NOTHING much was expected from the Interim Budget of 2024. In that sense, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman lived up to expectations. The FM stayed away from big-bang populist measures but turned her short Budget speech into a self-congratulatory session.

Most part of the speech was dedicated to listing out the 'achievements' of the Narendra Modi-led government in the past 10 years, drawing a then-and-now comparison between pre- and post-2014 era. Stressing that the Modi government will come back to power after the 2024 general elections,

on the contours of that roadmap, but highlighted PM Modi's key focus areas — the poor, women, youth, and farmers. But there too, no major announcements were made exshe said: "In the full budget in cept for the ₹1 lakh crore cor-

pus with 50-year interest-free loan for financing innovations. This is supposed to help the tech-savvy youth in pursuing their career in sunrise sectors.

The speech did not offer any roadmap for job creation. In fact, the word 'job' appeared only once in the FM's speech, that too as a passing mention. A couple of 'populist' announcement were made, though. The FM proposed a scheme to help 'deserving sections' of the middle class living in rented houses, slums, or unauthorised colonies buy or from the budgeted 5.9%. build their own houses. She also announced 300 units of free solar power to one crore families. The finer details will be known only later.

On the fiscal front, the Budget put the best foot forward with a target of 5.1% of the GDP in 2024-25. The FY24 fiscal deficit target has been revised to 5.8%

The FM also cut the government's gross borrowing target for FY24 to ₹14.13 lakh crore, lower than the revised FY24 estimate of ₹15.43 lakh crore.

Lower borrowing by the government means more funds up for grabs for the private sector. This stoked positive sentiments in the bond market with 10-year bond yields falling to 7.04%. The markets, though, were not too impressed with the Sensex shedding 0.15%. The Street is holding the cheer for the full Budget after polls. **P9, 10, 11, 12**

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B'luru gets big push ahead of Lok Sabha polls

Roads, flyovers, civic amenities-- state cabinet clears projects for city

THE Karnataka Cabinet on Thursday approved many projects and works for Bengaluru, including Rs 263 crore for an elevated flyover near Sir M Vivesvaraya Terminus. The government's push for projects in Bengaluru comes ahead of the Lok Sabha polls.

After the cabinet meeting, Law Minister HK Patil told reporters that the cabinet had given administrative approval of Rs 263 crore to construct an elevated flyover near Byappanahalli railway level crossing to the new Sir MV Terminal. There was a demand for road connectivity from the newly constructed Sir M Vivesvaraya Terminus of South Western Railway to Byappanahalli Metro station.

According to Patil, the road connectivity would help lakhs of people who travel, and also reduce traffic congestion. "In order to resolve this issue, a 1.5km long flyover was proposed at IOC junction and construction of an additional two-lane Railway Over Bridge at Byappanahalli railway level crossing," he explained. This flyover is also expected to allow people from Kammanahalli, Banasawadi and Old Madras Road ac-



cess the terminus with ease. The cabinet also approved the preparation of a Rs 1,200-crore action plan to provide basic amenities and also for white-topping roads. On the length of roads, Patil said BBMP will decide. They also approved a Rs 208-crore project to provide drinking water to villages that were newly added to City Corporation limits. Apart from this, a sum of Rs 150 crore was allocated for upgrading the Mother and Child

Health sector hails free cervical cancer vaccine

HEALTH sector experts on Thursday hailed the interim Budget that encourages free vaccination against cervical cancer for 9-14-year-old girls, a plan to establish more medical colleges by utilising existing hospital infrastructure by setting up a committee, the newly designed U-WIN platform for managing immunisation, and intensified efforts of Mission Indradhanush which will be rolled out throughout the country.

"The focus to plan free vaccinations for cervical cancer in girls is a welcome move. Every year, in India, about 1,20,000 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer and about 67,000 women die from the disease every year," informed Dr Shafiq AM, Co-Founder and CEO, Trilife Hospital.

Dr Meena Muthiah, Consultant - Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Manipal Hospital Old Airport Road and Sarjapur, said, "The Budget highlights that the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccination plays a crucial role in preventing HPV infection, a prominent contributor to cervical cancer in women. The cost of the HPV vaccine has historically been a significant hurdle, with each dose priced at around Rs 4,000, limiting accessibility to those with financial means. There is an optimistic outlook for the future. as efforts

Luggage, files of senior rly official stolen from 1st class of Rani Chennamma Exp

IN a shocking incident that exposed the lack of safety of passengers inside trains, an unknown individual managed to steal the luggage of a top woman railway officer of the Bengaluru Division and her copassenger on board the Rani Chennamma Express recently. They were travelling in a cabin of the AC first class compartment. Sources stated that the stolen luggage of the Additional Divisional Railway Manager (ADRM), Kusuma Hariprasad, contained department files as well.

They had boarded the train from KSR Bengaluru on January 24 at 11pm and their seats were in a cabin with four berths in H1 coach. It was when they were about to alight at Hubballi the next day at 5.20 am, that they realised their belongings were missing. Two separate FIRs have

been filed at the Government Railway Police (GRP) station at Hubballi under section 379 of IPC (Punishment for theft).

Speaking to TNIE, a GRP source said, "Strangely the belongings of only two of the four passengers were stolen. The ADRM's Allen Solly trolley suitcase which contained railway files have been stolen. In addition, her Hidesign handbag and gold earrings weighing 4 grams were stolen too"

The only other passenger whose belongings were stolen was that of Rajesh Kumar, a sound contractor with the Railways. 'He lost his Louis Vuitton bag which had a laptop worth Rs 60,000," he added.

The bag of another passenger in the coach, Lalitha Ram-

agopal, wife of a Railway Construction official was missing but she found it later in the train's washroom. "Only her charger was stolen and she did not want to file a complaint," the source said. Moreover, passenger Vinay Dias had all his belongings intact.

Inquiry into the theft

When inquired about the progress made in the case, an-

other cop said that CCTV cameras were spread across the stations and inside Rani Chennamma but were not fixed inside the cabin. "As of now, we have found out that no one boarded the train that night after Davanagere station. Somebody on board the train or someone who boarded before the station has committed the theft. Investigations are on," he said.

The train had armed Railway Protection Force cops until it covered the Bengaluru Division as well as GRP cops on board. Neither the ADRM nor the General Manager of SWR Sanjeev Kishore answered calls in this connection. Chief Public Relations Of-

ficer, SWR, Manjunath Prasad said, "A search is on to identify the culprit. We expect the person to be caught shortly."

Six revenue officials suspended

UPSET over not being allowed to have liquor with his favourite dish, 'naati koli saaru' (country chicken curry), a 58-year-old man allegedly bludgeoned his son to death at their house on Kanakapura Road in Kanakapura Rural police station limits. The accused, identi-

fied as Nagaraju alias Venkataraju alias Kodli, is reportedly in the habit of drinking, while eating non-vegetarian food. On Tuesday night, Nagaraju's wife, Gowramma, had prepared his favourite chicken dish, 'naati koli saaru', with which he wanted to consume alcohol. He asked his wife to arrange for the same, but their istered a murder case.

33-year-old son, Govindaraju, stopped his mother, opposing his father's drinking. Frustrated, the accused slapped his son, who in turn retaliated by beating his father. Later, Nagaraju walked out of the house and returned late at night. When Govindaraju

was asleep, Nagaraju took a stone and struck his head, before walking to the police station and surrendering.

The incident occurred around 12.30 am

on Wednesday, while Govindaraju succumbed to his injuries around 3.45 pm. The victim was a fruit seller. Gowramma has filed a complaint, and the Kanakapura Rural police have taken Nagaraju into custody and reg-

"The complainant had to separate both her husband and son after they started fighting. The accused, who returned home at midnight, saw his son asleep and smashed his head with a stone. Gowramma, who heard screams, started shouting for help. The victim was immediately shifted to a nearby hospital, and then to another hospital in Bengaluru. Since the doctors there said that the chances of survival were slim, the family again tried shifting him to another hospital in Harohalli. While being taken there, the victim breathed his last," said an officer.

KYASANUR FOREST DISEASE

21 cases detected in Siddapur taluk of U-K district

IN an clear indication that Kyasanur Forest Disease (KFD) or monkey fever has entered Uttara Kannada district, as many as 21 cases have been reported from several villages of Siddapur taluk.

Though some experts say the disease, which is spread by ticks, aggravates only during summer, this time it has been proven wrong as there are reports of early outbreak. According to the District Health Department, of the 21 cases detected in

ease. "It could be because of the drought. But we are well prepared to deal with the situation," he said. The disease has returned to Uttara Kannada after two years.

"Last year, there were no cases reported. This year, there are many cases. We have put medical staff on alert at places where the outbreak has been reported and in places which are prone to the spread of the disease, we are taking precautionary measures," he

said. Accordingly, places around Joida, Kumbarwada in Joida taluk have are on alert. The staff have been told to look for deaths of primates and cases of fever. "We have asked the people who have developed fever to get themselves investigated at hospitals and hospital staff have been told to conduct a survey and stock necessary medicines in case of an outbreak," the DHO told TNIE. He said, people who depend on forests for their livelihood have been told to avoid venturing into the wooded areas.

Cutout put up by BJP workers hurt two people, alleges AAP

Gold worth ₹48 lakh found concealed in flyer's knee cap

BENGALURU: In an ingenious smuggling route adopted by a male flyer from Singapore, gold weighing 777.5 grams was concealed in paste form in the knee cap he had worn. The value of the metal recovered by the Air Intelligence Unit of Customs is Rs 47.89 lakh. A Customs source said the 36-year old native of Tamil Nadu, arrived at Kempegowda International Airport via Singapore Airlines (Flight no. SQ 510) on Wednesday. "Profiling, personal search and repeated questioning helped in the recovery of the gold concealed in the knee cap," he said. A case has been booked against him.

Fight between two groups ends in man's murder in KR Puram

BENGALURU: A person was killed, while another sustained grievous injuries, during a fight between two groups in KR Puram police station limits around 11.30 pm on Wednesday. The deceased, Darshan Murthy, was rushed to hospital soon after, but failed to respond to treatment and died early on Thursday. It is learnt that the murder is the result of an old rivalry. The fight occurred near Deepa Hospital, where the victim was attacked with a wooden plank by the accused, identified as Raghavendra, Madusudhan, Naresh and Thygaraj. Two have been arrested. Meanwhile, the condition of another person who was injured is critical.



RANJITH MURDER

Four held for issuing death threat to judge

Threat messages were circulated on social media soon after the judgment

ALAPPUZHA South police on Thursday arrested four persons for spreading hatred against Mavelikkara Additional District and Sessions Court -I Judge Sreedevi V G who awarded death penalty to SDPI-PFI activists in the murder of OBC Morcha leader Ranjith Sreenivas.

The arrested are Nazeer Mon, 47, of Kumbalathuveli, Mannancherry, Rafi B, 38, of Thiruvananthapuram, Navas Naina (SDPI member of Mannancherry panchayat), 47, of Alappuzha, and Shajahan, 36, of Alappuzha.

The police intensified vigil after the threat messages were widely circulated on social media platforms immediately after the pronouncement of the judgment on Tuesday. The security of the judge was beefed up after the threat.

District police chief Chaithra Theresa John said that the district police have intensified the search and conducted inquiries about 13 people and arrested four. "The arrested persons made posts on social media aimed at destroying communal harmony, creating political enmity, and calling for riots. Police registered five cases in connection with it. More arrests will be recorded in the coming days," Chaithra said.

Six police personnel, including a sub-inspector, were deployed to guard the official residence of the judge on Wednesday. The Mavelikkara Additional District and Sessions Court on Tuesday awarded death sentence to all 15 accused in the murder case. The court gave capital punishment after observing that the murder fell under the category of the rarest of rare cases. Meanwhile, the trial in the case related to the murder of SDPI leader K S Shan, 12 hours before the murder of Ranjith, has not yet started and this has created resent-

ment among SDPI- PFI

activists. The trigger for the murder of Ranjith was the murder of Shan. However, the prosecution proved in the court that the trigger for the murder of Ranjith was not Shan's murder because the list of persons to be killed was found on the mobile phone of the third accused in the Ranjith murder case. So the court concluded that Ranjith's murder was pre-planned. The execution of the crime in front of the victim's mother, wife, and daughter was also considered by the court while awarding capital punishment. The police are expected to file a second chargesheet in the Ranjith murder case, including those who helped destrov evidence.

MEKEDATU PROJECT MAY BE REVERTED TO CWC

A MAJORITY of the members of the Cauvery Water Management Authority (CWMA) on Thursday opined that the authority is not competent for the technical examination of the Mekedatu Balancing Reservoir Project report. Since the Central Water Commission (CWC) is the competent authority, the proposal of the Mekedatu project may be reverted to it for further appraisal.

According to a note issued by

the Deputy Chief Minister's Office, at the CWMA meeting, Karnataka urged the authority to take up discussions and decisions on the Mekedatu project, without deferring the agenda. Tamil Nadu and Puducherry, however, objected to the discussion on the project.

The Chairman CWMA and Member Jal Shakti Ministry, opined that the matter related to Mekedatu is pending before the Supreme Court, however, there is no restrainment from the SC for deliberation on the project in the CWMA meeting.

"An opinion of all the members are no restrictions or any im-CWMA was sought. A majority of the members (five) opined that the authority is not competent for technical examination of the project report and since the CWC is the competent authority, the proposal of the Mekedatu project may be reverted to it for further appraisal," the note stated.

Karnataka had urged the authority to decide on the permissibility of the Mekedatu project to solve the problem during distress years permanently. The state had submitted that there


pediments in the decision of the tribunal or the judgment of the Supreme Court on the construction of the Mekedatu project across River Cauvery in Karnataka. "Karnataka, duly emphasising the above facts, requested the authority to take an appropriate view/stand about the DPR of the Mekedatu project and forward its views to the CWC that the report does not infringe upon the provisions of the award/decision of the CWDT to enable Karnataka

to obtain requisite clearances,"

the note stated.

HELD CAPTIVE FOR 12 YRS BY HUBBY, WOMAN RESCUED

IN a shocking incident that has gripped a village in HD Kote taluk, a woman who spent 12 years of her life within the confines of her own home was finally freed from her harrowing captivity. The woman was forced into confinement after her husband, Sannalaiah, suspected her fidelity and decided to keep her locked up.



The appalling ordeal came to light on Wednesday, through the efforts of a few people who discovered the woman's plight and alerted local authorities. Responding to a distress call, police and officials rushed to the village to investigate and intervene.

According to villagers, the woman, Swathi (name no FIR has been filed yet. However, villagers demandchanged), had allegedly been kept in isolation, and was forbidden from stepping outside her own house for over a decade. "There have been several panchayat meetings in this regard, but the accused had not changed, and kept the vilsights on the case.







'Optimistic, not a pre-poll budget'

DEVARAJ B HIREHALLI @ Bengaluru FINANCE Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's interim budget evoked a mixed response from experts — a few termed it "optimistic" whole others said it lacked clarity on initiatives to boost the agriculture sector and ways to curtail expenditure. "The Finance Minister has presented an optimistic budget with the view that everything seems to be going perfect and will continue to be perfect, including that the government will retain power and present the next budget. So there have been no drastic changes," remarked RS Deshpande, director, Institute for Social and Economic Change (ISEC), Bengaluru. He said that since it is a voteon-account, the FM has hardly any elbow space, but is cautious about allocations, so that it is not criticised as a pre-election budget. "The emphasis is on three components — gender, farmer and poor — which was there since Nehru's first budget but little has been done in that direction. This time, there is quantification with regard to funds allocated for women. Whether it is placating them for elections, or a sincere effort, the focus is on these three components," Deshpande observed. With regard to the poor and farmers, allocations do not match the claims made, he said. "The budget speaks little Sitharaman had stated that about the aspirations of the people, and has not touched proposals on direct or indirect taxes," said BT Manohar, chairman, State Taxes and GST Committee, and member of the GST Consultative Committee, Government of Karnataka. "In an election year, that is some anticipation but people did not expect the IT slab to be reduced. They were worried that higher taxes would be imposed but the government has maintained status quo and kept citizens happy. Which means people not expecting concessions did not get them," said psephologist Dr Sandeep Shastri, adding there were no hard decisions on curtailing nondevelopment expenditure.

SWR gets ₹7,329 crore

THE South Western Railway (SWR) Zone has been allocated Rs 7,329 crore in the budget. The allocation for Karnataka (which includes SWR along with Bidar, Raichur and Kalaburagi) stands at Rs 7,524 crore.

Briefing the media through a video conference from New Delhi, , Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said, "The average annual outlay between 2009 and 2014 was Rs 835 crore per annum compared to the budget outlay of Rs 7,329 crore in 2024." The allocation in recent years is nine times that of the past. SWR received Rs 9,200 crore in 2023-2024 while it received Rs 6,900 crore during 2022-2023.

A huge thrust has been laid on infrastructure with Rs 2,286 crore for new lines and Rs 1,531 $\,$ crore for track doubling. Passenger amenities have been earmarked Rs 987 crore.

An official release from South Western Railway said, "All major stations are being redeveloped. The redevelopment work has commenced at Bengaluru Cantonment and Yesvantpur stations already."

Under the Amrit Bharat Stations Scheme, 48 stations in SWR have been taken up for redevelopment.

To ensure safety, Rs 341 crore have been earmarked for Road Over Bridge and Road Under Bridge works. For faster execution of projects, all future works will be 100 per cent funded either by the Railway or state government. EXPRESSING strong reservation about the Union government's focus on the northern states, he said it will be enough if the Centre gave Karnataka its share of money. "Our demand is that we must get our share of GST and Customs from our state and direct taxes. We have been witnessing a lot of injustice to South India...our share of money is being distributed in North India.'

He was responding to a question on the budget promise of interest-free loans of Rs 75,000 crore to states. "The Centre is collecting taxes to the tune of more than Rs 4 lakh crore from

Karnataka but how much we are getting in return? We must question this. Since the 16th Finance Commission is going to start, if these (anomalies) are not rectified then the southern states will have to raise their voice."

BJP leaders were quick to launch a scathing attack, saying MP Suresh is asking for a "separate southern nation" and linked it to Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra. "This MP has spoken about division of the country, it is Bharat Todo, not Bharat Jodo," they said. Congress leaders, including DCM DK Shivakumar, rushed to their lone MP's defence, saying he has spoken about peo-

ple's concerns. Shivakumar

said, "I am a citizen of united India. Suresh has only mirrored the disappointment of the people about not a getting a fair share of revenue. We are all children of Mother India and we have to stay together. South India also needs the same priority and importance that is accorded to Hindi states."

Attacking the BJP, he said, "Karnataka elected 25 BJP MPs, what have all the MPs done for Karnataka? Will our BJP MPs protest in front of Parliament House at least now?" Congress leaders said imbalance in central allocations to the South needs to be addressed, without raising the issue of dividing India.

TO simplify the marriage registration process, the state cabinet on Thursday gave its approval to amend the Hindu Marriage Registration Act that will pave the way for online registrations.

According to Law Minister HK Patil, marriage registration at present can be done only at the sub-registrar offices. "To make it people friendly, there was proposal to allow marriage registrations through the Kaveri 2.0 portal and at GramOne and Bapuji Service Centres in ru-

ral areas," he said. The cabinet also gave the go-ahead to the 2 per cent quota for sportspersons in government jobs as well as to get the CM's approval for the governor's draft speech prepared by the cabinet committee.





FINANCE MINISTER FRAMES GROWTH STORY, SOUNDS POLL BUGLE

HE interim budget has turned out to be a three-way play—a bugle to amplify the achievements of the government; a broad statement of growth policies it expects to pursue; and a tightening of purse strings to cut the fiscal deficit from 5.8 percent to 5.1 percent. The sharp prudence surprised many as Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman firmly declared that she intended to meet the deficit target of 4.5% in another two years. Her tight, under-an-hour budget speech dwelt expansively on past performance—tackling poverty with schemes ranging from the direct transfer of ₹34 lakh crore to the wallets of 80 crore Indians, to providing loans to 78 lakh street vendors.

The interim budget was also cleverly used to signal that the coming Lok Sabha polls are but a formality; and that the incumbent government intends to continue its aggressive capital expenditure policies helmed by infrastructure projects. The capex target for the next fiscal has been raised by 11.1 percent to ₹11.11 lakh crore. But the big revelation was that a whopping ₹50,000 crore of last year's capex went unspent mainly because of states not meeting their targets. Or, is that a euphemism to say the opposition states were denied their dues? Meanwhile, the finance minister indicated that housing is going to be a future mainstay, with 2 crore rural housing units in the pipeline, while slums, chawls and unauthorised colonies can expect to be recognised and upgraded.

There were parts which resembled an election speech, like the underlining that the four 'castes' the government was budgeting for: the poor, women, youth and *annadata* or farmers. However, it must be conceded there were real sops too, not expected from an interim budget: a national vaccination programme for cervical cancer and medical cover for all ASHA and Anganwadi workers. The government said the tax regime will remain unchanged but threw in the sweetener that it intends to waive the backlog of small-but-irritating income tax demands up to ₹25,000 hanging since 1962. What seems to be a big miss is the failure to recognise and provision for growing rural distress. Rural India has faced a steady decline in income, and it is seriously impacting consumer goods sales. In this scenario, the expected push to enlarge employment and wages has disappointingly gone abegging.

LL economics is essentially articulation of contextual postures in politics. India's budgets have validated this truism year after year. In 1991, Manmohan Singh borrowed words from Victor Hugo and declared that no power can stop an idea whose time has come, as the Indian economy was opened up. In 2009, in the wake of the global financial crisis, Pranab Mukherjee paid tribute to the nationalisation of banks in 1969 and celebrated government expenditure crossing the ₹10-trillion mark. The Modi Government, in its two terms—particularly in the aftermath of the pandemic and geopolitical tensions which wrecked business and economic models of nations-renewed the construct of economic resilience to present the idea of Atmanirbhar Bharat.

On Thursday, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman opened her speech with the declaration, "The Indian economy has witnessed profound positive transformation in the last 10 years." In the run-up to the 2024 elections, the Finance Minister presented to Indians—in a speech spread over 5,200 words, laced with Modi's quotes, embellished with data and punctuated by slogans—an illustrated account of the approach and accomplishments of the government. The 2024 budget pitch revolves around a new acronym GYAN—gareeb, yuva, annadata and nari-which addresses the bottom of the economic pyramid, the catchment zone of electoral politics inhabited by nearly a billion voters.

It is, verily, the preface of the election campaign. The foundation for the ambition of a third term is built on a huge investment in physical and digital infrastructure. The Modi government has, in the past nine years, taken overall public sector capital investment from ₹5.6 lakh crore when it assumed power and trebled it to over ₹18.6 lakh crore. It is building roads at the rate of 28 km per day and laying railway lines at around 15 km per day. India had built 74 airports in the first 67 years of independence: the number was doubled over the last decade to 149. In its effort to expand financial inclusion, the government leveraged Aadhaar to open 51.6 crore Jan Dhan accounts. This has enabled delivery of welfare payments of ₹34 lakh crore in all through direct transfer of benefits. Budget 2024 is also the prologue to the construct of Viksit Bharat-the aspirational idea of a developed economy. The sterling surprise of the essay is the promise to bring down fiscal deficit by 0.7 percentage points to 5.1 percent of the GDP in the comThe budget aims to improve macro fundamentals and attract more investment. 

ing year. It has also brought down gross and net borrowings—both in ratio to the GDP laws and comes embedded with the predictability sought by investors. In the past decput is measured as the sum of consumption plus private investment plus government expenditure and net exports. The government is faced with a conundrum. While spending on infrastructure has gone up and fuelled growth, the push is not visible in private sector investment. Worse, the growth is not broad enough to propel private final consumption.

Companies engaged in production of entry-level consumer goods, durables and automobiles have been candid about the lack of offtake in rural areas; they interpret this as a problem of income at the bottom of the pyramid. Consumer goods companies are worried about sluggish demand even in the festival season this year. Automobile giant Maruti Suzuki flagged a decline in the offtake of entry-level models, Bajaj Finance shares tumbled this week as the company flagged issues with businessto-consumer and rural segments. Indeed, business chamber members have been advocating measures to prop rural demand, ranging from more allocation for MGN-REGA to higher compensation for farmers to free spending power.

The reduction of fiscal deficit and lowering of borrowings opens up room for the Reserve Bank of India to bring down the cost of capital—the hope being this will rekindle the Keynesian animal spirits to nudge private sector investments and enable consumption as interest rates and inflation taper. The move is a measured attempt to invite a re-assessment of India's macro fundamentals among its emergingeconomy peers. One of the factors influencing foreign portfolio and direct investment is the cost of capital, which is influenced by the level of debt in relation to the GDP, fiscal deficit and government borrowings. For instance, Vietnam and Mexico, both beneficiaries of friend-shoring and near-shoring of manufacturing, have a lower fiscal deficit to GDP ratio.

There is no quarrelling with the smart approach. However, much more needs to be done. For instance, bringing down government debt by monetising the value of its assets and investments in public sector enterprises. To lure investment, India will also have to unclog the regulatory cholesterol, push state governments to adopt friendlier labour codes and land acquisition laws, and enable plug-and-play opportunities for investors. Much also depends on the geopolitics, which influences geoeconomics. It is said that fortune is at the intersection of opportunity and preparation. This, in a sense, is only the beginning. OPPN HOPES FLOATED AND SHOT IN PATNA

HE exit of Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar from the INDIA bloc has exposed the deep divide between regional parties and the Congress. Nitish was the main architect of the opposition alliance. He travelled across the country to persuade regional parties to join hands and put up a one-on-one fight against the ruling NDA. He convinced AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal and TMC president Mamata Bannerjee to drop the idea of forming a third front with Bharat Rashtra Samithi chief K Chandrasekhar Rao. Nitish also tried, though unsuccessfully, to bring K Chandrasekhar Rao and BJD chief Naveen Patnaik into team INDIA. The credit for the successful first meeting of the opposition parties at Patna last year goes entirely to the Bihar chief minister. He got the opposition bandwagon rolling by getting the disparate parties to agree to work together. So it was not unreasonable for him to expect to be officially named its leader. But instead of rewarding him for his efforts, the opposition parties gave Nitish a cold shoulder. He was kept waiting for months and ultimately Mallikarjun Kharge was named the chairman. The opposition parties had nothing to offer Nitish except giving him a chance to play a role in national politics. Once that chance was denied, he flipped.

With Nitish's exit, the differences among the opposition parties have resurfaced. Akhilesh, Mamata and Kejriwal are playing hardball with the Congress. The three parties—having presence in nearly 150 Lok Sabha seats across the six states of Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Delhi, Punjab, Goa and Gujarat have refused to accommodate the Congress party's demand for seats. While Kejriwal has said no to an alliance with the Congress in Punjab, Mamata and Akhilesh have offered what the Congress leaders have termed as unacceptable crumbs. The seat-sharing talks in West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh are on the verge of a collapse with INDIA partners in these states threatening to go it alone. This is where a universally-acceptable Nitish could have played a role as a deal maker.

The hope that the opposition parties may be able to mount

WATCH WHAT THEY DO, NOT WHAT THEY SAY


XACTLY on this day last year, I had predicted in this newspaper: "The Finance Minister has cut the MGNREGA budget artificially and will be forced to spend much more." Nirmala Sitharaman had budgeted ₹60,000 crore

for the jobs scheme last year. It turns out that the government spent ₹86,000 crore, 44 percent more than what was budgeted. MGNREGA is a demand-based right-towork programme and, given the larger jobless economic growth environment, it was evident that the demand would far exceed what the finance minister had hoped for.

What is worse—recall that in 2014, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had mocked MGNREGA in the Lok Sabha as a monument to the UPA government's failure. His government has been forced to spend nearly triple the amount for the scheme. It was MGNREGA that saved this nation from potential civic unrest during the Covid lockdown. Modi's troubling tryst with MGN-REGA epitomises the larger budget exercise and its handling of the economy over the last decade. Watch what the Modi government does, not what it says.

The government says that India's economy is among the world's fastest growing. The Reserve Bank of India's latest consumer confidence survey shows that 70 percent of Indian families—those earning less than ₹50,000 a month—feel the economy has worsened for them, while it is only the top 30 percent that say the economy has improved.

The government says that India's economy is the lone shining star in the world. Foreign investment into India has remained stagnant for a decade.



The government says that welfare schemes for the poor have increased enormously in its tenure. Welfare expenditure has actually come down to 16 percent of total expenditure from 20 percent in 2014.

The government says it is highly nationalistic and puts 'nation first'. In its tenure, the Modi government has sacrificed territory to the Chinese and reduced defence expenditure from 17 percent of total expenditure in 2014 to 13 percent.



This government has repeatedly talked down MGNREGA. But the budget numbers show it actually increased allocations for the job scheme. We need to rely on the government's deeds rather than es, personal income taxes and indirect taxes such as GST that everyone from the poor to the rich pay at the same rate. In its 10 years, the Manmohan Singh government nearly quadrupled its tax collections. The bulk of this increase in taxes came from rich corporates. The Modi government tripled tax collections in its 10-year tenure, but a bulk of its increase came from regressive indirect taxes that the poor share a greater burden of, while corporates' share came down. This, in essence, is the taxation philosophy of the Modi government. For all the hullaballoo over tax reforms, GST, globally competitive corporate tax rates and so on, the reality is that the direction of taxation in the Modi government's tenure turned regressive to greater indirect taxes and corporates merely pocketed the reduced taxes without increasing investment.

Alternatively, the Modi government has spent its monies largely on public investment in infrastructure such as roads, airports, ports, power and so on, while cutting back on defence, despite its high-decibel jingoistic nationalism. To be clear, capital expenditure is a good investment for the future as a public good that can benefit society at large. But the problem is that most of this capital expenditure is being undertaken by the government using public money, rather than from the private sector. The government's capital expenditure has gone up five times in the last decade, while private investment has remained flat. A foolish demonetisation exercise, followed by a haphazard and hasty transition to GST and the pandemic shock have rendered private sector investment sluggish in the last decade. To make up for this slack, the government has been forced to increase its expenditure for which it collected money largely through regressive taxation of the poor. This, in a nutshell, is the Modi government's budget track record over the last 10 years. In her budget speech, when Sitharaman gloated about the number of chess grandmasters having increased to 84, insinuating that somehow Modi and his government deserves credit for it, it symbolised everything about the government's economic management philosophy—give me credit for the rains, but don't blame me for the (Views are personal) drought.

CHECK BEFORE YOU CUT

SRAEL alleges and the West disposes. This view—admittedly lacking in nuance—is gaining ground in the Global South. Several unproven allegations of primeval violence by Hamas have been repeated by Western leaders; on almost all such occasions, they have eaten their words later. The latest allegation has life-or-death ramifications for millions. Soon after Israel alleged that some of the October 7 attackers were UN Relief and Works Agency workers, the US and eight other Western countries cut more than half the aid agency's funding. The dichotomy list of what the government says versus what it does is long. Just as everything else in the country—from movies to sports to universities—the budget exercise is also heavily politicised. One can rightfully argue that every budget of any government is first and foremost a political act. But what sets this one apart is the complete dissonance between the narrative and the budget speech to what actually transpires in the numbers and on the ground. Former US President Barack Obama would have called the last 10 budgets 'lipstick on pigs'.

Fundamentally, any government's budget is about where it gets money from and what it spends it on. In India, the federal government gets its money from three predominant sources of taxes—corporate tax-

IN the Interim Budget announcement, school education received a notable increase of over ₹500 crore, while higher education grants saw a decline. Funding for higher education decreased from ₹57,244.48 crore (Revised Estimates) to ₹47,619.77 crore.

A surprising development was the significant cut in funding for the University Grants Commission (UGC), responsible for maintaining teaching, examination, and research standards in university education. UGC funding witnessed a staggering 60% reduction, dropping from last year's Revised Estimate (RE) of ₹6,409 crore to ₹2,500 crore. Budgets for Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) and Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs) also declined. IITs experienced a second consecutive year of budget cuts, decreasing from ₹10,384.21 crore to ₹10,324.50 crore. Similarly, IIMs saw their allocation reduced from ₹212.21 crore (RE) to ₹331 crore, following a decrease from ₹608.23 crore (RE) to ₹300 crore last year. In contrast, grants for India's 56 Central Universities increased substantially to ₹15,472 crore from the RE of ₹12,000.08 crore, marking a 28% hike. For school education, the 2024-25 budget allocation stands at ₹73,498 crore, up from ₹72,473.80 crore. This marks the highest-ever allocation for the Department of School Education and Literacy under the Education Ministry, aligning with plans to introduce new textbooks following the National Education Policy 2020. In line with the focus on school education, the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS) received their highest-ever budget allocations. KVS received ₹9,302 crore, compared to the previous ₹8,500 crore, while NVS received ₹5,800 crore, up from ₹5,470 crore. PM Schools for Rising India (PM SHRI) received a significant share, with ₹6,050 crore allocated for the 2024-25 fiscal year. Finance Minister Sitharaman highlighted the establishment of new higher learning institutions, including seven IITs, 16 IIITs, seven IIMs, 15 AIIMS, and 390 universities since 2024. Additionally, 3,000 new ITIs were established.

GOVT ANNOUNCES ₹11,925 CRORE FOR LPG SUBSIDY

The government has announced ₹11,925.01 crore for the LPG subsidy in the Interim Budget 2024. It will pay ₹1,500 crore to oil marketing companies (OMCs) for direct benefit transfer under the PAHAL Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) scheme. The government has allocated ₹1,200 crore for subsidizing the sale of natural gas under the administered price mechanism (APM) in Northeastern states for FY25.

GOVT TO PROVIDE CAPITAL SUPPORT OF ₹15,000 CR TO OMCS

The government will provide capital support of ₹15,000 crore to the oil marketing companies, which is almost half of the previous budget's allocation. No budget has been allocated for refill of Indian Strategic Petroleum Reserve Limited (ISPRL) or an emergency fuel store. Currently, India stores 5.33 MMT or 36.92 million barrels of strategic crude oil, enough to provide 9.5 days of consumption.

CGST AMENDMENT: ISD PROVISIONS MADE MANDATORY

The Finance Bill 2024 has proposed amendments in the Central Goods and Services Tax Act, 2017 whereby the mechanism of Input Service Distributor (ISD) has been made mandatory. Now, any office of the taxpayer, which receives tax invoices for and on behalf of his other offices would have to mandatorily obtain registration as an ISD and distribute the ITC in the manner to be prescribed.

TO create employment opportunities and boost economic growth, finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman in her interim budget speech on Thursday proposed to raise capital expenditure (capex)— for the fourth straight year—by 11.1% to ₹11.1 lakh crore.

"Building on the massive tripling of the capital expenditure outlay in the past 4 years resulting in huge multiplier impact on economic growth and employment creation, the outlay for the next year is being increased by 11.1% to ₹11.1 lakh crore. This would be 3.4% of the GDP," said Sitharaman while presenting her sixth budget.

Despite an 11.1% increase, the annual growth in capex allocation for the upcoming fiscal is the slowest in the past few years. India's capex for FY24 was kept at ₹10 lakh crore, a sharp jump from ₹7.3 lakh crore in FY23. Between FY21 and FY22, the capex grew from 4.1 lakh crore to ₹5.9 lakh crore.

"There are a large number of petty, non-verified, non-reconciled or disputed direct tax demands, many of them dating as far back as the year 1962, which continue to remain on the books, causing anxiety to honest tax payers and hindering refunds of subsequent years," she said. Sandeep Jhunjhunwala, Partner at Nangia Andersen LLP, a business advisory firm said, "This move should reduce burden on taxpayers, fostering a more conducive environment for compliance and economic growth."

speech. The fiscal deficit target has been reduced based on the assumption that there will be a surge in tax collection.

The minister said that the current fiscal budget estimate of deficit is expected to 5.9%. Sitharaman end at 5.8%, surpassing the budget estimate of 5.9%. PLI scheme: ₹6,200 crore allocation for electronics

THE government on Thursday allocated ₹6,200 crore for the production-linked scheme (PLI) to promote electronics manufacturing in the country.

According to the budget document of FY2024-25, the finance ministry provisioned ₹6,125 crore for large electronics and ₹75 crore for IT hardware. In the last budget, 2023–24, the government allocated ₹4,559.88 crore. The PLI for electronic manufacturing is being funded more because, among the 14 PLI schemes, it is thought to be the most successful.

Electronics production in the country has grown about 400% from ₹1,90,000 crore in 2014 to ₹8,22,000 crore, and mobile phone production has grown from ₹18,900 crore to 3,50,000 crore in FY22-23, thanks to the PLI scheme.

Electronics has climbed to India's 5th largest exporting commodity, with mobile phones contributing 50% of this export.

FAME SUBSIDY FUND

In a setback for the country's fast growing electric vehicle (EV) market, the government slashed the allocation for the FAME subsidy scheme by about 45% for the financial year 2024-2025. The allocation for the faster adoption and manufacturing of (hybrid and) electric vehicles (FAME) scheme has been kept at Rs 2,671.33 crore for the next fiscal as against Rs 4,807.4 crore allocated (revised) for the same scheme in FY24.

FDI INFLOWS 2014-23 AT \$596 BILLION

cated ₹6,903 crore in the interim budget 2023–24 to develop the semiconductor and display manufacturing ecosystem in India.

This follows the announcement of ₹76,000 crore in incentives in December 2021 to encourage companies to establish a semiconductor ecosystem in the country.

Experts have welcomed the move, with Satya Gupta, President of the VLSI Society of India, expressing satisfaction with the allocation. However, he suggests that given the global interest in setting up semiconductor manufacturing in India, the allocation should have been nearly ₹10,000 crore.

"I'm very happy to see 6,000 crore allocated in the current budget for semiconductor and display manufacturing in India. Although I feel that with the number of proposals and the global interest in setting up semiconductor manufacturing in India, we will probably need about ₹10,000 crore of allocation for 2024–25. But I'm very happy that this allocation has been increased from ₹3,000 to ₹4,000 crore," said Gupta.

The allocation includes ₹1,500 crore for the Modified Scheme for Setting up of Semiconductor Fabs in India and ₹4,203 crore for the Modified Scheme for setting up compound semiconductors/ silicon photonics/sensors fab/discrete semiconductors fab and semiconductor assembly, testing, marking, and packaging (ATMP)/outsourced semiconductor assembly and test facilities in the country.

Additionally, ₹100 crore has been allocated for setting up display factories in India, ₹200 crore for the modernisation of the semiconductor laboratory in Mohali, and ₹200 crore for the designlinked incentive scheme.





ity of 1 GW of offshore wind power. Sitharaman said a VGF will be provided for harnessing offshore wind energy potential for an initial capacity of one gigawatt. The government aims to install 500 GW of installed capacity by 2030. As part of this, the government aims to establish 10 GW of offshore wind capacity by 2030.

Currently. India's onshore wind energy capacity stands at 44 GW.

To meet its net zero target, the minister announced phased mandatory blending of compressed biogas (CBG) with compressed natural gas (CNG) for transport and piped natural gas (PNG) for domestic purposes will be mandated.

THE interim Budget for the conservation of the environment is short of funds and absence of new initiatives. Funds for the improvement of air quality as well as the conservation of large animals like tigers and elephants have been reduced. Meanwhile, the Budget's major thrust is on the commitment to achieve climate goals to reduce emissions by promoting solar power on a large scale.

The Budget estimate for the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) is allocated ₹3,265.53 crore which is a marginal increment (1.05%) to the revised estimate. However, it is around 5% increase from last year's Budget estimate. There is a slight increase in allocations for statutory bodies such as the Central pollution control boards and the Central Zoo Authority. The funds for the flagship project of conservation of tigers and elephant witnessed a decline. The current budgetary estimate for Project Tiger and Elephant is ₹290 crore which is ₹41 crore less than the previous year's allocation. This year's Budget allocated a similar amount to the Sovereign Green Fund (₹170 crore) and National Afforestation Programme (₹170 crore) like last year. However, the revised estimate saw a significant reduction of ₹120 crore each. Among Centrally sponsored schemes, there was a decrease in the revised estimates for the 'Biodiversity Conservation' & 'Conservation of Aquatic Ecosystems' programmes compared to the original allocations, indicating limited government expenditure. Budgets for the National Biodiversity Authority & the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) have been cut, likely due to lower government expenditure as indicated by the revised estimate for 2023-24. The revised estimate shows only ₹13.1 cr for the CAQM out of the allotted ₹17 cr in last year's Budget. Funding for autonomous institutions (excluding IIFM) has increased significantly, particularly for institutions like the GB Pant Himalayan Institute and The Indian Council of Forestry Research.

FINANCE Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, while presenting the Interim Budget 2024-25, said on Thursday that efforts of value addition in the agri sector and increasing farmers' income will be stepped up, adding, 11.8 crore farmers including marginal and small farmers - have been provided financial assistance under PM Kisan Yojana.

The Interim Budget 2024-25 allocated ₹1,17,528.79 crore for the Ministry of Agriculture that makes for about 2% of the Union Budget -- slightly lower than the revised estimate for the year at ₹1,16,788 crore. The budget estimate for FY24 for the sector was ₹1.25.036 crore. She said that Pradhan Mantri Kisan Sampada Yojana has benefited 38 lakh farmers and generated 10 lakh jobs. Adding more, she said that PM Formalisation of Micro Food Processing Enterprises Yojana has assisted 2.4 lakh SHGs and 60,000 individuals with credit linkages. She added that the Minimum Support Prices for 'Annadata' (farmers) increased periodically. She said the poor, women, youth, and farmers' needs are the government's

(IIP) data for April-November revealed the output of consumer durables decelerated to 0.6%. against 5.3% in the same period last year. Last year the Union government spent less on agriculture than what it was allocated. The Central government spent over ₹4,000 crore less than what was allocated in its budgetary estimate.

Lakshadweep drew disparaging remarks against Modi from three Maldivian ministers.





THE SUPREME Court will on Friday hear former Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren's petition challenging his arrest by the ED in an alleged land scam case. Soren's senior lawyers — Kapil Sibal and Dr Abhishek Manu Singhvi — mentioned the matter before an apex court's bench, headed by the CJI DY Chandrachud, who agreed to hear the matter on Friday. "We will list this case tomorrow," the CJI said Both the lawyer due sought

CJI said. Both the lawyer duo sought urgent hearing from the apex court.

"Declare the arrest and consequent detention of the Petitioner as unwarranted, arbitrary, illegal and violative of the fundamental right of the Petitioner guaranteed and protected under Article 21 of the Constitution of India and direct the Respondent to forthwith set the Petitioner free," the petition read.

Soren, who was arrested on Wednesday night in the money laundering case, has moved the top court challenging his arrest by the central agency. "This affects the polity of the country. Can a man be arrested like this?"

Sibal replied and told the SC that they will be withdrawing their petition from the Jharkhand HC. JMM leader Soren was arrested after over seven hours of questioning on money laundering charges in an alleged land fraud case, official sources said.

Just before his arrest, he stepped down as the chief minister to Governor CP Radhakrishnan at the Raj Bhavan and was then taken to the ED office here. According to the sources, as the 48-yearold Soren was "evasive" in his replies during his q uestioning, hence was taken into custody under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

During the second round of questioning in the case, the agency put across 15 questions to Soren. The JMM leader was shown the typed statements he recorded with the agency and his signatures were sought on documents.

Task cut out: 7 junior ministers told to reply to queries of 13 depts in MP

MINISTERS of state responding to queries of MLAs and MPs pertaining to their departments in the absence of senior cabinet ministers in union or state legislatures is nothing new. In BJP-ruled Madhya Pradesh, however, the chief minister Dr Mohan Yadav, has tasked junior ministers of departments not held by him and ministers of state (independent charge) to respond to MLAs queries pertaining to the departments headed by him.

In a move being seen as one aimed to further empower the ministers of state and ministers of state (independent charge), the CM has written to the Assembly Speaker Narendra Singh Tomar, authorizing seven first time ministers (ministers of departments not headed by him) to take care of affairs related to the 13 departments headed by him during the Vidhan Sabha's budget session starting on February 7.

partments among others. Informing about it to the Speaker in advance seems a clear cut move by the CM to empower and motivate the junior ministers.

AAP councillor Kuldeep Kumar who had reasoned "malpractice" in the Chandigarh mayoral elections for his defeat by the BJP nominee, on Thursday knocked the doors of the Supreme Court for an immediate stay on the poll result and announcement of fresh elections. It came a day after the Punjab and Harvana High Court refused to grant the interim stay but sought a reply over the AAP's plea from the Chandigarh administration, the presiding office, the BJP candidate, the UT's civic body and others within three weeks and fixed February 26 as the next date of hearing. The BJP candidate Manoj Sonkar was announced as the winner of the mayor post after securing 16 votes in the 35-member municipal corporation House while Kuldeep Kumar, the joint candidate of Congress-AAP received 12 votes. Eight votes were declared "invalid" by Anil Masih, the presiding of-

Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Thursday performed the "bhoomi pujan" for a beautification project of the architectural heritage. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had laid the foundation stone for the project in April last year.

Built during the reign of Ahom ruler Swargadeo Rudra Singha in 1744, Rang Ghar is Asia's oldest surviving amphitheatre and a symbol of Assam's cultural heritage. It stands tall near Sivasagar town in upper Assam.

It is a two-storey building, constructed specially for enjoyment of recreational/sports activities by the royal families of the Ahom dynasty.

After performing the rituals, Sarma said he had sought the blessings of ancestors as the government began the beautification works to preserve this living monument for another 1,000 years. He said Rang Ghar lies in the heart of Assam's culture and civilization. an Stating that the 600-year-old ne Ahom rule was a glorious era in Assam's history, he said the m state's architecture took a new pu form after Swargadeo Rudra io Singha had established the capital at Rangpur.

"The Doul Pukhuri dug under the stewardship of Swargadeo Rudra Singha added a new dimension to the glory of Rangpur. By constructing Rang Ghar, Swargadeo Rudra Singha added a new chapter not only to architecture but also the art, th culture and sports of Assam

culture and sports of Assam. for 3,00 Therefore, giving a new look to ameniti

architectural beauty was the need of the hour," Sarma said. He added that the government took suggestions from public representatives and senior citizens in beautifying the architecture.

He said the project entailed a financial outlay of ₹140 crore and it would be completed and dedicated to the people before 2026.

The beautification plan includes building an encroachment-free perimeter, an amphitheatre with seating capacity for 3,000 people and other amenities. the Silkyara tunnel in Uttarakhand's Uttarkashi district, which suffered partial collapse due to a landslide on Diwali last year and trapped several workers for more than two weeks, has resumed under "strict restrictions".

The 4.5 km-long-tunnel was being built to facilitate traffic on the Chardham yatra route.

Speaking to this newspaper, project manager Colonel Deepak Patil said the work has resumed gradually following the necessary permissions and will accelerate in the next 15 days.

"In sensitive areas, pipes are being installed as escape tunnels," Colonel Patil said.

According to the sources, workers will access the sensitive area through an exit tunnel specifically made for safe evacuation. The shuttering of the central wall (separation wall) is underway from the tunnel entrance towards Silkyara, sources added. BJP's Manoj Sonkar after he won Chandigarh mayoral polls| **рт**і

The 71-year-old former-cricketer-turned-politician on Wednesday filed a petition, urging the SC to declare him eligible to contest the elections. Later in the day, the apex court offices returned Khan's plea with a direction to remove the

THE US has approved a sale of 31 MQ-9B remotely piloted aircraft (drone) and related equipment to India at a cost of \$3.99 billion. The US Defense Security Cooperation Agency has delivered the required certification notifying the Congress of this sale on Thursday.

"This proposed sale will support the foreign policy and national security objectives of the United States by helping to strengthen the US-India strategic relationship and to improve the security of a major defense partner, which continues to be an important force for political stability,

peace, and economic progress in the Indo-Pacific and South Asia region," the US State Department said on Thursday. The implementation of this

sale will not require the assignment of any additional US Government or contractor representatives to India.

The sale will improve India's capability to meet current and future threats by enabling unmanned surveillance and reconnaissance patrols in sea lanes of operation. India has demonstrated a commitment to modernise its military and will have no difficulty absorbing these articles and services into its armed forces.





F you are a ChatGPT user, this is not good news for you. According to a news report, OpenAI's artificial intelligencepowered chatbot collected data from users, which was then used to train the algorithm. An inquiry by Italy's Data Protection Authority (DPA) found data privacy violations pertaining to collecting personal data and age protections.

The regulatory body, in a statement, said the available evidence pointed to the existence of breaches of the provisions contained in the EU GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation). These are related to the mass collection of users' data, which is then used to train the algorithm. The DPA is also concerned that younger users may be exposed to inappropriate content generated by the chatbot.

DPA launched a "fact-finding activity" at the time, which has now found data privacy violations. OpenAI has 30 days to respond with its defence. An OpenAI spokesperson said it would continue talks with the regulator.

In March 2023, Italy blocked the product citing privacy concerns, becoming the first Western country to do so. However, it was reinstated four weeks later. after stating it had successfully addressed or clarified the issues raised by the DPA.

HEN worries over artificial intelligence (AI) tools taking over jobs peaked last year, the assumption was that it would first dis-

rupt the simple, repetitive tasks done by humans and then move to higher-level jobs that involve a high degree of creativity, dexterity, and complexity. However, one year down the line, the opposite seems to have played out globally with unlikely casualties – creative artists, musicians, and actors.

Oscar-winning composer A R Rahman recently used AI software to recreate the voices of late singers Tamil playback singers - Bamba Bakya and Shahul Hameed. marking a paradigm shift in the use of technology in music production in India. In his latest album 'Lal Salam', Rahman 'brought back' the voice of the two popular playback singers of vestervears. The experiment stirred heated discussions, ranging from awe to criticism to concern. In a chat with TNIE, Rahman dispelled the notion that AI will kill creativity. According to the legendary music composer, AI is just a tool and that it cannot replace human creativity. Explaining the rationale for recreating the voices of the late singers, Rahman said the album demanded the voices. "I thought why not bring them back since we have the technology now. Some people texted me saying it made them emotional. It made some listeners nostalgic," he said. The process involved the

AI model learning the singers' voice with a dry voice recording and mimicking the version sung by a source singer.

"It learns multiple songs. (Also), we had to find a singer better suited for the AI model to replicate," Rahman said.

The AI voice cloning was done by Pitch Innovation, a Chennaibased music software company which uses voice models from studio recordings.

Rahman stressed that they used the technology in a fair and ethical manner. "It is important to check with the family. Is the song and lyrics okay? Do they agree with the lyrics?" he said, adding that the families gave their consent. They were also given compensation.

Responding to a question about fears of job losses, he said: "There is no need to feel threatened by this technology." He added: "AI has been there for a long time. Even the auto-tune has AI. It is just a tool. Now everybody talks about AI. It doesn't do anything on its own. It doesn't alter the tune; it just changes the voice textures of the source singer and alters the timbre.' Rahman feels there is a lot of room for improvement as AI voice models are only about 60% correct. "We should do it when it is really right," he said, adding that generative AI is fantastic in producing visual art. On the creative aspects of AIbacked art, he said the human element in music production is important and that's what makes creativity amazing. "I don't think that will go away," he said. Referring to the times of Napster and LimeWire, he said it was a chaotic period that saw all the

GSTN has implemented GST Interactive Technical Assistant (GITA), functioning as a Chatbot for Query Handling. In FY2022-23 GITA has adeptly addressed 5.35 lakh queries, attaining an accuracy rate of 92%.

On the global front, the Internal Revenue Service has implemented chatbots to assist taxpayers in finding information, answering common questions, and guiding them through the tax filing process. Implementation of chatbots in tax administration is limited to information retrieval and compliance support. But in the next decade, the progress would be astronomical. India would be at the forefront to lead the tech driver change, where chatbot automation will extend to the initiation of SCN and the orchestration of hearings, facilitated by chatbot-driven mechanisms.

How does ChatGPT work?

The startup OpenAI created the chatbot ChatGPT. It has humanlike abilities to write poetry, plays, essays, and computer code. It even has the ability to communicate

and own up to errors. GPT stands for Generative Pre-Trained Transformer. This implies that it uses information gathered from the internet to determine what to say. It then makes use of this entire text to "generate" answers.



Legacy, longevity & Anderson

WHEN James Anderson walks out for his 184th Test on Friday. he will become one of the oldest to feature in the format in India in the 21st century. If the visitors bowl first, the age difference will be tangible straightaway. If and when he bowls to Yashasvi Jaiswal, he would be bowling to a batter who wasn't born when he made his domestic debut. At some point, Anderson will likely be replaced by debutant Shoaib Bashir.

When Bashir was born, the 41-vear-old had already played seven Tests. If Ben Stokes prefers to replace Anderson with Rehan Ahmed, it will be starker. When Ahmed was born on August 13, 2004, the Lancashire-born seamer was playing his 10th Test. The other frontline bowler in the visitors' attack — Tom Hartley — is 24 and has played one game. Any which way you look, the bowling attack they have named for the second match is incredible.

What it hides, though, is the trust the management has placed in the veteran to lead a bowling attack in what is likely to be hot and unfavourable conditions for seamers.

Anderson, of course, felt some of those conditions in Hyderabad when he was tasked with carrying the drinks at

It's small things like being 12th man when it's hot, lads need rehydrating and we need to concentrate the whole time with guys coming on and off the field. Two of those three wickets saw him hooping the ball to breach the defences of Shubman Gill and Ajinkya Rahane. On Thursday, Stokes hoped for more of the same on Friday and beyond. "Bringing Jimmy in, we just feel like there's a bit more I can turn to him for. Not only his new ball skills; reverse skills, his off-cutter skills and stuff like that."

What he also offers is control, both with the new and the old ball. In these conditions, a pacer's main role could just be to tie one end up. Stokes knows his super senior is more than capable of that. That may well be needed. The alliance of Rohit Sharma and Jaiswal may be in its infancy but it's already on the verge of blossoming. Sports Ministry gets ₹45 cr boost

'Online abuse risks turning stars away from sport'

THE Sports Ministry was on Thursday allocated ₹3,442.32 crore, a hike of ₹45.36 crore as compared to last year, in the interim Union Budget presented by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman. In the previous budget, the Sports Ministry had got a revised allocation of ₹3,396.96 crore. The Olympic Games in Paris will be the country's main focus during the 2024-25 financial year. The ministry's flagship programme, Khelo India, was allotted ₹900 crore, an increase of ₹20 crore from the previous budget.

GROWING online abuse on social media risks pushing highprofile stars out of sport unless urgent action is taken, according to a new survey backed by major federations published on Thursday. The federations also called for social media companies to do more to prevent or block attacks directed at athletes and officials.

Carried out in conjunction with 22 global sporting federations and NGOs including football's world body FIFA and motorsport body FIA, the United Against Online Abuse (UAOA) barometer examined the impact

online abuse and hate speech was having on those in sport. It found that 90 percent of organisations believe some of their leading athletes might leave their sports as a result of online abuse. Three quarters say stars are facing threats of harm against themselves or their families, while 66 percent believe social media platforms should do more to tackle the abuse.

dia companies in fighting the problem was "crucial to the long-term outcome of any campaign for change". "Online abuse is a persistent issue within the sporting world," said FIA president Mo-

hammed Ben Sulayem, who is a founding partner of UAOA.

The findings come following high-profile online abuse cases involving England women footballer Lauren James and recently-retired World Cup rugby referee Wayne Barnes. One of the main triggers for the FIA's launch of UAOA was the abuse suffered by

a female steward from Spain at the Mexican Grand Prix in 2022.

"The survey findings highlight the importance of united anti-abuse efforts across sporting ecosystems and beyond," said Ben Sulayem. "We already have the support of a number of sporting bodies and governments and are in discussions with other stakeholders to grow our support base."

The findings are based on responses from 22 international sporting federations and NGOs, including world football governing body FIFA, the International Tennis Federation (ITF) and cycling's governing body UCI.
