the founder-members of

He was one of the founder-members of the Delhi Science Forum, which among other things played a vital role in promoting science and rationality besides taking up causes such as compensation for the victims of the Bhopal Gas Tragedy, and intervening in public debates on science and technology policy. He was recently chair of Knowledge Commons, a body dedicated to promoting dissemination of knowledge beyond intellectual property, and played a vital role in the Free Software Mowement of India, an organisation that promotes the use and implementation of free and open source software in the country, Prabir is also founder and editor-in-chief of the alternate, news and analysis website, alternate news and analysis website, Newsclick.in.

In jail, again Ironically, today Prabir is in jail again. He

has been arrested, just like the journalist Fahad Shah was, on UAPA charges for his work in *Newsclick* after the organisation work in Newsclick after the organisation was subjected to several raids and searches in the last three years for alleged offences related to its funding.

Despite getting relief from a lower court and the Delhi High Court on matters related to the Enforcement Directorate

related to the Enforcement Directorate and the Income Tax department, Newsclick was subject to a whole set of fresh allegations related to a "terror case with Chinese links".

An editorial in The Hindu called the FIR registered by the Delhi police as a "vague analgam of sweeping accusations that do not actually disclose any offence, leave alone one of terrorism". Yet, Prabir is still in detention under the UAPA, as he awaits judicial hearing on the case.

As Prabir's case and that of a score of others who have been booked under draconian laws for their mere acts of

draconian laws for their mere acts of dissent recently shows, India might not be under an Emergency today, but the situation faced by dissenters and activists, specifically those opposed to religious fundamentalism today is not any

As Gyan Prakash points out in his book, today's regime, "supported ground troops, which Indira [Gandhi's] Emergency rule never enjoyed, and a largely compliant and corporatised electronic media, which did not exist in 1975-77... enjoys unprecedented power. It is equipped with the powers of the administrative state, including the law against sedition under the British-era Section 124A, preventive detention, and the Armed Forces Special Powers Act for use in the so-called "disturbed" areas...
Today, there is no formal declaration of Emergency, no press censorship, no As Gyan Prakash points out in his Today, there is no formal declaration of Emergency, no press censorship, no lawful suspension of the law...Today, the courts, the press, and political parties do not face repression. But they appear unable or unwilling to function as the gatekeepers of democracy in the face of state power spiked with Hindu populist ressentiment."

BJP got 90% of all corporate donations in 2022-23: report

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) received nearly 90% of corporate donations worth ₹680.49 crore that worth ₹680.49 crore that five national parties togeth-er gathered in 2022-23, ac-cording to a report by elec-tion watchdog Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR)

for Democratic Reforms (ADR).

The report focuses on donations above ₹20,000 received by the national political parties in the 2022-23 financial year, as per details submitted by them to the Election Commission

These parties are the BJP, the Congress, the Ba-hujan Samaj Party (BSP), the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), the Communist Par-ty of India (Marxist) [CPI (M)], and the National Peo-ple's Party (NPP).

The last date for submis-

sion of contribution re-ports for the parties was September 30, 2023. The total donations de-

the Congress got ₹55.62 cr

clared by the national par-ties for 2022-23 stood at ₹850.438 crore. The BJP re-ceived ₹719.85 crore and the Congress ₹79.92 crore. The donations declared by the BJP are more than five times the aggregate de-clared by the other parties together. The BSP declared that it

did not receive any dona-tions above ₹20,000 dur-

tions above ₹20,000 dur-ing this period.

The total donations re-ceived by the national par-ties in 2022-23 increased by ₹91.70 crore, a rise of

12.09% from the previous financial year.

Congress sees dip The donations received by

the BJP increased from ₹614.62 crore in 2021-22 to 68 de 3c rore in 2021-22 to ₹719.85 crore in 2022-23. On the other hand, the do-nations to Congress de-creased from 705-45 crore in 2021-22 to ₹79.92 crore in 2022-23. A total of ₹276.20 crore was donated to the nation-al parties from Delhi, fol-lowed by ₹160.50 crore from Gujarat and ₹96.27 crore from Maharashtra. Donations to the nation-al parties made by the cor-porate or business sector amounted to ₹80.49 crore - 80.01% of total donations

80.01% of total donations out of which the BJP received ₹610.49 crore, while the Congress got ₹55.62 crore. The BJP's ₹610.49 crore

Since toothpaste and multani mitti have a cooling effect, we are using them to protect our skin."

Centre uses British-era Act to block Internet in Punjab

As Punjab farmer groups prepared for a protest march to Delhi, the Union government invoked its powers under a British-era law to suspend mobile In-ternet in certain districts of the State last week, citing public emergency and pupublic emergency and pu-blic safety. This is the first time the Union govern-ment has issued such or-ders to block the Internet, outside of the national cap

ital. Given that law and orital. Given that law and or-der is a State subject, the more usual procedure is for a State government to issue such orders, as was done in Haryana, which is governed by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). Punjab, however, is ruled by the Aam Aadmil Party (AAP). In a denarture from

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). In a departure from norms, the Union Home Ministry issued two or-ders, on February 10 and February 12, under the Temporary Suspension of Telecom Services (Public

Emergency or Public Safe-ty) Rules, 2017 of the In-dian Telegraph Act, 1885. The orders, issued follow-ing a reference by the Intel-ligence Bureau, resulted in the Internet being sus-pended within the jurisdic-tion of 20 police stations in seven districts of Punjab — Patiala, SAS Nagar, Bathin-Patiala, SAS Nagar, Bathin-da, Sri Mukhtsar Sahib, Mansa, Sangrur, and Fateh-garh Sahib — till February

A Punjab government official, speaking on condi-

tion of anonymity, said the Union government had the power to issue such orders under the Rules, adding that the Punjab govern-ment had not objected to it

it.

This provision was first used by the Ministry in 2019 during the protests against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), when the Internet was suspended in seven season. pended in some areas of Delhi. As Delhi is a Union Territory, the police func-tions under the Home Ministry. Later, the same pro-visions were used to suspend the Internet again in parts of Delhi during the farmers agitation of 2020-21 that lasted nearly 13 months.



Ex-JNU student Umar Khalid withdraws bail petition from SC

Mr. Khalid has also with-Mr. Khalid has also with-drawn his separate writ pe-tition questioning the le-gality of certain sections of the UAPA, especially deal-ing with bail. This petition had been tagged with oth-ers which had similarly challenged the draconian nature of the UAPA. The other writ petitioners, in-cluding Foundation for Me-dia Professionals and indi-



viduals, have sought time to consider the option of withdrawing from the Supreme Court to move the

preme Court to move the respective High Courts. The hearing in the case had been through a persistent series of re-scheduling. His case has also travelled across different Benches of the Supreme Court in 2023.

Justice Trivedi had earlier pointed out that the hearing of and decision in the case should not be delayed any further. It was a matter concerning liberty.

Additional solicitor general of India S.V. Raju had countered that the accused was the reason why the framing of charges was delayed all these years.

No more adjournment letters in after-notice bail cases: SC

Adjournments, denounced as a major factor for pen-

as a major factor for pendency, delay in court hear-ings, and a money-drainer for litigants, is no longer going to be easy in the Supreme Court.

A circular issued by the Supreme Court on Wednesday said it would not entertain letters of adjournment from lawyers in bail and anticipatory bail cases for which notice had been earlier issued by the court. Letters of adjournment

are last-minute requests by parties for postponement of cases listed before a Bench of the court. The letters are filed in the Registry ters are filed in the Registry and circulated to the opposing parties. The case, when called for hearing in the day, is usually adjourned if all the parties agree. Usually, they do as a matter of professional courtesy.

case. The circular said a party or counsel can only circulate an adjournment letter once in a case. The court would not allow consecutive adjournments, irrespective of which party in the case is making the request. If a case is adjourned, it should be listed within four weeks. The specific date for the hearing would be given to the specific date for the hearing would be given to the parties. No oral mentioning would be permitted to advance the date. Finally, the SC made it clear that no letter would be permitted for adjourning fresh cases or regular hearing matters. Both the Supreme Court Advocates-on-Record Association (SCAORA) and the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) had registered their protest against the move.

war in Gaza more than four months ago. Israell Army chief Herzi Halevi said after meeting commanders near the bor-der with Lebanon that Is-raels "next campaign will be very much on the offen-sive, and we will use all the tools and all capabilities". "We are intensifying the

strikes all the time, and Hezbollah are paying an in-creasingly heavy price," he said in a statement. Fears have grown of another full-blown conflict

between Israel and Hezbol-lah, with tens of thousands displaced on both sides of the border amid soaring regional tensions.

Since the outbreak of the Hamas-Israel war on October 7, at least 243 people have been killed in Lebanon, most of them Hezbollah fighters but also including 30 civilians, according to an AFP tally.
On the Israeli side, nine soldiers and six civilians have been killed.

XVI Finance Commission begins work

It was chaired by former NITI Aayog Vice-Chairman Arvind Panagariya. The panel discussed terms of reference and decided to kick off wide-ranging consultations with stakeholders. times when prices plummet... (and) give them the freedom to sow crops of their choice," Mr. Sharma said, stressing that meaningful procurement only takes place in paddy (41% takes place in paddy (41% of produce) and wheat (24% of output), which account for 60% of India's crop produce.

food articles also eased to a three-month low of 6.85% from 9.4% in December, with slight declines record-



ed in most items, including cereals, whose inflation rate eased to 4.1% in Janu-ary from 5.9%. Fruits infla-tion dropped to a five-month low of 1% from 4.6% a month earlier a month earlier.

However, overall inflation rates remained high for quite a few food itemsonion inflation was 29.2%, down from 91.8% in December; vegetable prices were up 19.7% (down from 26.3%); pulses inflation

were up 19.7% (down from 26.3%); pulses inflation was at a five-month low but still at 16.1%. Paddy inflation dropped from 10.5% in December to 9.6% in January. Wheat and potato prices dropped 3.1% and 8.4%, respectively, while milk inflation eased to 5.4%. On a monthon-month basis, the Wholesale Price Index reading was 0.33% lower while the Food Index dropped 1.1% Food Index dropped 1.1% from December levels.



ishaal Uppal has been strongly intertwined with Indian tennis for many years. Not many may remember, but Vishaal had remember, but Vishaal had beaten Rohan Bopanna in the final for the National grass court title. He had won a crucial doubles rubber with Leander Paes in the Davis Cup tie against Korea, beating a team that had Hyung Taik Lee.

He had also won he Asian Games medal with Mustafa Ghouse, when Leander Paes and Mahesh Bhupathi won the gold.

He has been the captain of the Fed Cup team, now known as the Billie Jean King Cup. More importantly, he guided the team to the World Group play-off for the first time in history.

that he is now familiar in the tennis circles
as the mentor for the women's national
champion Shrivalli Bhamidipati, who has

champion Shrivalli Bhamidipati, who has made rapid strides in recent weeks. The 22-year-old Shrivalli had won her maiden singles title in the \$25,000 ITF women's event in Bengaluru in November. She was slowly realising her potential

Yet, there was no hint of what she Yet, there was no hint of what she unleashed in the \$115,000 WTA tennis tournament in Mumbai. Shrivalli won three matches in a row, including the one over former world No. 56, No Hibino of Japan, now ranked 93. She played a vibrant match on equal terms against the teenage sensation, Alina Korneeva and went down in three tough sets, after winning the first winning the first.

To put things in perspective, despite not breaching the top-500 in ranking, Shrivalli was beating players in the top-100 to 300 bracket. Was it a surprise Vishaal, even though he has been

for Vishaal, even though he has been working diligently, tuning her thoughts to a positive wave length.

"I wasn't surprised at the way Shrivalliplayed in Mumbai. I was happy to see her execute the things I have been working with her. What pleased me most was the mentality she played with, in her matches. Her tennis playing ability and talent is known to everyone. So, tennis wise it was not a surprise for me", said Vishaal.

The 16-year-old Korneeva, who was World No.1 junior last year, having won Australian Open and French Open singles titles, apart from making the semifinals of Wimbledon, has already won three

Wimbledon, has already won three women's titles in the professional circuit. Shrivalli matched her in every department before Korneeva nosed ahead, playing strong on the big points in the climax. As luck would have it, Korneeva fell ill and could not play the

Korneeva fell ill and could not play the quarterfinals.

"That is the way it goes. Korneeva had to give a walkover, which was a loss for the tournament as the is a rising star of the WTA Tour. She had earned her spot in the quarterfinals by beating Shrivalli", observed Vishaal.

There is no doubt that Shrivalli has progressed treendous, especially in

progressed tremendous, especially in terms of self-belief which helps her play best tennis in match situations. She enjoys the competition and thrives under pressure as it tunes her focus to a higher



degree. With conviction in her ability to compete, Shrivalli no longer allows the reputation of her opponent or the situation of the score to weigh down her

She is growing as a tennis player, and

She is growing as a tennis player, and definitely needs to work more on her game and consistency.

"We have to work on and improve every aspect of her game. Have to pay attention to detail, her mentality, physicality and tactical awareness", said Vishaal.

There will be three more tournaments in a row in India, the \$25,000 events in Gurugram, Nagpur and Indore, providing the chance for Shrivalli and the rest to gain precious match experience and improve their status on the WTA computer, so as to play at a higher level.

process and continue to develop her mentality. The tournament in Gurugram has a tough entry list. Having said that, if she executes our plan well then Shrivalli will be a very dangerous player in the upcoming three tournaments in India", said Vishaal.

It is not about Shrivalli alone, as it is a It is not about Shrivalli alone, as it is a bunch of Indian girls who are hunting the big fish in the competitive ocean. Sahaja Yamalapalli, Rutuja Bhosale, Zeel Desai, Vaidehi Chaudhari and of course the leader, Ankita Raina, are all capable of winning against better ranked opponents on their day. Sahaja was outstanding in Mumbai in beating the top seed Kayla Day of the USA in the first round. She was two points away from beating Polina Kudermetova in the pre-quarterfinals before the Russian

the pre-quarterfinals before the Russian stepped it up brilliantly to snuff the challenge. Rutuja had lost a tough second round in three sets against Katie Volynets

of USA.

"I was very happy to see our girls perform the way they did in Mumbai. Two Indian girls beating two top 100 players in the same tournament was unheard of. Also, they didn't lose easy matches. Every match was a tough loss and our girls had chances to win. This surely will give them and other Indian girls a lot of belief", pointed out Vishaal.

Considering their excellent fare, do the Indian girls deserve more such big events at home?

"I believe, for now, one WTA \$125K event is enough. We need to concentrate more on hosting the \$60K, \$40K, \$25K and \$15K tournaments as we have to focus at the lowest relient pool and give them on the larger talent pool and give them the opportunity to rise in the world as well", said Vishaal.

Does updating COVID-19 vaccines frequently have any benefits?

The 'match' between the viral strain loaded in a vaccine and the strain circulating in the population influences a COVID-19 vaccine's effectiveness. In flu vaccines, with which COVID-19 vaccines share many similarities, effectiveness can vary by as much as 15% between a match and no match

esearchers update the composition of influenza vaccines every six months to match the strains of the virus that are circulating in the wild, so that the shots may provide protective immunity enables the composition of the virus of the viru against the flu. But despite their best efforts, researchers rarely perfectly match the strains loaded in the vaccine with the strains circulating by the time the vaccines reach the market.

vaccines reach the market.

The reason for this is the long gestation period – usually at least six months – between identifying the circulating strain and the development, manufacturing, and distribution of the vaccines. By the time the updated flu vaccine is available, the circulating strain may have drifted from the one contained in the vaccine, thanks to the high mutational rates of influenza viruses.

The 'match' between strains included

influenza viruses.

The 'match' between strains included in the vaccine and strains in circulation is the most important factor controlling the vaccine effectiveness (VE) of flu vaccines. The VE increase by more than 25% when there is a match with the circulating strains but see a low so 100% in strains but can be as low as 10% in seasons when there is no match. Another issue with flu vaccines is the

Another issue with flu vaccines is the durability of protection. According to a recent study, the VB declines by 7% for H3N2 to 11% for H1N1 viruses per month, and could vanish as soon as 90 days after vaccination.

There are some striking similarities between the influenza and COVID-19 vaccines. The VE of COVID-19 vaccines varies according to the disease's progression as well as the circulating strains. With the advent of the highly mutated Omicron variant of SARS-CoV-2, the VE of COVID-19 vaccines has nose-dived.

According to one large study, COVID-19 vaccines had a VE of 52.8% against the Delta variant but only 16.4% against the Omicron. Another large review – of the findings of 78 studies on the VE of four COVID-19 vaccines before the advent of

omicron. Antonic raige review—Of the indings of 78 studies on the VE of four COVID-19 vaccines before the advent of Omicron – concluded that VE against symptomatic disease waned by 20-30% by the sixth month of the primary series.

Thus, researchers worldwide rushed to revise COVID-19 vaccines that contained the ancestral strain to match the circulating strain of SARS-CoV-2, and thus remain clinically relevant.

In early 2023, a highly mutated sub-lineage of the Omicron variant, XBB.1.5, emerged. It was antigenically as distant from the ancestral strain of SARS-CoV-2 as the latter was from the SARS-CoV-1 virus. There were three COVID-19 vaccines available as booster doses at this time: the monovalent ancestral (OG) shot, a bivalent OG-BA.1 shot, and a bivalent OG-BA.5 booster. However, as stated above, none of the vaccines (including mRNA vaccines) were found to be efficacious against infections of this hypermutated variant.

Subsequently, the vaccine was updated in mid-2023 to include the antigens of the XBB.1.5 strain. But by the time the U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC) approved and recommended the updated monovalent vaccine as a booster, another new lineage of Omicron, JN.1, had emerged with more than 30 mutations in the spike protein and a high immune-evasion potential. By January 2024, JN.1 had completely replaced XBB.1.5 in the population.

The CDC estimated the updated booster was around 50% efficacious against symptomatic JN.1 infections but some experts doubted this figure.

Merit in updating COVID-19 boosters The matching problem raises a pertinent question: Is it prudent to attempt frequent updates?

requent updates?

One interesting study from Australia, uploaded as a preprint paper on February 9, analysed this question in detail.

Researchers retrospectively analysed 18 studies that investigated the ability of the OG, the OG-BA.I, and the OG-BA.5 boosters to neutralise the variant that started circulating immediately after their deployment. They found that updated vaccines consistently improved neutralising antibody titres by 40% or more compared to non-updated vaccine formulations.

Specifically, the researchers found that

Specifically, the researchers found that relative to the OG antigens' efficacy against XBB.1.5, the BA.1 update did a better job and the BA.5 update did even better. Based on these benefits in the neutralisation titres, they predicted that updating an existing vaccine should, on average, induce a 1.52-dimes higher titre against a future variant compared to boosting with an older formulation. The researchers also stated they expect a 11.25% increase in Ve against symptomatic disease and 23-33% against severe disease caused by the future variant.

In sum, the study supports the case for revising COVID-19 vaccines' formulations as often as possible.

However, there are some confounding factors, including past exposure to infections, inter-study variations of such exposures, in vitro and in vivo differences, and publication biases. The researchers also clarified the benefits of the update

Indeed, there is no guarantee that a profoundly drifted variant with a very high transmissibility and more virulence won't emerge in future, and which would negate the advantage of updating existing vaccines.

Does India need an updated booster? In India, the advent of Omicron (mainly BA.2) in January 2022 and its resultant mild disease rendered a much lower uptake of COVID-19 vaccines. For many Indians, the pandemic is long past, notwithstanding a few surges in 2023. Currently, there is no Indian vaccine with antigens matching the currently dominant JNJ strain or its predecessor, KBB.1.5. Corbevax, the vaccine made by Biological E, is currently

developing an XBB-based vaccine. Whether Indians should be boosted with an updated COVID-19 vaccine depends on the objective. If it is to prevent severe disease, hospitalisation, and death, only three exposures – through natural infection or vaccination will suffice to confer protection irrespective of the antigenic makeup of the circulating variant. (This protection is provided by our T-cells.) This is the case with most healthy, immunocompetent individuals. individuals

individuals. For the vulnerable sections of society, like the elderly and those with comorbidities and immunodeficiencies, it is desirable to actively prevent an infection. These individuals need an updated booster. The vaccines based on OG or older strains may not offer meaningful protection owing to the mismatch and other factors. All available influenza vaccines are being developed on conventional egg-based or cell-culture platforms, which is why updating them takes six months or more. Many CoVID-10 vaccines use the mRNA platform whose main attraction is

mRNA platform whose main attraction is the ease and speed with which they can be modified. Unfortunately, updating mRNA vaccines has also required four to six months. India also has a next-generation mRNA

India also has a next-generation mRNA vaccine called Gemocvac, developed indigenously by Gennova Lab and based on the old Omicron variant. It can also be updated to use a contemporaneous variant, but that depends on the need and the will of the national recommending authority as much as the still-evolving SARS-COV2 virus.

Scientists seek more protections for 'living fossil'

Environmental groups on Monday petitioned the U.S. government seeking endangered species protection for the American horseshoe crab, a "living fossil" under threat from commercial harvests for bait and biomedical use as well as

for bait and biomedical use as well as from habitat loss and climate change. These spine-tailed sea creatures, named for the shape of their body shells, were once a familiar sight to summer beachgoers along the U.S. mid-Atlantic and Gulf Coasts.

But populations have crashed in recent decades, with spawning numbers down two-thirds from 1990 in the Delaware Bay estuary that was once their biggest stronghold, according to conservation groups. Research also shows their egg densities falling more than 80% in the past four decades.

past four decades.

Those trends are tied to stress on other marine species that feed on their larvae and eggs, including the rufa red knot, a migratory shorebird whose own 2014 threatened-species listing cited horseshoe crab harvests as a contributing factor.

crab harvests as a contributing lactor. Classified not as true crabs but as marine arthropods more closely related to spiders and scorpions, horseshoe crabs are among the oldest living creatures on the earth, with fossils of their ancestors

dating back some 450 million years. dating back some 450 million years.
"We're wiping out one of the world's
oldest and toughest creatures," said Will
Harlan, a senior scientist at the Center for
Biological Diversity, one of 23 groups
petitioning the National Oceanic and
Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) for
the endangered species declaration.
Such a listing would generally make it
unlawful to harm or kill a horseshoe crab
without a special permit. The petition also
seeks designation of "critical habitat" to
be protected, especially during spawning
season.

season.
The petition cites numerous threats to the American horseshoe crab, one of four living species of the animal, stemming from human activities.

Pharmaceutical companies reap horseshoe crabs in large numbers – nearly 1 million in 2022 – for their blue-coloured blood, which contains a clotting agent used to test drugs and medical devices for bacterial endotoxins, the petition said.

Regulations allow the biomedical industry to extract only a portion of a horseshoe crab's blood and then release it

horseshoe crab's blood and then release it alive in the area it was collected, though 10-15% of harvested animals die during this process, NOAA says on its website. The creatures also face growing habitat loss from oceanfront development, dredging, pollution, coastal erosion and sea-level rise linked to global warming from increased greenhouse gas emissions. Mass die-offs have been observed in the past three years, with NOAA in 2023 ranking the horseshoe crab's overall vulnerability to climate change as "very high," the petition said.


