ED arrests Delhi CM days after it linked him to ₹100 cr kickbacks in excise case

NEW DELHI, MARCH 21

ARVIND KEJRIWAL, whose campaign against corruption in 2011 birthed the Aam Aadmi Party and paved the way for his ascension as Delhi's Chief Minister. was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate Thursday night in connection with the Delhi excise policy case.

He became the first serving Chief Minister to be arrested, after months of skipping summons by the investigation agency — nine in total — and calling them "illegal".

His arrest came hours after the Delhi High Court declined to grant Kejriwal interim protection from coercive action by the ED. The case pertains to alleged

PUSHED AND prodded by the

Supreme Court, the State Bank of India (SBI), which had sought time until June 30, revealed telling data on electoral bonds Thursday – from donor details to parties that redeemed the bonds, including the unique alphanumeric codes that link donors to beneficiaries.

A scrutiny of the data published by the Election Commission of India reveals that the top 10 of the total 487 donors to the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party account for Rs 2,119 crore, which is 35 per cent of the party's electoral bond kitty of Rs 6,060 crore encashed since April 2019, the largest amongst all parties.

This data, published by ECI after SBI filed a compliance affidavit as directed by the top court, represents the largest disclosure regarding the controversial scheme that guaranteed absolute anonymity to donors. The CONTINUED ON PAGE 2



Shortly after 4 pm, information began to emerge that the ED had sought information from the Delhi Police about security arrangements around the CM's residence. "Queries included whether there is a rear entry/exit at his Civil Lines home, and how many party workers were present outside," a senior police officer said.

"Messages were shared with officers of the North district and security wing. Two things were conveyed – that he was at home and that there is a gate in the backyard. A security plan was prepared and higher-ups told personnel not to share information about the raid. Police personnel were asked to reach his house and the Rapid Action Force was called to manage the crowd," the officer said.

An officer said there had been instances in the past when party workers gathered in large numbers when the ED went to serve summons to Kejriwal which is why extra caution was taken to ensure the plan re-

"After all the arrangements were made by the Delhi Police, a message was conveyed that the ED team could come and ques-

tion the CM," the officer said. "Following questioning, the ED team decided to arrest Kejriwal after seeking legal opinion," the officer said.

In a statement later, AAP minister Saurabh Bharadwaj said, "Every corner of the CM's residence was searched, and the ED got Rs 70,000 in cash, which it returned."

Outside, the crowd had been swelling. With hundreds of party workers and MLAs blocking the entry and exit points from Kejriwal's home, the ED, despite arresting Kejriwal at 9 pm, could not take him out of his house for another two hours. He was then escorted to the ED headquarters.

Dozens of protesters, including MLAs Rakhi Bidlan, Sanjeev Jha and Jarnail Singh, were detained. Also in the crowd were Delhi Congress chief Arvinder Singh Lovely and senior leader Sandeep Dikshit. The AAP and Congress have tied up in the national capital. "We are firmly

with our alliance partner. This arrest is blatant and unconstitutional," Lovely said.

The AAP, meanwhile, decided to knock on the Supreme Court doors – its legal team rushed to the Registrar's home hoping for a late-night hearing. The top court, however, said it would hear the matter on Friday.

With its founder and chief arrested, the AAP said Kejriwal "is and will remain Chief Minister". "He will not resign," said party leader and Delhi minister Atishi. Punjab Chief Minister, AAP's

Bhagwant Mann, in a post on so-

cial media, said, "The BJP's polit-

ical team (ED) cannot arrest

Kejriwal's ideology... because

only AAP can stop BJP. Ideology can never be suppressed." At a press conference a little before midnight, AAP minister Gopal Rai said, "If Arvind Kejriwal can be arrested, anyone can be arrested. BJP is scared of losing the polls – it will come down from 400 to 40 seats." The party asked its workers to head home for the night, and gather at the party office on Friday

While Kejriwal was not named in the FIRs registered by

the ED or the CBI in the Delhi excise policy case, his name first found a mention in the ED's chargesheet wherein the agency claimed that he allegedly spoke to one of the main accused, Sameer Mahendru, in a video call and asked him to continue working with co-accused Vijay

The second reference to Kejriwal was made in a press release issued by the ED on Monday, wherein it called him a "conspirator" in the case. This followed the arrest of K Kavitha, a BRS leader and daughter of former Telangana CM K Chandrashekar Rao, in the case. The ED has alleged Kavitha is part of the "South group" that paid money to get undue benefits under the now-scrapped policy. "ED investigation revealed that Kavitha along with others conspired with the top leaders of AAP including Arvind Kejriwal and Manish Sisodia for getting favours in the Delhi Excise policy formulation and implementation. In exchange for these favours, she was involved in paying Rs 100 crore to the leaders of AAP," the ED alleged.

CCTV footage from the store, along with footage from Bengaluru where the suspect is seen without a mask in a public bus, has provided a clearer picture of the identity of the suspect, multiple sources familiar with the probe said.

According to police sources, the man, in all probability, is Musavir Hussain Shazib, a missing suspect from the Shivamogga module of the Islamic State, who has been on the radar of investigative agencies since January 2020 and carries a Rs 5 lakh reward by the National Investigation Agency

The IED went off at 12.56 pm on March 1, an hour after the suspect was at the cafe for barely nine minutes – between 11.35 am and 11.44 am. The CCTV trail of the suspect from public buses and street cameras – after his exit from the cafe – showed him entering a religious place and later boarding a bus without the cap and shirt he wore to the cafe.

The CCTV trail had first taken investigators till Ballari in north Karnataka, where the man could be seen at a bus stop around 9 pm. Parameshwara had also said on March 7 that "the accused changed clothes and travelled by

BJP has got Rs 227 crore from Vedanta Ltd, a company that figures among the top five donors of the Congress too. ED had claimed that it had evidence related to Vedanta Group's alleged involvement in the bribe-forvisa case where certain Chinese nationals were given visas by alleged bending of rules.

opposition party was not enough for the 'asuri shakti' now the arrest of the elected Chief Ministers has also become a common thing. INDIA will give a befitting reply to this," Rahul said.

Kharge said "the arrogant BJP, which makes false claims of victory every day, is trying to weaken the opposition by illegal means before the elections. If there was real confidence of victory then the accounts of the main opposition party, Congress Party, would not have been frozen by misusing the constitutional institutions. Leaders of opposition parties are not targeted right before the elections. The truth is that BJP is scared of the upcoming election results and in panic is creating all kinds of problems for the opposition."

That the Lok Sabha elections are knocking on the door is the key imperative but the larger message that the Opposition parties want to convey, many of its leaders said, is that the Modi government is hellbent on squeezing its political rivals to ensure an "Oppositionfree" campaign. And Kejriwal's arrest was meant to "silence his voice during the campaign."

Earlier in the day, the top three of the Congress -- Kharge, Sonia Gandhi and Rahul -- had come out accusing the government of crippling it financially by freezing its bank accounts. The refrain of the opposition

leaders was that the BJP, despite its claim of securing a third term with an improved tally, is unsure of its victory and hence is targeting the Opposition. Kejriwal, after all, is not Hemant Soren or BRS leader K Kavitha or for that matter Manish Sisodia or Sanjay Singh. The opposition is hoping that his arrest in the excise policy scam, days after the election schedule was announced, sends a signal to the electorate of the Centre's strong-arm politics.

Emerging on the political scene as an anti-graft crusader a little over a decade ago, labelling almost every established political party and many of its well0-entrenched leaders as corrupt, Kejriwal, then the quintessential outsider, is now one of the lynchpins of the anti-BJP opposition bloc, having forged close relationships with many of its leading lights and alliances with parties including the Congress.

His arrest will also effectively keep him out of the Lok Sabha election campaign trial, robbing the opposition of a potent national voice, who takes on the BJP aggressively on its nationalism pitch -- his framing the CAA, for instance, as hurting young citizens along with his school-mohalla clinic governance pitch.

Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan called Kejriwal's arrest "outright vicious and part of a callous plot to silence all opposition voices just ahead of the general

elections." He said the move "exposes the cowardice of those who fear democratic process and calls for collective action to resist abuse of power."

His Tamil Nadu counterpart M K Stalin called the BJP government fascist. "Not a single BJP leader faces scrutiny or arrest, laying bare their abuse of power and the decay of democracy. The relentless persecution of opposition leaders by the BJP Govt smacks of a desperate witch-hunt. This tyranny ignites public fury, unmasking BJP's true colours. But their futile arrests only fuel our resolve, fortifying the INDIA alliance's march to victory. BJP, brace for the people's wrath," Stalin said.

The Trinamool Congress, NCP, Samajwadi Party and the Left, too, slammed the arrest.

"We vehemently condemn

the arrest of Arvind Kejriwal, an elected CM, especially when EC is in charge & MCC is in place. Earlier his administrative powers were snatched through an illegal ordinance. How can we expect fair elections in India if sitting CMs & prominent opposition leaders are arrested weeks before polls? If SC & ECI fail to act now, who will stand with people against BJP's oppressive politics in future?' said senior TMC leader Derek O'Brien.

He said if the "chiefs of political parties, Chief Ministers, political leaders, election agents, workers, every opponent -- being harassed & arrested like this...what will be the fate of our precious democracy."

Akhilesh Yadav was scathing "Those who are themselves imprisoned in the fear of defeat...What will 'they' do by imprisoning someone else? The BIP knows that it will not come to power again. Due to this fear, it wants to remove the opposition leaders from the public by any means at the time of elections. Arrest is just an excuse. This arrest will give birth to a new people's revolution," Yadav said. Condemning what he called

"vindictive misuse of Central agencies to target the opposition especially as general elections loom," NCP chief Sharad Pawar said the "arrest showcases the depth to which BJP will stoop for power." The INDIA alliance, he said, stands united against this unconstitutional action. CPM general secretary Sitaram Yechury claimed that BIP and Prime Minister Narendra Modi are in "panic" over their impending rejection by people in the Lok Sabha polls. People's Democratic Party (PDP) president Mehbooba Mufti said Kejriwal's arrest reeks of political vendetta and growing authoritarianism. "The arbitrary arrest of yet another CM by ED reeks of political vendetta and growing authoritarianism," the former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister said.

For Tamil Nadu Minister Senthil Balaji, arrested by the Enforcement Directorate in June last year, the Madras High Court in January asked how he could continue to be a minister 230 days after being arrested. Even within AAP, Manish Sisodia and Satyendar Jain tendered their resignations after being denied bail.

But if Kejriwal holds on to his post, the Centre could cite that to frame new constitutional challenges. For one, a Chief Minister governing from a jail could trigger questions of "failure of constitu-

> But who will, before an all-important Lok Sabha election, the first one that AAP is contesting in an alliance, lead the party is the political question?

> Even though it has an overwhelming majority in the Delhi Assembly — AAP has 62 of 70 MLAs — there is no clear answer.

> This is not only because nearly all of its most senior leaders — Arvind Kejriwal, Manish Sisodia, Satyendar Jain and Sanjay Singh — are in jail but also because the Chief Minister is the glue that holds the party together.

The next biggest leader that the party has is Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann, who is also facing a crucial test in Punjab, where AAP is contesting on all 13 Lok Sabha seats, and stands against its alliance partner in Delhi Congress as well as BJP and Akali Dal. In Delhi, the leadership includes Ministers Gopal Rai, Atishi and Bharadwaj

What the AAP faces now, party insiders said, is not just a crisis of leadership but also a test of loy-

"We know how BJP has broken party after party over the last few years. With Kejriwal behind bars, these efforts will only become more strident. What the party needs at this hour is a leader who can take charge but who that is going to be remains a big ques-

tion mark," the leader said. "The party's fate is tied directly to that of Kejriwal. One has to remember that the party is barely 11 years old. AAP is a young party with young leaders. When an attack of this sort is made, the very foundations are tested. This is that moment for AAP," he added. Many party leaders, however,

believe that the party has the resilience and depth to tide over. "Parties with core strength do not stop existing at a time of crisis. We have stood against the BJP's tactics all these years and will continue to do so," Bharadwaj said.

The genesis of AAP lies in the 2011 anti-corruption movement that started from the narrow lanes of Jantar Mantar, before shifting to the expansive Ramlila Maidan, and eventually led to the demise of the Congress in Delhi. Then, Kejriwal shared the stage with social activist Anna Hazare, Prashant Bhushan, Yogendra Yadav, Manish Sisodia, Kumar Vishwas, Sanjay

Singh and Gopal Rai. In 2012, when the decision to form the party was taken, the posters carried photos of all except Hazare, who was against the idea. Of those who launched the party, only Gopal Rai, who is the head of

the party's Delhi unit and a Delhi minister, remains.

Another line of thought in AAP is that it is the BJP that has taken a "It is AAP's history that when-

ever it is faced with a crisis, it emerges stronger. This party's obituary had been written countless times, only to be erased. The BJP has taken a risk by arresting a chief minister who has won not one, but three elections in the country with an overwhelming majority (twice in Delhi and once in Punjab). It is the people that BJP has to answer to now," Bharadwaj added.

On apprehensions that President's rule will be imposed in Delhi if the CM tries to run the government from jail, Bharadwaj said: "It is a possibility but eventually the BJP has to come back to the people. They have arrested someone who has been chosen by the people of Delhi to lead them. They have to be answerable to the people."

the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Amendment Rules 2023 are decided by the High Court.

The FCU has been a contentious issue with concerns about the government's fairness to act as an arbiter in matters where it may have a conflict of interest. There are worries about its potential impact on press freedom, especially when reports critical of the government are published. With social media platforms becoming an important tool for media companies to disseminate content, flagging of a report as fake by the FCU can prompt the government to direct a platform to remove the links to that report.

The bench said it was not making any comment on merits as the matter was pending before the High Court.

"We are of the considered view that the challenge which is pending before HC implicates core values impinging on freedom of speech, which is protected by Article 19. Since all the issues await the adjudication of the HC, we are desisting from expressing any opinion on merits which may ultimately have the impact of foreclosing a full and fair consideration by the third judge of the High Court," it said.

"However, we are clearly of the view that the notification dated March 20, 2024, which has been issued by the Union Government after the rejection of the application for interim relief, would need to be stayed," it said.

The bench said "the challenges to Rule 3 (1) (b) (v) involves serious Constitutional questions. The impact of the Rule on the fundamental right to freedom of speech and expression would call for analysis by the HC".

"We accordingly set aside the opinion of the third judge declining interim relief (of stay) dated March 11, 2024 and direct that pending the disposal of the proceeding before the HC, the notification of the... Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology dated March 20, 2024 shall remain stayed," the bench ruled, hearing petitions filed by the Editors Guild of India (EGI) and stand-up comedian Kunal Kamra.

Appearing for Kamra, Senior Advocate Darius Khambata said social media intermediaries will be forced to take down content flagged by the FCU as fake. "The rules make the Central government the arbiter of truth regarding facts relating to itself," he said. "It is a question of Caesar judg-

ing Caesar. (The) Centre is not a

separate class... Why is the FCU

only for the Central government?

Why isn't there some independent body for everybody?... If the objective is to prevent fake news, then everybody is affected by fake news. It affects individuals more than the government," he said.

Khambata said with elections approaching, "this is the time when the public should have access to all information relating to the Central government and not just filtered facts".

He contended that "this will have a deep chilling effect on free speech".

Appearing for the Centre, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta cited instances of fake posts on social media and said the Rules only require the intermediary to put a disclaimer that the information is false as per FCU.

He said it is "only restricted to governmental business as understood in the Constitutional sense. So, if somebody criticises the Prime Minister, it will not fall within this. It will only relate to governmental business as defined in the transaction of business rules".

"We are only alerting it is fake," Mehta said, "Can the government be prevented from doing that?" he asked.

On March 11, the Bombay High Court had rejected applications seeking an interim stay on notifying the FCU until the court

decides on multiple petitions challenging the validity of the amended rules.

The petitioners, including

Kamra, Editors Guild of India, News Broadcasters and Digital Association and Association of Indian Magazines, have challenged the rules calling them arbitrary, unconstitutional, and in violation of fundamental rights.

A split verdict was delivered by the division bench of Justices Gautam Patel and Neela Gokhale in January this year. Agreeing with the petitioners,, Justice Patel struck down the amendment. Justice Gokhale, on the other hand, upheld the government position. It was then referred to a third judge, Justice A S Chandurkar.

In April last year, the MeitY promulgated the 2023 Rules, which further amended the Information Technology Rules, 2021. Under the new Rules, if the

FCU comes across or is informed about any post that is "fake", "false" or contains "misleading" facts pertaining to the business of the government, it would flag it to the social media intermediaries.

The online intermediaries would then have to take down such content if they wanted to retain their "safe harbour" (legal immunity against third-party content).

Donor Number 2 Megha Group emerged as the top donor for both the BJP and the Congress. Of the Rs 1,192 crore worth bonds purchased by the group, BJP got almost half at Rs 584 crore. This was more than five times that of Congress (Rs 110 crore).

Four companies of the Kolkata-headquartered MKJ Group bought bonds worth Rs 617 crore — put together they are the third largest donor. The BJP received Rs 372 crore, more than half the total bond purchases by the group, which includes Madanlal Ltd, Keventer Food Park Infra Ltd, and Sasmal Infrastructure. The Congress Rs 161 crore, and the Trinamool Rs 47 crore. Eight companies of Aditya

Birla Group purchased bonds worth Rs 584 crore, making it the fourth highest donor. The Group's four top donor companies – Haldia Energy (Rs 377 crore), Dhariwal Infrastructure (Rs 115 crore), Philips Carbon (Rs 35 crore) and Crescent Power (Rs 34 crore) together purchased bonds for Rs 561 crore. Of this, the Trinamool received Rs 419 crore, the BJP 126 crore and the Congress Rs 15 crore.

RPSG Group is the fifth largest donor overall with a total bond purchase value of Rs 553 crore. The top three donor companies of the Group — Essel Mining (Rs 225 crore), Utkal Alumina International (Rs 145

crore) and Birla Carbon (Rs 105 crore) accounted for bonds worth Rs 475 crore. Of this, Rs 245 crore went to the BJD and Rs 230 crore to the BJP.

Next on the list is Qwik Supply Chain Pvt Ltd, an associate company of Reliance Industries Ltd, which spent Rs 410 crore on bonds. Of this, the BJP received Rs 375 crore and the

Shiv Sena Rs 25 crore.

Vedanta Limited, the seventh largest buyer of bonds, spent Rs 401 crore. The BIP is the top beneficiary with Rs 227 crore while the Congress and the BJD received Rs 104 crore and Rs 40 crore, respectively.

Four companies of the Bharti Group purchased bonds worth Rs 247 crore. The top donor, Bharti Airtel Limited, spent Rs 183 crore on bonds. Of this, the BJP received Rs 197 crore.

Four Jindal companies donated Rs 192 crore in bonds. Jindal Steel and Power, the biggest buyer, spent Rs 123 crore. The BJD received the lion's share of Rs 100 crore, while the Congress and the BJP received bonds worth Rs 20 crore and Rs 3 crore respectively.

Building collapse leaves two dead

TWO WORKERS died while another was left critically injured after a two-storey building collapsed on them in Northeast Delhi's Welcome a little after midnight on Thursday, officers said.

Police said the three men were working in a jeans factory that operated from the ground floor.

According to DCP (Northeast) Joy Tirkey, they received a PCR call at 2.16 am. "The first floor was vacant while the ground floor was being used for cutting jeans... three workers were trapped under the debris...Two men were declared dead at GTB Hospital."

The owner of the building and factory has been identified as Shahid, the DCP said.

The victims were identified as Arshad, 30, and Tauhid, 20. The injured man, Rehan, 22, is undergoing treatment. An officer said the first floor of the building was under construction after the landlord decided to carry out renovation work. "A lot of the construction material was kept on the first

A case under IPC section pertaining to causing death by negligence has been lodged and raids are ongoing to arrest the owner.

Speaking to The Indian Express, Rehan's father Fardeed Ahmad said, "My son received major head and foot injuries... he recently started working at the factory and was paid around Rs 7,000 for stitching clothes."

The MCD said in a statement, "As per our information received, the building was 40 years old and its owner was bringing it down due to his personal reasons... because of which it collapsed..."

THE AAM Aadmi Party's top 10 donors donated Rs 52.4 crore through electoral bonds, according to data shared with the Election Commission on Thursday.

Among these, six are on the list of leading donors of the Congress party. One among these six donors, Avees Trading Finance Pvt Ltd, donated Rs 10 crore to

Three other firms — MKI **Enterprises Ltd: Torrent Power** Limited; and Transways Exim Private Limited — each donated Rs 7 crore to AAP. Among the others, IFB Agro Industries Limited, a Kolkata-based distillery and bottling company, donated Rs 4 crore. Likewise, Pune-based BG Shirke Construction Technology Private Limited donated Rs 1 crore to AAP. This company provides infrastructure construction and engineering services.

The above six companies col-

lectively donated to Congress multiple times more than to AAP.

Other top donors for AAP included Bajaj Auto Ltd (Rs 8 crore), Asian Trading Corporation Limited (Rs 5 crore), Bird Worldwide Flight Services (Rs 2 crore) and Avon Cycles Ltd (Rs 1.4 crore). Delhi-based Bird Worldwide Flight Services is a service provider in the fields of travel technology, aviation services, hospitality, retail, and

education. The data shared by the **Election Commission last week** showed that the AAP's win in the Punjab Assembly polls in March 2022 drew in a big amount of donations for the party. In the whole of 2021, the party received only Rs 1.85 crore through electoral bonds. Ahead of the Punjab Assembly polls held in February 2022, it received Rs 3.4 crore in January (2022). After winning the elections, the party got Rs 44.45 crore by redeeming 126 electoral bonds in three months — October, November and December — in 2022.

'BJP UNDERESTIMATING PUBLIC SENTIMENT'

If no relief in SC, streets the next recourse

With ED team at his home, anxious supporters poured in, only to be herded into police vehicles

A LONG fight that will be played out on the roads of Delhi, and across the country, is what the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has promised in the wake of the arrest of its convenor and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal. Glimpses of what could follow could be seen outside his house Thursday evening as MLAs, workers and volunteers started to gather as soon as news broke of an ED team reaching the CM's home.

AAP's Delhi unit chief Gopal Rai said the arrest showed the BJP was scared, and asked people to gather at the AAP office at 10 am on Friday. "BJP is scared of losing the polls. It will come down from the 400 seats, that it is hoping to get, to 40 in the Lok Sabha polls... Narendra Modi has started the fight and we will finish it... everyone should be prepared to protest tomorrow," Rai said, inviting anyone who is against "dictatorship" to participate in the demonstration.

AAP sources said plans to mobilise people were being chalked out late into the night. They expressed confidence that the people of Delhi "will be out on the roads" to protest the "illegal arrest" of their "beloved" CM.

Sources said all MLAs and councillors have been asked to mobilise people and get them to the party office. "Smaller local protests are also being planned but for now, the focus will be on the party office on Friday," a party leader said.


AAP, which was born from a street protest and was labelled "anarchist" by its opposition parties, will have to return to its roots after being in power for nearly a decade. "The arrest is not just a deciding factor ahead of the polls but will also have long-term ramifications for Indian politics. BIP has underestimated the public sentiment. The entire organisation will fight it out on the streets, not just in Delhi but across the country. This takes us back to our roots, we are a party born out of an andolan," said senior leader Jasmine Shah.

On Thursday evening, as soon as the ED arrived at the CM's residence in Civil Lines, senior party leaders Atishi, Durgesh Pathak, MLA Sanjeev Jha, Imran Hussain, Rakhi Bidlan, Jarnail Singh, Rohit Mehraulia and scores of party workers and supporters gathered outside.

Witnessing crowds and protests by AAP workers, security arrangements and deployment of force was increased and both gates of the CM house were barricaded. Both Delhi Police as well as paramilitary forces such as the RAF were brought in to control the crowd. Protesters raised slogans against the PM and BJP.


"It was very clear from the evening that ED was going to arrest Kejriwal *ji*. Heavy security was deployed from the evening and the entire area was barricaded and cordoned off. They did not allow us to enter the stretch. This is a political conspiracy of the BJP because PM Modi is scared of Kejriwal. BJP knows it is going to lose the polls and that is why it has got him arrested before the polls," Atishi said.

AAP's Rajya Sabha MP Sandeep Pathak, meanwhile, said, "Today, the entire country saw how PM Modi and the BJP have murdered democracy... I want to tell BJP, rather than filing false cases and arresting leaders like a coward, fight on the political ground..."

Anti-corruption icon, populist CM, and now a corruption accused — long arc of Kejriwal

FROM A popular anti-corruption star, a populist leader to battling corruption charges himself, the arrest of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal by the Enforcement Directorate in the liquor policy case marks another dramatic episode in the long arc of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) chief.

The dramatic rise Kejriwal shot to fame a decade ago as an anti-corruption activist — making Anna Hazare sit on two high-profile hunger strikes in Delhi in 2011 – demanding a Jan Lokpal to rein in corruption and accusing "all politicians" of corruption. With day-long media coverage, Anna and Kejriwal became a sensation, denting the then UPA government in the process. However, to a great extent, the BJP with a large organisation — the party had been very cautious at the time of the Anna movement — took full

advantage of the anti-Congress mood in the 2014 Lok Sabha polls, with Narendra Modi as its PM candidate.

The politician Meanwhile, Kejriwal formed AAP with a promise of leading a clean government that would work for the people. He tasted early success in Delhi in the 2013 assembly elections — winning 28 seats out of 70 and defeating sitting Chief Minister Sheila Dikshit

of the Congress. The BJP got 32 seats in alliance with the Shiromani Akali Dal but could not garner a majority. AAP threw the first surprise by becoming CM with the support of the Congress, which had eight seats. Forty-nine days later, he dramatically resigned on the ground that the Delhi Assembly was stonewalling his Jan Lokpal Bill.

Kejriwal now took a 'national' turn, deciding to contest Lok Sabha polls against Modi from Varanasi

in 2014. He lost by a margin of about 2.7-lakh votes, but stood second, bagging 2.09-lakh votes. This raised his profile further.

Delhi sweep

Early in 2015, AAP posted a spectacular result in the Delhi assembly polls, winning 67 of 70 seats, with the BJP winning just three and the Congress drawing a blank. Kejriwal threw out Prashant Bhushan and Yogendra Yadav from the party within months of the victory on grounds of "anti-party activities". Bhushan decried this as dictatorship, and said the party had been reduced to a 'Khap'. Kejriwal's image was fast

changing from that of a democrat to someone who wanted to control the party through favourites. However, the power and water subsidies continued he claimed to have improved the condition of government schools and the healthcare system in Delhi from 2014 to 2019 thus becoming a populist leader focusing on service-deliv-

ery with ideology agnosticism. The Lokpal demand gradually disappeared altogether.

Despite his popularity, he could not win a single seat in Delhi in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, with the BJP sweeping all seven. In the 2020 Delhi assembly polls, AAP again won Delhi, bagging 62 seats. The BJP won just eight.

Punjab expansion But that wasn't all. Kejriwal was able to expand beyond Delhi and post a stunning victory in Punjab in 2022, winning 92 of 118 seats and reducing Congress to just 18. He also made a dent in Gujarat, winning five seats in the assembly polls out of 182, with the Congress winning 17. The BJP swept the polls with 156 seats.

This makes the AAP a possible future challenge to the BIP, which is right now in pole position. But the party leadership has shown it is willing to nip the party in the bud before it expands further by attacking its only leader of stature for alleged corruption.

FROM HELMING Cabinet meetings to giving direction to the AAP's vision of governance for the Capital, Arvind Kejriwal has been at the core of both the administration in Delhi as well as the party's expansion across the country for the last decade.

During his nine years as CM, he pitched several important schemes of the AAP government power and water subsidies, free travel for women in the city's public buses, and the education and health models.

He headed the Delhi Jal Board as its chairperson for a significant duration between 2015 and 2020, and gradually distanced himself from any official portfolio for most of the AAP's

second term in power. Kejriwal, instead, had entrusted significant departments such as power, water and the Public Works Department to Satvendar Iain before the reins of more than a dozen government departments like education were handed over to Deputy Chief Minister Manish

Sisodia. While Jain was arrested in 2022, Sisodia was sent behind bars in the liquor policy case last year.

The baton was handed over to Atishi who currently holds around 14 government departments in addition to any others which have not been assigned to any other Cabinet members.

Kejriwal also guided the government during several waves of the pandemic, which emerged in the aftermath of the 2020 Northeast Delhi riots.

He also led a three-day sit-in protest inside Raj Niwas – the office-cum-residence of the L-G along with his cabinet colleagues over installation of CCTVs in the city in 2018, and addressed a large gathering over a 'one-time settlement scheme' for water bills last month.

He was, and remained, the face of the AAP's political ambitions within and beyond the Capital. While he led from the front as the Delhi government took on successive attacks on various aspects of its administration in the city through three Lt-Governors, the party formed a government in Punjab under his watch after it ousted the BJP from the MCD after 15 years in power.

Delhi riots 'larger conspiracy' case: Those facing graver charges granted bail, says **Umar Khalid**

ARGUING FOR bail in the 2020 Northeast Delhi riots 'larger conspiracy case', Umar Khalid said other accused persons facing graver allegations than him are out on bail while those allegedly involved in the same activities as him have not even been made accused by the Delhi Police. Khalid was booked under the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) in connection with the case.

In February, citing a "change in circumstances", Khalid withdrew his bail plea from the Supreme Court. His lawyer, Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal, had said "We will try our luck in the trial court".

Advocate Trideep Pais, appearing for Khalid, revealed the change of circumstances in Delhi's Karkardooma Court on Thursday. "The factual basis on which three accused in the case have been granted bail have several overlaps with me," said Pais. He also argued that the court could consider if Khalid was entitled to a bail of parity even though he was charged with the stringent UAPA as the law was interpreted differently by a Supreme Court judgment in

"The court must be satisfied with the probative value of evidence at the stage of examining bail," said Pais, adding that no terrorist act had been attributed to the accused by the prosecution.

Another change of circumstances cited by the advocate was the continued incarceration of the accused. Reading from the police chargesheet, Pais said the prosecution cited 15 instances to point out the involvement of the accused - in many of these, there were no witnesses.

BJP LEADERS CALL FOR KEJRIWAL'S RESIGNATION

'Arrest marks end of drama that has been going on for over a yr'

AMID THE Aam Aadmi Party's calls for a nation-wide protest against the arrest of Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Friday, the BJP said that the party was insulting the Constitution by saying that Kejriwal will run the government from jail and demanded that he resign.

Delhi BJP President Virendra Sachdeva said that Kejriwal's arrest had brought satisfaction to the people of Delhi.

"The liquor scam started in Delhi from 2021, and revelations have been made one after the other since on how money was laundered with brokers and liquor contractors... Today, Kejriwal's arrest marks the end of a drama that has been going on for over a year," he said.

BJP leaders also sought the resignation of the Chief Minister and said that it was not constitutionally possible for the government to run from jail.

"The statement of AAP leaders that Kejriwal will run the government from jail is an insult to constitutional norms... (former Jharkhand Chief Minister) Hemant Soren also said the same thing, but upon being arrested, he had to resign. The same thing will happen in Delhi as well." he added.

BIP national spokesperson Shehzad Poonawala, meanwhile, said AAP's "victimhood card" would not work.

"This victimhood card is not going to work... no matter how many such cards Kejriwal and the AAP play, they will have to answer how the same people who held Anna Hazare's finger and said that resignations will precede investigation... when they faced such proceedings themselves are saying that they will run the government from jail but not join investigation?" he said.

Taking on the AAP for calling Kejriwal's arrest the death of democracy, Sachdeva said, "While everyone is chanting a political slogan that BJP is killing democracy, it is nothing but a political drama... undoubtedly in a democracy, the public elects the government and removes the government, but the public does not give freedom to the government elected by it for corruption. The government is accountable to the public and is not meant to rob the public."

"This is a liquor scam which has reached all the courts, has been investigated by all the investigation agencies... if your excise policy was so good, why did you roll it back? This question has not been answered yet. How could you bring cartelisation into the liquor trade? Why did you relegate to the dustbin your own government department's advice against allowing private players in the liquor trade?" asked BJP national spokesperson Sambit Patra.

What arrest means for Oppn in Delhi, heading into LS polls

WHAT HAPPENS after the arrest of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal is as likely to have an impact on the results of the upcoming Lok Sabha elections as it is on the contours of the capital's administration and governance going forward, sources across the BJP, Congress as well as AAP said.While the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and the Congress – the chief protagonists of the INDIA bloc in Delhi - believe that Kejriwal's arrest will act as a shot in the arm for its political prospects in the Lok Sabha elections, the BJP, according to insiders, has its sights the city's possible "transformation into a world class capital territory".

"The AAP has been fighting against the BJP for the sake of the Constitution of this country so far and will continue to do so... we hope the Supreme Court will protect the democracy of the country," AAP Minister Atishi said.

Throwing his weight behind his party's ally, Delhi Congress president Arvinder Singh Lovely, who led a Congress delegation to

Kejriwal's residence, said, "Timing of the elections shows the BJP is afraid of our alliance. Democracy is in danger. This happens in Pakistan, not in India."

The BJP, which last year began working on a 400-day strategy to corner the AAP on "10 specific scams" including the "DJB scam" - for which Kejriwal has also been issued summons by the ED – to portray the AAP convenor "as the face of corruption", maintained that his arrest was "a legal and not a political matter".

"This arrest will certainly help the INDIA bloc's prospects in Delhi; both parties have a common support base across slums, unauthorised colonies and lower-middle class households in the city. Kejriwal's arrest will trigger a wave of sympathy which will help consolidate our votes," a senior Congress leader said.

According to a BJP insider, however, the party's senior leadership was in a huddle with "legal minds" to chart the way forward with "several options" on the anvil.

"The matter has now reached the courts, where if AAP continues to stick to its strategy of Kejriwal governing the city from jail, there is a window for us to argue for the President's rule to avoid a constitutional crisis. The Centre has already stated on several occasions that since Delhi is the national capital, it needs more control over its functioning," a source said.

A senior AAP leader admitted that the Lieutenant Governor being put at the helm of the capital's governance was "a very real" possibility in days to come. "We believe putting the Delhi Assembly under suspended animation for the foreseeable future during which the L-G will act as the BJP's arm to govern the city till the 2025 Delhi Assembly elections is very much on the cards, said the leader.

"Whether or not they let the Delhi Assembly exist after that a fear which we have expressed several times – will likely depend on whether the BJP thinks it can defeat the AAP in elections next year," the leader added.



Once a BIP minister, Ravi lost Chikkamagaluru seat in last Assembly elections and is a BJP aspirant from Chikkamagaluru-Udupi Lok Sabha constituency.

Surya, who is also the president of Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha, shared on Xavideo of a shopkeeper who was allegedly attacked by a group of six people for reportedly playing "bhajans" during Azan and wrote that the incident was "a direct result of Congress's appearement politics".

A police officer told *The Indian Express* that a case was registered at Halasuru Gate police station against Surya after the Flying Squad Team (FST) of Election Commission filed a formal complaint.

On Wednesday, the Election Commission filed an FIR against BJP leader Shobha Karandlaje over her recent remarks on the people of Tamil Nadu.

THE CONGRESS on Thursday released its third list of Lok Sabha candidates, fielding its leader in the Lok Sabha Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury again from Baharampur and veteran leader Pradip Bhattacharya from Kolkata Uttar in West Bengal. The list of 57 has the names of the kin of many Congress leaders and several turncoats.

While the list did not have the names of candidates from Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh, sources said party veteran and Rajya Sabha MP Digvijaya Singh would enter the fray from Rajgarh in Madhya Pradesh and former Madhya Pradesh Congress president Arun Yadav would contest from Guna against Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia.

In Uttar Pradesh, state Congress president Ajay Rai may contest from Varanasi against Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Imran Masood from Saharanpur, Congress veteran P L Punia's son Tanuj Punia from Barabanki, and Danish Ali from Amroha.

The party has yet to decide on Amethi and Raebareli despite the Uttar Pradesh leadership of the party pushing for the candidatures of Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, respec-

tively. A section of the party leadership argues the Gandhi siblings are not keen to contest from Amethi and Raebareli. Another section believes it is mere posturing by the brother-sister duo.

Here are the major takeaways: SONS, DAUGHTERS & KIN

The list of candidates for eight states — Arunachal Pradesh, Gujarat, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Telangana, West Bengal and Puducherry — has the names of kin of several Congress

leaders. In West Bengal, the party replaced Malda Dakshin MP Abu Hasem Khan Choudhury with his son Isha Khan Choudhury and has fielded late Congress leader Abdus Sattar's grandson Mohammad Mortaja Hossain from Jangipur.

In Karnakata, the party has fielded PWD Minister Satish Jarkiholi's daughter Priyanka Jarkiholi from Chikkodi, Transport Minister Ramalinga Reddy's daughter Sowmya Reddy from Bangalore South, Women & Child Development Minister Laxmi Hebbalkar's son Mrinal Ravindra Hebbalkar from Belgaum, and Agricultural Marketing Minister Shivanand Patil's daughter Samyukta S Patil from Bagalkot. Forest Minister Eshwar Khandre's son Sagar Khandre has been fielded from Bidar.

In Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge's turf of Gulbarga, the Congress has fielded his son-in-law Radhakrishna Doddamani. In Bangalore Central, the Congress has fielded former Union Minister K Rahman Khan's son Mansoor Ali Khan. In Davangere, the Congress has fielded veteran Shamanur Shivashankarappa's daughter-inlaw Prabha Mallikariun. Her husband is a minister in the

Siddaramaiah government. In Telangana, the party has fielded Gaddam Vamsi Krishna, the son of Speaker Gadam Prasad from Peddapalle. In Maharashtra, veteran leader and former Home Minister Sushil Kumar Shinde's daughter Praniti is the candidate from Solapur (SC-reserved) and former Maharashtra minister and MLA K C Padvi's son Goval Padvi from Nandurbar (ST-reserved

constituency). Of the 11 candidates from Gujarat on the list, the party has four dynasts : Anklav MLA Amit Chavda, Khedbrahma MLA Tushar Chaudhary, former Gujarat Mahila Congress president Sonal Patel and current Pradesh Mahila Congress president Jenny Thummar.

TURNCOATS IN TELANGANA

Jagan Mohan banks on candidate culls, welfare schemes as TDP-led alliance rises

ANDHRA PRADESH is going to elections for its 25 Lok Sabha and 175 Assembly seats on May 13. Unlike in 2019, when these were held in the state in the first phase of the Lok Sabha elections, this time the simultaneous polls will take place in its fourth phase.

The 2019 elections saw the Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy-led YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) storming to power by sweeping the polls, winning 22 Lok Sabha and 151 Assembly seats with a vote share of just under 50%. The then incumbent N Chandrababu Naiduled Telugu Desam Party (TDP), was reduced to only 3 Lok Sabha and 23 Assembly seats with a vote share of 39.1%.

This time, while CM Jagan Mohan Reddy is banking on his welfare schemes, dubbed "navaratnalu (nine gems)", and the support of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and minorities to help the YSRCP sail through, he faces some stiff challenges.

Firstly, the TDP, which leads an alliance comprising the BJP and Pawan Kalyan-led Jana Sena Party (JSP), seems to be resurgent now. Secondly, the YSRCP will have to take on Andhra Pradesh Congress chief and Jagan's sister Y S Sharmila, who is likely to eat into the party's vote base.

Jagan is also faced with growing anti-incumbency against his ministers and MLAs, some of whom are said to have lost connect with their electorate after the

commencement of disbursement of welfare scheme funds through Direct Benefit Transfer.

Jagan has dropped or shifted a slew of YSRCP MLAs and MPs in order to beat anti-incumbency, leading to an exodus of party leaders to other parties. Over the past few months, the YSRCP has faced desertion by at least six sitting MPs. "The CM's intentions cannot be questioned but a leader's comfort and stronghold must also be taken into account (while shifting them from seats)," a YSRCP office-

bearer from Visakhapatnam said The YSRCP is also grappling with the capital issue, especially in the wake of Hyderabad ceasing to exist as the common capital of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh after June 2.

On the other hand, the TDP-JSP alliance has got a shot in the arm with the BJP joining it and is looking to capitalise on the consolidation of the Kamma-Kapu votes, among other things, to dislodge the YSRCP government.

Kammas, who are traditional supporters of the TDP as Naidu belongs to the community, make up around 5% of the population in Andhra Pradesh. Pawan Kalyan belongs to the Kapu community which accounts for about 18% of

the state's population. Historically, the TDP has fared better when it has joined hands with the BJP. In 2014, the party in alliance with BJP stormed to power, winning 102 Assembly and 16 LS seats. Five years later, contesting alone, it faced a drubbing.

'Taking train to karmabhoomi with happy heart': Shivraj Chouhan returns to LS fray after 20 years

Ex-CM showcases welfare schemes like Ladli Behna his govt had launched

MADHYA PRADESH BJP stalwart and ex-chief minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan, who is contesting the Lok Sabha elections from his home turf Vidisha seat, hit the campaign trail on Thursday, travelling by a train in a second-class coach from Bhopal to reach Ganjbasoda, which is part of his

Known for his down-to-earth approach and mass outreach which had contributed to his becoming the longest-serving Madhya Pradesh CM involving four terms until December 2023 - Chouhan, 65, has now entered the Lok Sabha poll arena after two decades.

He has been a four-time MP from Vidisha, a BJP stronghold, which had been represented by ex-Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee (1991) and Sushma Swaraj (2009 and 2014).

"I have been travelling by train since I was an MP. My heart is full of happiness. I am going to Ganjbasoda, which is my 'karmabhoomi' (workplace). I have family relations with the people and I am going again

there to meet all of them," Chouhan said onboard the sleeper class of Bhopal-Bilaspur train. He was accompanied by his wife Sadhna.

Vidisha has remained a traditional BJP bastion for decades, with the Congress having managed to win it only twice (1980 and 1984) since 1967. The Congress is yet to name its candidate from here.

Chouhan kicked off his campaign three days ago, when he visited Icchawar where he met party workers, ate the local sweet dish Mawa Bati, and interacted with local people.

During his train journey, Chouhan chatted with a child, who sat on his lap, and interacted with the passengers. He also met BJP workers who had gathered in large numbers at Salamatpur, Sanchi, Vidisha, Gulabganj and Ganjbasoda railway stations.

At Ganjbasoda, Chouhan was greeted by a huge crowd who gathered in a hall. He bowed down and welcomed the crowd, apologising for the lack of arrangements. "After a long time I have got the opportunity to hug everyone... Those people who couldn't get a selfie don't worry. Many nephews and nieces keep

saying 'Mama selfie, selfie'. For five years I will be among you only, why are you worrying," he told the cheering crowd.

Chouhan is popularly known as "Mama (maternal uncle)" in the state. As the then CM, Chouhan had

spearheaded the BJP's campaign in the November 2023 Assembly elections during which he addressed over 160 rallies. His campaign was based on the plank of his welfare schemes for women, especially the Ladli Behna Yojana, a monthly stipend of Rs 1,250, which many believe was an important factor behind the BJP's landslide win in the polls. However, the BJP central

leadership replaced Chouhan with three-time Ujjain MLA Mohan Yadav as the CM as it opted for a new face at the helm. Chouhan had become the CM

for the first time in 2005 and con-

tinued in his post for three terms until December 2018, when the BIP lost to the Kamal Nath-led led Congress. In March 2020, he returned to

the CM post after a defection led by Jyotiraditya Scindia brought down the Nath government. Asked about his Lok Sabha

Of poll bonds bought by top individuals, over two-thirds were redeemed by BJP

NEW DELHI, MARCH 21

ELECTORAL BONDS purchased by a majority of the 15 top identifiable individuals — from steel magnate Lakshmi Niwas Mittal to Biocon's Kiran Mazumdar Shaw — were redeemed by the BJP, according to the data put out by the State Bank of India Thursday and published by the Election Commission of India.

In all, 333 individuals purchased electoral bonds worth Rs 358 crore, of which the 15 identified by The Indian Express accounted for Rs 158.65 crore with over 70% going to the BJP and the rest to others.

The list of top 15 identifiable donors along with the list of parties which redeemed the bonds is as follows:

LAKSHMI NIWAS MITTAL: Rs 35 crore (BJP)

The executive Chairman and CEO of ArcelorMittal bought electoral bonds worth Rs 35 crore. All were redeemed by the

INTRODUCED BY the UPA government in 2013, the electoral trusts scheme allowed companies and individuals to donate to an electoral trust that would in turn make donations to parties. Both the contributions by companies and the trusts' donations to parties were made public in the form of annual reports submitted to the **Election Commission.** From 2013-14 to 2021-22, a total of Rs.2,268.6 crore was donated by trusts and 72% of that went to the BIP.

Medha Servo Drives gave Rs 30 crore and Medha Traction Equipment donated Rs 5.01 crore in 2022-23 through Prudent Electoral Trust. Both companies did not use the EB route. Serum Institute of India, the second largest donor through trusts in 2022-23, donated Rs 50.25 crore in 2022-23. Serum was also the fourth-largest donor in 2021-22, donating Rs 45 crore through Prudent Electoral Trust.

Stop sending PM's letter on WhatsApp: EC to MeitY a day before the election dates **EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE**

NEW DELHI, MARCH 21

THE ELECTION Commission on Thursday instructed the Union Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) to immediately stop sending a letter by Prime Minister Narendra Modi from the account "Viksit Bharat Sampark" to WhatsApp

In a letter to MeitY Secretary S Krishnan, the EC asked the Ministry to submit a compliance report immediately. The Ministry had informed the EC in a letter on March 16 that the WhatsApp messages were sent on March 15,

were announced. "It was informed in that letter that though the letters were sent out before MCC period, but due to system architecture and network limitations it is possible that some letters have a delayed delivery," the ECwrote. The EC told the Ministry that it had received "complaints from various quarters that such messages are still being delivered on citizens' phones".

"Since the MCC is now in force, you are hereby directed to ensure forthwith that no further delivery of 'WhatsApp messages' takes place during MCC period. A compliance report in this regard may be sent immediately," the EC said.

CJI pulls up Tamil Nadu Governor: He is defying the Supreme Court

THE SUPREME Court on Thursday pulled up Tamil Nadu Governor R N Ravi over his refusal to administer oath to reinduct DMK MLA K Ponmudi, whose conviction was stayed by the apex court, into the state Cabinet.

"We are seriously concerned about the conduct of the Governor in this case... This is not the way. Because he is defying the Supreme Court of India. When a two-judge bench of the Supreme Court stays a conviction, the Governor has no business to tell us that this does not wipe out the conviction and it is non-existent. Those who have

advised him have not advised him correctly in accordance with law. The governor better be informed that when the Supreme Court of India stays a conviction, the law has to follow its course," said Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud presiding over a three-judge bench. The bench, also comprising

Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, asked the Governor to take a decision by tomorrow (Friday) morning, failing which it said it will pronounce a judgment. "Now we will give you overnight. Otherwise we will declare judgement tomorrow." The court will hear the matter again Friday.

The Madras High Court had recently reversed Ponmudi's acquittal in a case of disproportionate assets, but on March 13, a two-judge SC bench stayed this saying it would otherwise lead to irreversible consequences.

The court was hearing an application by the TN government, which said that after the SC order Chief Minister MK Stalin had requested the Governor to administer the oath of office to Ponmudi but the Governor, while referring to the grounds on which he was convicted by the HC, refused the request and said "his reinduction while he remains tainted of corruption would be against constitutional morality".

The CJI said, "I may have a different view about this particular man (Ponmudi), but that's not the point. The point is about constitutional law. We have to act in accordance with the Constitution. His conviction has been stayed, and the Chief Minister says he wants to induct him into the Cabinet. That's parliamentary democracy, the Cabinet form of government."

Geelani grand-daughter, Shabir Shah daughter 'disassociate' from separatist ideology

IAILED SEPARATIST leader Shabir Ahmad Shah's daughter Sama Shabir and Hurriyat patriarch Syed Ali Shah Geelani's granddaughter Ruwa Shah have put out nearly identical notices in local newspapers in Kashmir, disassociating themselves from "separatist ideology" and pledging their loyalty to "the sovereignty of Union of India".

Ruwa Shah, whose father and Geelani's son-in-law Altaf Ahmad Shah died last year while in jail over charges of terror funding, also distanced herself from the Hurriyat Conference faction founded by her late grandfather, in a notice in the newspapers last week. She declared she has no inclination or sympathy towards its ideology. "I am a loyal citizen of India not affiliated with any organisation or association which has an agenda against the Union of India and I owe allegiance to the Constitution of my

country (India)," Shah said. In a separate public notice, published in a local newspaper Thursday, 23-year-old Sama Shabir said she was "a loyal Indian citizen" and distanced herself from the banned sepa-

ratist organisation founded by her father, who is currently in Tihar Jail on money laundering and terror funding charges.

"I, Sama Shabir Shah... want to clarify that I have not been associated nor have an affiliation with the Democratic Freedom Party, nor do have any inclination towards the ideology of the Democratic Freedom Party," she said. "I hereby declare that if any person uses my name with the said party, Democratic Freedom Party, I shall take legal action against them... I am a loyal citizen of India and I am not affiliated with any person or organisation which is against the sovereignty of the Union of India."

It is perhaps the first time that a family member of a separatist leader in Jammu and Kashmir has published such notices.

Shabir Shah, 70, the founder of the Democratic Freedom Party, has been in jail since 2017. He was arrested by the Enforcement Directorate under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act in July 2017 and lodged in Tihar Jail. In 2019, the **National Investigation Agency** took his custody in an alleged terror funding case, along with separatist leaders Masarat Alam and Syeda Asiya Andrabi. WITH INPUTS FROM PTI

Why BJP is confident of containing any fallout from arrest of Delhi CM Kejriwal

NEW DELHI, MARCH 21

WHILE THE arrest of Delhi Chief Minister and Aam Aadmi Party supremo Arvind Kejriwal has come on the eve of the Lok Sabha elections, amid the Opposition's claims of a witch-hunt by the Central government, the BIP is confident that it can withstand any backlash.

It stems from the belief that taking Kejriwal out of the picture at this critical time deals a blow to the INDIA bloc at large, and the AAP in Delhi, apart from bolstering the Modi government's credentials as committed to rooting out corruption.

The BJP will be underlining the AAP chief's defiance of the ED summons to make its case, as the Opposition unites in support of Kejriwal.

A senior BJP leader said: "One of the main fallouts of the arrest would be the impairing of AAP, with Kejriwal being its face and voice mobilising crowds and resources. He is also the brain and pillar of the party. Without Kejriwal, the AAP will not be in a position to make any

impact in the campaign scene.' Another party leader added: "This will also take away one of INDIA bloc's star campaigners, as well as reinforce our message of it being a coalition of the corrupt."

A source said many BJP cadres were questioning why the Modi government was playing safe on Kejriwal, saying it sent the message that it was apprehensive of acting against him due to his "popularity". "The arrest has lifted the morale of our cadre and our party as regards the leadership's uncompromising stance against corruption."

The senior BJP leader quoted above said that even with the Congress and AAP coming together, the BJP did not expect a major impact of Kejriwal's arrest in Delhi. While the AAP has now had two sweeping back-to-back victories in the Delhi Assembly

polls, the BJP had won all seven of its Lok Sabha seats in 2019 with over 50% of the votes.

According to BIP sources, recent internal surveys and assessments conducted by the party in and around Delhi tried to determine, among other things, voters' sentiments regarding action against Kejriwal, which comes more than a year after his Deputy CM Manish Sisodia was held in the same case and continues behind bars. Another sen ior AAP leader, Sanjay Singh, is

also in jail in the same case. According to sources, the surveys indicated that the Opposition would not be able to mobilise people. "The liquor policy charges have stuck and hurt

> Kejriwal's image," a source said, arguing that if there was "no ev idence", Sisodia would have been out on bail. Plus, as a Delhi BJP leader pointed out, the

Capital votes only in the sixth phase, or on May 25 more than two months from now. "By then Kejriwal's absence would have weakened the AAP and affected its ability to fight."

BJP leaders admitted that Kejriwal posed a threat because of the goodwill for his government's schemes, such as free power and water, plus its health and education agenda — matching the Centre's welfare plank.

Former AAP leader Anand Kumar, who was removed from the party several years ago, also pointed to this, saying his schemes might stand Kejriwal in good stead. "I believe the arrest is related more to the support offered by Kejriwal to non-BJP endeavours, particularly the INDIA bloc, Kumar told *The Indian Express*, also pointing to the arrest's timing, coinciding with the release of full

The other names in the AIADMK list include three-time MLA R Kumaraguru from Kallakurichi, the party's IT wing president and an IIM-Ahmedabad alumni, Singai G Ramachandran, Coimbatore,

Muthuchozhan from Tirunelveli. Its debutants include P

Karuppaiah from Tiruchi, N D Chandramohan from Perambalur and district secretary P Babu, son of ex-MLA Pounraj, from Mayiladuthurai.

The single-phase election in Tamil Nadu and Puducherry on April 19, is staring at a three-cornered contest in some seats, with the BJP-led front giving voters an option. The BJP is contesting 20 seats, leaving 19 for its allies, including the PMK.

Apart from Annamalai, the BJP list includes Tamilisai Soundararajan, who resigned as Telangana Governor days ago, rejoined the party on Wednesday, and has been fielded from Chennai South. Other notable candidates include Union minister L Murugan from Nilgiris and Nainar

Nagendran from Tirunelveli. Sitting Indhiya Jananayaga Katchi MPTR Paarivendhar, who in 2019 won on the DMK ticket, is the BJP's candidate from his home turf Perambalur. Despite speculation that a new face could be fielded by the BJP from Kanniyakumari, it has repeated Pon Radhakrishnan, the BJP's 2014 MP from the seat.

Kanniyakumari and Coimbatore are the only two Lok Sabha seats ever won by the BIP in Tamil Nadu. Its two victories in Coimbatore came in the wake of the 1998 serial blasts in the town.

The younger generation in the BJP list includes Vinoj P Selvam from Chennai Central, A CShanmugam from Vellore and C Narasimhan from Krishnagiri.

THREE DAYS after Chennaibased Music Academy awarded vocalist T M Krishna with the Sangita Kalanidhi, the highest recognition in the world of Carnatic classical music, an open war broke out in the Carnatic classical establishment with a number of musicians protesting against the move.

On Wednesday, sisters and musician duo Ranjani and Gayatri withdrew from the December Music Season, the annual music festival that's one of the largest such in the country, refusing to attend "the conference that will be presided over by Mr TM Krishna".

In a letter addressed to the Music Academy that they shared on their social media platforms, they wrote, "It's dangerous to overlook Mr TM Krishna's glorification of a figure like EVR (Periyar) who openly proposed a genocide of 'brahmins', repeatedly called/abused every woman of this community with vile profanity and relentlessly worked to normalise filthy language in social discourse."

The sisters were scheduled to perform at the Academy on December 25.

in 2023 in honour of Periyar, political activist and 'father of Dravidian movement', to commemorate the Vaikom Satyagraha, the anti-caste agitation in 1920s to enter the prohibited premises of Vaikom Temple in Kerala. The song, penned by noted writer Perumal Murugan, questioned caste discrimination.

Responding to the sister duo on Thursday, N Murali, the president of the Music Academy, said their joint letter was "replete with unwarranted and slanderous insinuations verging on defamation" and that he was shocked by "its vicious tone against a respected senior fellow musician".

Murali also said the decision to award Krishna was based on "careful deliberation" and "with the sole criterion being musical excellence demonstrated over a significant and sustained career... with no extraneous facts influencing our choice".

He also said the duo's stand was "unbecoming of artistes and in poor taste" and termed their act of making their letter to him public on social media as "discourteous".

Soon after Ranjani-Gayatri made their position public, another vocalist duo — Srikrishna Mohan and Ramkumar Mohan, better known as Trichur Brothers

 also withdrew from the Academy's Annual Music Conference for this year and wrote on social media that Krishna "believes and propagates a value system that is diametrically opposite to our core values". Amid the escalating war of words, vocalist Vishaka Hari too joined the chorus, slamming the recent honour to Krisha.

Chitraveena Ravikiran, another popular name in the Carnatic music circuit, went a step further and decided to return his Sangita Kalanidhi in a letter addressed to N Murali, the president of the Academy. Ravikiran was awarded the honour in 2017. The Academy had in 2018 dropped Ravikiran and six other artistes after a slew of sexual harassment allegations in the #MeToo movement surfaced against them.

But in a letter addressed to

has said that his decision to withdraw his award does not stem from the "inestimable angst" he experienced in October 2018 but his "inability to relate to the kind of values the Academy is glorifying today by honouring an individual who has... tried to polarise and destabalise Indian classical music and dance and a country as a whole... has painted some of the greatest architects and institutions and its culture black...drawn numerous young minds away from the pursuit of excellence".

Ranjini-Gayatri added that Krishna had "caused immense damage to the Carnatic music world, willfully and happily stomped over the sentiments of this community and insulted the most respected icons like Tyagaraja and M Subbulakshmi".

This is a reference to Krishna's writings and lectures on the two subjects. While singing Tyyagaraja kritis for several years, Krishna has attempted to scrutinise the complexity of the personality of the famed Telugu saint while guestioning some of his aesthetic choices, politics and social commentary. In the case of M S Subbulakshmi, Krishna revered the power of the vocalist's mu-

Devadasi roots and argued that Subbulakshmi Brahminised herself to receive wider acceptance. Many had accused Krishna of "Brahmin-bashing then".

In their letter, Ranjani-Gayatri also said that they were boycotting the whole season. "We believe in a value system that respects art and artists. vaggeyakaras, rasikas, institutions, our roots and culture. We would be in moral violation if we were to bury these values and join this year's conference," the duo said.

Krishna is seen by conservative Brahmins as one who tarnishes the image of the community and its huge stakes in the Carnatic world, but many others see him as a musician who has democratised the Carnatic classical space by questioning issues like caste, gender and class.

Many credit Krishna, who won the Ramon Magsaysay award in 2016, with reforms like changing the sitting positions on stage to make everyone visible to the audience, not making classical music a conserve of certain spaces only, making the field inclusive and breaking convention to merge Carnatic music with local art forms.

after contempt notice over ad

PATANJALI AYURVED has tendered an unconditional apology to the Supreme Court in response to a notice asking it to show cause why contempt of court proceedings should not be initiated for allegedly flouting an undertaking given to the top court on November 21, 2023.

Hearing a plea by the Indian Medical Association (IMA) accusing the company of allegedly violating provisions of the Drugs and Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act, 1954, and making statements critical of allopathy, a Supreme Court bench of Justices Hima Kohli and Ahsanuddin Amanullah had on March 19 sought the personal presence of company Managing Director Acharya Balkrishna and Baba Ramdev before it.

The court was upset about an advertisement issued by the company on December 4, 2023, after it had assured the court on November 21, 2023, that it would not make any "casual statements claiming medicinal efficacy or against any system of medicine".

In the affidavit filed in response to the notice, Acharya Balkrishna said he "regrets that the advertisement in question which was meant to contain only general statements inadvertently included the offending sentences".

"The same was bona-fide and added in routine course by the media department of the...Company", he said adding "the personnel of the media department of the...Company were not cognizant of the order dated 21.11.2023."

"The Deponent on behalf of

Respondent No. 5 (Patanjali Ayurved) submits an unqualified apology before this Hon'ble Court for the breach of the statement recorded in Para 3 of the order dated 21.11.2023," the affidavit said. Balkrishna also sought to assure the court that he "will ensure that such advertisements are not issued in the future".

The affidavit added, "By way of clarification, not as a defense the Deponent begs to submit that its intention is only to exhort the citizens of this country to lead a healthier life by consuming products of the Respondent No. 5 including products for lifestyle ailments through the age old literature and materials supplementing and backed by ayurvedic research."

Acharya Balkrishna said his "only quest is for a better and healthier life for each and every citizen and to reduce the burden on the countries healthcare infrastructure by providing holistic, evidence based solutions for lifestyle related medical complications through the usage of age old traditional approach of Ayurveda and Yoga". "In fact, the idea was to promote the ayurvedic products which are based on age old literature/ma-

terial backed by scientific re-

search," the affidavit added.

THE SUB-ORBITAL launch of India's second privately developed rocket, which was scheduled for Friday early morning, has been postponed.

A day ahead of the launch, Agnikul Cosmos, the IIT-Madras incubated startup, said: "Holding our launch out of an abundance of caution based on certain minor observations from the full countdown rehearsals last night. Will keep you all posted on the new date and time. Thanks a lot for all the support that has been pouring in." The SubOrbital Technological Demonstrator(SOrTeD) is a single stage rocket that would test the company's Agnilet engine in a real flight. A sub-orbital launch takes the payloads to space or close to it but cannot push it into an orbit around the Earth. This was a much anticipated launch, with the launch vehicle using a 3D printed

manufactured in parts and then assembled ahead of the launch, however, 3D printing will ensure that Agnikul's rocket engine comes in one piece.

Another significant thing about the launch is that it would use the first private launch platform that the company has set up at the country's only spaceport at Sriharikota. And, the use of this platform also means that the rocket will not utilise guiderails to determine its lift-off trajectory Instead, Agnibaan SOrTeD will lift off vertically and follow a pre-determined trajectory.

It is expected to reach the height of around 20 km and then splash back down to Earth. To compare, commercial airplanes fly at a height of around 10 km.

The only other private company to have undertaken a suborbital flight was Skyroot Aerospace in 2022. They are likely to undertake their first orbital flight this year.

Nation's 2nd pvt rocket Outrage over classical dancer's remark on artiste's skin colour

REMARKS BY a prominent Mohiniyattam artiste about the skin colour of another renowned exponent of the classical dance has caused outrage in Kerala, with cultural institutions and political leaders condemning the comments.

Kalamandalam Satyabhama, who in an interview with a YouTube channel said that Dr RLV Ramakrishnan's skin colour was that of a "crow" and suggested that he was not "beautiful enough" to be a Mohiniyattam performer, later told reporters on Thursday that she stood by her comments. Ramakrishnan has said that he would explore legal options against her. Both are well-known exponents of the classical dance form that originated in Kerala.

"His colour is that of a crow. A performs person who Mohiniyattam should be a mohini (enchanting one). One should be beautiful enough to perform Mohiniyattam. There are attractive men who perform it, but his looks are unbearable," she said in the interview, referring to Ramakrishnan.

When reporters asked her later for clarification about the comments, she said, "I do not regret what I said. A performer of

Mohiniyattam, be it man or woman, should be beautiful enough." Claiming that she was not disparaging his skin colour, Satyabhama said, "Have darkskinned persons not won beauty contests? Dark-skinned girls can perform Mohiniyattam. But if boys are performing, they should have a charming appeal. If darkskinned students come to learn dance, they will be given training, but they will be told not to attend competitions," she said. Dr Ramakrishnan, who is the

brother of the late Malayalam film actor Kalabhavan Mani, said the comments were an insult to Kerala's cultural realm. "This is not just an insult to

me as an individual. She has insulted all dark-skinned aristes in the country. To say that only beautiful people should dance gives a wrong message to society. It is an insult to Kerala's entire cultural world," he said.

China objects to US recognising Arunachal as Indian territory

China on Thursday said it firmly opposes the US recognition of Arunachal Pradesh as part of Indian territory and affirmed that Washington has nothing to do with the India-China border

dispute. It also accused the US of "instigating and using other countries' disputes" for selfish geopolitical interests. China's strong reaction came hours after US State Department Principal Deputy Spokesperson Vedant Patel's remarks that the United States "recognises Arunachal Pradesh as Indian territory." Patel also said, "We(the US) strongly oppose any unilateral attempts to advance territorial claims by incursions or encroachments, military or civilian, across the Line of Actual Control." "China strongly deplores

and firmly opposes this," Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Lin Jian told a media briefing while replying to a question posed by the official Chinese media. The delimitation of the

China-India boundary has not been completed, Lin said adding, "Zangnan' (the official Chinese name for Arunachal Pradesh) has always been China's territory. This is an undeniable basic fact. The question of the China-India border issue is between China and India and it has nothing to do with the US".

"It is well known that the US has been instigating and using other countries' disputes by al means to serve its selfish geo-political interests," the spokesperson said. The comments by the US official came days after the Chinese military reiterated its claim over Arunachal following PM Narendra Modi's visit to the

Biren seeks ₹2,000 crore to tackle tax loss due to unrest

MANIPUR CM N Biren Singh has asked the Centre for a "special" financial grant of Rs 2,000 crore to offset the loss in tax revenue due to the unrest since last May, *The Indian Express* has learnt. The Centre is likely to take a

call on this shortly, sources said. In a letter written to Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman earlier this year, Singh said that according to initial assessments the state was

looking at a tax revenue loss of

Rs 820 crore in the 2023-24 fi-

nancial year. This might go up when the actual figures are available, he said.

"This loss will hamper the

functioning of the state government considerably and may impede our developmental and security goals," Singh wrote in the letter. Saying that the state's finances were under "severe strain... not faced earlier" due to the crisis, Singh told Sitharaman his government was working to reduce expenditure in non-critical areas while exploring other avenues to increase revenues, such as lifting the three-decade old prohibition on liquor.

"These efforts will bear fruit,

although it may take at least 3-4 months," he said, adding that in such a situation the "need of the hour is strong support from the Central government".

Given that the Independents are already favouring the BJP, that could put the Sukhu government under threat.

Worse, since the cross-voting episode, the division within the state Congress between Sukhu's loyalists and the faction led by state unit president Pratibha Singh seems to have widened. Pratibha is the wife of the late Congress leader Virbhadra Singh, a six-time CM; the loyalty of their son Vikramaditya, a state minister, remains unclear after he openly sided with the rebels and briefly

The Hamirpur district in particular has given the state two recent CMs in Sukhu and the BIP's Prem Kumar Dhumal. But in the 2017 Assembly polls, the region had rejected Dhumal in favour of the Congress candidate, following which the BJP's Jai Ram Thakur

became the "accidental CM".

Shanta Kumar of the BIP had failed to retain his Sullah seat in the Kangra district in 1993, after a period of President's Rule in the wake of the Babri Masjid demolition. Going back further, the Congress's former MP and Union minister Sukh Ram, who was often likened to politician-scholar Chanakya by his supporters, had lost the Lok Sabha poll from Mandi in 1989 despite having won the Assembly four times and the Parliamentary seat once. Heading into election season, the BJP is confident of not only

winning Himachal Pradesh's Lok Sabha seats but also flipping the state Assembly with enough wins in the bypolls. In a social media post earlier this month, Jai Ram Thakur said that with the six Assembly bypolls being held with the general elections which the BJP would "definitely" win, there was no surprise in the outcome, and that the BJP would come to power in Himachal too. Even a modest Indian initiative for peace will be most welcome in a war-weary Europe

RIME MINISTER NARENDRA Modi's push for an early end to the war in Ukraine, in his phone calls on Wednesday to Russian President Vladimir Putin and his counterpart in Kyiv, Volodymyr Zelenskyy, comes amid the military stalemate on the ground and a gathering political sentiment in favour of a negotiated settlement. It is perhaps premature to talk of a major Indian role in ending the brutal war in the heart of Europe. The earlier initiatives by Turkey and China to promote a ceasefire and negotiations between Moscow and Kyiv had fizzled out. But the conditions for productive peace talks might have improved amidst the Republican Party's refusal in the US to support new military assistance to Ukraine and the growing prospects of Donald Trump winning the White House in the November elections. Modi's phone calls also come weeks before a major peace conference on Ukraine that Switzerland is organising in the coming weeks.

The Indian diplomatic initiative comes amid an important shift in international perceptions of India's role in Ukraine. Ever since the Russian invasion of Ukraine in February 2024, India has received many brickbats in the West for its refusal to criticise the Russian aggression formally. Delhi's presumed political tilt towards Russia in the Ukraine war was magnified by the surge in India's oil purchases from Moscow. The US and Europe sought to inflict economic pain on Moscow by imposing sanctions on its energy trade. Despite sharp media criticism of India, sensible elements in the West saw Delhi's close ties with Moscow as a potential political asset in promoting peace. Recent Western media reports have lauded Modi's role in 2022 in preventing nuclear escalation in Ukraine, as Putin threatened to use atomic weapons if the West directly intervened in favour of Kyiv. Being Putin's best friend is not enough of a qualification to be a peacemaker in Ukraine. Over the last year, Delhi has stepped up its contact with the Ukrainian leadership and sought to dispel the notion that it was taking Russia's side in the war. PM Modi, Foreign Minister S Jaishankar, and National Security Adviser Ajit Doval have been in regular touch with their Ukrainian counterparts. In a reflection of this balanced approach, India is expected to host the Ukrainian Foreign Minister, Dmytro Kuleba, in Delhi next week. This will be the first time that Delhi is receiving Ukraine's top diplomat.

PM Modi, who is basking in the balmy sun of a successful diplomatic run over the last decade, is seizing the diplomatic possibilities in Ukraine, slim though they might be. India's growing salience on the world stage is matched by Modi's high personal prestige among world leaders. This allows the PM considerable room to explore a potential peacemaking role in Europe. Even a modest Indian contribution will be most welcome in a war-weary Europe. It would also boost Modi's domestic image as an influential world leader in his quest for a third term as India's PM. Both the PM and the nation have everything to gain from Delhi's bold diplomatic moves on Ukraine.

From Gwadar, a warning



The growing infrastructure of violence in Pakistan does not augur well for the region in the long run

ON MARCH 20, Pakistan security forces thwarted a complex coordinated attack on Gwadar Port Authority Complex in a twohour-long battle and claimed to have neutralised all eight militants. Two soldiers were killed in action. The Majeed Brigade of the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA), claiming responsibility for the attack, stressed that their fighters had targeted Pakistan's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) and Military Intelligence facilities. Less than two weeks ago, the Baloch Liberation Front (BLF) ambushed a convoy of 10 military vehicles in the Kolwa town of Kech.

The Baloch insurgency in Pakistan has been gaining momentum for the past two years and insurgents can regularly breach the perimeter security of Pakistani military and paramilitary installations across Balochistan in bold, frontal attacks. The Gwadar incident is yet another big-ticket attack that points to the growing capability of armed Baloch groups. Meanwhile, the newly elected "hybrid" government in Pakistan seems to be following the decades-old policy of ruthless repression of Baloch populations, fuelling the insurgency to alarming levels.

Baloch armed groups, including the BLA, BLF, Baloch Nationalist Army (BNA), and the Baloch Republican Guard (BRG) created an operational umbrella alliance under the banner of Baloch Raaji Aajoi Sangar (BRAS) in 2018 to coordinate their actions on the ground. The BRAS have claimed over 612 attacks and over 600 casualties of armed forces in 2023, while the BLA alone has claimed over 247 attacks, including on 23 military installations and big attacks in Turbat and Gwadar. The BLA even briefly captured a facility in Quetta in 2023 and arrested and released troops after giving them a "warning".

Apart from economic deprivation and lack of political freedom, the burning issues in Balochistan have been the forced disappearances of thousands of men and extrajudicial killings of many of those reported missing.

Balochistan and the Gwadar port are immensely important for Pakistan, especially for the army that has taken on the responsibility of making the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) and its end port, Gwadar, a success story for China's Belt and Road Initiative. Chinese President Xi Jinping has always maintained that CPEC is a part of his 'vision'. However, not just in Balochistan but also in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, the forces have repeatedly failed to provide fool-proof security to the project for many years. Additionally, in February, after almost a decade, Pakistan approved work on the first phase of the Iran-Pakistan gas pipeline from the Pakistan-Iran

The community has lodged several protests in the past. However, Since November last year, Balochistan has seen fresh public movement on the issue of forced disappearances. This was triggered by the "encounter" of a 24year-old Baloch man, Balaach Mola Bakhsh. He had been missing since October. Due to public protests and on the basis of a court order, an FIR was registered against counter-terrorism officials, but no action was taken by law enforcement officials.

Mahrang Baloch, one of the most prominent leaders of the Baloch Yakjehti Committee, or Baloch Solidarity Committee, who had lost her own father in an extrajudicial killing became the face of women-led protests in Balochistan. The women's group marched to Islamabad in December and staged a sit-in at the National Press Club. But, following repeated rough treatment by state actors, it called off the sit-in and returned to Quetta on January 23. In the middle of electioneering, the welcome rally for Mahrang Baloch and team was far bigger than any election rally by national parties. The Islamabad march by women has re-energised the issues in the minds of the population, civil society and armed groups.

The ill-treatment of women has led to a deadly round of violence by Baloch groups, who claimed over 92 small and big attacks between January 28 and February 6. The attacks included unprecedented mobilisation of over 380 fighters who took over control of Mach town and the surrounding areas for two days. They used 12 suicide bombers and claimed responsibility for 78 fatalities to troops in the March attacks alone. Calling it "revenge" for the torture of women folk, Baloch groups have now openly expressed readiness to "work with any nation against the common enemy for mutual benefit".

The Chinese may, for now, continue holding the hand of the "all-weather ally" with respect to moving forward on CPEC and Gwadar port. However, in the larger scheme of things in the Indian Ocean region, given the grave security imperatives for Pakistan, the Gwadar port may not be able to compete with the Iranian port of Chabahar for business and trade.

Late last month, Pakistan Army Chief General Asim Munir blamed the Taliban regime for supporting the Baloch insurgency after repeatedly warning it against supporting the Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) network. In January, Pakistan retaliated against Iranian airstrikes into Balochistan. Earlier this month, it mounted air strikes into Afghanistan, reportedly killing civilians while claiming the strikes were targeting the TTP. Apart from serious domestic troubles on security, Pakistan does not enjoy good relations with most of its neighbours at the moment By continuing to point to the "foreign hand' for its own failings in securing the nation, the Pakistan army is an unlikely "partner of choice" for regional or global security considerations. The growing infrastructure of violence in Pakistan does not augur well for the

region in the long run.

LABELLING THE PEOPLE

Shobha Karandlaje's remarks don't just pose a hurdle to her party's ambitions, they also drag down level of public discourse

NTHE RUN-UP to elections, with the Model Code of Conduct in place, the Election Commission has done well to take note of BJP leader and Union Minister of State Shobha Karandlaje's irresponsible and polarising statements about "people who .come from Tamil Nadu" to "plant bombs here". Karandlaje is the BJP's Lok Sabha candidate from North Bengaluru. Her remarks, made to reporters on Tuesday, are also surely an embarrassment for her party, which has intensified its focus on the southern states — the push is led by the Prime Minister himself.

Karandlaje's latest outburst — which also included sweeping statements that labelled "people of Delhi" and "people who come from Kerala" — has drawn strong condemnation from Tamil Nadu's ruling DMK government as well as the ruling LDF and opposition UDF in Kerala. She has stoked similar controversies earlier. In 2020, Kerala Police had filed a case against her for a social media post suggesting that Hindu families in Malappuram were denied water for supporting the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA). Now, Karandlaje has apologised, but she may well have contributed to making the BJP's challenge in the region — an uphill task — more difficult. For a party hoping for a third term at the Centre, making gains in the south may be crucial. In the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, out of 129 seats from the region, the BJP won 29 — of these, 25 were from Karnataka and four from Telangana. Of the five states, Kerala and Tamil Nadu, which send 20 and 39 MPs respectively, have been the toughest for the BJP to crack. It has never managed to get its candidates elected to the Lok Sabha from Kerala, while in Tamil Nadu, the party has only won from two constituencies — Coimbatore in 1998 and 1999 and Kanniyakumari in 2014. These are the odds that the BJP is trying to overcome as it makes an all-out effort to woo voters down South, with development projects worth thousands of crores, multiple rallies and roadshows addressed by the PM across the five states.

Polarising remarks of the kind made by Karandlaje don't just pose a hurdle to her own party's ambitions, they also drag down the level of public discourse ahead of a crucial election. In the weeks to come, other attempts will be made to deepen divides and embitter the contest. Going ahead, the challenge will be to ensure that even as they plunge into the heat of battle, both parties and their candidates respect the inviolable rules of the game.

DEAD OR ALIVE

This election season, AI is being used to generate life-like impressions of deceased stalwarts. It's problematic

VEN IN THE analogue age, the great men and women of Indian politics used to cast a long shadow. They built movements and parties, mobilised communities and won elections, ran governments and brought them down. In death, the assumption went, they would continue to inspire but would no longer have to perspire. A photo on the wall, an invocation at a political meeting of the "guiding" light", was enough. Apart from allowing the deceased to rest in peace, the passing of a generation — in politics, as in much else — allows new leadership to emerge and find its own vocabulary and practice. With AI, deepfakes and no barrier to distribution, however, the Digital Age is ensuring that deceased leaders do not, in a sense, die.

This election season has already witnessed a wide variety of content generated through artificial intelligence tools. There are parodies featuring leaders of the ruling party and the Opposition that have them singing songs and making statements. These videos and sound files mimic the appearance and voice of the leaders — sometimes so accurately that they are almost indistinguishable from the genuine article. And, as reported in this newspaper, the deepfake as a campaign tool is also indulging in necromancy. Both the DMK and AIADMK have used likenesses of their deceased leaders. A video of M Karunanidhi (died, 2018) was released by the former in which he is praising his son, Chief Minister M K Stalin. AIADMK workers received a message in the late J Jayalalithaa's voice last month, asking them to sup-

port party leader Edappadi Palaniswami. The all-too-real fakes will present a challenge for the Election Commission. But the issue in using the likenesses of deceased leaders is not just one of authenticity. It also speaks of a failure of imagination in terms of defining future politics — by looking ahead, not by going back to the past. The challenge for leaders of today is to take a legacy forward, to re-imagine and re-invent. But then, who wants to lose their star campaigner, dead or alive?

IN THE SAME BOAT

Citizens on the edge

Despite the political fanfare, CAA Rules fail to heed lessons from asylum policies globally or to establish a fair and transparent system for the proclaimed beneficiaries

THE CITIZENSHIP AMENDMENT Rules, released by the central government on March 11, have proven its critics right. Rather than a humanitarian refugee policy for persecuted people, they create opaque procedures that do not provide legal safeguards for asylum seekers in India.

These Rules are meant to implement the Citizenship Amendment Act, 2019. The Act offers routes to Indian citizenship for non-Muslim "illegal migrants" who came to India before the cut-off date of December 31, 2014, from Afghanistan, Bangladesh or Pakistan. The Act is under challenge in the Supreme Court for being arbitrary and discriminatory on the grounds of religion, which, if established, would render it unconstitutional.


Even beyond religious discrimination, the newly released Rules show that the CAA is bound to also fail its ostensible beneficiaries. The Rules operate with the same logic that policies like the NRC in Assam have adopted, with terrible consequences for ordinary people who were compelled to participate. They do not create a judicious, fair and accountable refugee system that protects fundamental human rights. Rather, they are poised to push people into a bureaucratic nightmare of uncertainty and vulnerability.

Under the Rules, those seeking benefits under the CAA will need to provide a document to prove that they are citizens of Afghanistan, Bangladesh or Pakistan, and entered India before the cut-off date. It is not difficult to imagine that those applicants, who fled persecution before 2014, would find it difficult to procure or present such documents. Inevitably, there will be situations where they have lost such documents.

Potential applicants may have been compelled to damage these documents for fear of being further victimised based on their nationality after their migration. Applicants who arrived and resided unlawfully are also unlikely to possess the listed documents that prove the date of entry into India.

Recent global trends show that governments often demand asylum seekers fulfil onerous documentary burdens to establish fear of persecution. This leaves them tangled in delays and rejections. It has been widely observed that asylum seekers do not possess eno-

ugh documents to satisfy state authorities. Refugee law experts, for example, have shown that refugees in Australia face a higher burden of proof than even criminals. There are several cases of Australian authorities demanding that Afghan asylum seekers produce state documents, despite the well-known fact that Afghanistan's documentation system has collapsed. South Asians seeking asylum in the United Kingdom face constant suspicions regarding the authenticity of their documents. Consequently, these countries have considerable backlogs of asylum applications, and

cases take between one to three years to conclude with no right to work for asylum seekers. Australia and the UK have been criticised for arbitrary and regressive policies that leave vulnerable asylum seekers in undignified conditions and even indefinite detention.

Over-reliance on documents is a major reason for these conditions. The new citizenship rules, rather than heeding these warnings from international experience, make documents central to the process.

This documentary logic is only the tip of the problem. The opaque bureaucratic system is the worst offender. The Rules provide that state-level Empowered Committees and District Level Committees will receive and process applications.

The Empowered Committee has to be convinced, after "making such inquiries as it considers necessary", that the applicant is "suitable", "fit and proper". But the Rules provide no meaningful guidance and procedures for these committees. The mandate of the Empowered Committee has not been laid down beyond the responsibility of generally ascertaining the suitability of the applicant. It remains debatable if the Committee will merely presume "persecution" for non-Muslim applicants, which is a qualification for citizenship under the CAA, or conduct an inquiry.

It is unlikely that these committees are fit for purpose, not least because they are composed of administrators like census, postal and intelligence officials, and not those familiar with asylum claims. This composition shows that this system is not conceived as an asylum system for vulnerable people fleeing persecution.

It is also unclear what the role of the committees will be in adjudicating documents provided by the applicants. For example, District Level Committees are expected to assess the "veracity" of documents but the Rules do not indicate how this will be done. Among the documents to prove nationality, applicants can submit "any document" issued by the country of origin. But this would imply that the committee will adjudicate the relevance and authenticity of these documents. This appears to be a logistically demanding, if not impossible, task for Indian authorities, especially if the issuing authorities in the country of origin are obscure or have ceased to exist. It may lead to delays or exclusion from Indian citizenship with no safeguards protecting them from detention and further marginalisation.

Applicants are also expected to submit "eligibility certificates" from "locally reputed community institutions" as proof of religious and national identity. It is uncertain how the committees will assess these certificates, or if they will follow a fair and transparent procedure. The complete lack of guidelines suggests that the Rules are likely to be implemented arbitrarily.

The Committees' lack of transparency and fairness in functioning brings to mind the patently arbitrary Foreigners Tribunals that have deprived over 1.5 lakh people of citizenship in Assam. These tribunals — like the Empowered Committee — have operated without any legislated procedure and separately from ordinary courts. Rather than creating another freewheeling body, the Rules should have clearly instituted independent and accessible judicial remedies for applicants, including the rights of appeal to higher courts.

Most concerningly, the CAA Rules expect and their implementation on the ground will inevitably involve force — people to declare themselves as "illegal migrants" in order to be eligible for Indian citizenship. Once they do so, they are bound to become exposed to the arbitrary powers that the state exercises in relation to foreigners, despite government assurances. They may be forced to do this only to face a bureaucratic maze.

The government could have learnt from good international practices that are not narrowly built around state-issued documents, but accept wide-ranging evidence including testimonies to show fear of persecution. The Indian system could have followed respected asylum adjudication that involves trained professionals who exercise their powers judiciously, and has mechanisms for appeals and revision.

It is clear that the Rules — despite all the political fanfare — fail to establish a fair and transparent asylum system for its proclaimed beneficiaries. The framing of the CAA and its Rules makes it clear that the government sees them not as a mechanism for addressing refugee rights but just another administrative formality.

The judge's code

Members of the judiciary should follow a self-imposed discipline — and be seen to do so too

FORMER JUDGE ABHIJIT Gangopadhyay officially joined politics within 48 hours of demitting office. There is nothing wrong in how he chooses to occupy himself post his resignation, which came five months before his retirement. His desire to serve the electorate of his home state is laudable and one wishes him the best in his new innings.

Admittedly, Gangopadhyay is not the first judge to demit office and join politics. Former Chief Justice of India, K Subba Rao, also resigned three months prior to his retirement. A staunch supporter of civil liberties, CJI Rao was part of the majority decision which held that Parliament has no authority to take away fundamental rights. Upon his resignation, CJI Rao became the Opposition's candidate for the Presidential elections. Given the electoral college system of indirect voting to elect the President, Justice Rao wasn't elected as the ruling party of the time pushed through its candidate.

Next was Justice Baharul Islam who was a seasoned politician active from his youth. He served two terms in the Rajya Sabha and resigned from the house to be appointed as a High Court Judge in his home state of Assam. Islam was elevated to the Supreme Court from where he resigned five weeks before the end of his tenure. Immediately thereupon, he was appointed as a Lok Sabha election candidate, which ultimately did not happen and so he came back as a Rajya Sabha member. This nomination of Islam saw people raise questions about some of his judicial decisions in politically sensitive cases. Justice Gangopadhyay may well face similar scrutiny.

The last instance is of Justice K S Hegde who was first an elected member of the Rajya Sabha, then came back to legal practice and was then appointed as a judge of the Supreme Court of India. After a gap of four years, he successfully contested for the Lok Sabha, and eventually became the speaker of the lower house of Parliament.

Juxtaposed to the above precedents, all of which were several decades ago, what is disconcerting about Gangopadhyay's foray into politics is that he used his Constitutional highchair as the pulpit from which he broadcast his political ambitions. Political barbs were exchanged in the courtroom and he courted controversy for

having run-ins with fellow judges, for giving press interviews about matters pending before him and for breaking rank by summoning documents from the Supreme Court of India. His acts raised questions about judicial propriety, impartiality, institutional integrity and independence. These values are the essential pillars on which the independence of our judiciary rests and form part of the Bangalore Principles of Judicial Conduct of which India is also a member state.

These Principles draw upon the "Restatement of Values of Judicial Life" and were adopted by the full court of the Supreme Court of India in the late 1990s. They resolved that, "a judge, like any other citizen, is entitled to freedom of expression, belief, association and assembly, but in exercising such rights, a judge shall always conduct himself or herself in such a manner as to preserve the dignity of the judicial office and the impartiality and independence of the judiciary.' Did Gangopadhyay's actions uphold that dignity and help preserve people's faith in the judiciary?

Notably, in India, the only check on the judiciary's exercise of powers is the selfimposed discipline of self-restraint. As former Supreme Court Judge E S Venkataramiah penned, "A judge should be independent of himself. A judge is a human being who is a bundle of passions and prejudices, likes and dislikes, affection and ill will, hatred and contempt and fear and recklessness. In order to be a successful judge these elements should be curbed and kept under restraint and that is possible only by education, training, continued practice and cultivation of a sense of humility and dedication to duty... It is the inner strength of judges alone that can save the judiciary. The life of a judge does not really call for great acts of self-sacrifice; but it does insist upon small acts of self-denial almost every day."

Quite contrastingly, on numerous occasions, Gangopadhyay drew the light upon himself. So much so that the Supreme Court on its own stayed his judicial decisions and reallocated cases pending before him to other benches. As the French philosopher, Michel De Montaigne said, and what is often cited in Indian jurisprudence "Were I not to follow the straight road for its straightness, I should follow it for having found by experience that in the end it is commonly the happiest and the most useful track." The straight and narrow merits being walked upon even if one is the lone one treading it. After all, as the revered son of Bengal, Rabindranath

My MP and I

Notes from a 2014 Lok Sabha campaign, some pointers for 2024

THE HEADLINES BROUGHT back sharp memories of a hot summer wind. Exactly 10 years ago, we had embarked on a grueling campaign for my husband Nandan Nilekani from Bangalore South constituency for the Lok Sabha elections of 2014.

Everyone knows how that particular movie ended, but there was so much we learnt which may be relevant for the sequel now playing out around the country. The first lesson that 900 million plus voters could acknowledge is that politics may be the world's most difficult profession. We personally witnessed how politicians work 24/7, 365 days a year, surprisingly often without rewards, to meet voter demands. So, can we give a thumbs up to the thousands of candidates from dozens of parties, of whom only 543 will win, but who will all keep our vital electoral democracy humming?

The second issue is that too many voters, especially from the elite urban classes, still take the elections too lightly. They should not. India does not have a compulsory vote like 21 countries do. Our elections are more of a celebration of the right to vote than a cumbersome duty.

But we let ourselves down when we don't participate in the free and fair elections India is so proud of, when we don't vote. Sure, our elections come in the way of the precious summer holidays; sure, some of us may find our names removed from the voter list. But think hard of what would happen if a majority thought it was not worth their time to vote.

What kind of country would India be? The third, critical question is what people should expect from their candidates. Most voters may not have internalised that we will be choosing those whose main job is to minister parliament as good law makers. The media does not highlight this enough. Politicians only rarely talk about it themselves.

MPs have the representative responsibility to reflect the aspirations of their constituents, the power of the purse responsibility to approve the expenditure of the government, and some oversight over the executive. But their main job is to participate in un-

derstanding, debating on and helping pass legislation that enables the nation to function smoothly, fairly and without conflict. In our experience of the 2014 campaign, that is not what the voters had understood or even wanted. Walking for months through many slums,

middle class neighbourhoods and fancy apartment complexes, we listened deeply to the people all day long. Some moments were particularly illuminating. One sweltering day, in a fancy apartment

complex, after my impassioned speech on how Nandan, if elected, would help drive systems reform, one man nodded wisely and said, "Wonderful. But what will he do about my crazy neighbour who feeds stray dogs at 1 am?"

In middle class neighbourhoods, people asked what we would do for street lights, or to keep their park green. In one such park, a lady probed — "You want my vote free or what? What will you give me?" When I mumbled something about a hardworking,

ethical candidate, she was amused. In slum areas, people were still desperate

for basic services. "Bari neeru kodi, saaku," they begged. If you can provide water, it is enough. Others spoke of electricity, transport, and hospitals. This was their one chance to pour out their frustrations to candidates and their crews.

Eventually, our team realised, even in a developed and educated city like Bengaluru, people want personally from their MPs what they should collectively organise for, or solicit from their corporators, local bureaucrats or MLAs. They want a direct solution to their local irritants, not abstract rewards.

None of these demands are unreasonable. Many, especially on basic services, are critical to meet. The question is, who should be fulfilling them?

It cannot possibly be up to the MP, who has no authority or legally sanctioned resources apart from a meagre MPLAD scheme, to meet any of these aspirations. If he or she has to please such a voter, the winning candidate has to perform a politics of patronage and brokerage.

A modern democracy needs enlightened politicians to work with efficient bureaucrats to solve forever more complex issues. Too often, our laws and policies are signed off on without any discussion. Too often, we the people can't see how that affects our day-to-day lives.

To take just one example, the Telecommunications Act 2023 cements the power of the government to suspend internet services. No urban voter even knows anymore how to live without the internet for more than a few hours. Do we not need our MP to intervene to ensure internet shut-

downs can be ordered only in the rarest of rare circumstances?

For the nearly 2 crore new young voters, policy issues may be critical for what they care about most — the future of work. Similarly, for women enrolling in larger numbers than ever, laws and rules on safety and health, equity and access, may be even more important than immediate relief.

We have an opportunity, as voters of the 17th Lok Sabha, to flip the old mental model. We can elect men and women who will speak up for our freedoms and guard against our fears when new laws are designed or old ones are modified.

Good parliamentarians make good laws. Good laws make for a good society. Good laws when well implemented enrich a democracy with justice, equity, rights and protections. Good laws written today create a better future for countless generations ahead.

Our MPs need not be distracted by local issues, for which we must hold local governments accountable. Surely we can spare 543 leaders to focus on ideas that matter more than we can immediately perceive. Ten years ago, our campaign team treaded

the heated streets, canvassing for strategic votes. In a few weeks, we will ink our fingers as members of the world's largest and proudest voting population. We, the *samaaj* of India can deepen India's

Centre-right wins polls but populists want a say in govt

Lisbon: A centre-right alliance led by the Social Democratic Party has won Portugal's general election by a slender margin and is set to form a minority government that could have a difficult term in office as a radicalright populist party that came third in the voting tries to get a hand on the levers of power. Results published Wednesday gave the Democratic Alliance a final tally of 80 seats in the 230-seat National Assembly. The centre-left Socialist Party placed second with 78 seats. The hard-right Chega (Enough) party collected 50 seats, up from 12 seats in 2022. Chega leader Andre Ventura is demanding that the Social Democrats give his party a say in governing the country. President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa invited Luis Montenegro, head of the Democratic Alliance, to form a government.

PAKISTAN

Two killed, 22 injured in suicide blast in KPK

Peshawar: At least two people were killed and 22 others injured when a suicide bomber rammed a vehicle laden with explosives against a convoy of the security forces in Pakistan's restive northwest region on Thursday, police said. The incident happened in the Dera Ismail Khan district of the country's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province when the security convoy was on the move from one part of the district to another. "In the suicide blast, at least 2 people were killed and 22 others iniured. The two deceased are believed to be from the Army. However, it is not confirmed yet," said a senior police officer.

Pak seeking 24th IMF bailout package: Sharif

Islamabad: Pakistan would require another IMF bailout programme for its macroeconomic stability, the cash-strapped country's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said on Thursday, a day after Islamabad reached a stafflevel agreement with the global lender on the successful completion of the existing short-term facility. Addressing a meeting of the Special Investment and Facilitation Council's Apex committee, Sharif asserted that the new tranche of the bailout package by the IMF would likely be received in a few

Billionaire calls land scam case a 'political stunt'

billionaire and Nepali Congress lawmaker Binod Chaudhary on Thursday rejected allegations against him in a government land grab scam, calling it a "political stunt". Chaudhary's remarks came after the Central Investigation Bureau recorded his statement in connection with the Bansbari Leather and Shoe Factory land grab scam. Chaudhary claimed that the government action against him was "a stunt and driven by political motives."

Truce possible as gaps are narrowing, US drafting a UN resolution: Blinken

US Secretary of State holds talks with Egypt President, fighting rages in Gaza

US SECRETARY of State Antony Blinken met Egypt's president on Thursday for talks on securing aGaza ceasefire, as Gaza's Palestinians despaired at observing Ramadan without relatives who had been killed or adequate food for their children.

In Gaza, Israel's offensive focused on the Al Shifa hospital, for a fourth day, and local residents said they had seen buildings inside the complex in flames. The head of the World Health Organization(WHO)said only the expansion of land crossings into Gaza could prevent famine.

Blinken met Abdel Fattah El-Sisi in Cairo after ceasefire talks resumed in Oatar this week, centred on a truce of around six weeks that would allow the release of 40 Israeli hostages in return for hundreds of Palestinians detained in Israeli iails. Blinken told the Arabic broadcaster Al Hadath that such a ceasefire would bring "immediate relief to so many people who are suffering in Gaza – the children, the women, the men", and that the US had drafted a UN resolution to that effect. "I think the gaps are narrowing, and I think an agreement is very much possible," Blinken told Al Hadath.

UN CHIEF TO EU: AVOID **DOUBLE STANDARDS OVER GAZA AND UKRAINE**

Brussels: European Union leaders were urged to show the same respect for international law in Gaza as they aim to uphold in Ukraine. UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres appealed to the leaders to remain strong and united in their respect of standards enshrined in the UN Charter. "The basic principle of humanitarian law is the protection of civilians. We must stick to principles in Ukraine as in Gaza without double standards." Guterres told reporters, standing alongside EU Council chief Charles Michel, who chaired the summit. AP

Sisi stressed the need for a truce to address the escalating humanitarian crisis and warned of the dangers of a military operation in Rafah. But an Israeli official insisted Israel would take control of Rafah even if it caused a rift with the US, saying that a quarter of Hamas's original fighting force was there. Officials from 36 countries and UN agencies gathered in Cyprus to discuss ways to expedite humanitarian deliveries.

How name-dropping Messi saved an Israeli grandmother from Hamas

"I'M FROM where Messi is from," 90-year-old Esther Cunio told the two masked Palestinian gunmen who moments earlier invaded her home in southern Israel. It was the morning of Oct. 7 and Hamas was carrying out its killing spree in communities near the Gaza border, including in Kibbutz Nir Oz, where Cunio, who was born in Argentina, was living.

The two armed men were demanding to know where the rest of her family was.

"Don't speak to me', I said,

'Because I don't know your language. You speak Arabic and I

speak Hebrew poorly'. I tell him, 'I speak in Argentine Spanish'," Cunio recounted. "So he says to me 'What is Argentina?''' "So I tell him, 'Do you watch soccer?' Then he says to me, 'Yes, yes, I like soccer'. So I say to him, 'I'm from where Messi is from'. Then he replies. 'Messi! I like Messi'.'' And then, one man leaned over the seated Cunio, and placed his assault rifle on her lap. The other man photographed them.

In another part of Nir Oz, Cunio's family was taken hostage. Her grandchildren David, 33, and Ariel, 26, are still being held in captivity in Gaza. Now, she awaits the return of her "golden boys".

Russia launches 31 missiles at Kyiv in 1st attack in 44 days

Migration at record high, Australia tightens visa rules for students

AUSTRALIA WILL begin enforcing tougher visa rules for foreign students this week as official data showed migration hit another record high, which is likely to further exacerbate an already tight rental market.

From Saturday, English language requirements for student and graduate visas will be increased, while the government will get the power to suspend education providers from recruiting international students if they repeatedly break rules.

"The actions this weekend will continue to drive migration levels down while delivering on our commitments in the migration strategy to fix the broken system we inherited," Home Affairs Minister Clare O'Neil said in a statement.

A new "genuine student test" will be introduced to further crack down on international students who look to come to Australia primarily to work, while the imposition of "no further stay" conditions will be used on more visitor visas.

The moves follow a raft of actions last year to close off COVIDera concessions introduced by the former government, including unrestricted working hours for international students. The government at the time said rules would be tightened for students. Australia boosted its annual migration numbers in 2022 to help businesses recruit staff to fill shortages after the pandemic brought strict border controls, and kept foreign students and workers out for nearly two years.

Ex-General accused of rights abuses declared winner in Indonesia polls, opponents cry foul

A FEARED former general won last month's presidential election in Indonesia, official results released Wednesday showed, confirming unofficial projections. Prabowo Subianto, who is now Indonesia's defense minister, garnered 58.6% of the vote, according to the final tally by the General Election Commission.

The result means that Prabowo won the election outright, avoiding a runoff with the second-place candidate.

His opponents — Anies Baswedan, who had 24,9% of the vote, and Ganjar Pranowo, who

took 16.5% — have said they plan to challenge the result. They accuse the outgoing president, Joko Widodo, of improperly influencing the election and claim widespread irregularities during the Feb. 14 vote. They have not provided proof of election-day impropriety but said they had evidence to prove their claims in court. Prabowo's representatives reject these claims, noting that nearly every poll before the election showed him as the front-runner. For many observers and crit-

ics, the election has tarnished Indonesia's hard-won reputation of a vibrant democracy. The focal points of their discontent are the actions of Widodo preceding the vote and how he used state resources to support Prabowo, whom he beat in the previous two elections. Widodo exerted his influence, they say, on a court that changed a law, allowing his son, Gibran Rakabuming Raka, to run as Prabowo's running mate. Then Widodo "violated norms" by appearing to campaign.

First pig-to-human kidney transplant performed in US

A 62-YEAR-MAN with end-stage renal disease has become the first human to receive a new kidney from a genetically modified pig, doctors from Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston announced on Thursday. The fourhour surgery, performed on March 16, "marks a major milestone in the quest to provide more readily available organs to patients," the hospital said.

The patient, Richard Slayman of Weymouth, Massachusetts, is recovering well and expected to be discharged soon, the hospital said. Slayman had received a transplant of a human kidney at the same hospital in 2018 after seven years on dialysis, but the organ failed after five years and he had resumed dialysis. The kidney was provided by eGenesis of Cambridge, Massachusetts from a pig that had been genetically edited to remove genes that could be harmful to a human recipient and add certain human genes.

Tibet offers college exam takers a spot if their parents invest \$400,000

TIBET IS luring investors from elsewhere in China with a promise to let their children take university entrance exams there in return for an investment of at least \$400,000, an unusual move to exploit what is considered an

easier scoring system.

With a population that is 90% ethnic Tibetan, the region has one of China's lowest college entry barriers, a key edge for the millions of students who take the competitive "gaokao" entrance exams each year, hoping to secure lucrative white-collar

The plan has sparked debate on Chinese social media, however, with some posters arguing it would be unfair to students

from the mountainous region, while others supported it. "What about the enrolment

rate of kids born in Tibet?" asked one user on Weibo platform.

Amid growing concern as the exam approaches in early June the education ministry issued a notice on Wednesday vowing to crack down on "gaokao migrants", as students seeking to benefit from such a plan have been dubbed.

In 2023, a student in Tibet scoring at least 300 out of 750 on the entrance exam would have qualified for an undergraduate place at more than 1,200 universities nationwide.

By comparison, those taking the exam in Beijing would have needed a score of 448.

Musk's Neuralink shows first brain-chip patient playing online chess

ELON MUSK'S brain-chip startup Neuralink livestreamed on Wednesday its first patient implanted with a chip using his mind to play online chess.

Noland Arbaugh, the 29year-old patient who was paralysed below the shoulder after a diving accident, played chess on his laptop and moved the cursor using the Neuralink device. The implant seeks to enable people

to control a computer cursor or keyboard using only their thoughts.

Arbaugh had received an implant from the company in January and could control a computer mouse using his thoughts, Musk said last month.

"The surgery was super easy," Arbaugh said in the video streamed on Musk's social media platform X, referring to the implant procedure. "I literally was released from the hospital a day later. I have no cognitive impairments."

Why SC has stayed Govt's 'Fact Check Unit' for now

THE SUPREME Court on Thursday stayed the operation of the amended Information Technology (IT) Rules, which empowered the government to identify "fake news" on social media platforms through a "Fact Check Unit" (FCU).

The Union Electronics and IT Ministry had notified the FCU on March 20 as a statutory body under the Press Information Bureau with the power to flag what it believes is false information related to the central government and its agencies on social media sites.

The amendment to the IT Rules, 2021, which allowed the Ministry to appoint the FCU, were notified in April 2023. On January 31 this year, a two-judge division Bench of the Bombay High Court gave a split verdict on a challenge to the Rules.

A third judge who was assigned to give an opinion on the split verdict is yet to give his final decision. However, after the third judge declined to stay the setting up of the FCU, the division Bench on March 13 said by a 2-1 majority that it would not stay the notification of the FCU.

The amended Rules

The amendment to The Information

Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021 notified in April 2023 brought in a legal framework for the online gaming eco-system and, more importantly, introduced a legal mechanism for the government to fact-check online content pertaining to "government business".

The Rules made it obligatory for intermediaries like social media platforms "to not publish, share or host fake, false or misleading information in respect of any business of the Central Government". The changes raised concern that the FCU would make the government the "sole arbiter of truth" in respect of any business related to itself.

The rules were challenged before the Bombay High Court.

Question before HC

The petitioners, including standup comedian Kunal Kamra, Association of Indian Magazines, Editors Guild of India, news channel TV18 Broadcast Ltd, and Bennett, Coleman & Company Ltd, challenged Rule 3(1)(b)(v) of the IT Rules 2021 as being violative of Article 14, Article 19(1)(a) and (g), and Article 21 of the Constitution, and Section 79 and the Information Technology Act, 2000 (IT Act).

The amendment to Rule 3(1)(b)(v) of the IT Rules 2021 expanded the general term "fake news" to include fake news involving government business.

This provision, when enacted in 2021, referred to "...any information which is patently false or misleading in nature but may reasonably be perceived as a fact".

By the 2023 amendment, after the word "nature", the words "or, in respect of any business of the Central Government, is identified as fake or false or misleading by such a fact check unit of the Central Government as the Ministry may, by notification published in the Official Gazette, specify" were inserted.

The petitioners argued that this would have a "chilling effect" on the freedom of

speech and expression. Under the Rules, the Centre would ask intermediaries — not an individual or media organisation directly — to take down speech that it found misleading. However, the restraint on the intermediaries would di-

rectly affect the individual. Section 2(1)(w) of the IT Act defines an

"intermediary" as "any person who on behalf of another person receives, stores or transmits that record or provides any service with respect to that record and includes telecom service providers, network service providers, internet service providers, webhosting service providers, search engines, online payment sites, online-auction sites, online-marketplaces and cyber cafes". This broad definition would include big tech, social media sites, and Internet service providers such as Airtel, Reliance Jio, etc.

Section 69 of the IT Act empowers the government to issue directions to block public access to any information through any computer resource. The Rules were framed essentially in exercise of this power.

However, no rule-making powers can be exercised by Parliament in a manner that is contrary to Part III of the Constitution, which deals with fundamental rights.

The Bombay High Court examined if these Rules were violative of free speech, and were arbitrary in nature. **EXPLAINED**

HC ruling and after On January 31, Justice G S

Patel struck down the

amended Rules, while Justice Neela Gokhale, the other judge on the Bench, upheld them. Justice Patel held that the "state cannot coercively classify speech as true or false and compel the non-publication of the latter.

That is nothing but censorship." Justice Gokhale said the "right of citizens to participate in the representative and participative democracy of the county is meaningless unless they have access to authentic information and are not misled by misinformation, information which is patently untrue, fake, false, or misleading, knowingly communicated with malicious intent".

Since a split verdict was delivered, as per rules of the Bombay High Court, the case had to be heard afresh by a third judge whose opinion would create a 2-1 majority one way or another. However, before beginning a substantial hearing, Justice Atul S Chandurkar – who was assigned by Chief Justice Devendra Kumar Upadhyaya as the third judge — had to decide if the Rules were to be stayed.

After the central government told the court that the Rules were yet to be notified in the official gazette, Justice Chandurkar refused to grant an interim stay on the amended Rules.

An appeal was filed before the Supreme Court against the rejection of interim stay. However, a day before the SC was to hear the appeal against rejection of stay, the Centre notified the 2023 Rules in the official gazette. With Lok Sabha elections less than a month away, the Rules are crucial for the government's engagement with news about "government business".

The stay by the SC

The top court on Thursday stayed the amended Rules until the Bombay High Court reaches a final decision. Chief Justice of India (CII) D Y Chandrachud observed that the issue before the court is whether the status quo should be allowed to change when one judge (Justice Patel) had completely struck down the notification.

Can the SC stay a law before it can rule it unconstitutional?

A law made by Parliament carries the presumption of constitutionality. It is subject to judicial review, but the onus is on the petitioners to prove that the law is unconstitutional. Navigating the line between judicial review and Parliament's power to legislate, courts usually shy away from staying a law before they can rule on its constitutionality.

However, there are two important aspects in this case.

One, the Rules in question are made by the Ministry in exercise of powers delegated to the central government by Parliament, and are not a direct expression of the will of Parliament. The threshold for the presumption of constitutionality varies.

Two, the SC has in the past stated that an interim stay can be granted only on an explicit finding of unconstitutionality. It can be inferred from the observations of CJI Chandrachud that Justice Patel's detailed 148-page ruling, although part of a split verdict, is an "explicit finding of unconstitutionality".

In 2020, the SC stayed the operation of a Maharashtra law granting reservation to Marathas in jobs and educational institutions through an interim order.

The farm laws — which were ultimately repealed — were also stayed by the SC in an interim order in 2021.

TELLING NUMBERS

MEET TWIN STARS OF THE UNIVERSE, WHICH GOBBLE UP PLANETS

EXPLAINED SCIENCE

THE PLANETARY system that includes Earth and its sibling planets orbiting the sun has been remarkably stable during its roughly 4.5 billion years of existence. But not all planetary systems are so lucky, as per a new study involving "twin" stars.

An examination of 91 pairs of stars with matching sizes and chemical compositions showed that a surprising number exhibited signs of having ingested a planet, scientists said on Wednesday, likely after the planet was sent hurtling out of a stable orbit for any number of reasons.

What are twin stars?

The study, published in the journal *Nature*, looked at pairs of stars that formed within the same interstellar cloud of gas and dust — called co-natal stars — giving them the same chemical makeup, and roughly equal mass and age. These are the "twins." While the pairs are moving together in the same direction within our Milky Way galaxy, they are not binary systems of two stars gravitationally bound to each other.

A star's chemical composition changes when it engulfs a planet because it incorporates the elements that made up the doomed world. The researchers looked for stars that differed from their twin because they had higher amounts of tell-tale elements like iron, nickel or titanium indicating remnants of a rocky planet, relative to certain other elements.

In seven of the pairs, one of the two stars bore evidence of planetary ingestion.

How do twin stars eat planets? Possible reasons for a planet making a

death plunge into its host star include an orbital disturbance caused by a larger planet, or another star passing uncomfortably close.

"The stability of a planetary system like the solar system is not a given," said



Aspects of inequality in India

Key takeaways from World Inequality Lab research: scale of wealth and income gap in population

A NEW working paper by World Inequality Lab (WIL), an international collaboration of researchers, has presented data that show inequality in India "declined post-Independence till the early 1980s, after which it began rising and has skyrocketed since the early 2000s".

The paper, Income and Wealth Inequality in India, 1922-2023: The Rise of the Billionaire Raj, co-authored by economists Nitin Kumar Bharti, Lucas Chancel, Thomas Piketty, and Anmol Somanchi, has used data from national income accounts, wealth aggregates, tax tabulations, rich lists, and surveys on income, consumption and wealth to arrive at the results.

WIL is a Paris-based global research centre focused on the study of inequality and public policies that promote social, economic, and environmental justice. Here's what the data show.

GROWTH IN AVERAGE INCOMES: Between 1960 and 2022, the average income of Indians grew at 2.6% per year in real terms (that is, after removing the effect of inflation). This period can be broadly divided into two halves: 1960-1990, when real growth rate of income was 1.6% per year; and 1990-2022, when average incomes grew by 3.6% per year. The periods 2005-2010 and 2010-2015 saw the fastest growth at 4.3% and 4.9% per year respectively.

VERY HIGH NET WORTH INDIVIDU-ALS: The period after 1990 saw the emergence of very high net worth individuals (with net wealth more than \$1 billion at market exchange rate). Their numbers increased from 1 in 1991 to 52 in 2011, and to 162 in

INCREASE IN INCOME TAX PAYERS: The share of the adult population that filed income tax returns was under 1% until the 1990s, and rose significantly after the economic reforms of 1991 onwards. By 2011, more than 5% of the adult population was filing ITRs. From 2017-2020, around 9% of adults filed returns.

EXTREME LEVELS OF INEQUALITY: In 2022-23, the percentage of national income that went to the top 1% of the population was 22.6%, the most in the data series since 1922, and more than even during the inter-war period. The share of wealth with the top 1% was

40.1% in 2022-23, the highest level since 1961, when the data series on wealth began. "The 'Billionaire Raj' headed by India's modern bourgeoisie is now more unequal than the British Raj headed by the colonialist forces," the paper says.

EXTREME WEALTH AT VERY TOP: Between 1961 and 2023, the share of the top 1% in national wealth increased threefold from 13% to 39%. Most of this gain came after 1991. (Figure 3) Within the top 1% wealth share of 39% in 2022-23, "29 percentage points went just to the top 0.1%, 22 percentage points to just the top 0.01% and 16 percentage points to just the top 0.001%", the

INCOME INEQUALITY GLOBALLY: The paper compares India's income inequality level (as of 2022) with that in Brazil, China, France, South Africa, the UK, and the US. Looking at the income share of the top 10%, India is second only to South Africa (Figure 4). If one compares the income shares of the top 1%, India is on top with 22.6%. "India's top 1% income share appears to be among the very highest in the world based on World Inequality Database data, behind only perhaps Peru, Yemen, and a couple of other small countries," the paper says.

WEALTH INEQUALITY GLOBALLY: The picture on wealth inequality is slightly less extreme. "In terms of top wealth shares, we see that both with top 10% and top 1%, India comes out in the middle of the pack, with Brazil and South Africa standing out with their extreme wealth concentration levels.... the paper says (Figure 5)

LIKELY UNDERESTIMATION OF IN-**EQUALITY:** The authors have emphasised that "the quality of economic data in India is notably poor and has seen a decline recently". Therefore, it is likely that the results represent "a lower bound to actual inequality levels", the paper says.

POLICY SOLUTION: a super tax: "Implementing a super tax on Indian billionaires and multimillionaires, along with restructuring the tax schedule to include both income and wealth, so as to finance major investments in education, health and other public infrastructure, could be effective" to address rising inequalities, the paper says.

Who are Majeed Brigade, Baloch militants who carried out Gwadar attack?

THE MAJEED Brigade of the separatist group Baloch Liberation Army (BLA) has claimed responsibility for Wednesday's attack on a complex outside Pakistan's strategic Gwadar Port. Pakistan has said eight militants and two security personnel were killed in the attack; the BLA has, however, claimed to have

killed 25 security personnel. The BLA is the most prominent separatist group in restive Balochistan. The Majeed Brigade, which has been active since 2011, is the BLA's dedicated suicide squad. The unit is named after two brothers, both called Majeed Langove. This is their story.

The Balochistan context Balochistan, in Pakistan's southwest, is

the country's largest and most sparsely populated province. It has oil reserves and abundant natural resources, but the ethnic Baloch are Pakistan's poorest and most under-represented people.

At the time of Partition, Balochistan comprised multiple chiefdoms owing allegiance to the British. Ahmed Yar Khan, the chief of Kalat, was the most powerful of these tribal chiefs, and hoped to secure an independent state for his people. However, he was forced to accede in 1948 after Pakistan invaded Kalat. This triggered an insurgency which is ongoing, fuelled by persisting economic disaffection, political disenfranchisement, and repression by the Pakistani state.

In many ways, the China-backed Gwadar Port is a symbol of the economic injustice faced by the Baloch — despite rampant unemployment in the province, engineers and technical specialists were hired

from Punjab, Sindh, and even China. In recent years, Baloch militants have repeatedly targeted both Gwadar, and

Chinese nationals in the country. Majeed Sr and Bhutto

In May 1972, the National Awami Party (NAP) came to power in Balochistan. Nationally, the **EXPLAINED** NAP sat in opposition to

GLOBAL Prime Minister Zulfigar Ali Bhutto's Pakistan Peoples' Party (PPP). The NAP had long advocated for greater regional autonomy in Pakistan, and it was emboldened by the secession of Bangladesh in 1971.

But Bhutto, chafing from the humilia-

tion of Pakistan's defeat to India, was un-

willing to grant any major concessions.

From the beginning of the NAP's term in the

created a serious law and order situation in the province. After a cache of arms supposedly meant for insurgents was discovered, Bhutto dismissed the NAP government in February 1973. This led to both the insurgency and the

Between 1973 and 1977, thousands of fighters and military personnel were killed in the fighting, and there were reports of mass atrocities against the Baloch by Pakistani forces.

Pakistani state repression be-

coming worse in Balochistan.

It is in this context that Majeed Langove Senior, then a young Baloch man, decided to assassinate Bhutto. On August 2, 1974, as Bhutto arrived in Quetta to attend a public gathering, Majeed Senior waited atop a tree,

a grenade in hand. He had no plans to escape, and was most certainly going to lose his life in his bid to kill Bhutto.

And he did — even before he had a chance to kill the Pakistani leader. The grenade burst in Majeed Senior's hand as he waited for Bhutto's motorcade, killing him.

Ir's sacrifice, Majeed Brigade

The death of Majeed Senior was mythologised for posterity by the actions of his younger brother, Majeed Langove Junior, who was born two years after Senior was killed.

On March 17, 2010, Pakistani forces surrounded a house hosting a number of Baloch militants in Quetta. One man — Junior — decided to put up a fight, and buy time for his comrades to exit. After an hour's resistance, Junior was killed. Majeed Junior's death was mourned by nationalists across Balochistan. After it became widely known that he was

the younger brother of Senior, who too had given his life for the cause of Balochi freedom, the Majeed Langove brothers were raised to near-mythical status.

When Aslam Achu, a BLA leader, decided to establish a suicide squad, the name 'Majeed' was chosen for it. The Majeed Brigade carried out its first attack on December 30, 2011, targetting a tribal leader and Pakistan Army proxy called Shafiq Mengal. While Shafiq himself escaped unhurt, at least 14 persons were killed.

After a long hiatus, the group became active again in 2018, attacking a bus carrying Chinese engineers in Dalbandin near the Pakistan-Afghanistan border. The Majeed Brigade has also attacked the Chinese Consulate in Karachi (2018), the Gwadar Pearl Continental Hotel (2019), and the Pakistan Stock Exchange in Karachi (2020), according to the South Asia Terrorism Portal.

Accenture lowers FY24 sales forecast as clients cut spends

ACCENTURE THURSDAY lowered its revenue forecast for fiscal 2024, with economic uncertainty prompting its clients to cut spending on its consulting services.

The IT services provider's revised outlook expects full-year revenue growth to be in the range of 1% to 3%, down from its earlier projection of 2% to 5%.

After the announcement, the company's shares fell by around 5% in pre-market trading on the New York Stock Exchange. The American Depository Receipt (ADR) shares of IT majors Infosys and Wipro were also trading up to 4% lower post the announcement.

Accenture has also forecast third-quarter revenue in the range of \$16.25 billion to \$16.85 billion, below an estimate of \$17.01 billion, according to London Stock Exchange Group (LSEG) data. Revenue for its communications, media & technology segment fell 8% year-on-year.

Accenture's performance is widely regarded as a benchmark for the Indian IT industry, providing a peek into the expected outcome for domestic companies.

Sebi asks MFs to stop investing in overseas ETFs

Mumbai: The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has directed Indian asset management companies (AMCs) to stop accepting inflows into funds that invest in overseas exchangetraded funds (ETFs) from April 1.

Sebi's step was taken in anticipation that the \$1 billion (around ₹8,300 crore as of March 21, 2024) limit for the overall industry might have been breached. Industry body Association of Mutual Funds in India has already informed fund houses about halting ETF investments following a Sebi directive.

The upper limit available to MFs to invest in overseas securities is \$7 billion. Since this limit was reached in January 2022, Sebi had asked fund houses to stop investing overseas. The limit to invest in overseas ETFs is \$1 billion which is about to be breached, said a mutual fund industry source. An exchangetraded fund is a basket of securities that trades on an exchange

US sues Apple, accuses it of monopolising smartphone mkt

THE JUSTICE Department and 16 state attorneys general filed an antitrust lawsuit against Apple on Thursday, the US government's most significant challenge to the reach and influence of the company that has put iPhones in the hands of over a billion people. The government argued that

Apple violated antitrust laws by preventing other companies from offering applications that compete with Apple products such as its digital wallets, which could diminish the value of the iPhone. Apple's policies hurt consumers and smaller companies that compete with some of Apple's services, according to excerpts from the lawsuit.

"Each step in Apple's course of conduct built and reinforced the moat around its smartphone monopoly," the government said in the lawsuit. The lawsuit caps years of reg-

ulatory scrutiny of Apple's wildly popular suite of devices and services which have fueled its growth into a nearly \$2.75-trillion public company that was for years the most valuable on the planet. It takes direct aim at the iPhone, Apple's most popular device and most powerful business, and attacks the way the company has turned the billions of smartphones it has sold since 2007 into the centerpiece of its empire.

By tightly controlling the user experience on iPhones and other devices, Apple has created what critics call an uneven playing field, where it grants its own products and services access to core features that it denies rivals. Over the years, it has limited fi-

nance companies' access to the phone's payment chip and Bluetooth trackers from tapping into its location-service feature It's also easier for users to connect Apple products, like smartwatches and laptops, to the iPhone than to those made by other manufacturers. The company says this

makes its iPhones more secure than other smartphones. But app developers and rival devicemakers say Apple uses its power to crush competition. "This lawsuit threatens who

we are and the principles that set Apple products apart in fiercely competitive markets," an Apple spokesperson said. "It would also set a dangerous precedent, empowering government to take a heavy hand in designing people's technology."

The lawsuit asks the court to stop Apple from engaging in practices including blocking cloud-streaming apps, under mining messaging across operating systems and preventing creation of digital wallet alternatives. It also asks for Apple to pay an unspecified financial penalty.

Reliance refuses to accept Sovcomflot oil shipments

New Delhi: Reliance Industries, operator of the world's biggest refining complex, will not buy Russian oil loaded on tankers operated by shipper Sovcomflot after recent US sanctions, two sources said.

The development adds to oil export problems for Russia as its oil firms may face difficulties finding ships to sell surplus oil after Ukrainian attacks on refineries.

In February, the US imposed sanctions on Sovcomflot and 14

The 17th edition of the IPL is bringing along a trimester of big-hitting. The tournament is expected to gain extensive interest this year with the marquee T20 World Cup commencing shortly after the tournament in June. Sixhitting is paramount and one of the most foolproof methods to make the IPL final, exemplified by the finalists over the years. Barring the inaugural season in 2008, at least one of the two teams in every final has invariably finished in the top-two of most sixes hit in that particular edition.

T2024: New beginnings

Four teams have new captains while IPL's two most successful skippers no longer in charge

CHENNAI, MARCH 21

THE STAGE was set. One player who hasn't played a game since the last Indian Premier League season, and is the darling of the masses. Another, who the whole of India is waiting to return to action, with questions still lingering in the air as to how he would use the IPL to confirm his spot in the T20 World Cup squad.

MS Dhoni vs Virat Kohli. Chennai Super Kings vs Royal Challengers Bengaluru. It seemed to be the ideal curtain-raiser for a party that would go on for two months.

But courtesy of a last-minute decision, the spotlight will now be trained on Ruturaj Gaikwad, CSK's new captain.

At the end of the player auctions, as Chennai put together a solid outfit that looked stronger than last season when they won the title, all things pointed to the franchise wanting to give their 'Thala' one final shot at the title. A record sixth title would have been hard to overtake for anyone. It was rolled out on a platter.

But here we are, like in 2022, just a day before a new IPL season begins, there is a change of guard that's gotten everyone talking. When Gaikwad leads the side on Friday against RCB, it would be the first instance of Dhoni playing an IPL game at Chepauk under a different captain. And for the first time since the league began, none of Dhoni, Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli will be leading any of the franchises. The next generation has taken over.

Like he did with India all things point out to Dhoni once again acing his timing. Having won their fifth title with an inexperienced bowling unit, Gaikwad now gets a chance to carry forward a proud legacy with arguably the best-ever unit assembled by the franchise. "Feels good. It's a privilege, but more than that, it is a huge responsibility," Gaikwad said about his promotion. "I have Mahi (Dhoni) bhai in the team, Jaddu (Jadeja) bhai, and Ajju (Rahane) bhai, who have been great captains to guide me. So nothing much to worry about and just looking forward to enjoy."

There is every reason for Gaikwad to feel excited about the challenge. To start off, he doesn't have much headache in terms of identifying who the best XI is.

For the earlier part of the season, Chennai

will miss the services of Devon Conway and Matheesha Pathirana — two players who played a stellar role in their victorious campaign last season – to injuries. While it may have affected other sides. Chennai are not fretting over it. In Rachin Ravindra, they have a ready-made opener who can also bowl four overs of left-arm spin in their ranks. With Shardul Thakur back in the team, and Deepak Chahar fit and available, the Super Kings have their bases covered.

In the middle-order, in place of now-retired Ambati Rayudu, Chennai have acquired the services of Daryl Mitchell to provide the fireworks. An excellent player against spin, with his ability to hit the ball in the 'V', Mitchell is crucial to CSK's plans this season.

The main question on the eve of their opening fixture is who will make up the rest of their overseas slot in the XI. For the two remaining spots, CSK have to choose between Mooen Ali, Maheesh Theekshana, and Mustafizur Rahman.

While Moeen would definitely provide Chennai with all-round options, the conditions could ultimately decide who among Theekshana and Mustafizur get the nod. Though Chennai have mostly preferred turning conditions in the past, last season they drifted away from the template, mixing things up depending on the opponents.

A day before the opener, there was a slight tinge of grass on the playing surface. Whether it stays so on Friday evening is a different question, but either way Chennai have no reasons to worry. Be it batting or bowling,

Chennai's depth looks staggering. With all-round options in place, they have Chahar, a capable hitter, coming in at No 10. In the bowling front, they have at least seven bowling options. Add the Impact Player in place, Gaikwad couldn't have asked for a more rounded team that is well-balanced to start off his captaincy journey. It is a luxury that Ravindra Jadeja missed badly in 2022 and was left exposed.

RCB searching for answers

If CSK have most bases covered, their opponents RCB are searching for answers. Unsurprisingly, they have plenty of firepower in the batting unit. In what should hearten their fans, RCB's Director of Cricket Mo Bobat said Kohli has hit the ground running after his break. "Virat's in a good place. He's at a stage of his career where most of what he does is pretty hardwired into him. He's coming in fresh, which is what we're excited

"He's had a few hits with us over the last few days and he's hitting the ball brilliantly.' But as has always been the case, there are holes that opposition can expose as well. The most problematic of them all lies in their bowling unit, which has room for only one of Lockie Ferguson and Alzarri Joseph.

With Faf du Plessis, Glenn Maxwell and Cameron Green needed in the batting front, Bengaluru have to make do with Mohammed Siraj, Akash Deep, Yash Dayal, Himanshu Sharma, Karn Sharma and Mayank Dagar from the domestic front. IT WAS sometime on Thursday morning that MS Dhoni, in his typical style, broke the news to the Chennai Super Kings management after shocking his teammates and support staff over the breakfast table. Post that meeting, Dhoni is understood to have dialled the franchise management, informing of his decision to hand over the captaincy to Ruturaj Gaikwad, a player CSK CEO Kasi Viswanathan said was being groomed for the role for the last two years.

Though the decision came out of the blue, the franchise seems to be far better placed to handle the transition, unlike in 2022 when Ravindra Jadeja took over the reins before stepping aside midway through the IPL. Back then, the franchise seemed to have been taken aback by Dhoni's decision, but this time head coach Stephen Fleming said they were far better

"Well, the big thing about a couple of years ago was that we probably weren't ready for MS to move aside. What that did was probably shake us up as a leadership group and make the coaches look at the possibility when he does go. Up until that stage, it was almost unthinkable, but it sowed the seed. So, we've worked pretty hard on making sure that any mistakes that were made then aren't made again," Fleming said.

In a team that has a big star cast and players of international repute, the decision to hand the captaincy to Gaikwad, a player familiar with the set-up and management, fits their philosophy. A very calm person, he has admirers for the way he deals with high-pressure situations. The 27-year-old joined the franchise ahead of the 2019 season at a base price of Rs 20 lakh

and since then, has impressed those in the dressing room as well as at the India Cements headquarters. After winning the Orange Cap in 2022, ahead of a big auction, Gaikwad was one of the four players retained by CSK for Rs 6 crore. That makes him the captain with the lowest price tag.

The Indian Express understands that Gaikwad was well aware that he will be the successor to Dhoni.

But according to those close to the player, even when he left Pune to join the pre-season camp on March 3, Gaikwad was only expecting to take charge next season after Dhoni hung up his boots. But it is understood that Dhoni wanted to groom Gaikwad in the role while he was still around as a player.

"He informed us of the decision this morning before the captain's meeting after talking to the head coach," Viswanathan

told The Indian Express. "Mr N Srinivasan has given the charge to Dhoni and whatever decision he takes, will always be in the best interest of the franchise. And he has been grooming Gaikwad for the last couple of years on the field as well as outside. Dhoni felt this is the right time to hand over to him as he felt Gaikwad is also ready," Viswanathan said.

Fleming concurred. "It was MS' call with a lot of consideration and with a view to the future on the back of a good season last year. The timing was good. Behind the scenes, Rutu and others have been on a captaincy grooming process, looking forward to days like this and the opportunities coming up, but MS is the best judge and he felt the time was right," he said.

Ever since the decision to hand Jadeja the captaincy didn't go according to plans, it is understood that Dhoni had earmarked

Gaikwad as the future captain. Though they brought in Ben Stokes as an alternate option, the feeling in the franchise has been that Gaikwad would take charge at some point. During the 2022/2023 edition of the Vijay Hazare Trophy, with Maharashtra playing their league matches in Ranchi, Gaikwad had spent each evening in Dhoni's company. And it was in those meetings that Dhoni informed Gaikwad about how the franchise was looking at him as a succes-

Gaikwad used the tournament to test himself for the role as well.

Picked by Gopi, speed of Ginting: Priyanshu continues upwards trajectory

PRIYANSHU RAJAWAT has been like a blur on the badminton courts of Basel these last two days.

Picked out by Pullela Gopichand at a scouting camp in Madhya Pradesh well before he turned 10, and solely for his foot and handspeed, the 22-year-old from Dhar is making his sheer pace count. On Thursday, he packed off Chinese Lan Xi Lei 21-14, 21-13 to make the Swiss Open quarterfinals. But the youngster, known for his conventional stick smashes, has been increasingly using the cross-angles on the backhand, with whiplash speed, to hurry

Indonesian Anthony Ginting arrived on the scene a decade ago, and everyone was talking about his incredible speed. Loh Kean Yew even went on to win a World Championship title with freakish pace on his court movements. The Singaporean has mellowed down a tad, and Ginting doesn't need to rely just on speed. So Rajawat has taken over the mantle of a streaking, dashing, whizzing bullet game on

the circuit with a breathless repertoire of shots. Of particular blink-and-miss significance is his inverted 'K-shot', which doesn't rely so much on power as timing - that's after he hurriedly gets into position to deliver it, like a fastforwarded reel. Firstly, he gets under the shuttle as if he's on roller-blades. The striding is precise, and the right knee goes across the left leg as the stroke is played mid-motion. The right arm then goes across the body for a Kshaped backswing silhouette. The shuttle is struck at a high point, and Rajawat gets such an incredible angle on the backhand and a whipping connect, that it lands within bounds steeply, but at giddy speed.

The K-shot is bound to become the talk of the town because of how stable Rajawat remains despite operating at very high acceleration, fuelling speed into the shuttle. What a spectator sees is the player dashing to the left of the court, and the shuttle fired to the right in the blink of an eye.

Unique style

Rajawat has often been compared to Kidambi Srikanth, who boasts of some exquisite strokes and technical proficiency. Rajawat's K-shot owes a lot to his coaches in Hyderabad, who have taught him to harness his natural speed for some sensational shot-making. The backhand and its prologue is more HS Prannoy than Srikanth, though Rajawat doesn't have the same power in his across-the-body smashes yet. While Lakshya Sen, who's most likely

But the smooth seamless execution of

headed to the Olympics, has speed in his defence and in that explosive hop at the net, Rajawat is bringing raw pace to the exchanges that will likely trouble most on the circuit. He also has a lean, mean across-the-body parallel flank defence which sees the shuttle travel quite speedily over the net.

While he raced to take the opener, Rajawat's pace only got crisper in the second game. Very early in the second, Rajawat played a lightning fast rally. He chased a shuttle on the right flank that was most likely dropping out, dragging it back into play at the last second. But even under defensive duress as the Chinese went a little bonkers hitting, Rajawat zipped across the court to end the exchange with his speed-kill. There were variations of the aerial acceleration at 6-3 and 7-4 as the Chinese realised rather slowly that his opponent was too fast for his liking.

Rajawat has the conventionally-pretty strokes too. And they are becoming some sort of a trademark in his typical candy pink gear. But it is in the speed that he brings to the court in both defence, anticipation and attack that he's proving to be deceptive. Unlike most of his opponents, he is unlikely to trade in power strokes. Unlike Sen, he won't scramble for the round- the-head whip either. But his pace can crunch reaction times for opponents, who have to simultaneously handle his fairly error-free blitzes.

USA'S BADMINTON STORY

How Indian coaches hope to make badminton thrive in the States

A 31-YEAR-OLD who won a singles World Championship medal. A 29-year-old who played at the top level in doubles, reaching a career best of World No 32 before retiring at 26. A veteran coach who has been an integral part of India's recent badminton history, having a front-row seat at Pullela Gopichand's famed academy as one of the mentors from the very start.

What is common among them? The United States of America.

B Sai Praneeth, recently retired, and coach Mohammed Siyadath Ullah will now be part of USA's badminton story. Shlok Ramchandran has already made a name for himself in the States in recent years, making the move Stateside to explore a coaching career.

USA's badminton scene

From a well-established badminton structure in India, Sai and Sivadath are entering a vastly different – yet increasingly vibrant – scene in the USA. For starters, badminton is not even close to being a top sport in the country at any level. Be it professional leagues, collegiate level, or Olympic disciplines. Unlike India, the concept of a national

team set-up doesn't exist, because it is entirely club-driven and largely self-funded. It's like professional tennis but without the financial returns.

"USA badminton has close to zero funding from the US Olympic Committee because they work on a dollar-to-medal basis. So there is no funding," Shlok tells *The Indian* Express. "So the circuit is entirely driven by clubs. A lot of our business revenue is earned through offering coaching services and renting out courts."

Shlok has been mentoring teenagers Allison Lee and Francesca Corbett, who won a historic silver medal at the BWF World Junior Championships 2023, a first for the Pan-Am region.

It is not for lack of trying, but badminton simply isn't high on the USOC's target list. World No.10 Beiwen Zhang, the flagbearer of the sport in the country for so long, took on PV Sindhu recently, Prakash Padukone and Vimal Kumar by the Indian's side. But Zhang was by herself during coaching breaks, as she was at the India Open too, because she still can't afford to bring her coach to all the tournaments she plays around the world.

There is also a significant problem of talented youngsters not transitioning. While Allison and Corbett have taken a gap year from their studies to focus on badminton, it's more common to see players drop out of the

The Indian presence

The recent good results could well be attributed to the hiring of high-quality coaching staff across the country, where there is now going to be a significant Indian presence.

While Shlok first moved to North Carolina – where Sai will be based – he has since moved to the Bay Area on the West Coast. Having retired at 26, Shlok dabbled in a few things in India (including working

fore the USA coaching offer came. Things might be a bit different now, but back then, Shlok felt Indian coaches wouldn't be valued as much in the system and took up the Stateside challenge. His work in North Carolina got noticed by

Ben Lee, an Olympian for USA in 1992 who heads Synergy Badminton Academy where the Indian is now the Coaching Director. Shlok's experience in a high-performance set-up like India has proved valuable as the rise of Allison and Francesca through the world rankings has proved.

While Shlok assisted the USA juniors at their historic World Championships campaign last year, there's another Indian who has been around longer. Abhishek Ahlawat, now Coaching Director at Frisco Badminton in Texas, became the first Indian to be a national Head Coach when he took charge of the USA men's team at the Pan-Am championships.

Ahlawat travelled to the USA in 2014 to play a couple of doubles events, took a holiday for a few months, and realised there was a potential career for him there. "I liked to be connected with the sport as a coach because I had six knee injuries in the past, multiple ACL knee surgeries. I knew that I could not

continue my playing career," he says. Ahlawat reckons the big reason for the

briefly with Chirag Shetty in Goregaon) be- enhanced reputation of Indian coaches in the USA has been India's success in the sport in the recent past, pointing to the likes of Saina Nehwal, PV Sindhu and HS Prannoy. "The major breakthrough was when India beat Indonesia in the Thomas Cup final. And we got our doubles recognition as well," Ahlawat says.

> For Siyadath, who has been ingrained in the Indian set-up for a long time, it will be a whole new challenge as he starts from scratch. "All my life, I've watched Gopi bhaiyya change and adapt and not stay with fixed ideas. Now I hope to bring all that I learnt into setting this up for beginners as well as hoping to train some to elite levels," Siyadath says about his move to the Portland Academy in Oregon.

> Indeed, this recent push in hiring overseas coaches is gearing USA towards the 2028 Los Angeles Olympic Games, which Shlok hopes could be a game-changer. "Our goal is to create an Olympian for 2028 from our club's existing programme. People ask me why did I quit so early as everything was so comfortable? I told them it wasn't good enough for me. So for me, creating the next Olympian is not good enough. It's creating a potential top-10 player, who can go on to get a podium finish. That is what I
