

EC uploads more data on bonds till Nov 2023

NEW DELHI: The Election Commission of India (ECI) on Sunday uploaded all electoral bond-related documents that it received from political parties in 2019 and November 2023 in sealed covers, which it had subsequently submitted to the Supreme Court.


The documents contain details of the number and value of electoral bonds that parties redeemed between March 1, 2018 and November 20, 2023. On March 14, 2024, the poll body had uploaded data it received from the State Bank of India (SBI) for the bonds bought and redeemed between April 12, 2019 and February 15,

The documents unsealed and uploaded on Sunday showed that political parties knew the identities of the people and entities that donated funds to them, belying previous claims that the electoral bond

BJP got lion's share before 2019 polls

NEW DELHI: Electoral bonds worth ₹16,492 crore were redeemed in the thirty phases of their sale between March 1, 2018 and January 11, 2024 and the

Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) redeemed 50% of them at ₹8,252 crore, according to data published by the Election Commission of India on March 14 and March 17.

The Congress accounted for 11.8% (₹1,952 crore) while the All India Trinamool Congress

(TMC) accounted for 10.4% (₹1,708 crore). The year the scheme was launched (FY18), only three parties got electoral bond donations: the BJP (95%), Congress (2.3%) and JD(S) (2.7%). The BJP thus received the biggest fillip ahead of the 2019 general elections.

AHMEDABAD: A group of people stormed the Gujarat University hostel in Ahmedabad late on Saturday and attacked international students who were offering namaz inside the premises, injuring five people during the melee, prompting the state police to begin a high-level probe on Sunday and arrest two men, even as the ministry of external affairs said it had taken note of the incident.

Two students - one from Sri Lanka and another from Tajikistan - were hospitalised after the attack, videos of which did the rounds on social media and drew widespread condemnation.

Police said they had arrested two people, Hitesh Mewada and Bharat Patel, both residents of Ahmedabad, for their role in the attack, adding that they were on the hunt for more suspects.

Officers said the incident took place around 10.30pm on Saturday, when around 25 people broke into A Block of the hostel, which houses around 75 of Gujarat University's 300 international students.



Others fast-track citizenships as well'



Amid criticism of the Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA) from the US and other parts of the globe, external affairs minister S Jaishankar has said that it is important to put the law in the context of the Partition and underlined that there are a "number of examples" of other countries fast-tracking citizenship. Speaking at the India Today Conclave on Saturday, Jaishankar said that he has a problem when people don't hold up a mirror to their own policies, as he cited Jackson-Vanik amendment, which was about Jews from Soviet Union, the Lautenberg Amendment, Specter Amendment and "fast-tracking of Hungarians after the Hungarian revolution, fasttracking of Cubans in 1960s". "So, if you were to ask me, have other countries, other democracies, fasttracked on the basis of ethnicity, faith, social attributes, I can give you any number of examples," the minister said.

MCD to miss deadline to clear 2 city landfills



The ongoing biomining project at two of Delhi's three landfills — Ghazipur and Bhalswa — are likely to miss the latest deadline of 2024 to clear the sites, Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) said on Sunday. Biomining is the process of separating various components of legacy waste by passing them through trommel machines. At present, MCD is in line

to clear only the Okhla landfill in December this year — a deadline set in March 2023 — as no fresh waste is being dumped at the spot. In a report submitted to the Delhi Pollution Control Committee on February 17, the civic body admitted that the three landfill sites still have 17.2 million tonnes of legacy waste, due to which the deadline to clear the Ghazipur landfill has been pushed back from 2024 to 2026, while the Bhalswa landfill will be cleared by 2025.

Case filed against me at the behest of BJP, says Baghel



Former Chhattisgarh CM and senior Congress leader Bhupesh Baghel on Sunday said the case filed against him in the Mahadev Online Book app scam was politically motivated and done at the behest of the BJP. HT reported on Sunday that the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the state police filed a case against Baghel under various sections pertaining to cheating, criminal conspiracy, breach of trust, and forgery under the Indian Penal Code (IPC), and Sections 7 and 11 of the Prevention of Corruption Act in connection with the alleged ₹6,000 crore scam. "The FIR against me was lodged on March 4 by EOW then why was it not published on the EOW website till now? My name was later added under pressure. This means the BJP fears losing Rajnandgaon and Chhattisgarh seats [in the Lok Sabha polls] because they know my candidature will have an impact across the state," Baghel, who is set to contest the Lok Sabha polls from Rajnandgaon, said. →P10 { BUSINESS } TUR, MASUR DAL

Centre to buy 2 pulses directly from farmers



The Centre plans to procure 400,000 tonnes of tur dal and 200,000 tonnes of masur dal directly from farmers at the minimum assured procurement price (MAPP) or at the dynamic buffer procurement price (DBPP), whichever is higher, to boost stocks, a senior official said. The MAPP is the weighted average price of previous three trading days in a district, while the DBPP is the weighted average price of the day of procurement, three previous days and three subsequent trading days. This comes in the backdrop of falling government buffer stocks amid firm market prices caused by lower production of some pulses, including tur. "As part of the plan, these two pulses will be procured by the Nafed and NCCF directly from pre-registered farmers," said the official cited above.

RSS names Hosabale as general secy again



Dattatreya Hosabale was on Sunday re-elected as the sarkaryavah (general secretary) of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) until 2027. Hosabale has held this position since 2021, when he succeeded Suresh 'Bhaiyyaji' Joshi. The decision was taken during the RSS's three-day Akhil Bharatiya Pratinidhi Sabha the highest decision-making body of the Sangh Parivar — in Nagpur. "The RSS Akhil Bharatiya Pratinidhi Sabha (ABPS) re-elected (2024-2027) Shri Dattatreya Hosabale ji for the post of Sarkaryavah. He has been discharging the responsibility of Sarkaryavah since 2021," the RSS said in a post on X. In the Sangh, the general secretary is the deputy to the sarsanghchalak (RSS chief), who is currently Mohan Bhagwat, but is largely seen as a key decision-making figure. At a press conference, Hosabale said: "Sangh is getting into the hearts of the people and the impact of the Sangh is also increasing in society," he said.

An expected win? Exit polls show victory for Putin

MOSCOW: Vladimir Putin is poised for a record victory in Russia's presidential election that will allow the Kremlin to claim he has overwhelming public support to pursue his war in Ukraine and confrontation with the West.

The Russian leader won Russia's presidential election with 87.97% of the vote, according to the first official results showed on Sunday after polls closed.

Putin received 77% of the vote in 2018 and the Kremlin has been determined to deliver a similarly high result this year to demonstrate that Russians are united behind him over the war. Three other candidates in the tightly controlled election all represent parties loyal to the Kremlin.

Turnout passed 69% by Sunday afternoon in Moscow, which didn't include more than 4.3 million people who voted online, state television reported, citing Russia's Central Election Commission. That exceeded the 67.5% turnout recorded in 2018.

Three days of voting concluded late on Sunday in Russia's westernmost Kaliningrad region, with results of exit polls published shortly after.

Signs of muted defiance

Long lines formed at noon outside some polling stations, including in Moscow and St Petersburg, after allies of opposition leader Alexei Navalny, who died last month in an Arctic prison camp, called on people to protest Putin's election by turning up at that time.

Their presence represented a muted sign of defiance amid the harshest Kremlin crackdown on dissent in decades. The head of the Kremlin's human rights council, Valery Fadeyev, said police should investigate people who spoiled ballot papers because they were "controlled from abroad," the state-run Tass news service reported.

Already Russia's longest-serving leader since Soviet dictator Josef Stalin, 71-year-old Putin is set to extend his nearly quartercentury rule by another six years

Russia is pressing its advantage in the third year of the invasion as Ukraine struggles to supply its forces with munitions amid delays in military aid from its US and European allies.

Wartime considerations

Russia's wartime economy has largely weathered the shock of unprecedented international sanctions, thanks to a continuing flow of energy revenues and a massive injection of government spending to support the defence industry and shield domestic businesses.

Trade with China is booming as Russia reorients its economy away from markets in Europe. "In the last two years, the Putin regime has rebuilt every element of itself to adapt to a permanent state of war," said Andrei Kolesnikov, a senior fellow at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace.

Ukraine has waged an intensified campaign of drone attacks aimed at key Russian infrastructure including oil refineries ahead of the election. Authorities said the refinery in Slavyansk-on-Kuban in the southern Krasnodar region was hit overnight, causing a fire that was later extinguished, after several plants were targeted on Saturday.

The Russian leader dismissed prospects for a halt to the war in a televised interview on Wednesday, saying he's not interested in a "pause" that would allow Ukraine to rearm.

Russia wants written security guarantees to end the fighting and the "realities on the ground" should be the basis for any negotiations, he said.


Russia occupies about a fifth of Ukraine including Crimea, which it annexed in 2014. Putin in 2022 declared four regions of eastern and southern Ukraine to be "forever" part of Russia, even as his forces don't fully control them.


Russia organised voting in the presidential election in occupied areas of Ukraine. The foreign ministry in Kyiv said the votes were illegal and called on Ukrainians in the territories not to take part in the "pseudo-elections."

The government said more than 4.5 million people registered to vote via a system that's being used for the presidential ballot in 29 of Russia's regions for the first time. Critics say the system may make it harder to identify fraud in the results.

FOURTH TIME IN THREE MONTHS

A volcano in Iceland erupted on Saturday evening for the fourth time in three months, sending orange jets of lava into the night sky. Iceland's Meteorological Office said the eruption opened a fissure in the Earth about 3 kilometers (almost 2 miles) long between Stóra-Skógfell and Hagafell mountains on the Reykjanes Peninsula. The volcano first erupted on December 18, last year, then on January 14 and February 8. Lava on Sunday continued to flow south towards the dykes built to protect the fishing village Grindavik, but the eruption's intensity had decreased, authorities said. Iceland is home to 33 active volcano systems, the highest number in Europe.

Access for EVs, relaxation of business mobility contentious issues in UK FTA


NEW DELHI: India is unlikely to allow unfettered access of electric vehicles (EVs) from the UK, one of the two key contentious issues resulting into a deadlock in the free trade negotiations even after 14 rounds of talks since January 2022, two people aware of the development said.

The other issue is related to India's demand for easy business visas, they said, requesting anonymity. The UK is averse to facilitate India's services trade by relaxing business mobility norms under the proposed pact, but it wants New Delhi to open up the vast Indian automobile market, particularly for EVs, they added.

"India has proposed some duty concessions in the automobile sector, provided London reciprocates on the Indian asks. But, it cannot open its EV market without giving due protection to domestic manufacturing as the sector is still at a nascent stage, and needs support," one of them said.

India may extend limited concessions on EVs in line with the new e-vehicle policy unveiled on Friday, provided British auto makers commit investments in India, the second person said.

On Friday, the government notified a policy to promote

India as an EV manufacturing destination by slashing duty on limited number of imports of such cars to 15% (from up to 100%), provided foreign automakers commit a minimum \$500 million (around Rs 4,150 crore) in three years and take up local value addition from 25% to 50% in five years.

India is the world's third largest automobile market worth \$151 billion (₹12.5 lakh crore) in 2023, according to official data. The sector is expected to cross \$300 billion (₹24.9 lakh crore) by 2030.

EVs are the future, the second person said. "It is unlikely that the FTA route would be provided to any country to completely bypass the policy obligations such as minimum investment requirement in setting up a manufacturing plant in India and local value addition," he added.

Although recent talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his UK counterpart Rishi Sunak have brightened prospects of resolving differences, it will take more time, the first person said. On March

12, Modi had a telephonic conversation with Sunak and "assessed positively the progress made towards early conclusion of a mutually beneficial Free Trade Agreement," a statement issued by the Prime Minister's Office that day said.

While releasing trade data on Friday, commerce secretary Sunil Barthwal said India and the UK are "actively engaged" in the FTA negotiations. "Both sides are quite committed to the fact that there should be a commercially meaningful, fair, equitable, good deal between the two countries and sensitivities of both the countries should be respected, as well as strengths of both the countries should reflect in the trade deal," he

While an FTA with Oman is possible soon, a deal with the UK is expected only after the general elections, another government official said. India on Saturday announced dates for the 2024 Lok Sabha polls that will be concluded on June 1 and ballots counted on June 4. "A trade deal is unlikely before the new government is formed in June as mutually agreeable solutions on key matters are

still elusive," he said. "FTAs are meant to be mutually beneficial. India is willing to open its market for scotch and British automobiles while adequately protecting its industries.

But these concessions will not be possible without easier mobility of Indian businesses in the UK," the first person said. India sees potential for its services exports to Europe, which needs easier mobility of its professionals and businessmen, he

added. Indian industries were unwilling to offer tariff concessions on items like automobiles and liquor to British manufacturers without London allowing easier mobility for Indian professionals, HT reported on October 3, 2023. If business mobility, or easier temporary movement of Indian professionals to the UK for business purposes, is taken out of the FTA negotiations, there won't be any significant gain for India as most Indian goods (more than 60% of the total merchandise) already have duty-free access to the British market, and most of the other items attract a low tariff of

5%, it said. The negotiating teams were not in a position to conclude an agreement even as the round 14 closed on Friday, PTI news agency reported from London, citing British officials. "We anticipate that while some talks might happen between rounds, the next round of negotiations will take place after the Indian elections," it quoted an official

as saying.

SPACEX BUILDING **SPY SATELLITE NETWORK FOR U.S. NSO: REPORT**

WASHINGTON: SpaceX is building a network of hundreds of spy satellites under a classified contract with a US intelligence agency, five people familiar with the programme said, demonstrating deepening ties between billionaire entrepreneur Elon Musk's space company and

national security agencies. The network is being built by SpaceX's Starshield business unit under a \$1.8 billion contract signed in 2021 with the National Reconnaissance Office (NRO), an intelligence agency that manages spy satellites, they said.

The plans show the extent of SpaceX's involvement in US intelligence and military projects and illustrate a deeper Pentagon investment into vast, low-Earth orbiting satellite systems aimed

at supporting ground forces. If successful, the sources said the programme would significantly advance the ability of the US government and military to quickly spot potential targets almost anywhere on the globe.

The contract signals growing trust by the intelligence establishment of a company whose owner has clashed with the Biden administration and sparked controversy over the use of Starlink satellite connectivity in the Ukraine war, the sources said.



ED summons Kejriwal in 2 separate cases, AAP hits out

NEW DELHI: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has issued summons to Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal in connection with its probe in two separate cases the Delhi excise policy 2021-22, and alleged irregularities in the awarding of Delhi Jal Board (DJB) contracts — people aware of the matter said on Sunday.

The federal anti-money laundering agency has summoned Kejriwal, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convenor, to appear before it in connection with the DJB case on Monday, and in connection with the excise case on March 21.

The two summons to Kejriwal came a day after a Delhi court granted him bail in connection with two complaints filed by ED for not appearing before the federal agency in connection with the excise case despite serving him with eight summons.

The people cited above, however, said that the bail does not mean that the court has given Kejriwal immunity from appearing before ED".

"Hence, we have issued fresh or ninth summons to him asking him to join the probe on March 21," said an ED officer, on condition of anonymity.

The AAP hit out at the development, terming the two summons an attempt to stop Kejriwal from campaigning, and referring to the alleged irregularities in DJB as a "back-up case". The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), meanwhile, accused the Delhi CM of repeatedly flouting the law.

Delhi chief minister Arvind Kejriwal at Rouse Avenue court on Saturday. The two summons to Kejriwal came a day after the court granted him bail in connection with two complaints filed by ED for not appearing before the federal agency in connection with the excise policy case.

Investigation probe into alleged irregularities in the regime. ED is carrying out a separate probe into the policy in connection with alleged money laundering.

Kejriwal has skipped eight summons issued by ED — on November 2, December 22, January 3, January 18, February 2, February 19, February 27, and on March 4 — calling them "illegal and politically motivated". He has also consistently objected to the summons, stating that it was not clear whether he was asked to appear before ED as a witness or suspect; as chief minister or as AAP chief.

quoted above said Kejriwal's questioning is "important" to know more about the conspiracy in the excise policy, in which ₹100 crore was allegedly paid by a lobby of businessmen and politicians - referred to as the "South

Group" — to AAP leaders in lieu of liquor licences.

The federal agency on Friday arrested Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader K Kavitha, and a court subsequently sent her to ED custody till March 23. A second ED official, also requesting anonymity, said that there is a possibility that if Kejriwal appears before agency on March 21, he may be confronted with Kavitha.

Separately, ED also issued summons to Kejriwal, asking him to appear before it on Monday in However, the ED officer connection with alleged irregularities in the awarding of DJB contracts.

ED's probe under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) is based on a case filed by CBI in July 2022, related to alleged corruption in the water

utility. It has been alleged that former DJB chief engineer Jagdish Kumar Arora awarded a contract to M/s NKG Infrastructure Ltd for ₹38 crore, even though the company did not meet the technical eligibility criteria.

ED arrested Arora on January 31, and on February 6 conducted raids at 12 locations, including those connected to Kejriwal's personal secretary Bibhav Kumar and AAP parliamentarian ND Gupta. ED alleged that bribes generated in the awarding of the contract were passed on as "election funds" to the AAP.

"Investigations and digital evidence show Arora passed on the bribe funds to various persons connected with managing the affairs of DJB including persons connected with AAP. Bribe amounts were also passed on as election funds...," the ED said in its statement on February 7.

ED said its probe has revealed the contract (to NKG) was awarded at highly inflated rates so that the bribes could be collected from the contractors from the inflated cost of the contract.

"As against the contract value of Rs 38 crore, only about Rs 17 crore was spent towards the contract and the remaining amounts were syphoned off in guise of various fake expenses. Such fake expenses were booked for bribes and election funds," it said.


AAP says Kejriwal targeted, BJP hits back

Hours after ED issued the two separate summons, the AAP alleged that the BJP-led Centre was attempting to prevent Kejriwal campaigning for the upcoming Lok Sabha elections.

"Nobody knows what the DJB case is... Maybe they doubt whether they will be able to arrest Kejriwal in the excise case, so this has been opened as a backup case. A third case may be opened if they can't arrest him in this case as well," Delhi minister Atishi said at a press conference.

Separately, AAP legislator Dilip Pandey said the party's legal team is examining the two summons, and an appropriate response will be issued. "The latest notice shows the desperation of BJP and the Centre ahead of the Lok Sabha polls," he said.

Hitting back, BJP accused Kejriwal of repeatedly flouting the law. "Kejriwal's bail on Saturday has nothing to do with the excise policy case. After disrespecting the summons which Kejriwal previously claimed were illegal, he has now taken bail, confirming the validity of the summonses. The conduct and language of AAP leaders resemble that of thugs, which is a testament to their character," Delhi BJP president Virendra Sachdeva said, adding that the summons in the DJB case is "another proof of looting".



Uptick in max temp in coming days: IMD

NEW DELHI: The temperature may rise by 2-3 degrees Celsius (°C) at most places across the Capital over the next five days as summer has begun making inroads across north India, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has said.

According to IMD, Delhi's maximum temperature could spike to 33°C by Friday. The minimum temperature was recorded at 11.9 °C on Sunday, which was five degrees below normal for this time of the year. It was 10.1°C on Saturday and 13.9°C on Friday.

Both maximum and minimum temperatures had dipped marginally in the last 48 hours. owing to the strong surface winds sweeping the region. IMD said despite clear skies in Delhi, there was a dip in temperature after fresh snowfall in the upper parts of the Himalayas on March 15. The snowfall impacted the plains too with northwesterly winds blowing towards Delhi-NCR. IMD has forecast the minimum to rise again in the next few days, touching 13°C by Monday, 14°C by Thursday and 15°C by Friday.

"The slight dip in temperature over the last two days was down to strong surface winds of 30-35 km/hour. With fresh snowfall recorded during the last western disturbance on March 14 and 15, we saw cool northwesterly winds again bringing a slight cooling effect to the plains. This temporary impact is reducing and we expect clear skies to continue for the next seven days and plains to heat up again," said an IMD official.

Delhi's maximum temperature was recorded at 30.8°C on Sunday, a degree below normal. The maximum was 30.3°C on Saturday and 28.4°C on Friday. With clear skies persisting, the maximum is forecast to touch 32°C by Tuesday and could touch 33°C by Friday, IMD said.

The highest maximum recorded so far this March has been 31.4°C, which was recorded on both March 11 and March 13. In March last year, the highest

maximum recorded was 34.3°C on March 16. In 2022, it went up to 39.6°C on March 31 and in 2021, touched 40.1°C on March 30. In 2020, the highest maximum in March was 33.3°C (March 26) and it was 39.2°C in 2019 (March 31).

The Met department said that day temperatures will likely increase by 2-4 degrees over northwest India as well, including Haryana and Punjab in the next 4-5 days. Maximum or day temperatures are below normal by 2-3 degrees over many parts of the country except some areas of J&K, Ladakh, Himachal Pradesh, and Punjab, among other areas, where these are near normal. But, now there will be a gradual shift towards hot weather, IMD has said.

"No major weather activity is expected over northwest India now. This will lead to both rise in day and night time temperatures. Max will reach around 33°C over say Delhi next week and rise further thereafter," said Mahesh Palawat, vice president, climate and met at Skymet Weather.







Outer Ring Road stretch set to be repaired in April

NEW DELHI: The state Public Works Department (PWD) will repair and recarpet the south Delhi stretch of Outer Ring Road between Modi and Chirag Delhi in a ₹15 crore project that's likely to get off the ground in April, said senior officials aware of the matter.

PWD opened up the bidding process for the project's tenders on Friday. A senior PWD official said the tendering process will be completed by April 1 and the project will likely take four months to complete.

"Since this is a major arterial road for the city, we will carry out the recarpeting work in phases during off-peak hours and at night so that traffic disruptions are minimal," said the official cited above.


"The existing bituminous layer will be scraped off and the surface entire stretch, including the service lanes on either side, will be revamped. We will add new layers of glowing studs and horticulture work," added the official.

NEW DELHI: The office of the chief electoral officer of Delhi has set up flying squads and control rooms across the city's seven Lok Sabha constituencies to check incidents of voter intimidation. In a public notice issued on Sunday, the poll office said district election functionaries or returning officers will enforce the model code of conduct in letter and spirit.

Polling for Delhi's seven Lok Sabha seats will be held on May 25 in the sixth phase of the general elections, with 14.7 million people eligible to exercise their franchise, according to the schedule announced by the Election Commission of India on Saturday. According to the notice, flying squads have been formed to register cases against "givers and takers of bribes" and to take action against those engaged in intimidation of electors."

"All the citizens are hereby requested to refrain from any illegal activities," it said. The poll body has also urged people to inform of incidents related to violations, including defacement of any public property, distribution of cash, liquor, gifts and bribing of returning officers by candidates or political parties.

4 held for supplying pre-activated SIM cards to Vietnam

karn.singh@htlive.com **NEW DELHI:** The Delhi Police's IGI airport unit on Sunday said it busted an organised inter-state racket involved in procuring SIM cards and supplying them to their links in Vietnam, adding that four people were arrested.

Police identified the arrested suspects as Anil Kumar, 20, the mastermind of the racket, Mukul Kumar, 22, Hemant Kumar, 26, and Kanhaiya Gupta, 29. While Anil was arrested from Model Town, the other three were nabbed from Agra. The arrests were made between March 14 and 15, officers said.

According to police, the SIM cards were sold for higher rates to people in Vietnam to be used for gaming apps and social media profiteering. Nearly 700 SIM cards of three private service providers were issued on the IDs of poor people in Agra and nearby areas, they added.

Deputy commissioner of police (IGI airport) Usha Rangnani said that the scam was unearthed following an investigation into a cheating case filed at the IGI airport police station under Section 420 of the Indian

Penal Code on February 22 on the complaint of a courier company at IGI cargo terminal.

"A total of 500 SIM cards were recovered from three separate packets to be parcelled to Vietnam ... The original owners of the SIMs revealed that they were fooled by Mukul, who gave them ₹200 to get the SIM issued in their name. They were mostly labourers," said Rangani. The manager of the company, in his complaint, said they discovered a shipment with SIM cards in bulk during a random physical check. "They were concealed in carbon papers, hidden in a cavity in a diary," said Rangnani.

The suspects, police said, are part of a syndicate through which they used to procure SIM cards issued in the names of gullible people after luring them for a very small amount of money. The SIMs were then sold to people in Vietnam. Investigators also identified multiple bank accounts in which Anil received the money he earned illegally. The accounts were reported in 19 cyber complaints filed from various parts of India. He was using a Chinese crypto-currency app named Binance, recently banned in India, police said.

NOIDA TO MOVE HC OVER ORDER FOR REGISTRY OF HOUSING PROJECT

NOIDA: Two weeks after the Allahabad high court ordering to execute registry in the name of the homebuyers in Cloud Nine's Lotus Espacia housing project in Sector 100, the Noida authority has decided to challenge the court order, thereby causing more delay in the proc-

In response to the writ of the homebuyers, the Allahabad high court in February directed the Enforcement Directorate (ED) to investigate the realty firms, Lotus 300 housing project in Sector 107 and Cloud 9 Projects Private Limited, accused of diverting homebuyers' money to the Lotus Espacia housing project in Noida's Sector 100 and delaying the project. Nearly 160 buyers are yet to execute registry of their flats.

The high court also directed the Noida authority to execute the registry in the name of homebuyers without seeking a no-dues certificate from realty firms in these two projects.

However, the Noida authority chief executive officer Lokesh M and chief legal advisor Ravinder Prasad Gupta said that the authority will not be able to issue permission for the registry without the promoters paying up the financial dues.

Lotus 300 project has a dues of around ₹166 crore and the Lotus Espacia has a dues of around ₹80 crore.

"We have decided to challenge the Allahabad high court orders on the ground that the authority can not allow registration without the realtor clearing the financial dues. We are exploring the legal options available for us. Either we will file a special leave petition in the larger bench in Allahabad high court or go to the Supreme Court protecting our financial interests. We have a duty to recover the financial dues as per the law," said Ravinder Prasad Gupta, the chief legal advisor of the Noida authority.

Transforming railway stations into new city centres

NEW DELHI: Railway stations are integral to a city's history and identity, serving as gateways through which visitors get their first impressions of a city. India boasts some of the grandest stations in the world, but many stations constructed during the British Raj have, over time, deteriorated into dirty, dilapidated, and chaotic places.

While several airports across the country have been modernised, railway stations remain caught in a time warp, lacking amenities that meet the requirements of contemporary travellers. Now, several colonial-era railway stations across the country are undergoing a major transformation into city centres under the Union government's Amrit Bharat Station Scheme, reshaping the city-station relationship.

Under this scheme, 1,318 railway stations are earmarked for development or redevelopment. These include stations in Delhi and the National Capital Region (NCR) such as New Delhi, Delhi Cantonment, Anand Vihar, Gurugram, Ghaziabad, and Faridabad.

Last month, Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation for 554 stations and virtually inaugurated the first phase of the redeveloped Gomti Nagar station in Lucknow.

Apart from Gomti Nagar, the stations that have already been redeveloped include Gandhinagar Capital, which boasts a luxurious five-star hotel atop it, and Rani Kamalapati railway station

in Bhopal. "The redevelopment work is currently underway at 65 major stations across the country and is at different stages of progress. Many of these stations, such as Chandigarh, are already over 50% complete. Most of these stations are being redeveloped under an engineering, procurement, and construction (EPC) model," said a senior railways official associated with the station redevelopment project. "Over the years, we have been upgrading stations under various schemes, but now we are fully redeveloping them. The aim is to provide a world-class experience to travellers and create new city centres at railway stations, integrated with the surrounding urban environments through place-making," he added.

Tracks to terminals The Amrit Bharat Station

Scheme focuses on constructing station buildings, covering both sides of railway lines with mod-

ern facilities and designs, including separate arrival and departure areas at different levels. Redeveloped stations will boast amenities such as airportlike concourses, digital information systems, executive lounges, shopping areas, cafeterias, and spaces for business meetings, among others. Many, like the New Delhi railway station, will also serve as a massive multimodal transit hub, with several luxury facilities.

"The concept of redeveloping railway stations as city centres stems from the idea of maximising their potential as dynamic urban hubs. This approach seeks to integrate transportation infrastructure with commercial, recreational, and residential amenities, creating a vibrant urban environment," said Dikshu Kukreja, whose firm CP Kukreja Architects developed the master plans for the Gandhinagar Capital and Gomti Nagar stations.

The Gandhinagar Capital station, inaugurated in 2021, is India's first redeveloped station. It features a modern facade, an interfaith prayer hall, a baby feeding room, a posh waiting lounge, a business centre, and an airport-like concourse. The concourse serves as the main congregation space, connecting all entry gates to platforms, lounges, toilets, cloakrooms, food courts, retail shops, and

ticket vending machines.

Similarly, Gomti Nagar railway station in Lucknow, whose completed first phase covers around 1 million square feet, features two separate terminals, a concourse connecting them, elevated departure, ground floor arrival and various amenities, including hospitality and retail blocks.

"In India, railway stations over the years became the centres of chaos in a city. But mega stations in the world like the Grand Central in New York or the King's Cross Station in London do not choke the traffic movement, and so inspired by them we introduced separate departure and arrival points at Gomti Nagar station, a first in India. The redevelopment of Gandhinagar Capital and Gomti Nagar railway stations aim to transform them into bustling urban districts that cater to

diverse needs and activities,' says Kukreja.

The proposed redevelopment plans for stations in Delhi-NCR, also aim for grandeur and modernization. The nondescript Gurgaon station, constructed in 1950 is set for a nine-story makeover. With three floors dedicated to railway operations, one for passenger amenities, and four for commercial ventures, including cafes, it promises a whole new look. The proposed blueprint for

Andheri station in Mumbai includes east and west side station buildings, with an expansive concourse linking both. It will have five commercial towers on the east side. "While nighttime traffic at the station is low, it presents an opportunity for transformation into a bustling city centre for dining and shopping. The redevelopment plan is rooted in the idea that stations should be responsive to the city's needs and contribute positively to its community," said Harsh Varshneya, principal architect at Sthapati Associates, a firm that has developed master plans for stations such as Bangalore Cantonment and Andheri station in Mumbai.

Evolving role of the railway station

Railway stations have evolved since their inception in the mid-18th century. During the British

Raj, the primary purpose of the first railway stations was to facilitate the transportation of goods - particularly raw materials such as cotton, jute, and coal, from the hinterlands to the ports for export to Britain. Initially, passenger travel played a secondary role, but it gradually gained importance as the railway network expanded and connected more regions across the country. The stations were designed to facilitate the movement of trains, passengers, and

"Now, the main focus of design is on passengers, as goods movement is shifting to new freight corridors and stations," said Goonmeet Singh Chauhan, co-founder, Design Forum International (DFI), which developed the master plan for the redevelopment of stations such as Amritsar, Delhi Cantonment and Thiruvananthapuram.

Railway stations in India were often built on the outskirts of cities, as transportation hubs to minimise disruptions caused by train traffic and to meet the extensive land requirements of railway infrastructure. But over the decades, cities grew around them, and today, many railway stations in India find themselves surrounded by densely populated urban areas.

"Historically, cities grew as administrative or commercial

centres and railway stations typically saw wholesale trade centres grow around them, and therefore bound the neighbouring smaller towns in the region as one economic whole," Chauhan said.

"In India, stations typically have the main buildings on one side, leading to an uneven development of the city with one side often neglected. The lack of proper foot-over bridges at the stations limited the cross-city movement. New stations we have been designed address this with wide foot over-bridges, facilitating movement between the two sides of the city without entering the stations," he said.

The challenges of redevelopment

Architects say redeveloping stations without affecting railway operations is a herculean task involving maintaining platforms, ticketing systems, and other critical infrastructure. "We must carefully phase our approach, constructing new facilities before demolishing the old ones, all while contending with the existing spatial constraints. For example, a new booking office is constructed

before demolishing the old one," said Varshneya.

While prefabricated or modular construction techniques help as they allow faster assembly on-site and reduce the overall construction timeline, there are many other complexities to be taken care of. "We engage with multiple stakeholders - municipal authorities, traffic police, and other entities to align our station master plan with the broader city master plan," said Varshneya.

However, the biggest architectural challenge lies in the redevelopment of heritage stations like Bangalore Cantonment. "It involves preserving historical features while introducing modern amenities and functionality, ensuring that every new addition harmonises with the existing architecture and environment," said Varshneya.

Symbolising heritage

While laying the foundation stone for the development, the Prime Minister said that these stations will symbolise both Vikas (progress) and Virasat (heritage) showcasing local culture and architectural heritage.

Ahmedabad station, for example, will be inspired by the Modhera Sun Temple, and the Dwarka station by the Dwarkadheesh temple.

"The British made all the stations in the colonial idiom. Now, we are prioritising local architecture and plan to use local materials in construction wherever feasible. The station's design must represent the city, drawing from its cultural moorings, thereby instilling pride and a sense of belonging in people," said Chauhan, adding that railway station designs are also an exercise in placemaking.

"A railway station, as a public space, should prioritise safety, inclusivity, and convenience while capturing the essence of the city — its cuisine, culture, and architectural heritage."

Instant hit on Instagram Some of the new station buildings have become architectural novelties. Stepping out of Gandhinagar Railway Station, visitors are surprised at the sight of a five-star hotel — The Leela — atop live-running train tracks. The hotel's lobby sits approximately 77 feet above the ground level, while rooms start at about 150 feet.

"Staying in a hotel above the railway tracks is a one-of-a-kind, Instagram-worthy experience for guests. Many choose to plan their special occasions at the hotel for the sake of creating lasting memories. While people get great views of Gandhinagar's lush green cityscape without any train noise in the rooms,' said Vikas Sood, general manager, The Leela, Gandhinagar station.

Kukreja said the redeveloped stations will help reshape the urban landscape. "They will help catalyse economic growth, revitalise neglected neighbourhoods, and boost overall liveability," he said.

NEW DELHI: The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) will initiate biomining and remediation work at the silt dumping site at Singhola village in outer Delhi, similar to biomining work currently in progress at the Capital's three landfills at Okhla, Bhalswa and Ghazipur, officials aware of the matter have said.

The civic body has invited bids for the project to clear 900,000 tonnes of accumulated silt and waste, they added.

The silt dumping site in Singhola, located near Khanpur village on Grand Trunk Road, is spread over an area of 7.2 acre. Officials said the site is used to dump silt collected during the annual pre-monsoon exercise of desilting the Capital's drainage system, but has also accumulated plastics, construction and demolition waste, and other waste.

"NHAI conveyed to us that the available material has a lot of plastic and garbage, and for making it suitable for use in highway construction, the silt will need to be segregated from other fractions," the MCD official quoted above said.

MAN MURDERS PARTNER FOR NOT **COOKING EGG** CURRY, ARRESTED

GURUGRAM: A 35-year-old man was arrested from Delhi's Sarai Kale Khan on Saturday for allegedly bludgeoning his live-in partner to death with a hammer and brick inside an under-construction house at Sector-1 in Palam Vihar after she refused to cook egg curry for him, officials aware of the matter said on Sunday.

Naveen Sharma, assistant commissioner of police, Palam Vihar, said the suspect was identified as Lallan Yadav, a native of Bihar's Madhubani, and the victim as Anjali, 32.

Police said that the murder took place on the second floor of the building on Tuesday night. A worker and his wife spotted the body the next morning.

"Yadav's wife died of snakebite six months ago, after which he had a fight with his family members and shifted to Delhi where he met Anjali. Both of them started living together and came to Gurugram on March 10 and began working at the building site," he said.

Sharma said that in an inebriated condition on Tuesday night. "When Anjali refused to cook egg curry, a quarrel ensued during which Yadav assaulted her, leading to her death," he said. HTC

Snake venom case: YouTuber held, sent to judicial custody

NOIDA: Noida Police arrested YouTuber Elvish Yadav on Sunday in connection with a probe into the suspected use of snake venom as a recreational drug at a party, officials aware of the matter said. Yadav has been sent to 14-day judicial custody, they added.

"We have found substantial evidence against Yadav and his involvement in supplying snake venom. After appearing before the court on Sunday, Yadav was sent to 14-day judicial custody," said Noida additional deputy commissioner of police Manish Kumar Mishra.

"Yadav was called in for questioning at Sector 20 police station on Sunday," he added.

Police also added sections 284 (negligent conduct with respect to poisonous substances) and 289 (negligent conduct with respect to animals) of the Indian Penal Code and the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act in the first information report (FIR).

On November 3 last year, Yadav and five others were booked under the Wildlife (Protection) Act and section 120 B (criminal conspiracy) of the

Indian Penal Code for allegedly providing snake venom at a party in Noida's Sector 51. The arrests took place after an animal welfare activist, Gaurav Gupta, associated with the NGO People For Animals, approached the Sector 49 police station.

Noida assistant commissioner of police Praveen Kumar Singh said, "Yadav's involvement in the party at Sector 51 was established during the investigation."

The five others, who were arrested, are now out on bail. "Nine snakes — five cobras,

one python, two sand snakes and one rat snake — protected under Schedule 1 of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, and a 20ml tube of suspected snake venom were recovered from the possession of the five suspects," said police.

NEW DELHI: The ongoing biomining project at two of the Capital's three landfill sites - Ghazipur and Bhalswa - are likely to miss the latest deadline of 2024 to clear the sites, Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) officials aware of the matter said on Sun-

Biomining is a process of separating various components of legacy waste such as plastic, paper, cloth, sand, and bricks by passing them through trommel machines, which act as cylindrical rotating sieves. MCD launched the biomining project to clear its three oversaturated landfill sites in July 2019 on

directions of the National Green Tribunal, that directed that legacy waste dumps are to be "cleared within one year but substantial progress must be made and demonstrated within six months".

Senior officials at the civic body, however, noted that there have been multiple revisions and

extensions of these deadlines due to several reasons, including the slowdown in biomining due to the continued dumping of fresh waste, as well as the halting of work due to rainy weather during the monsoons. The civic body also faced problems with the disposal of inert material and plastic derived after the biomining process, but this issue was later resolved.

At present, the officials said, MCD is in line to clear only the Okhla landfill in December this year — a deadline set in March 2023 — as no fresh waste is being dumped on this location. In a progress taken report submitted to the Delhi Pollution Control Committee on February 17, the civic body admitted that the three landfill sites still have 17.2 million tonnes of legacy waste, due to which the deadline to clear the Ghazipur landfill has been pushed back from 2024 to 2026, while the Bhalswa landfill will be cleared by 2025.

The victim was identified as Dharmendra Kumar Ahirwar, 38, a native of Jhansi in Uttar Pradesh and lived at Dwarka in Delhi. The accident took place when he was returning home from his office in DLF Phase-III, they added.

Inspector Balraj Singh, station house officer of DLF Phase-III police station, said that the cab driver, who was identified Mohammad Saddam, 27, was arrested on Saturday. "He hails from Nuh and entered the wrong lane to take a shortcut," he said.

Investigators said the cab suddenly came from the wrong side to head towards Udyog Vihar and hit Ahirwar's motorcycle. He was flung several feet away due to the impact and his helmet also came off. The cab driver lost control and rammed the divider.

Commuters immediately rushed Ahirwar to a private hospital in DLF Phase-III where he soon died while undergoing treatment, investigators added. Inspector Singh said the Swift Dzire and the motorcycle were

seized from the spot. "The body was handed over to the family after the autopsy," he said.

Open interpretation area to be developed at Ridge

NEW DELHI: Delhi's forest and wildlife department will landscape a 1.5 hectare area at the Kamla Nehru Ridge in north Delhi to create an open interpretation area, which will consist of a cactus garden, herbal garden and large pond, officials aware of the matter said on Sunday.

An area will also be dedicated to native species that grow predominantly in the rocky terrain of the Aravallis, they added.

The forest department operates a government nursery at the Kamla Nehru Ridge and the department said a natural revamp of the area is planned, not only to educate visitors at the nursery about the different species available, but also to start educational tours for students.

The Delhi government currently has 14 nurseries across the city, where free plants are distributed by the forest department, officials said.

A senior forest department official at the Kamla Nehru Ridge on condition of anonymity said that a tender has been floated to landscape around 1.5 hectares out of the three-hectare area occupied by the nursery, which will not only allow them to showcase over 3,000 species of shrubs, medicinal plants and trees, but also facilitate educational tours.

The Kamla Nehru Ridge is also called the Northern Ridge. Delhi's Ridge areas, the broken extension of the Aravallis into Delhi, are divided into four








Foreign students attacked at Guj varsity over namaz, MEA steps in

AHMEDABAD: A group of people stormed the Gujarat University hostel in Ahmedabad late on Saturday and attacked international students who were offering namaz inside the premises, injuring five people during the melee, prompting the state police to begin a high-level probe on Sunday and arrest two men, even as the ministry of external affairs said it had taken note of the incident.

Two students - one from Sri Lanka and another from Tajikistan - were hospitalised after the attack, videos of which did the rounds on social media and drew widespread condemnation.

Police said they had arrested two people, Hitesh Mewada and Bharat Patel, both residents of Ahmedabad, for their alleged role in the attack, adding that they were on the hunt for more sus-

pects. Senior officers said the incident took place around 10.30pm on Saturday, when around 25 people broke into A Block of the hostel, which houses around 75 of Gujarat University's 300 interna-

tional students.

"Some students were sitting on a platform (within the hostel premises), offering namaz when the group entered, asked why they were praying there and told them to go to a mosque instead," said GS Malik, Ahmedabad com-

missioner of police, citing a preliminary investigation.

According to Malik, this "led to a verbal altercation" that then "escalated into stone-pelting and physical violence". "Some people in the group then barged into the rooms and began vandalising property," said Malik.

Gujarat University vice-chancellor Neerja Gupta said, "This is the first time such an incident has happened. We have been running the Study Abroad Programme (SAP) since 2005. The government and police have taken strict action and two people have also been arrested.

"At the university we have made some administrative changes today (like decision to appoint ex-army men as security personnel and appointment of new hostel warden and new

co-ordinator for SAP) and we have also decided to form a Foreign Student Advisory commit-

tee," Gupta said. An Afghan student said the men were shouting "Jai Shri Ram" as they "pushed the security guard out" of the building.

"Other international students who came to help were also attacked. Their rooms were ransacked and their personal devices, including laptops and cellphones damaged. Five students, including two from South Africa and one each from Afghanistan, Uzbekistan, and Sri Lanka, have been injured," the student said.

Several purported bits of footage from the incident went viral on social media and showed a group of people pelting stones and vandalising stationary motorcycles within the hostel's prem-

ises. One clip shows a person asking students if they should be praying in the hostel, prompting an aggressive response.Other videos showed the group leaving the college even as residents of the hostel demanded they be apprehended. "There are many videos of stone pelting and other incidents of vandalism. We are conducting a fair and neutral investigation, and the government is also of the view that strong action should be taken against those responsible for the violence," said Malik. Gujarat Police filed a case on Sunday night and booked the

Tarun Duggal, Ahmedabad deputy commissioner of police (zone 7), said, "The police have arrested two Ahmedabad residents, Hitesh Mewada and Bharat Patel, and booked them under multiple IPC sections, including 143 (unlawful assembly), 147 (rioting) and 323 (voluntarily causing hurt), among others." "What a shame. Your devotion & religious slogans only come out when Muslims peacefully practice their religion...What is this, if not mass radicalisation? This is the home state of @AmitShah & @narendramodi, will they intervene to send a strong message?...' Owaisi said on X.

Reacting to the incident, Gujarat Congress spokesperson Manish Doshi said it was the failure of law and order by the ruling BJP government in Gujarat. "It's election time and the ruling BJP wants to divert from the real issues of the people and hence they are allowing communal forces to take over," alleged Doshi.

Gujarat BJP spokesperson Yamal Vyas said the government has taken swift action and already put two people behind bars who were responsible for the incident.

"The government will leave no stone unturned to ensure that peace and order is maintained. All culprits behind the incident will be punished," said Vyas.

They also discussed efforts to boost bilateral trade and investment and enhance people-topeople links via capacity building and travel, external affairs ministry's readout said. Both sides agreed to hold the next meeting of core group in Delhi.

Fresh details offer peek at donor details of 11 parties

NEW DELHI: New data uploaded by the Election Commission (EC) on Sunday revealed donor details for at least some of the parties, something that was missing in the data released on March 14.

Donor details have been made available for 11 parties. Of these, eight have submitted data pertaining to the period before April 12, 2019, and three parties — Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK), Janata Dal (Secular) or JD(S) and Maharashtrawadi Gomantak Party (MGP) — have submitted data till September 30, 2023. The newly submitted data connects some of the biggest electoral bond donors to their recipients.

Among the three parties that have revealed donors up to September 2023, the DMK is the biggest recipient with bond donations of ₹662.5 crore, followed by the JD(S) (₹89.8 crore) and the MGP (₹55 lakh).

The two biggest donors for the DMK during this period contributed over 90% of the party's bond receipts. They were Future Gaming and Hotel Services Pvt Ltd, which donated 77% (₹509 crore) of the party's bond receipts, and Megha Engineering & Infrastructure Limited, which donated 16% (₹105 crore).


Similarly, JD(S) received around 80% of its ₹89.8 crore bond donations from just two companies: Megha Engineering & Infrastructure Limited and the Embassy Group of Companies. The former donated 56% of the JD(S)'s bond receipts (₹50 crore) and the latter 24.5% (₹22 crore). The MGP received bond dona-

tions from just two companies: ₹35 lakh from VM Salgaocar & Brother Pvt Ltd and ₹20 lakh from VS Dempo & Company Pvt Ltd.

The top three recipients for the period up to April 12, 2019 for whom donor details have been made available are the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), Janata Dal (United), and Samajwadi Party. They have revealed donors for ₹37.75 crore, ₹13 crore and ₹10.84 crore, respectively.

The top three donors for the NCP were Bajaj Finserv, Atula Chordia, owner of the Panchshil Group, and Infina Infrastructure. They donated ₹7.5 crore, ₹5 crore

and ₹5 crore, respectively, of the total ₹37.75 crore for which the party has revealed donors.

The top donors for the Janata Dal (United) included Shree Cement, which donated ₹2 crore, and Bharti Airtel, which donated ₹1 crore. Another ₹10 crore were donated by donors whose identity has not been made available.

The top donors for the Samajwadi Party were San Beverages, which donated ₹30 lakh, and AK Traders and KS Traders which donated ₹10 lakh each. The data released on Sunday

also allows one to track the fraction of companies' total bond donations that went to parties who have revealed their bond donors.

For example, Future Gaming and Hotel Services Private Limited, owned by lottery magnate Santiago Martin, purchased electoral bonds worth ₹1,368 crore from April 12, 2029 to January 11, 2024. It was the biggest purchaser in this period. At least ₹509 crore (37%) of this went to the DMK, which has revealed receipts of donations from April 15, 2019 to September 30, 2023,

but not for the period after. The company appears in the list of the DMK's donors in every fiscal year since 2020-21. The DMK came into power in Tamil Nadu in May 2021.

Meanwhile, the second-biggest purchaser of electoral bonds from April 12, 2019 to January 11, 2024 was Megha Engineering. It gave ₹105 crore to the DMK and ₹50 crore to the JD(S). These two parties accounted for 15.5% and 5% respectively of the ₹966 crore worth of electoral bonds purchased by the company.

The list of donors even includes an IPL Franchise. The Chennai Super Kings, owned by India Cements, donated ₹5 crore to the AIADMK, Meanwhile, the DMK received ₹10 crore from India Cements.

To be sure, the data here only includes parties that revealed their donor details for electoral bonds. Most political parties claimed they had no access to information about their donors. Some also refused to share information citing their donors' wish to remain anonymous.

Not aware who donated ₹10 crore, JD(U) tells EC

NEW DELHI: The Janata Dal (United) or JD(U) told the Election Commission that it was not aware of the identity of the donor or donors that gave electoral bonds worth ₹10 crore to the party, saying that "somebody" handed over a sealed envelope with 10 bonds of ₹1 crore each at its Patna office in April 2019, which it encashed within days.

The poll panel on Sunday made public the sealed disclosures made by political parties about the electoral bonds redeemed by them between March 2018 and November 2023. In its reply submitted on May 30, 2019, the Nitish Kumarled party said that it received donations worth Rs 13 crore through electoral bonds. It, however, added that it did not have the details of the donor or donors that gave bonds totalling ₹10 crore.

"Somebody came to our office on 03-04-2019 at Patna and handed over a sealed envelope and when it was opened we found a bunch containing 10 Electoral Bonds of Rupees One Crore each. Accordingly as per Gazette Notification of the Govt of India we opened an account in SBI Main Branch, Patna and deposited it which was credited to our party account on 10 04 2019. In this view of the situation we are unable to provide any more detail about the Donors,' the JD(U) said in its disclosure.

The JD(U) added that it received the remaining ₹3 crore in three bonds, two ₹1 crore bonds from Ajmer-based Shree Cement Limited, and one ₹1 crore bond from Bharti Airtel.

BETWEEN MAR 2018 AND JAN 2024, BJP REDEEMED 50% OF BOND DONATIONS,

REVEALS EC DATA

NEW DELHI: Electoral bonds worth ₹16,492 crore were redeemed in the thirty phases of their sale between March 1, 2018 and January 11, 2024 and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) redeemed 50% of them at ₹8,252 crore, according to data published by the Election Commission of India on March 14 and 17.

The Congress accounted for 11.8% (₹1,952 crore) while the All India Trinamool Congress (TMC) accounted for 10.4% (₹1,708 crore). The year the scheme was launched (FY18), only three parties got electoral bond donations: the BJP (95%), Congress (2.3%) and JD(S) (2.7%). The BJP thus received the biggest fillip ahead of the 2019 general elections.

The Lok Sabha elections were announced on March 10, 2019 and were held in seven phases from April 11 to May 19. Until May 10, electoral bonds had been sold in 10 tranches across 110 days. Parties redeemed bonds purchased in the last tranche before the elections ended up to May 22 because bonds could be redeemed 15 days from the date of issue. From the inception of the scheme up to May 22, 2019, the total value of bonds redeemed by parties was ₹5,831 crore. The BJP benefited the most ahead of the 2019 polls as it redeemed 68% (₹3,963 crore) of all bonds redeemed. The Congress redeemed 12% (₹698 crore), and the TMC 2.6% (₹150 crore).

Between FY18 and FY20, the TMC encashed less money through electoral bonds than the Congress but every year since then until FY23, the TMC encashed double or more than double the electoral bonds that the Congress did. The TMC ceased to be a national party in April 2023 but it still accounted for 13.6% (₹612 crore) of all bonds redeemed in FY24 while the BJP and the Congress accounted for 37.4% (₹1,686 crore) and 18.4% (₹828 crore). respectively.

Ex-CM Baghel rejects FIR against him as 'politically motivated'

RAIPUR: Former Chhattisgarh chief minister and senior Congress leader Bhupesh Baghel on Sunday said the case filed against him in the Mahadev Online Book app scam was politically motivated and done at the behest of the BJP ahead of the Lok Sabha elections.

HT reported on Sunday that the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the state police filed a case against Baghel under various sections pertaining to anyone. The investigation cheating, criminal conspiracy, breach of trust, and forgery under the Indian Penal Code (IPC), and Sections 7 and 11 of the Prevention of Corruption Act in connection with the alleged ₹6,000 crore scam.

"The FIR against me was lodged on March 4 by EOW then why was it not published on the EOW website till now? My name was later added under pressure. This means the BJP fears losing Rajnandgaon and Chhattisgarh seats [in the Lok Sabha polls] because they know my candidature will have an impact across the state, Baghel, who is set to contest the Lok Sabha polls from Rajnandgaon, said.

Those named along with Baghel in the FIR include Mahadev promoters Sourabh Chandrakar and Ravi Uppal, 16 other named accused persons, and "unnamed" bureaucrats, police officers, and officers on special duty (OSDs) during his tenure as the CM, HT reported on Sunday.

"In the FIR, my name was mentioned as an accused in sixth place. The content of the FIR, in which the names of the promoters of the app have been mentioned, does not have my name. The FIR is politically motivated, I was deliberately implicated under pressure. It was done due to political vendetta," the former CM said.

The BJP dismissed Baghel's allegation, saying that the investigation agencies were working independently.

"There is nothing political in the case titled against Baghel. We all know that the accused of Mahadev betting app case has also released a video naming Baghel... He could have named

agencies are doing their job, said BJP spokesperson Sacchinand Upsane.

People familiar with the development earlier told HT that the case against Baghel was filed after the Enforcement Directorate (ED) sent two references to the state police, on January 8 and 30 this year, based on its findings that allegedly reveal the involvement of state government functionaries at the top level for allowing illegal activities of those running the betting app in lieu of alleged "protection money".

Baghel rejected the charge and said that during his tenure as the CM, the state police took strict action against the accused as they registered 72 FIRs in connection with the case and arrested around 450 people.

So far, the ED has filed two charge sheets in the case, including one against Chandrakar and Uppal. The ED has alleged in its charge sheet that Chandrakar got married at Ras Al Khaimah, UAE, in February 2023 and about ₹200 crore in cash was spent for this event and private jets were hired to ferry his relatives from India to the UAE and celebrities were paid to perform at the wedding.

The projected proceeds of crime in the case are about ₹6,000 crore. So far, assets worth ₹572.41 crore have been seized or frozen by the ED in this case.

RAPE CASE AGAINST SAJJAN JINDAL IS FALSE, SAY COPS, FILE A CLOSURE REPORT

MUMBAI: The Mumbai Police have filed a closure report in the rape case against Sajjan Jindal, the managing director of the JSW Group, and concluded that the complainant attempted to frame him.

According to the complaint filed by the woman, an actor, she first met Jindal in October 2021 in Dubai and they remained in touch. The actor alleged that Jindal forced himself on her at the company's head office in the Bandra Kurla Complex (BKC) in January 2022, when she had gone there for a meeting.

On December 13 last year, based on the woman's complaint, the police registered an FIR against Jindal under sections 376 (rape), 354 (outraging modesty of a woman) and 506 (criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code. Jindal, however, dismissed the allegations as "false and baseless".

On Saturday, the police dismissed the case as "false".

In its closure report filed at the Bandra Metropolitan Magistrate Court on Saturday, the police said that though the complainant had promised to present evidence of Jindal's culpability in the court herself, she had failed to do so.

The complainant also did not appear to record her statement under Section 164 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, despite repeated reminders, the report

Citing testimonies collected from witnesses present at the alleged scene of crime and from the evidence obtained during their investigation, the police concluded that there "was no wrongdoing with the woman" and Jindal was not even present at the place that day.

NEW DELHI: Social media influencers could face action for endorsing online gambling amid growing instances, the country's consumer protection watchdog has stated in an advisory to online platforms and advertising intermediaries, people familiar with the matter said.

The statutory Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has told self-regulatory bodies and advertising intermediaries that "increasing instances" of direct and surrogate endorsements of betting and gambling, both banned under Public Gambling Act of 1867, had come to its notice.

The watchdog has mounted a watch and endorsers could face stringent action, including fine and prosecutions, an official said, declining to be named.

The authority has asked online advertisement intermediaries not to target Indian audiences with betting ads.

"Advertisement of online betting platforms and apps promotes an activity that is predominantly banned and carries significant financial and socioeconomic implications on consumers, particularly the

youth," the advisory stated. Social media influencers and celebrities found to be endorsing gambling online will be

"equally liable" under various provisions and rules under the Consumer Protection Act 2019, according to the advisory.

The advisory has asked these platforms and influencers to immediately refrain from showing such advertisements or promotional content in any form whatsoever, failing with the government would be constrained to take action under various statutes, an official of the consumer

affairs ministry said. "The law on online gaming is not uniform across the country, but online gambling is prohibited in majority of the states," said Ashok Paul, a lawyer spe-

cialising in cyber laws. Sikkim regulated and licensed all forms of online gaming and betting through legislation in

Cabinet sends poll dates to Prez for notification

NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, met on Sunday to take up the process of notifying the dates for the upcoming sevenphase parliamentary elections by sending the Election Commission's recommendations to President Droupadi Murmu for her approval, as required by the law.

On Saturday, the Election Commission had announced the dates for what will be arguably the world's largest election, beginning April 19, with nearly a billion people eligible to vote. Polling will go on in various phases till June 1 and votes counted on June 4.

"We address you at a precious moment, when we as a nation are set to reiterate our pledge to electoral democracy, when Indians will together express their will once again," Rajiv Kumar, who heads the Election Commission, had told reporters announcing the poll schedule.

The Cabinet meeting, the last one during the current term of the National Democratic Alliance government, took up a proposal by the Union law ministry to notify the polls to elect the 18th Lok Sabha (lower house).

The notification and president's approval of the poll schedule will

set the ball rolling for the general elections in which Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who leads the National Democratic Alliance, will seek a third straight term.

The first notification is likely to be issued on March 20 for the first phase of polls on April 19 for 102 seats. Once a poll date is notified, the process of filing nomination by candidates can begin.

According to a person familiar with the developments, no agenda or papers were circulated ahead of the brief meeting, where the Union law secretary was present. The Cabinet recommended to the President that notifications for the different phases of polls be issued, the person said.

According to rules, the Election Commission sends its recommendations to notify the Lok Sabha elections to the Union law ministry.



Earlier, three other sitting Lok Sabha MPs had quit the BRS -Venkatesh Netha from Peddapalli, Pothuganti Ramulu from Nagarkurnool and BBPatil from Zaheerabad. While Netha joined the Congress party, Ramulu and Patil joined the Bharatiya Janata Party.

In his resignation letter addressed to BRS president and former chief minister K Chandrasekhar Rao, Ranjith Reddy said: "Unfortunately, due to the current political circumstances in the state of Telangana, I have come to the difficult decision to pursue an alternative path. It is with a heavy heart that I hereby submit my resignation from the BRS Party and relinquish my membership." Nagender, meanwhile, did not

submit any resignation letter to the party. But, he, along with Reddy, went to the residence of PCC president and chief minister A Revanth Reddy and joined the Congress.

MUMBAI: A day after the Election Commission of India announced the schedule for the world's largest democratic exercise, the Lok Sabha elections, the opposition alliance launched its joint campaign from Mumbai's iconic Shivaji Park that saw the attendance of several senior leaders and a thousands-strong crowd.

On a day the Congress leader Rahul Gandhi-led Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra culminated in Mumbai after 63 days, opposition parties used the rally to display a show of strength and counter allegations of cracks appearing in the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA).

Taking to the dais, Rahul Gandhi said the opposition is not fighting against the Bharatiya Janata Party or Prime Minister Narendra Modi, but against the system they have created.

"People believe that we are against a political party or fighting against Narendra Modi. It is not true. They have created a face in Modi's name," he said, as he attacked Modi over corruption, electoral bonds, crony capitalism and alleged manipulation of electronic voting machines (EVM).

The former Congress president alleged that PM Modi had a

"monopoly over corruption". "Electoral bonds are nothing but national level extortion. They used to run it in four ways by taking percentage from companies for allotting contracts, by issuing threats with the help of ED, CBI, taking cut through shell companies and taking money after giving contracts," Gandhi said.

The Congress leader urged the people to stand up against the Modi government. "You all have to stand up. You all are 'Bharat Mata'.

TN GUV REFUSES TO SWEAR IN MLA PONMUDI AS MIN

CHENNAI: Tamil Nadu governor RN Ravi on Sunday refused to swear in K Ponmudi as minister in MK Stalin-led Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) cabinet, an official aware of the matter said on Sunday.

The Raj Bhavan has not released an official statement on the matter as of now.

"The governor has sent a letter that he cannot administer the oath of office to him (Ponmudi) to be minister since his conviction has only been stayed," a senior government officer aware of the matter

The official said that further course of action will be decided

in the coming days. On March 13, Tamil Nadu reinstated Ponmudi as an MLA, following the Supreme Court's order on March 11, suspending his conviction and four-year jail sentence in a disproportionate assets (DA) case.

The Madras high court had found him guilty in December last year which had led to his immediate disqualification as a legislator and a minister.

Ponmudi was elected from the Tirukkoyilur assembly constituency and served as the higher education minister before conviction.

Last week, the assembly secretariat had notified Tirukkoyilur constituency as vacant and forwarded it to the Election Commission. But Ponmudi received relief from the top court and the order copy was released last Wednesday.

Cyberattack on aerospace research firm under NIA lens

attack on government-owned National Aerospace Laboratories (NAL), India's largest aerospace research company, on November 15 last year has come under the scanner of the National Investigation Agency (NIA), which has started investigating the incident as a cyberterrorist attack.

The federal anti-terror agency has registered a case in the ransomware attack, suspected to have been carried out by world's most notorious cybercrime enterprise called LockBit, people familiar with the development

said, on condition of anonymity. An affiliate of the government's Council of Scientific and Industry Research, NAL Bengaluru is the only government aerospace R&D laboratory in the country's civilian sector. It came under a ransomware attack on November 15, after which Lock-Bit threatened to publish the stolen data, including classified letters, if it failed to pay an unspecified ransom amount.

"We have registered a case to investigate the ransomware attack at the NAL from the cyberterrorism angle," said an NIA officer.

The federal agency has a specialized anti cyberterrorism unit which probes cyber attacks by state or non-state actors on government and private installations in India. It had earlier assisted other agencies including CERT-In in the ransomware attack at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) in November 2022.

"Lockbit is one of the most prolific cyber criminals' groups,' said Tarun Wig, information security expert and co-founder

of Innefu Labs. "Ransomware attacks are usually carried out by private groups for money and Indian establishments have been targeted very often." LockBit has been involved in

data theft and encryption, followed by extortion and data leak. It first emerged in 2019, with its name at that time as ABCD.

After a joint operation by law enforcement agencies from 10 countries, including the US, France, Germany, Sweden, Australia, Japan and Canada and led by British authorities, UK's National Crime Agency last month announced it had taken control of LockBit's services, compromising their criminal enterprise.

"Through our close collaboration, we have hacked the hackers; taken control of their infrastructure, seized their source code, and obtained keys that will help victims decrypt their systems," Graeme Biggar, director general of the British agency, said in a statement on February 20. "As of today, LockBit are locked out. We have damaged the capability and most notably, the credibility of a group that depended on secrecy and anonymity," Biggar said while terming LockBit as world's most harmful cybercrime group.

The US department of justice also said it had partnered with the Federal Bureau of Investigation to disrupt the LockBit ransomware group.

SMUGGLER SHOT DEAD BY BSF IN TRIPURA: OFFICIAL

AGARTALA: An alleged Bangladeshi smuggler was killed during a clash with the Border Security Force (BSF) in Unakoti district of Tripura on Sunday, an official

BSF troops were on duty near the border outpost of Magroli in Kailashahar when they observed a group of 15-20 men approaching the border fence from the Indian side carrying suspicious articles, the official added.

Despite warnings by the BSF jawans to stop, they did not stop, became aggressive, and surrounded the BSF personnel on duty. "In response to the imminent danger to life, one BSF jawan opened fire killing one of the smugglers," the official added.

Angered by the incident, the other smugglers attacked the BSF jawan, but other personnel arrived at the scene and opened fire again, forcing the attackers to flee. The deceased has been identified as Saddam Hussein (23) from Dastaki village in Bangladesh's Moulvibazar district.

planters to help reduce pesticide levels Rhythma Kaul

NEW DELHI: Tea planters in the country are being sensitized and trained to reduce pesticide levels in tea, the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) said in a statement after conducting such a workshop in Coonoor district of Tamil Nadu.

A session was held on Friday to ensure safe and hygienic production of tea and strengthen awareness on the basics of integrated pest management and good agricultural practices for tea, the food standards watchdog said. "It was supported by the Tea Board and Confederation of Indian Industry Food and Agriculture Centre of Excellence," it

There have been reports in the past when both international and domestic buyers rejected consignments due to excessive presence of pesticides and chemicals. The food regulator has been working on a plan to rectify this and training tea growers is a part of it.

The training included information on maximum residue levels for pesticides and measures to keep the harmful chemical within that range.

"Wide ranging discussions were held which included insights into FSSAI notifications on Maximum Residue Levels (MRLs) for pesticides, emphasizing the importance of maintaining a recommended time gap between pesticide spraying and tea leaf plucking. During the session, the Small Tea Growers were sensitized about the significance of safe use of pesticides adhering to the FSSAI norms on MRLs," the statement said.

Last year, the national food regulator had issued directions

under section 16(5) of Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, regarding operationalisation of limits of pesticide use in tea. It focused on five pesticide that are being used by tea growers in the country, such as Emamectin Benzoate (MRL= 0.06 mg/kg). Fenpyroximate (MRL= 6.0 mg/ kg), Hexaconazole (MRL=5 mg/ kg), Propiconazole (6.0 mg/kg), and Quinalphos (MRL= 0.7 mg/

"Based on representation received and considering the fact that five pesticides are widely used for crop protection in tea plantations and that the MRL of these pesticides have been revised upwards on the basis of data..., it has been decided to operationalise the MRL for tea with immediate effect," the regulator said in a notification issued last year. Based on manufacturing processes, tea can be broadly classified into three categories: black, oolong and green. Due to the environmental and climatic conditions in which tea is cultivated, plantations are prone to pests. The tea plant is attacked

by at least 1,000 species of phytophagous insects and mites, sci-

entific studies have shown. To manage this problem planters have been resorting to use of high volumes of pesticides that cause the presence of higher than prescribed limits of pesticide residue in tea. Pesticides are harmful for human health and are known to cause allergies. aggravated asthma symptoms. and certain types of cancer.

To improve the quality of tea and increasing its safe and hygienic production, the food regulator along with industry partners plans to take forward a comprehensive capacity building initiative in various clusters across tea growing areas in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Assam and West Bengal.

India is the second largest tea producer (producing nearly 900,000 tonnes a year), with 20% of global tea produced in Darjeeling, the Nilgiris and Assam. Tea is the world's second highest consumed beverage with the highest consumption in China, India, Turkey and Pakistan.

MARRIED WOMAN GANG-RAPED IN MP, ATTEMPTS SUICIDE

BETUL: A 38-year-old married woman was gang-raped by two persons following which she consumed pesticide in Betul district of Madhya Pradesh, police said on Sunday.

The incident occurred in Bordehi police station limits on Saturday and one of the two accused has been arrested, said sub divisional officer of police (SDOP) Shalini Paraste.

"The woman was coming home on Saturday evening from a farm plot when two persons, one of them known to her, offered to give her a lift on their scooter. The accused, however, took her to a deserted place and raped her," she said.

"Following the incident, she consumed pesticide and is admitted in Betul's district hospital. The police and tehsildar recorded the statements of the victim in the hospital and registered a zero FIR," the SDOP informed. The case will be forwarded to Bordehi police station for further action, she added.

IT ministry tests parental control app, progress to be reviewed today

NEW DELHI: The ministry of electronics and information technology is testing an app called SafeNet, which will allow parents to set content filters for their children, access their live location, and keep a watch on their calls and messages, the progress of which will be reviewed on Monday.

At a November meeting convened by the department of telecommunications, an industry body recommended that mobile, computer and laptop manufacturers should preload this app. The progress will be reviewed in a meeting on March 18, according to the minutes of the November meeting that HT has seen.

The SafeNet app has been developed by the Centre for Internet Studies and Artificial Intelligence of the Kerala-based Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, with R&D support from MeitY.

"MEITY has developed an application named 'Safenet' for parental control for PC/tablets/ mobile phones for use by parents which is under testing. All the participants were served with document of Safenet, provided by MEITY, to take their valuable comments immediately so that MEITY may launch (including uploading the App on Google Playstrore [sic]) the App

at the earliest," read the minutes of the meeting convened at Sanchar Bhawan on November 23, 2023. As per the minutes of the meeting, the Internet Service Providers Association of India suggested that the app should come pre-installed in mobile phones, laptops and personal computers. The industry body requested the ministry to "take appropriate action with respective manufacturers". Members of the association include Airtel, Vodafone Idea, Tata Communications, ACT Fibernet and Hathway, among others.

In the November meeting, telecom department officials told participants that the Prime Minister's office had directed to "incorporate parental controls in data usage" by July this year.

In the meeting, the department of school education was requested to issue instructions to all schools through their respective boards to raise awareness on

At a previous meeting on this issue on August 29, it was decided that MeitY may "arrange to develop" an app for parental control. It was also decided that telecom and internet service providers would "provide details of configuration in mobile/computers with regard to parental control on their website through PPT/short videos, etc."

The SafeNet app allows parents to set up content filters for their children's phones, get detailed YouTube activity insights, manage how much time a child spends on each domain, and block "age-inappropriate" content, according to its website.

SafeNet has also set up three custom domain name servers (DNS) with a graded approach to filtering that can be implemented at network level in different institutions.

Through the "primary" DNS, recommended for schools, more than 70 million domains and more than 34 categories can be blocked. Through the "secondary" DNS, recommended for colleges and research organisations, more than 40 million domains and more than 21 categories can be blocked. The third

DNS, called "ternary" on the SafeNet website, allows everything except terrorism, nudity, and porn and blocks more than 4 million domains. HT has not tested these filters.

"Such apps, if widely available on all devices, without verification of legitimate parent child relationships, can lead to incidences of intimate partner violence, so enough safeguards need to be built to avoid abuse of these tools," said Aparajita Bharti, founding partner of the Quantum Hub Consulting. She has worked extensively on protecting children online.

Apps meant for parental control are often used as stalkerware, which are used by abusers to monitor and track their victims without the victim's knowledge and consent.

"Countries around the world are exploring device level parental controls. However, there are competing concerns to be balanced such as overall safety and well being of children and privacy of children from their parents, excessive content censorship," Bharti said.

Before deploying such tools, it is important to address "unintended consequences" by engaging with child rights experts, educators, adolescents and civil society organisations who work added.

scheme would ensure the donors' identity remained hidden from the beneficiaries.

Of the parties that submitted details to the poll body between May and July 2019, to comply with the Supreme Court's interim order dated April 12, 2019, eight revealed names of their donors.

These were the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), Janata Dal (Secular), Janata Dal (United), Samajwadi Party, Rashtriya Janata Dal, Sikkim Democratic Fund and All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK). The Congress's head office did not reveal names of donors but its Goa unit said it received ₹30 lakh from VM Salgaocar and Brother Pvt Ltd, a mining company, in April 2019.

In November 2023, while complying with the Supreme Court's order dated November 2, 2023, the number of such parties dwindled to six. The AIADMK, JD(S), and SDF gave details of donors again and the JD(S) was the only party to receive donations through bonds after its previous submission. Three other parties — Jammu & Kashmir National Conference, Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) and Maharashtrawadi Gomantak Party gave details of their donors in 2023 though they had not made any submissions in 2019.

Of the ₹656.5 crore that Tamil Nadu's ruling party DMK received between April 2019 and October 2023, ₹509 crore, or 77.5%, was donated by Future Gaming and Hotel Services Pvt Ltd, run by the Coimbatore-based Santiago Martin. Between April 12, 2019 and February 2024, the lottery firm bought bonds worth ₹1,368 crore, of which 37.2% was donated to the DMK.

In its submission to the poll body dated November 14, 2023, the DMK prefaced the details of the donors and wrote, "The Scheme also does not require the details of the donor to be furnished to the donee.

Under these circumstances the donors did not strictly adhere to the requirement of furnishing their details whenever they handed over the electoral bonds to us. Be that as it may, following the direction of Hon'ble Supreme Court, we contacted our donors and we were able to collect the details from them.'

The MGP got bonds worth ₹35 lakh from VM Salgaocar and Brother, and another ₹20 lakh from VS Dempo and Company Pvt Ltd, another mining and steel company in January 2022. In 2009, Vedanta-controlled Sesa Goa bought Dempo's mining operations.

Between April 12, 2019 and February 15, 2024, VM Salgaocar and Brother bought bonds worth ₹1.5 crore while an associated company, VM Salgaocar Corporation Private Limited bought bonds worth ₹4.45 crore. In the same duration, the chairperson of the Dempo Group, Srinivas Vasudev Dempo bought bonds worth ₹1.25 crore and three entities linked to Dempo -Dempo Industries Private Limited, Vasudeva Dempo Family Private Trust, and Dempo Private Limited Navhind Papers and Publications (which published The Navhind Times in Goa) — bought bonds worth ₹25 lakh.

Telangana-based Megha Engineering and Infrastructures Limited, which bought bonds worth ₹966 crore (without including bonds bought by its wholly owned subsidiaries) between April 12, 2019 and February 2024, of which it donated ₹105 crore or 10.9%. It also donated ₹50 crore to JD(S) in March 2019 and April 2023.

Most parties claimed in their submissions they had no information about the donors. Some others suggested they had the information but could not share it as their donors wished to remain anonymous.

In its submission dated May 27, 2019, the All India Trinamool Congress, while claiming that it did not have the details of its donors, wrote, "[M]ost of these bonds were sent to our office and dropped in the drop box or sent through messengers from various persons who wished to support our party, many of whom prefer to remain anonymous. Thus we are not in possession of the names and other details of the buyers."

The ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which has emerged as the biggest recipient of funds under the scheme and has accounted for the redemption of 50% of the value of all bonds redeemed, refused to give details of its donors in both the 2019 and 2023 submissions. In its July 6, 2019 submission, it said that under the Income Tax Act, 1961, political parties have been exempted from the need to maintain the details of donations received through electoral bonds. It reiterated, "It is

duly submitted that the Electoral Bonds were introduced with the aim of bringing only accounted for funds in political funding while protecting the donors from any consequences, therefrom."

To be sure, in a letter dated May 26, 2017, the then director of expenditure at the poll body, Vikram Batra had written to the secretary of the legislative department in the ministry of law and justice, expressing misgivings about the amendments to the IT Act through which the scheme was enabled.

"I am directed to draw your attention to the Finance Act, 2017, which has introduced certain amendments in the Income Tax Act, the Representation of the People Act 1951 and the Companies Act, 2013 and will have serious impact on Transparency aspect of political finance/funding of political parties," he had written.

The new documents showed that in at least one case, an electoral trust donated to a political party. India's largest electoral trust, the Prudent Electoral Trust, donated ten ₹10 lakh bonds for a total of ₹1 crore to the Rashtriya Janata Dal in April 2019.

Electoral trusts are mandated to report who contributes to them and which political parties the trust contributes to, but they do not specify which donor's donation was used as a contribution for which party. News agency Reuters recently identified 18 transactions between 2019 and 2022 in which eight corporate groups made large donations to the trust. Within days, Prudent issued cheques for the same amounts to the BJP. The Goa Forward Party, in

its May 2019 submission about electoral bonds, said it received a cheque of ₹50 lakh from Prudent Electoral Trust in its HDFC Bank account. To be sure, electoral bonds can be encashed by political parties only in their special accounts in the State Bank of India.

MODI IN ANDHRA

At his first rally in the state ahead of the summer's general elections, the Prime Minister said that the Opposition's alliance was one formed out of necessity and, without naming anyone, alleged that the Congress and the state's ruling YSR Congress Party led by chief minister Jagan Mohan Reddy were being run by the same family.

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led NDA takes everyone along, "but the Congress party's only agenda is to use and throw allies. Today, the Congress had to make the INDI alliance (INDIA bloc) out of necessity, but their mindset remains the same," the PM said at the "Praja Galam" (people's voice) rally at Boppudi village in Palnadu district of Andhra Pradesh.

Modi's thrust in southern India comes at a time when the BJP hopes to hold on to its Lok Sabha stronghold in Karnataka where it won 25 of 28 Lok Sabha seats in 2019, but also wants to expand its footprint in states where it has thus far had limited influence. In Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, which have a total of 101 parliamentary seats on offer, the BJP won four in 2019.

We managed to zero in on Kumar and found he was often seen in the Matiala area. A team was sent there and they caught him when he was spotted in the area with his stolen items. He was arrested on

Saturday," DCP Meena said. During interrogation, police learnt more details of Kumar's exploits, unearthing a trail of unsolved robberies, previous stints in jail, and a change in his modus operandi.

For instance, two days before against getting carried away by the Kotla Mubarakpur incident, Kumar stole a car engine in Okhla and fired at a man who tried to fend him off. As a result, police in the southeast district were also looking for him after the victim was severely injured, said a senior police officer who was not authorised to speak to

the media. Senior officers said Kumar would target multiple cars and car owners in the night and is an "expert" in breaking into cars. "Also, he was only stealing car parts and wasn't stealing the entire car. It is difficult to trace a thief who's not captured in CCTVs," an officer said.

Previously, Kumar's records revealed, he was involved in more than 40 cases of theft and robbery of car engines and parts. This was when he worked with gangs and associates. But they kept getting caught. He had been arrested at least 3-4 times, police said. So he decided to go his own way.

"He worked with a gang but they would often get caught. He was released in September last year and decided not to work with a gang to evade arrest. He thought working with other criminals would increase the risk of them being caught," said

the officer. Since September, DCP Meena said, Kumar had been operating as a lone wolf and committed over 200 robberies, adding that cases where he was involved were lodged across south Delhi, including Lajpat Nagar, RK Puram, Palam, Okhla, Hauz Khas, and Hazrat Nizamuddin.

"To prevent being attacked by the victim or the police, he started keeping two pistols. We have recovered them. According to the initial enquiry, he has fired at two people. We are checking if he has hurt others,' said the senior officer quoted earlier. Police also recovered from his residence in Matiala two hammers, keys, screwdrivers, a ring spanner, and other tools Kumar used to break into

Police said Kumar mainly targeted high-end cars and trucks since their engines sell for a good price. Based on Kumar's interrogation, police also arrested Mohammad Yamin from Chawri Bazaar. Yamin, police said, Yamin was the "receiver" of the stolen items and would sell the engines to workshops, car dealers and repair shops in Central

Kumar told police that he hails from the Farrukhabad, Uttar Pradesh, but left his village after he failed in class 10 in 2014. He then came to Delhi and began living in Matiala.

"He came to Delhi with a friend to get a job but wasn't able to earn much. He was hired as a security guard at a residential area. He also got addicted to drugs. To survive and buy more drugs, he decided to steal car engines. He and his friends would often get caught and sent to jail. After his release, he would go back to theft and robberies. Last year, he bought firearms and ammunition with his money and started targeting more people," another officer said.

Kumar's long string of burglaries is reminiscent the career of Devender Singh, better known as Bunty Chor, who was infamous for at least 500 burglaries across the country, with half of them in his hometown, Delhi. He had been arrested over a dozen times, escaped custody six times and convicted thrice - enough to inspire a Bollywood film.





BJP's new pitch for South India

Governance with an emphasis on battling corruption may be the theme of the NDA's campaign in the Opposition's backyard

ust as the Election Commission of India was announcing the polling dates, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was addressing rallies in Karnataka and Telangana, castigating the Opposition for corruption and dynastic politics. For Modi, southern India is the last frontier in his bid to expand the BJP's electoral footprint. The five states and the Union Territory of Puducherry, which elect 130 Lok Sabha members, have been resisting the BJP's political and ideological advancement— Karnataka, the only state in southern India to elect the BJP to office, is an exception. The party needs more seats from this region to ensure that it touches the 370 mark Modi has set, and for the "400 paar" (beyond 400 seats) slogan he has given to the NDA to be met. Having nearly saturated the gains from the rest of India, winning in the South is central to the BJP's Mandate 2024 plan.

Three factors are creating hurdles for the Modi juggernaut in the South: One, organisation; two, ideology; three, language. All three are connected. The southern states were born in the crucible of linguistic subnationalism, which allowed regional parties to flourish while limiting the appeal of the BJP and its unitarian agendas. Modi seems to recognise that Hindutva may not be enough to defeat linguistic subnationalism in the short run even if the government's muscular nationalism and Ram temple have found traction among a section of the electorate. Hence, he has been focussing on governance issues during his many recent, and frequent, trips to the southern states. He has spoken about welfare guarantees and the benefits of double-engine *sarkars*. Though regional parties have been pioneers of welfare politics, they have also been tainted by corruption allegations—the Karnataka BJP is no different. The governance pitch with emphasis on corruption, the BJP seems to think, is better suited to win the South, especially since hardline Hindutva failed to deliver in the Karnataka assembly polls last year.

The BJP has also done some smart alliance-building in Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka. In Telangana, where the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) is in a shambles after the assembly poll defeat and now the arrest of K Kavitha, the daughter of party founder K Chandrashekhar Rao, the BJP sees the scope for a bipolar contest, with the party pitted against the Congress. In a national election, this may turn out to be advantageous to the BJP.

In 2019, the BJP won just 29 of 130 LS seats in the South. It held a majority in Parliament even without these, but increasing the tally is essential to further diminish the Opposition.

A needed reform for digital competition

rith rising digitalisation of markets, the proposed Digital Competition Act (DCA) can provide a much-needed reform. Large digital markets have emerged in India, and can grow further given its mammoth internet-user population. These markets are dominated by a few players who operate on both the supply and demand sides. Their innovations often manifest as anti-competitive practices.

The 2002 Competition Act's ex post approach the regulator acts when abuse of dominance occurs —was adequate for the earlier, almost exclusively physical markets. But, digital markets need a different regulatory orientation, an ex ante approach to prevent the building of dominance as they are driven by network effects and get skewed much faster in favour of dominant players or incumbents. The ex post approach is simply ineffective here, with its time-consuming processes. Also, where the existing law does take an *ex ante* route, in approval of specific mergers by the Competition Commission of India (CCI), it doesn't impact the digital markets much—the acquisition of smaller start-ups by the hegemons often doesn't meet the thresholds for notification before the CCI.

Of course, digital markets have many avatars (the metaverse markets are different from plain vanilla platforms) and law can't always play catch-up. But, the current state of the digital markets needs a DCA-like fix. The Act must not prevent genuine competitive advances, but companies must realise their innovation can't be geared towards monopoly.

Another election nears with change in the air

The Kovind panel has proposed simultaneous polls. Any such change should factor in all possible consequences so that intention and outcome are in harmony

he Election Commission of India (ECI) has announced the schedule for the 18th general elections. Like last time, the commission will hold the poll in seven phases. Voting in the first phase, for 102 constituencies, will take place on April 19, and the last set of votes will be cast on June 1. The vacancies created in the ECI by the retirement of Anup Chandra Pandey (on February 14) and the resignation of Arun Goel (on March 9) possibly delayed the announcement of the general elections.

With the ECI announcement, the Model Code of Conduct kicked in. It prevents ministers from laying foundation stones for projects and the government from issuing advertisements highlighting its achievement at the cost of the public exchequer. The ECI timetable also provides the dates from which candidates must adhere to expenditure limits for their campaigns. In this election, Lok Sabha hopefuls can spend up to Rs 95 lakh in larger states and Rs 75 lakh in smaller states. Two days before voting in the seven phases, political parties and candidates must stop campaigning to give voters quiet time to decide before they vote.

The ECI will count the votes on June 4, and the results will be out on the same day. In the last four Lok Sabha elections (2004 to 2019), the gap between election announcement and result declaration was roughly 74 days. In 1999, when the general elections took place in September-October, this period lasted 86 days. One of the shortest gaps, of 66 days, was in the 1998 elections, which the ECI con-

ducted in four phases. This time, the gap will be 80 days. It will delay the constitution of the Arunachal Pradesh and Sikkim legislative assemblies – their terms end on June 2. There will be less time available for government formation in Andhra Pradesh (AP) and at the national level since the term of the AP legislature expires on June 11 and for the Lok Sabha on June 16.

Earlier this month, another significant development related to the general elections occurred. The high-level committee headed by former President Ram Nath Kovind submitted its One Nation One Election report. The committee suggested a framework for simultaneously holding the elections to the Lok Sabha and state legislative assemblies. It recommends that the process kick off from a specified date, after which the Lok Sabha will have its five-year tenure, which will be called its full term.

The term of individual state legislatures will end with the tenure of the Lok Sabha. This way, both elections will take place in a synchronised manner. After this specified date, if a government loses a no-confidence motion and resigns, then mid-term, elections will occur. The newly elected legislature will only be in office for the unexpired portion of the full five-year term.

The Kovind panel noted that simultaneous elections "will fundamentally transform the electoral process and overall governance. They will optimise scarce resources and encourage voters to participate in the electoral process

in larger numbers. Disruptions to governance and policy paralysis resulting from the application of the Model Code of Conduct and its adverse impact on economic growth will be mitigated". It is up to the next government to see which of the panel's recommendations it will want to take up.

But, before taking any policy action, it should undergo a careful evaluation to check whether it would fulfil its intended purpose. For example, it is common knowledge that candidates contesting elections spend beyond the expenditure limit. In this and earlier elections, parties have declared their candidates before the ECI announced the polls. This move allows candidates to start spending money before the ECI can start counting it towards their expenditure limit. Similarly, in a phased election, there is no question of a quiet period for voters. If campaigning stops in one area, the star campaigners of parties are moved to other regions. Traditional and new media then carry the message to the voters where polling will occur, defeating the purpose of the quiet period. These are



Nani Palkhiwala called elections the heartbeat of democracy. Therefore, any change in something so critical should avoid a surprise

two simple examples of well-intentioned actions failing in their purpose.

Policy actions can often have unintended consequences. Some can defeat the purpose of the action or have undesirable results. Robert Merton, a Harvard professor, examined this theory in a 1936 paper titled *The Unanticipated Consequences of Purposive Social Action*. He identified a few sources of unanticipated consequences, like ignorance, analytical errors, and the "imperious immediacy of interest". The last one refers to prioritising short-term gain over long-term consequences.

The mechanism proposed by the Kovind panel could also have unanticipated consequences. For example, legislators are already being horse-traded after polls where no political party gets a clear mandate. Will this trend become more pronounced when parties realise there will be a higher political cost if they do not seize the opportunity to form a government at the beginning of the five-year cycle? Would it increase political pressure on the Governor and the non-partisan office of the Speaker?

Under the proposed simultaneous polls scheme, a government that comes into power after a mid-term election will have a shorter tenure. What will be the incentive of such a government to take tough policy decisions when it will have less time to prove its governance record? It could resort to populist short-term measures to win the next election. Such midterm polls would reduce the time for legislatures to function. Since elections will have to be held again at the end of five years to maintain the synchronous calendar, it will not reduce but add to any perceived inefficiencies

caused by the polls.

Renowned jurist Nani Palkhiwala called elections the heartbeat of democracy. Therefore, any change in something so critical should avoid a surprise. The changes in our electoral system should be rigorously evaluated to ensure that the intention and the outcome are in harmony.

A Delhi-Tokyo-Seoul trilateral in the making

uring his back-to-back visits to Seoul and Tokyo recently, external affairs minister, S Jaishankar, set the tone and agenda for future cooperation with two of India's major partners in the Indo-Pacific. The visit was part of the 10th India-Republic of Korea Joint Commission Meeting (JCM) where Jaishankar met with Cho Taeyul, minister of foreign affairs of the Republic of Korea, and the 16th India-Japan Foreign Ministers Strategic Dialogue where Jaishankar engaged in discussions with the foreign minister of Japan, Yoko Kamikawa. Also on the agenda was participation in the first Raisina Roundtable@Tokyo organised jointly by the foreign ministries of India and Japan which brought together business leaders, think tanks, and academia, as part of Track II efforts to deepen bilateral ties and strengthen regional cooperation.

While India's relations with both Japan and South Korea have been important with the steady deepening of ties over the years, bilateral cooperation has witnessed a definitive upswing in recent times with an expansion in the scope of partnerships with both countries, laying the foundations of a potential trilateral framework of cooperation. Key aspects of New Delhi's partnership with Seoul include semiconductors, green hydrogen, nuclear capabilities, and critical and emerging technologies. With Tokyo, the focus is on defence and digital technologies, clean energy, high-speed rail, industrial competitiveness, and connectivity. Semi-

conductors and supply chain resilience are common aspects of cooperation that New Delhi wants to build upon.

Japan and South Korea play pivotal roles in India's Indo-Pacific outreach, contributing significantly to the region's strategic landscape across various dimensions. Seoul has demonstrated its intent to partner with other democratic and like-minded countries in the region under the broad architecture of the Indo-Pacific parrative



rary opportunities serves as a testament to India's commitment to adapting to emerging challenges and harnessing the potential for collaboration in key areas indicating the positioning of India as an important player in the global arena, ready to capitalise on emerging trends and navigate the complexities of the 21st century. It underscores a commitment to innovation, technological collaboration, and a proactive approach in shaping the future trajectory of India's relations

with South Korea and Japan. Over the course of 2022 and 2023, Tokyo and Seoul have undertaken gradual, yet intentional, steps to look beyond the difficulties that have strained their bilateral ties for decades. This shift reflects a recognition of the need to work together more effectively and collectively respond to regional opportunities and concerns signifying a maturing of diplomatic relations. From India's perspective, this evolving synergy holds immense significance as a more cohesive and cooperative East Asia translates into a more conducive environment for India. It opens the door for a revival of trilateral cooperation among the three countries, an idea that originated first in 2011 but had thus far been dormant. The political message in electoral bonds findings

n March 14, two days ahead of the announcement of general elections, the Election Commission of India (ECI) made public the data on electoral bonds it received from State Bank of India (SBI). Can this cause a political storm?

Before answering that question, let us look at the complete chain of events in the electoral bonds matter. The National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government led by Narendra Modi, in its first term, implemented the electoral bond scheme to "legalise" donations made to political parties. Even before the scheme was notified, the Opposition alleged that it was aimed at supporting the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). The Association for Democratic Reforms, which has worked for electoral reforms for years, approached the Supreme Court (SC) against the move. The court took seven yearsincluding the six years since the bond scheme was implemented-to deliver a verdict. In its February 15 order, the court

rejected the scheme as unconstitutional.

The data released on March 14 does not reveal the complete story. The first data set gives the name of the bond buyer, while the second gives details of the recipient parties. The linkages between the two are lacking. The SC has sent a notice to SBI asking why it didn't provide unique numbers linking

donors to their political contributions. Are some secrets waiting to be revealed in the coming days? Perhaps. But the story that has emerged so far is exciting in itself. Those expecting to see the names of industrial bigwigs benefiting from the government were disappointed. It is natural in such a situation to wonder what the more than 1,250 firms that purchased electoral bonds totalling ₹12,155 crore between April 12, 2019, and February 15, 2024, really do. What are their business interests? On top of the list is Future Gaming and Hotels Services Pvt. Ltd. It purchased bonds worth ₹1,368 crore. Megha Engineering and Infrastructure Ltd invested ₹966 crore, while Quick Supply Chain Pvt. Ltd bought bonds for ₹410 crore. Until today, the names of these companies have rarely been discussed by the public. Future Gaming, the largest contributor, runs a lottery business headquartered in Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu and was founded by Santiago Martin, a lottery king. Martin's story is astonishing. In his early days, he used to do petty jobs in Myanmar. In 1988, he returned home and opened a lottery firm, the success of which was beyond all expectations. Martin has often been the subject of controversy. Is he so pro-democracy that he purchased bonds worth over ₹1,300 crore from lottery money and donated it to political parties?

According to initial information, three of the top five bond buyers purchased the bonds following action taken by the Enforcement Directorate or the Income Tax department. Also, the first 20 donors bought bonds worth ₹5,830 crore, representing 48% of the overall transaction. Which parties were given these bonds?

Data shows the BJP has received 47.5% of total donations, the Trinamool Congress 12.6%, and the Congress 11.1%. Bharat Rashtra Samithi, led by K Chandrashekar Rao, finished fourth with ₹1,215 crore, while the Biju Janata Dal ranks fifth, with ₹776 crore.

If you ask anyone which is the second largest political party after the BJP, the majority would say the Congress. Oddly, the Congress is third while Mamata Banerjee's TMC, in power only in West Bengal, is second. The question also arises as to how the parties running relatively small states such as Telangana and Odisha rose to fourth and fifth place, respectively. Information available so far shows the majority of bond purchases have been made by businesses that needed government assistance. Is this money spent to further personal gain? We'll have to wait a few more days for an answer

Finally, let us return to the question raised in the beginning. It will be intriguing how the Opposition leverages this matter in the upcoming election. Given that all parties were involved in the game, simply proclaiming one's innocence can potentially lead to complications. This scenario presents a collective predicament, in which both donors and recipients find themselves in an equally awkward position.

JERUSALEM/GAZA STRIP: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu vowed on Sunday to send ground forces into Gaza's southern Rafah city despite international fears for the fate of Palestinian civilians sheltering there.

The right-wing premier, whose security and war cabinets were also due to discuss latest international efforts towards a truce deal, stressed that "no amount of international pressure will stop us from realising all the goals of the war".

"To do this, we will also operate in Rafah," he told a cabinet meeting, before he was set to meet visiting German Chancellor Olaf Scholz for talks on the war raging since Hamas militants attacked Israel from Gaza on October 7.

His comments came as talks were expected to resume in Doha towards a truce in Gaza, where Israel has pursued a campaign against Hamas militants for more than five months.

International envoys were planning to meet in Qatar to revive stalled talks for a ceasefire and hostage release deal.

A Hamas proposal calls for an Israeli withdrawal from "all cities and populated areas" in Gaza during a six-week truce and for more humanitarian aid, according to an official from the

Palestinian group. Israel has repeatedly threatened to launch a ground offensive against Hamas in Rafah, now home to nearly 1.5 million mostly displaced Gazans sheltering near the Egyptian border.

US President Joe Biden, who has backed Israel during the war, has said an invasion of Rafah would be a "red line" unless credible civilian protection plans are in place.

Washington, which provides Israel with billions of dollars in military assistance, has said it cannot support a Rafah operation without a "credible, achievable, executable plan" to shelter civilians.

UN World Health Organisation chief Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus urged Israel "in the name of humanity" not to launch a Rafah invasion, warning that "this humanitarian catastrophe must not be allowed to worsen".

AT LEAST 21 DEAD **IN AFGHANISTAN AS BUS COLLIDES** WITH TANKER, **38 INJURED**

LASHKAR GAH, AFGHANISTAN: At least 21 people were killed and 38 injured on Sunday when a bus collided with a fuel tanker truck and burst into flames in southern Afghanistan.

"Twenty-one people were killed... in a traffic accident between a passenger bus, a tanker and a motorbike" on a main highway through Grishk district in southern Helmand province, Mohammad Qasim Riyaz, a spokesman for the provincial governor, told AFP.

Of the 38 people injured, 11 were seriously hurt, according to the provincial information department.

The accident occurred in the early hours of the morning on a key highway that sees traffic between the western city of Herat through southern provinces to the capital Kabul, provincial officials said.


The passenger bus was travelling from Herat to Kabul when it first collided with a motorbike carrying two people, killing both riders, Helmand traffic management officials said, according to the information department.

The bus driver lost control and crashed with a tanker truck travelling in the opposite direction, sparking a fire. The accident killed three peo-

ple on the tanker and 16 bus passengers. Taliban government spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid

expressed regret over the accident and wished the injured a quick recovery, in a post on X.

"We seriously ask drivers to be careful while driving and to follow traffic rules," he said.

Trump warns of bloodbath' if he is not elected as prez

OHIO: Donald Trump told a rally in Ohio on Saturday that November's presidential election will be the "most important date" in US history, painting his campaign for the White House as a turning point for the country.

Days after securing his position as the presumptive Republican nominee, the former president also warned of a "bloodbath" if he is not elected though it was not clear what he was referring to, with the remark coming in the middle of comments about threats to the US auto industry.

"The date — remember this, November 5 - I believe it's going to be the most important date in the history of our country," the 77-year-old told rallygoers in Vandalia, Ohio, repeating well-worn criticisms that his rival, President Joe Biden, is the "worst" president.

Criticising what he said were Chinese plans to build cars in Mexico and sell them to Americans, he stated: "We're going to put a 100% tariff on every single car that comes across the line, and you're not going to be able to sell those cars if I get elected."

"Now if I don't get elected it's going to be a bloodbath for the whole — that's going to be the least of it, it's going to be a bloodbath for the country. That'll be the least of it. But they're not going to sell those cars."

As Trump's comment gained traction on social media, Biden's campaign released a statement calling the Republican a "loser" at the ballot box in 2020 who then "doubles down on his threats of political violence". "He wants another January 6 but the American people are going to give him another electoral defeat this November because they continue to reject his extremism, his affection for violence, and his thirst for trended more strongly Republirevenge," the campaign said, referring to the deadly attack on

the US Capitol by Trump supporters in 2021.

Earlier this month, Trump and Biden each won enough delegates to clinch their party nominations in the 2024 presidential race, all but assuring a rematch and setting up one of the longest election campaigns in US history.

Among the issues Trump is campaigning on is sweeping reform of what he calls Biden's "horror show" immigration policies, despite the ex-president successfully pressuring Republicans to block a bill in Congress that included the toughest border security measures in dec-

On Saturday, Trump invoked the border again as he reached out to minorities who have traditionally voted Democrat.

He said Biden had "repeatedly stabbed African-American voters in the back" by granting work permits to "millions" of immigrants, warning that they and Hispanic Americans "are going to be the ones that suffer the most.'

For decades Ohio had been seen as a bellwether battleground state, though it has can since Trump's White House win in 2016.

BIDEN ROASTS **EX-PREZ TRUMP** AT WASHINGTON PRESS DINNER

WASHINGTON: US President Joe Biden joked about Donald Trump and his own age at an annual media dinner on Saturday - before unloading deadly serious criticisms of his rival in November's election.

"One candidate's too old and mentally unfit to be president," the 81-year-old Democrat quipped at the Gridiron Club in Washington. "The other guy's

Democrat Biden was making his first speech as president at the annual white tie gala for the US media and political elite, an event that Republican former president Trump addressed in

2018. He also backed journalists whom Trump has repeatedly attacked, adding: "You are not the enemy of the people. You are a pillar of any free society."

Biden is trailing in a number of polls and faces voters concerns about his age, which he has tried to address by highlighting 77-year-old Trump's recent verbal slip-ups.



Centre to procure masur, tur directly from farmers

600,000 tonnes of dal procurement comes against the backdrop of falling govt stocks

NEW DELHI: The Centre plans to procure 400,000 tonnes of raw tur dal and 200,000 tonnes of masur dal directly from farmers at the minimum assured procurement price (MAPP) or at the dynamic buffer procurement price (DBPP), whichever is higher, to boost stocks, a senior official told Mint.

The MAPP is the weighted average price of previous three trading days in a district, while the DBPP is the weighted average price of the day of procurement, three previous days and three subsequent trading days.

The MAPP and the DBPP are the weighted average of the modal price (70% weightage) and maximum price (30% weightage).

This comes against the backrop of falling government buffer stocks amid firm market prices caused by lower production of some pulses, including tur.

While raw tur in key markets of the top growing regions of Maharashtra, Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh is being sold at ₹10,300-10,600 a quintal as compared with the MSP of ₹7,000 per quintal, the all-India average tur price in the retail market is as high as 32.4% on-year at ₹150.2 a kg.

However, the masur price in major mandis is hovering in the range of ₹5,900-5,950 per quintal as compared to its MSP of ₹6,425 a quintal and ₹93.6 per kg, an increase of 0.3% on-month and 1.2% on-year.

Inflation in pulses eased to 18.9% in February from 19.5% in January; however, it was as low as 4.1% a year ago.

With the firm prices, the central stock as of 28 February had depleted to a little over 1.97 million tonnes against the buffer norm of 3.1 mt. This includes about 36,000 tonnes of tur and 616,000 tonnes of masur stock compared to 1 mt and 600,000 tonnes norm, respectively.

Coal inventory may hit 155mt by FY24: coal secy

NEW DELHI: Coal stocks across power plants in the country will be enough to meet the anticipated surge in power demand in the upcoming summer, according to Amrit Lal Meena, secretary, union ministry of coal.

In an interview, he said the accretion of coal stock at plants will continue even during the summer and monsoon, in contrast to last year's depletion.

Total coal stocks may touch 155 million tonnes by the end of the fiscal, against 125mt last year, he added.

Noting that since November coal stocks at thermal plants have increased at a rapid pace, he said daily coal stock accretion stood at about 194,000 tonnes in the second half of February, compared with 26,000 tonnes in the corresponding period of last

Similarly in the first half of

March, stocks grew by about 209,000 tonnes, compared with a depletion of 42,000 tonnes during the corresponding period of the last fiscal as temperatures rose in March last year.

"In the first 15 days of March last year, depletion of coal stock started because temperatures had increased. But this year, it has increased by 200,000 tonnes per day. This trend will continue, because capacity has increased significantly, both for production

and transportation. There is not much chance for depletion during April, May and June. This trend will continue even in monsoons," Meena said. However, the rate of daily increase in stocks may slow down in the monsoons.

Usually, with high power demand and coal consumption by plants, stocks at the plant-end deplete during the summers, while monsoon rain impacts both production and transportation of the mineral, adding to the fall in inventory.

The remark on having a healthy coal stock position in the high demand period gains significance as the union ministry of power has directed power generating companies to continue blending 6% imported coal till June amid projections of high power demand and concerns over logistical issues.

The peak power demand in the next fiscal is expected touch 260 GW, a new high, and way above the 243 GW hit last year.

SMARTPHONE EXPORTS FROM INDIA TO US REACH \$3.5 BN

NEW DELHI: India's smartphone exports to the US jumped to USD 3.53 billion in April-December this fiscal against \$998 million in the same period last year, according to the Commerce Ministry data.

The increasing outbound shipments led to an increase in the smartphones' market share to 7.76 per cent during April-December this fiscal from 2 per cent in the same period of last year, the data showed.

Increasing exports have made India the third-biggest smartphone exporter to the US.

An official said that an increase in overall smartphone production has helped in pushing exports.

During the nine-month period of this fiscal, the share of China and Vietnam declined. The US smartphone imports from the top five suppliers also declined during April-December to \$45.1 billion from \$49.1 billion in FY'23.China exported \$35.1 billion worth of smartphones to the US market in April-December, down from \$38.26 billion last year. Vietnam's shipments of phones declined to \$5.47 billion in April-December 2023 from \$9.36 billion in the same period of the previous year. Other two major smartphone exporters to the US are South Korea and

Hong Kong. South Korea's exports to America during the period under review increased to \$858 million from \$432 million, while Hong Kong's sales are down to \$112 million from \$132 million in

April-December 2022-23. Smartphones started registering their presence in the Indian export basket in 2022-23 when shipments touched \$10.95 billion. With the continued momentum, exports have touched \$10.5 billion in April-December 2023-24.

India may soften stand on UK FTA

NEW DELHI: India is contemplating softening its stand on some of the contentious issues that have held up a free trade agreement with the UK, according to two people aware of the matter who expect the UK to do the same.

Both countries have underscored the significance of finding a "feasible solution" to speed up the process, they added.

"India is planning to soften its stand on some of the sticky issues in the trade negotiations with the UK. A similar approach is expected from its counterpart, without compromising their interests," one of the two people said, seeking anonymity. Signing the bilateral trade deal holds equal importance for both nations, he added.

India and the UK initiated FTA discussions in January 2022 to bolster the economic ties. Now,

they are in the midst of the 14th and what is expected to be the final round of discussions, which began on 10 January.

However, talks are currently on hold, and are expected to resume only after the Lok Sabha elections. Both countries are actively working towards a fair and balanced agreement, and are in favour of closing the deal at the earliest, considering its significance for both the economies, the second person said.





ADANI TO INVEST \$14 BN IN FY25 **ACROSS ITS COS**

NEW DELHI: Adani group plans to invest more than ₹1.2 lakh crore (about \$14 billion) across its portfolio companies that range from ports to energy, airports, commodities, cement and media in fiscal year starting April 1, as it doubles down on its \$100 billion investment guidance over the next 7-10 years to grow

businesses, sources said. The projected capital expenditure or capex for 2024-25 (April 2024 to March 2025) fiscal is 40% higher than what the portfolio is estimated to have incurred in FY24. According to analysts, the portfolio is estimated to have incurred a capex of around \$10 billion in FY24 that ends on March 31.

Sources said these investments will set the stage for exponential profit growth.

The group had previously guided a \$100 billion capex over the next 7-10 years. Most of this investment is going to go into group fast growing businesses renewable, green hydrogen and airports. As much as 70% of the planned capex will go into its green portfolio and of the remaining 30%, the majority will be spent towards airports and ports businesses, they said.



Mandhana helps RCB end barren run in T20 leagues

Delhi Capitals lose their second WPL final in a row after a batting collapse with RCB winning the final at Kotla by 8 wickets

NEW DELHI: The wait is over for Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB). The much-loved, much-debated franchise with the biggest stars and glitziest ad campaigns finally has a title, and it has taken them 16 years to get here. RCB Women have taken only a second edition of the Women's Premier League to come up victorious

Anil Kumble couldn't do it in 2009, Daniel Vettori in 2011, Virat Kohli in 2016. On a starlit Sunday night, cheered madly by a vociferous 29,000-strong crowd that had descended on the Ferozeshah Kotla in a sea of Delhi Capitals blue, the unassuming Smriti Mandhana took RCB to their first ever

title, beating the home favourites, league toppers and last edition's finalists with eight wickets and three balls remaining.

Having restricted DC to 113 runs inside 19 overs, RCB endured a few nervous moments in the chase, but a target of 114 was never going to realistically test them. Their ultra-defensive, safety-first approach meant the what should have been a sub run-a-ball

chase petered out in the middle overs, leaving them to go at seven an over in the last four overs. Importantly for them, RCB had Ellyse Perry in the middle to shepherd them through the defining phase.

Needing 19 off the last three overs, Perry found the crucial boundary off Jess Jonassen to bring the equation down to under run-a-ball going into the last two overs. Another four off Alice Capsey in the next over all but sealed the deal but RCB still

needed five off the last over. Arundhati Reddy conceded singles off the first two balls but when Richa Ghosh swung her length ball over cover for the winning hit, Kotla rose in unison,

reverberating with chants for the winners.

> While Ghosh and Perry deservedly took the late glory, RCB's win was forged on the back of some exemplary middle overs bowling that, not for the first time this season, proved to be more than the sum of its parts.

> Coming into Sunday's final, no RCB bowler featured among the top five wicket takers of

the season, a list that had three DC bowlers led by South Africa's Marizanne Kapp (11 wickets). By the time the DC innings met its premature end, the RCB trio of Shreyanka Patil, Asha Shobhana and Sophie Molineux had all

zoomed past Kapp's tally. The three spinners produced a combined haul of 46/9 in 11 overs. breaking the back of DC batting and all but sealing RCB's date with history at the halfway.

DC got off to a flier thanks to a typically fearless 27-ball 44 from opener Shafali Verma. The belligerent 20-year-old lived up to her reputation on the big night, making full use of the field restrictions to pummel Renuka Singh, Perry

IPL is a game changer that keeps delivering

uring the recent assembly elections, a political party's manifesto promised to bring IPL to the state. The cricket loving party lost, and fans missed out, but the public declaration confirms that IPL is huge; and riding on its runaway success, India is cricket's undisputed global boss. When it started, people

thought IPL was a disruptor which gave cricket a solid shake. Today, it is seen as a turning point in cricket's growth. IPL broke new ground because with it came private ownership, the (visible) owner/ investor and the (invisible) market forces that determined the commercial value of players. In one stroke, the traditional ladder (junior to Ranji to Tests) was discarded and the traditional selection process went for a toss. The fate of cricketers was now in the hands of the person who moved the paddle in the IPL auction room.

The league's most profound impact has been on cricket's commerce. BCCI, owner of the league, makes heaps of money from media rights, franchise fee (Lucknow Super Giant pays ₹709 crore each year) and the 20% share of revenue (the top line) from the original eight teams. Team owners are also in a happy space because business is risk free, return of investment is great and profits are guaranteed. Commercially, in IPL there is no play and miss.

In IPL, all is well for all, all the time. Player Sensex is at an all-time high after Hardik Pan-

dya's move to Mumbai Indians. Others too have hit paydirt, the latest to luck out being Uttar Pradesh's Sameer Rizvi (₹8.4 crore) and Jharkhand's Kumar Kushagra (₹7.2 crore) and Vidarbha's Shubham Dubey (₹5.8 crore).

As IPL is the fast track to fame and riches, young players have signed up with agents to secure 'placements'. Due to IPL, players are better prepared and ready, good enough to succeed even in the longer format.

Cricket underwent a corporate changeover as well. Professional CEOs are hired to build the brand and deliver a positive balance sheet. The data analyst helps unearth talent, hires players and shapes team strategy. IPL team meetings are slick affairs with serious presentations made by experts.

Some dismiss this as unnecessary noise created by support staff wanting to appear busy. True to an extent, but there is no denying that many good practices have come into Ranji Trophy and domestic red-ball cricket is more professional.

IPL has made cricket open, allowing talented kids to force their way up. Looking at the larger picture, it has stretched the boundary and altered cricket in so many ways. That is why its template (cricket/commerce/entertainment cocktail) is a hit worldwide.

Cricket is currently struggling to adjust to the landslide support for T20 cricket. Initially, when the calendar got crowded, it was seen as a scheduling issue and traditional cricket tried to adjust to the new leagues. But now, with South Africa giving priority to its league over Tests, it's clear that T20 is the favoured option for all stakeholders.

India calling the shots because of IPL's influence is understandable. That it generates more money than the rest of the cricket world is known. What is not is that India has the biggest cricket set up in the world -- more matches (across age groups) than the rest of the world put together. While Australia and SA have 6 first-class teams, and England 18, India had 38 with more than 1,000 first-class players. In size, scale and scope, India is far ahead of others.

Today, thanks to IPL, India has muscle and does not hesitate to use it. When ICC was dividing its income among members, India demanded and got its fair share. In the next financial cycle, India is to receive \$230 million annually, nearly 40% of ICC's yearly global revenue. The next best is England with 7%.

Gulveer shatters 10,000m natl mark

NEW DELHI: 453 days. That's how long it would have been since Rishabh Pant played a competitive game when he turns out for Delhi Capitals in their opening IPL game against Punjab Kings in Mullanpur, Mohali on March 23. Or more appropriately, that's how quickly Pant will have man-

aged to stage a comeback. To first appreciate how miraculous a recovery this has been, a

flashback to the wee hours of December 30, 2022, is needed when Pant, driving from Delhi to meet his mother in Roorkee, suffered a horrific road accident that saw his car go up in flames and his body soaked in blood. By the time the grim news broke out that morning, cricket was farthest from anyone's mind because it was clear that Pant, then 25, had narrowly escaped

death. Two knee reconstruction procedures, a plastic surgery and countless rehab, strength and training sessions later, here we are — Pant, wearing 120 stitches across his forehead, has challenged the 18-month timeline orthopaedic specialist Dr Dinshaw Pardiwala, who operated on his right knee, had set for his return by getting back in 14 months.

From being bedridden in the initial weeks to walking with crutches to gradually getting back to training to now reaching a position where he's hoping to entertain crowds again with bat and gloves, Pant has pulled off a feat just as unbelievable as some of his stupendous knocks in a career that was hitting its peak when the accident occurred.

A long hiatus of this nature can break many strong individuals, but Pant is upbeat and back to flashing that wicked smile again, knowing that this is a second chance in life as well as cricket that he should enjoy and embrace wholeheartedly. Even a month ago, Pant's

immediate cricketing future seemed riddled with uncertainty given the reports that were swirling. Delhi Capitals co-owner Parth Jindal had gone on record to say Pant will only play as a batter during the first half of the IPL season. This was following the suggestions from officials

For example, he is the only Indian wicketkeeper-batter with Test hundreds in England, Australia and South Africa. His unbeaten 89 against Australia at the Gabba in 2021, which landed India a landmark series win, is a knock that will go down in history as one of the greatest in the fourth innings of a Test.

While Pant has gratitude for simply being able to return to the field, it will be a travesty to his immense talent if he's unable to conjure the magic that made him stand out. And in the coming weeks, that's the battle he faces. Can Pant be the cricketer he was?

From the short social media clips that Pant and DC have been sharing of his batting, he still has

the leg side, the bludgeons down the ground and the range of sweeps and paddles that can send captains into a tizzy about the fields to set. The caveat is these are just practice sessions, and a more accurate assessment of his readiness can only be arrived at in the heat of the battle.

Even if he rediscovers that special touch with the willow, the work behind the stumps is bound to ask questions of his right knee

Sharma — he runs the late Tarak Sinha's Sonnet Club in Delhi and is regarded as an "elder brother" by Pant — says: "It is difficult to keep wicket after a knee surgery. The challenge as a keeper is to go up and down constantly. Even when the ball doesn't come to you, you have to go up and down for 120 balls in a T20. And there are sideways movements as well. If your knee isn't right, keeping is impossible."

It is indicative of Pant's resolve that he hasn't wavered from his determination to return as a keeper-batter. "He met me last week and we spoke for about five hours," Sharma said. "He is confident that keeping won't be a problem. He told me, I will keep and play all the matches. This impact player talk is meaningless. I am absolutely fit.' He is mentally very strong. He told me that his aim is to start off where he had finished. He has his mind set on the T20 World Cup."

While Pant's positive attitude is just what we've come to expect, it is essential that the decisionmakers take things easy with the 26-year-old. Having missed last year's ODI World Cup and the recent Test series against England, Pant will be understandably eager to make up for lost time. Even as we marvel at his imminent return, however, it is important that a pragmatic roadmap is charted out. That will benefit both Pant and Indian cricket in the long run.

MUMBAI: At around 9am on Sunday as she was being discharged from a hospital in Indore, India women's No. 5 tennis pro Shrivalli Bhamidipaty had a chat over phone with coach Vishal Uppal. "I asked her how are you feeling. She said I'm feeling terrible," Uppal said. "I then asked her what are you thinking. She said I'm thinking how can I beat Dalila (Jakupovic)."

At 10.30am, Shrivalli stood across Jakupovic to play the singles final of the ITF women's event after spending the night in hospital with high fever, food poisoning and heat stroke. She lost 6-3, 6-2 to the Slovenian second seed but after being on multiple IV drips, antibiotics and paracetamol all night, turning up and finishing the match showed something beyond the result for Uppal. "The fact that she stepped on the court told me that she is a fighter and is hungry in the mind," the former Davis

Cupper and Fed Cup captain said. "I wanted to give it a shot, and for her (Jakupovic) to earn the win," Shrivalli said. Withdrawing would perhaps have been the easier option (one that has been taken countless times on the pro tour). but not once did Shrivalli entertain the thought. "Throughout the night, I was stressed about not being able to play the final, but I didn't want to not turn up. I thought about the organisers who were so supportive, the spectators and the little girls who would see

me play," she said. The 22-year-old, who had reached the second round of the WTA Mumbai Open last month as a qualifier stunning world No.94

It was after the doubles final on Saturday that Shrivalli could barely stand. She had felt sick for a couple of days, 103F temperature, vomiting and diarrhoea after playing most of her matches in the afternoons. All of which got worse on Saturday evening. "She was also shivering quite a bit, so we decided to get her admitted to a hospital," her father BRN Prasad said.

The bottles of drips through the night infused some fluids back into her system even as antibiotics took care of the fever. Shrivalli woke up deciding to step on court against the world No.213, but apart from the serves and returns, her on-court movement was hardly the same. She had nine break point opportunities but could convert just one. "I couldn't move much on the court. My body had lost a lot of fluids and it was also heavy from all the medication. I just felt a lot weaker," she said.






