# Voters brave heatwave; first phase has over 62% turnout

Lakshadweep saw the highest turnout at 83.88% and Bihar the lowest of 48.88%, says EC; violence was reported in Manipur, West Bengal and Chhattisgarh; polling has been completed for 10 States and Union Territories in the opening phase

voter turnout of 62.37% was recorded in the first phase of the Lok Sabha election on Friday, which sealed the fate of candidates in 102 constituencies across 21 States and Union Territories.

The voting percentage is likely to go up when reports from all polling stations are obtained, the Election Commission (EC) said in a statement. The poll body also commended the "high" voter turnout "despite the heatwave".

The poll percentage was 69.4 in the first phase of the 2019 election.

Polling has been completed for 10 States and Union Territories in this phase, including Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand, Andaman and Nicobar, Lakshadweep and most north-eastern States. Prominent leaders such as Nitin Gadkari, Kanimozhi, Gaurav Gogoi and Bhupendra Yadav were among the contestants in this phase

The seven-phase polls would end on June 1 and counting would take place on June 4.

the polling took place, incidents of violence were reported from Manipur, West Bengal and Chhattisgarh. Lakshadweep saw the highest voter turnout at 83.88% and Bihar the lowest of 48.88%, as per provisional EC data at 11.30 p.m.

Tamil Nadu, where voting took place for all 39 Lok Sabha seats, saw a turnout of 69.46%. Voters in Eka-

ram district boycotted the

polls to protest against the acquisition of farmland for a greenfield airport for Chennai.

In ethnic violence-hit Manipur, the voter turnout was 72.17%. Violence was reported in areas under the Inner Manipur seat straddling the Meitei-majority Imphal Valley.

Unidentified men fired several rounds outside a polling station at Thamnapokpi in Bishnupur district, reportedly injuring three persons.

No violence was reported from the Outer Manipur seat reserved for the Scheduled Tribes.

Very few people from the Kuki community came out to vote. Kuki politicians had decided not to contest the polls.

Elections were also held for 50 of the 60 Assembly seats in Arunachal Pradesh and 32 in Sikkim. The BJP had won the remaining Arunachal Pradesh seats unopposed on March 30. The crucial eight seats of western Uttar Pradesh saw a voting percentage of 60.25. The Samajwadi Party and the ruling BIP traded barbs over bogus voting. Polling in five constituencies in Maharashtra's Vidarbha region concluded peacefully without any major untoward incident. The voter turnout averaged 61.87%

# Manipur sees 72% turnout as violence mars polling

Amid complaints of voter intimidation, booth-capturing, and violence across several polling booths, the first phase of the Lok Sabha election in Manipur concluded on Friday evening, with officials pegging the average turnout of the State's two constituencies at 72.17%. Three persons were arrested in connection with the violence.

While the Inner Manipur constituency reported a turnout of 76.05%, parts of Outer Manipur saw 65.22% polling, as per provisional data from the Election Commission at 11.30 p.m. The turnout for Inner Manipur in the 2019 election was around 81%.

Voting will take place in the remaining places of Outer Manipur in the second phase on April 26.

Multiple poll officers in the State confirmed to *The* Hindu that there were several instances of electronic voting machines (EVMs) being damaged during disturbances at booths where re-polling may be called for. These instances were spread across three or four polling booths in a couple of districts, CEO Pradeep

Kumar Jha said.

He added that candidates of the Congress, BJP and an Independent in the Inner Manipur seat had filed complaints of boothcapturing at multiple locations. He said the complaints would be examined and action taken.

#### Three arrested

On Friday night, the Manipur police said that it had arrested three persons in connection with a firing incident at a school in Imphal in which one person had been injured.

In complaints sent to the poll panel, the Manipur Pradesh Congress Committee has alleged booth-capturing, rigging of votes, and coercion of voters by armed miscreants in as many as 47 booths across 12 Assembly segments. Eleven of these segments were in the Inner Manipur seat such as Thongju, Khurai, Andro, Sekmai, Moirang, Oinam, Keirao and others.

The party has sought a repoll in most of these polling booths. In Outer Manipur, the Congress complained of booth-capturing in voting centres of the Sugnu area. Several incidents of

booth-capturing were caught on videos. Some of them showed armed men roaming around polling stations despite the presence of security forces while others showed miscreants firing multiple rounds near polling stations, following which prospective voters can be seen fleeing.

# SC assails poll-time prohibitory orders

The Supreme Court on Friday questioned the basis of Executive Magistrates issuing blanket orders prohibiting yatras to uphold democratic and electoral values, dharnas and public meetings during the entire duration of the Lok Sabha election, till the declaration of poll results.

"How can such orders be passed?" Justice B.R. Gavai exclaimed in open court. The indignant query from the Bench, also comprising Justice Sandeep Mehta, came when Prashant advocates Bhushan, Prasanna S. and Cheryl D'Souza, for petitioner-activists Aruna Roy and Nikhil Dey, said the prohibitory orders under Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code had been issued in the past six months on the ground of

elections. Authorities deal with applications seeking permission for public meetings and yatras with a deafening silence, keeping them pending without responses indefinitely, Mr. Bhushan said.

phenomenon had been seen in many States, including Rajasthan, Gujarat and Delhi. The Bench directed Magistrates to decide the applications within three days.

"These blanket prohibitory orders directly affect the civil society and general public from freely discussing, participating, organising or mobilising on issues affecting them ahead of elections," Mr. Bhushan submitted in the court.

"The conduct of elections - being the ostensible reason for invoking Section 144 - is neither a valid ground recognised under Section 144, nor an emergent situation to justify imposition of sweeping prohibitory orders," Mr. Bhushan submitted.

The court issued notice to the Union government and the Election Commission of India.

# media reports Israeli hits

Iran's state media reported explosions in the central province of Isfahan on Friday, as U.S. media quoted officials as saying Israel had carried out retaliatory against strikes arch-rival.

Israel had warned it would hit back after Iran fired hundreds of missiles and drones at Israel almost a week ago, in retaliation for a deadly strike – which Tehran blamed on its foe – that levelled Iran's consular annex at its embassy in Syria.

Air defence systems over several Iranian cities were activated, state media reported, after the country's official broadcaster said explosions were heard near Isfahan city. There had been no reaction from Israeli or Iranian officials, and the extent of the damage remained unclear.

An anonymous Israeli official told The Washington Post the strike was retaliation for Iran's barrage and intended to signal that Israel had the ability to strike inside Iran.

Iran's Tasnim news agency, citing "informed sources", denied that Iran

had been attacked from outside. "Contrary to the rumours and claims" in foreign media, "there are no reports of an attack from abroad on Iran's central city of Isfahan or any other part of the country", it said. Three Iranian officials told The New York Times that small drones carried out the attack, possibly launched from inside Iran, and that its radar systems had not detected unidentified aircraft entering Iranian airspace.

Fars news agency reported "three explosions" close to Qahjavarestan, near Isfahan airport and the 8th Shekari army airbase, while Iran's space agency spokesman Hossein Dalirian said "several" drones had been "successfully shot down".

Mr. Dalirian said on X there were "no reports of a missile attack". "Reports indicate there

was no major damage or large explosions caused by the impact of any air threat," the official IRNA news agency said.

The senior military officer in Isfahan, Brigadier General Siavash Mihandoost, told state TV that people had heard defence systems shooting at a target in the air, not an explosion on the ground.

Nuclear facilities in Isfahan were reported to be "completely secure", Tasnim said, and the UN's atomic watchdog confirmed "no damage" to Iran's nuclear sites.

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# AAP councillor turns rebel days before MCD elections

Trilokpuri councillor Vijay Kumar decries 'lack of democracy' in AAP, says he will contest the poll for the Deputy Mayor's post; BJP is trying all sorts of tactics imaginable to unsettle us, says AAP

day after the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) announced its candidates for the posts of Mayor and Deputy Mayor in the upcoming Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) elections, AAP councillor Vijay Kumar from Trilokpuri said he will contest the poll for the Deputy Mayor's

Mr. Kumar, along with two other AAP councillors, Ravinder Bharadwaj and Narendra Kumar, had filed his nomination for the Deputy Mayor's post on Thursday.

AAP, which has publicly backed Ravinder Bharadwaj as its Deputy Mayor candidate, had on Thursday clarified that the party had fielded two extra candidates as "backups". Hours

later, Mr. Kumar, in a post on X, clarified that he would not be contesting the elections, which are scheduled for April 26.

"I am a soldier of [AAP chief and Delhi Chief Minister] Arvind Kejriwal. I am with AAP and I will remain with AAP. I am not contesting the mayoral elections," he had said in the now-deleted post.

However, Mr. Kumar released a video statement on Friday, retracting his former claim. "I have filed my nomination for the Deputy Mayor's post. I will contest this election and win it. I request everyone not to put any pressure on me or my family," he said.

"You [AAP] talk about democracy. But there is no democracy within the party," he added.

In another post, Mr. Kumar termed the change of heart a "personal decision", adding that it was "his job" to serve the public. In the post, he tagged senior party functionaries, including Finance Minister Atishi, Rajya Sabha member Sanjay Singh, and the party's MCD in-charge Durgesh Pathak.

#### 'Deceitful trick'

AAP termed the development a "deceitful trick of the BJP"

"We are fighting a demonic power called the BJP. They will try all sorts of tactics imaginable to unsettle us," the party said in a statement.

"A true soldier of Arvind Kejriwal always believes in party discipline unwaveringly and will refuse to become a puppet of the BJP, regardless of all temptations," it added.

The development comes days ahead of the crucial polls, which will prove to be the first electoral test of unity for AAP after the arrest of its chief in a money laundering case related to the now-scrapped Delhi excise policy.

AAP's nominees for Mayor and Deputy Mayor posts - Mahesh Khichi and Ravinder Bharadwaj, respectively - will fight against BJP candidates Kishan Lal and Neena Bisht.

### Police chiefs of Delhi, Haryana, and U.P. chalk out poll details

An inter-State meeting of police chiefs was held to discuss security arrangements and border surveillance for the Lok Sabha poll in the National Capital Region, the police said on Friday.

While Noida and Ghaziabad will vote in the second phase of the general election on April 26, Delhi, Gurugram, and Faridabad will vote in the sixth phase on May 25.

The meeting, which took place on Thursday night, was led by Special Commissioner of Delhi Police (Law and Order) Madhup Tiwari and attended by officers of the Delhi police, as well as the police chiefs from the neighbouring districts in Haryana and Uttar Pradesh.

Mr. Tiwari said that issues such as deployment of paramilitary forces on the States's borders, joint patrolling at checkpoints, maintaining a vigil on the flow of illicit liquor and cash, seamless exchange of intelligence, and a lookout for criminals were discussed in the meeting.

## Street plays, flash mobs to feature in BJP's Delhi Lok Sabha campaign

The BJP's Delhi unit will launch a host of cultural programmes, such as flash mobs, nukkad natak (street plays), poetry recitals, music, magic and puppet shows, as part of its Lok Sabha campaign in the national capital on May 1.

A party leader said 163 nukkad natak teams trained by the students of the National School of Drama will present over 8,000 shows in the city between May 1 and 23.

Delhi BJP chief Virendra Sachdeva said cultural programmes such as street plays will be used to promote the party's achievements as well as to publicise the "corruption and misrule" of the Delhi government.

Mr. Sachdeva said the party will organise street plays in Hindi, English, and various regional languag-

Meanwhile, party leaders said the BJP will host a "mega conclave" of Hindu priests, saints, and seers to celebrate the Hindu new year and construction of the Ram temple in Ayodhya, at the IGI stadium on Sunday.

## Six of 25 UPSC toppers are DU alumni, says V-C

Six of the top 25 rankers in the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) exams were graduates of Delhi University (DU), Vice-Chancellor Yogesh Singh

said on Friday. A former student from Miranda House secured the third rank, while a St. Stephens alumnus ranked fifth across India, the V-C added, highlighting that almost all the top rankers from the university were women. At least six other former students were

among the 1,016 candidates who cleared the exam, university officials said.

DU is "continuously improving its rankings" as a top university of India. Dean (Rankings) Mukesh Mahlawat added that among the 56 universities listed in the QS World University Rankings (Sustainability) report, which evaluates the social and environmental impact of educational institutions, DU had claimed the first spot. The university was ranked 220th worldwide.

#### Highlight work done by H.P. govt., CM tells Cong. workers

Himachal Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Friday directed all Congress workers and office bearers to effectively highlight the State government's achievements among the people in order to secure victory in the upcoming Lok Sabha election. Mr. Sukhu said this during a meeting with Congress leaders from the Mandi constituency that was organised in Shimla to formulate a strategy for the upcoming poll. During the meeting, the Chief Minister said the party has fielded a capable and experienced leader Vikramaditya Singh from Mandi, who will win the seat with a huge margin. PTI

#### Setback for JJP as senior party leader Harpal Kamboj resigns

In a setback to the Jannayak Janta Party (JJP) ahead of the Lok Sabha poll, its State general secretary Harpal Kamboj on Friday resigned from the party. Mr. Kamboj sent his resignation to party chief Ajay Singh Chautala. Mr. Kamboj said he quit the party due to "personal reasons". He was earlier the urban district president of JJP's Ambala unit and had unsuccessfully contested the 2019 Assembly elections from Ambala City. JJP's Haryana unit president Nishan Singh and the party's general secretary Kamlesh Saini had also quit the party earlier this month. Polling for the 10 Lok Sabha seats in Haryana will be held in the sixth phase on May 25. PTI

#### Shunned BJP, Cong. as both cheated people: Mayawati

Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) chief Mayawati on Friday said her party stayed away from alliances led by the ruling BJP and the Opposition Congress since both had cheated people. Addressing a poll rally in Madhya Pradesh's Rewa, the former Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister also claimed that the BJP would struggle to win the Lok Sabha poll "if EVMs are not tampered". "The BSP did not ally with the BJP or the Congress as both these parties have cheated people. Both their manifestos are weak. We are fighting the Lok Sabha poll relying on the strength of the Dalits, the tribals, the Other Backward Classes, and the Muslims," she said. PTI

#### Cab booked in Bishnoi's name, sent to Salman's residence

A Ghaziabad resident has been arrested for allegedly booking a cab in the name of jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi and sending it to actor Salman Khan's residence in Mumbai, police said on Friday. Accused Rohit Tyagi, who was picked up from his home town, intended it to be a prank, an officer said. On Wednesday, Mr. Tyagi allegedly booked a cab online for a journey from Galaxy Apartments, Mr. Khan's residence, to the Bandra police station. When the cab driver reached the address, he realised that it was a prank, and lodged a complaint. Bishnoi was in news earlier this week after a motorbike-borne man fired at Mr. Khan's residence last Sunday. PTI

### Bhujbal opts out of poll fray in Nashik

After weeks of discord among the Mahayuti allies over the Nashik Lok Sabha seat, Cabinet Minister and senior NCP leader Chhagan Bhujbal on Friday announced his withdrawal from the electoral fray. He said the delay in announcing a candidate for the seat was affecting the prospects of the ruling coalition.

Mr. Bhujbal's move paves the way for the Chief Minister Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena to claim the seat, with two-time party MP Hemant Godse seeking a third consecutive win. Nashik goes to polls in the fifth and final phase in Maharashtra on May 20.

'Breaking deadlock'

Speaking in Mumbai, Mr. Bhujbal, an OBC leader and three-term MLA from Yeola in Nashik, said the BJP top brass, particularly Union Home Minister Amit Shah, had been insistent on him contesting the seat, but "it was essential that the deadlock be broken and hence I am stepping back from the poll fray".

Thanking Mr. Bhujbal for withdrawing from the race, Mr. Godse said, "We now expect the rift within the *Mahayuti* over this seat to be resolved soon."

# Kejriwal seeks insulin access; ED says he can have jail meals

The Hindu Bureau NEW DELHI am Aadmi Party national convener and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Friday told a Delhi court that the Enforcement Directorate (ED) was being "petty" and accused the agency of "politicising"

what he ate in prison. Mr. Kejriwal's statements came a day after the Central agency claimed that the Delhi CM, who is currently lodged in Tihar Jail, is eating foods high in sugar despite having type 2 diabetes to raise his blood sugar level and create grounds for medical bail.

The Delhi CM on Thursday withdrew a plea seeking consultation with his doctor thrice a week regarding his fluctuating sugar levels and moved a fresh plea on Friday seeking 15-minute daily consultations with his physician and access to insulin.

The court will pronounce its order on April 22. Mr. Kejriwal was arrested by the ED on March 21 in connection with the Delhi excise policy-linked mo-

ney laundering case.

"ED claimed that I want to increase my blood sugar levels to get bail. Am I going to risk paralysis to get bail? Whatever food I have is as per the diet chart prepared by my doctor prior to arrest," senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, representing the AAP chief, told the court.

Mr. Singhvi told the court that there were only a few occasions when his client had deviated from his prescribed diet. "The allegation is that I have been consuming mangoes... Out of 48 meals sent from home, only three

times mangoes there," Mr. Singhvi said. Regarding claims that his client was consuming sugar and aloo-puri, Mr. Singhvi said the AAP chief mixed an artificial sweetener in his tea.

"There was no stipulation in his diet that he should have fruit or anything. In fact, he is not following the diet. We have also got an opinion from AIIMS. According to this, he should avoid mangoes. He should follow this diet. There is no need for insulin. In fact, if he takes insulin, his sugar level will go down drastically," counsel for Tihar Jail, Yoginder Handoo, told the court.

Justice Kaveri Baweja, who was hearing the arguments, expressed displeasure that Mr. Kejriwal's home-cooked meals were not in compliance with his prescribed diet. She had earlier permitted the Delhi CM to have home-cooked meals due to his diabetes.

#### 'Blood sugar spiking'

Meanwhile, AAP continued to allege that Mr. Kejriwal was deliberately being denied insulin and that, as a result, his blood sugar was spiking. The party also lashed out at the ED, asking how information about any prisoner related to his health or food habits could be made public. It also alleged that the BJP and ED were conspiring to harm Mr. Kejriwal's life in prison by spreading

"You cannot make any kind of information about any prisoner, related to his health or food habits, public. I want to ask the ED with what authority did it get Mr. Kejriwal's false diet chart publicised in the media yesterday?" AAP's Raiva Šabha member Sanjay Singh said.

Senior AAP leader Atishi said the ED, a money laundering probe agency, should not interfere with what Mr. Kejriwal is consuming in jail.

## Annamalai says one lakh names removed from voters' list in Coimbatore

The names of around one lakh voters were missing from the electoral roll in Coimbatore, alleged K. Annamalai, BJP State president and candidate for Coimbatore constituency.

Addressing the media, Mr. Annamalai said that nearly 850 names were missing at the polling station in Angappa School, and about 200 names were missing at a polling station in Theppakulam.

"We do not know by what logic the names were removed. This also raises questions about the pre-poll preparedness of the Election Commission. This is a planned and mass-scale deletion of names," he said.

A husband and wife's names were on the list in different polling stations. The name of a dead person was on the list, while his wife's name was missing. There were several such cases. In a polling station in Palladam, basic amenities were not available, he said.

The BJP had documented and given the details to the Returning Officer and the Observer. It had also sought a repoll in such "We also suspect politi-

cal interference (in the deletion of names)," he said. According to Kranthi Kumar Pati, the Returning Officer for the Coimbatore Parliamentary constituency, changes take place in the electoral rolls in the summary and continuous revisions. "At every step the rolls are shared with political parties. The parties did not

ings. If there is any specif-

ic instance, we will look

into it," he said.

#### Five key agendas

The manifesto listed five key agendas of the party of remodelling the political structure, reconstructing the economy, reforming

the government, reviving the civil society and rallying the youth. 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

Before hurling allegations at the CPI(M) in Kerala, the Congress will do well to ask itself why a large number of people joining the BJP are Congress leaders, said CPI(M) general secretary Sitaram Yechury in an interaction with The Hindu at Parakkandy.

"In Kerala too, people think it's a safer bet to have the Left which is unlikely to defect to the BJP. In West Bengal and Tripura, we are getting killed. But our leaders don't become turncoats. That sort of character you require in the party, which the Congress doesn't have," he said.

Responding to a question on the charges levelled by Prime Minister Narendra Modi against the CPI(M) and the Kerala government, Mr. Yechurv said Mr. Modi was deliberately spreading false information as the agencies under him could not come up with anything incriminating in the diplomatic baggage gold smuggling case even after years of investigation. "The point is the boot is always on the other foot for Mr. Modi. He makes these reckless allegations while he is singularly responsible as the head of the Union government for having conducted these investigations," Mr. Yechury said.

On the Income Tax Department freezing the bank account of his party in Thrissur, he said details of all accounts across the country using the CPI(M) PAN card were consolidated every year and submitted by the party and "there were times when the Elec-

tion Commission of India and other authorities went on record saying that we were the ones that actually fulfilled that obligation in time. Even the ruling party does not do that, but no questions are asked".

The action of the I-T Department in the midst of

election, a year after receiving the data, smacked of mala fide intentions, especially when it is read with the arrests of Delhi and Jharkhand Chief Ministers, the attacks on Opposition leaders, and engineering a split in Opposition parties, etc, he said.

While targeting over 400 seats, the BJP and Mr. Modi knew fully well that they had hit the ceiling in terms of the number of seats in 2019 in States where the sharpening of communal polarisation worked for them. If free and fair elections were held, the CPI(M) would improve its electoral performance in West Bengal and Tripura, he said.

## Yes Bank co-founder Rana Kapoor secures bail, walks out of jail

Yes Bank co-founder Rana Kapoor walked out of jail on Friday evening after a special court in Mumbai granted him bail in all cases filed against him in connection with the ₹466.51crore bank fraud case.

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) had arrested Mr. Kapoor on March 7, 2020 in a money laundering case. The ED and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) have registered a total of eight cases against him related to alleged fraud at the bank. On completing all formalities, Mr. Kapoor stepped out of Taloja Central Jail at 7 p.m.

The court granted bail to Mr. Kapoor in the CBI case against him and Avantha Group promoter Gautam Thapar for allegedly indulging in criminal conspiracy, criminal breach of trust, cheating, and forgery for diversion of public money worth ₹466.51 crore. Mr. Thapar had been released on bail in the case without arrest.

The CBI had alleged that Mr. Kapoor obtained "illegal gratification" in the form of a prime property in Delhi at a price much lesser than its market value for sanctioning a loan.

"The case in brief is that Yes Bank Ltd. was accused of misappropriation of the impugned loan amount and through Bliss Abode Private Limited [BAPL] had the sole intention of taking over the property at Amrita Shergill Marg in New



Delhi," Rahul Agarwal, Mr. Kapoor's lawyer, said.

Mr. Kapoor's wife was a director at BAPL. He had filed for bail on the ground that the allegations in the chargesheet did not prima facie reveal his role in the case and no offence was made out against him. He was sent to police custody on August 14, 2021 and later to judicial custody.

"The chargesheet makes out a vague case that three loans were granted by Yes Bank to Avantha Group entities prior to and after the sale of the property, which were not used for the specified purposes. No connection was drawn by the CBI between such loans and the sale of the property, and none exists. Considering all this evidence, the court released him on bail," Mr. Agarwal said.

#### 'Baseless allegation'

The CBI's main allegation in the chargesheet that the property was purchased at an undervalued consideration is baseless and reliance was placed on various valuation reports that belonged either to the pre-demonetisation period or the valuation itself was defective, the lawyer said.



#### Rahul in fray in Wayanad fearing defeat in Amethi: BJP

BJP president J.P. Nadda on Friday said Congress leader Rahul Gandhi was contesting from the Wayanad constituency in Kerala as he was aware that he did not stand a chance in Amethi. Addressing an NDA roadshow at Sulthan Bathery in Wayanad district as part of election campaign of BJP State president K. Surendran, Mr. Nadda said Mr. Gandhi, who is facing probe in the National Herald case, had no other option but to protect corrupt people. "Mr. Gandhi is driven by family politics but his motto is politics of appeasement," he said. "Lotus is all set to bloom in Wayanad," Mr. Nadda said.

### Tirumala temple gets ₹1,161 cr. and 1,031 kg gold in one year

The temple of Lord Venkateswara at Tirumala has deposited ₹1,161 crore during the 2023-24 financial year, taking the total fixed deposits of the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) in various nationalised banks to over ₹18,000 crore. The temple also scripted history by denositing over 1,031 kg of gold in the banks during this period. Over 4,000 kg of gold was deposited in various banks during the last three years, taking the total gold deposits to 11,329 kg. According to sources, the TTD derives an income of over ₹1,200 crore in the form of interest every year.

### Kerala Congress splits again; new faction to support NDA

Nearly a week after resigning from the party over allegations of discrimination, rebel leaders of the Kerala Congress, led by Saii Manjakadambil. launched a new political entity on Friday - the Kerala Congress Democratic. The new party has declared its allegiance to the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA). The new party's alignment with the NDA in Kerala is seen as advantageous for the BJP State unit, particularly in its efforts to engage the Christian community. According to the Kerala Congress leadership, the party has split roughly over 20 times.

# Peaceful polling in Maoist-hit areas in Maharashtra seats

The first phase of the Lok Sabha election in five constituencies in Maharashtra's Vidarbha region concluded peacefully on Friday without any major untoward incident. The voter turnout was put at 61.06%, with the final figures to be updated on Saturday, according to an election official.

The total number of voters in these five constituencies - Nagpur, Chandrapur, Ramtek (SC). Gadchiroli-Chimur and Bhandara-Gondia - is 95,54,667, comprising 48,28,142 male voters, 47,26,178 female and 347 transgender voters.

Polling commenced at 7 a.m. but the voter participation gradually increased, reaching its peak between 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. Officials said voting took place at 10,652 polling centres.

In five Assembly segments, spread across two Lok Sabha seats, including Maoist-hit Gadchiroli-Chimur and Bhandara-Gondia, voting concluded at 3 p.m. "The polling concluded peacefully without any incident. Although the official cut-off time was 3 p.m., people were seen standing till 5 p.m.," Gadchiroli Superintendent of Police

Neelotpal told The Hindu. Maharashtra sends 48 MPs to the Lower House, the largest number after Uttar Pradesh's 80. Polling in the remaining 43 seats will be held in four more phases later this month and in May.

ver 56% of voters cast their vote in the first phase of Lok Sabha election in 12 of the 25 constituencies in Rajasthan on Friday. As many as 114 candidates are in the fray in the first phase in the State. The highest voter turnout of 63.67% was recorded in Sriganganagar seat, while the average turnout was registered at 56.09%.

Workers of the Bharatiya Janata Party and the Rashtriya Loktantrik Party clashed at Kuchera in Nagaur district over an open call allegedly made to the voters outside a polling booth for supporting a particular candidate. Kuchera Municipal Council chairperson Tejpal Mirdha, who was expelled from Congress recently, sustained injuries in his head during the clash.

The police used mild force to disperse the party workers and bring the situation under control. RLP candidate in Nagaur and party chief Hanuman Beniwal has been supported by the Opposition Congress

as a nominee of INDIA bloc. BJP candidate Jyoti Mirdha had quit the Congress and joined the ruling party in September 2023 ahead of the Assembly election.

Congress polling agent, Vijendra Jakhar, was allegedly attacked at Rampura Renu village in Churu district over the charge of bogus voting.

Mr. Jakhar, who was rushed to the hospital, has lodged a complaint at Bhaleri police station. Congress candidate and sitting MP Rahul Kaswan in Churu had recently switched to the party after

resigning from the BJP. Voting was held in Churu, Nagaur, Sriganganagar, Jhunjhunu, Bikaner, Sikar, Jaipur City, Jaipur Rural, Alwar, Bharatpur, Karauli-Dholpur and Dausa Lok constituencies. Sabha Chief Electoral Officer Praveen Gupta said a total of 2.54 crore people were eligible to vote in the first phase.

Governor Kalraj Mishra, Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma, former Deputy CM Sachin Pilot and other leaders cast their votes in the initial hours.

PCC president Govind Singh Dotasra said no wave in favour of BJP or Prime Minister Narendra Modi was visible anywhere in the State.

## SP alleges 'fake' voting at several booths; BJP says 'false propaganda'

Voting concluded for eight Lok Sabha seats in Uttar Pradesh in the first phase of the Lok Sabha election on Friday. The Election Commission recorded 57.54% voter turnout till 5

The eight seats are in Western U.P. - Saharanpur, Kairana, Muzaffarnagar, Bijnor, Nagina (SC), Moradabad, Rampur, and Pilibhit. Rampur recorded 52.42% voter turnout while in Moradabad it was 58.06%. Pilibhit marked a 58.95% turnout at the time of going to press.

The Samajwadi Party alleged that the BJP engaged in fraudulent voting in many constituencies. "The BJP leaders and agents are casting fake votes at booth number 237 in Moradabad's Kanth: attempts are being made to capture the booth in the presence of the administration. The EC should ensure fair voting," the SP said in a statement. The party made similar claims about booths in Rampur, Kairana, and Muzaffarnagar as well.

In response, the BJP said, "Seeing its imminent defeat, the SP is engaging in false propaganda."

In the first phase, seats

like Moradabad, Rampur, Saharanpur, and Muzaffarnagar with a substantial number of Muslim voters went to the polls.

Here, 80 candidates – 73 men and seven women – were in the fray.

Roughly 1.43 crore voters - 76.23 lakh men and 67.14 lakh women – cast their votes.

Prominent candidates are Union Minister Sanjeev Balyan from Muzaffarnagar; U.P. Minister Jitin Prasada from Pilibhit; Congress leader Imran Masood from Saharanpur; and Azad Samaj Party chief Chandrashekhar from Nagina.



## First step

The BJP's southern push was evident in run-up to first phase

round 62.3% (preliminary) of 16.63 crore voters turned up at polling booths across . 21 States and Union Territories on Friday in the first phase of the election to form the 18th Lok Sabha. Across 102 Lok Sabha seats, 1,625 candidates were in the fray. People of Arunachal Pradesh and Sikkim also voted to elect new Assemblies. Reports of isolated incidents of violence and disruption apart, polling was largely peaceful. In one of the two seats in strife-torn Manipur, at least a 72.32% turnout was recorded amid reports of violence. All 39 Lok Sabha seats in Tamil Nadu went to the polls in the first phase of the general election, preceded by the most ambitious push by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) to make a political entry. The BJP hopes to find a foothold in Tamil Nadu, where the Dravidian parties are faced with challenges of various types. The charismatic leaders of the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam and the Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam, J. Jayalalithaa and M. Karunanidhi, respectively, passed away in the last decade and the BJP has found a strident leader in K. Annamalai, a former police officer. The DMK continues to maintain its hold over the levers of state and social power in Tamil Nadu, but the BJP is invested in redefining the political character of the State.

The BJP's State focus has both ideological and tactical strands. The party rightly sees that the strongest resistance to its politics, outside of the spheres of influence of the Left parties, is from Tamil Nadu, where the regional parties have the social, material and intellectual resources that make them formidable. Tactically, the BJP needs to pick some seats in newer regions considering that it has peaked in its strongholds in the Hindi belt, and can grow no further. Reports from parts of Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh that went to the polls on Friday suggest the ruling BJP faced headwinds. In the event of losses here, the party hopes that any gains in peninsular India could at least partially compensate for these. Meanwhile, regional parties across the country are trying to hold their ground in the face of the BJP's stridency but without offering any new imagination as the campaign has shown so far. The BJP works on the plausible premise that popular resistance to nationally dominant parties may have weakened over time in Tamil Nadu. The extent of the BJP's advances will be known only when the votes are counted, but campaigning in the first phase has given out enough signals about the seriousness of its southern project.

# Israel, a two-state solution, some recent perceptions

ow, and where, did the idea of a Jewish national home arise and take shape since recorded history on the matter is somewhat hazy?

Rarely has social media summed up a situation so succinctly. According to the Urban Dictionary, the noun Israel 'got israeled' as a verb to mean when someone is asked to share something of yours, then claims it as their own, and takes it for themselves.

#### Origin and questions

The 40th anniversary (in 1988) of the establishment of the Israeli state, however, and the release of official documents, coincided with the effort by Israeli scholars to challenge it. The historian Ilan Pappé contested 'the Ten Myths' about the origin and identity of the contemporary state of Israel. Five of these related to the origins: that Palestine was an empty land; that the Jews were a people without land; that Zionism is Judaism; that Zionism is not Colonialism; and that the Palestinians left their land in 1948.

Bilateral and multilateral efforts to seek a solution to the resulting problems brought forth no compromise. On the contrary, and early in 2018, Israel's ruling Likud Party unanimously endorsed a resolution calling for the annexation of West Bank settlements. The Public Security Minister Gilad Erdan declared, "We are telling the world that it doesn't matter what the nations of the world say. The time has come to express our biblical right to the land."

Subsequent writings, and official Israeli assertions, have confirmed the validity of these questions. The war of June 1967 changed the landscape to Israel's benefit. It was followed by United Nations Security Council resolutions 242 (1967) and 338 (1973). In 1974, the Palestine Liberation Organization was officially recognised by the Arab League and the United Nations General Assembly as being the "sole legitimate representative of the Palestinian people", and was invited to participate in all UN activities under observer status. The Arab states, after much meandering, developed a common position in the Arab League Declaration/Initiative of March 2002. This was followed a few months later by the Palestinian Non-Paper (June 12, 2002) outlining a vision for Permanent Status Negotiations based on it and stating that 'the border between the state of Palestine and the state of Israel will be the June 4, 1967 Armistice

Light on this was shed by Benjamin

Vice-President of India (2007-2017) Beit-Hallahmi of Haifa University in Original Sins: Reflections on the History of Zionism and Israel: 'Out of the original sins of the world against the Jews grew the original sins of Zionism against the Palestinian'. Looking at the future he argued that 'the main obstacles to a solution have to do with exorcising the past, admitting past and present injustice for one side; forgiving the past, and the present for the other. The Israelis' problem is asking for forgiveness; the Palestinians' the readiness to forgive...Israelis seem to be trapped in a peculiar and impossible situation. Any concession to the Palestinians may lead to the unravelling of the whole Zionist enterprise'.

#### **Balance of forces**

A realistic assessment of the balance of forces was made by former negotiator and Ambassador to Washington, Prof. Itamar Rabinovich of Hebrew University, in Waging Peace: Israel and the Arabs 1948-2003: 'The military might that Israel displayed in June 1967 convinced the Arabs that they could not reasonably hope to end the conflict through a military victory... The effect of the 1967 defeat was qualitatively different from that of the defeats of 1948 and 1956...In the Arab's ensuring soul-searching, several alternatives were fiercely debated...but a recommendation to seek a political settlement based on a historic compromise was not made.'

Further turmoil, regional and global, including the arrival in Israel of nearly a million immigrants from the former Soviet Union, and the long and profound effect on the Israeli public of the Intifada, eventually led to the Madrid Conference of 1991. The letter of invitation to invitees did not include the phrase "territories for peace" but was mentioned in the letters of assurance addressed to the Arab invitees.

Writing in 2004, Rabinovich concluded that 'Israel is far more powerful than its Palestinian adversary, but it cannot translate its military superiority into a total, definitive victory....The military might that Israel displayed in June 1967 convinced the Arabs that they could not reasonably hope to end the conflict through a military victory...The effect of the 1967 defeat was qualitatively different from that of the defeats of 1948 and 1956...In the Arab's ensuring soul-searching, several alternatives were fiercely debated...but a recommendation to seek a political settlement based on a historic compromise was not made.'

In a study published recently by a the Tel Aviv University think-tank, two experts assessed that the American support for Israel in the present

war 'has been unprecedented' in terms of diplomatic support, ongoing military assistance and strategic support but also in growing criticism of Israel's conduct and increasing efforts to shape the post-war situation. It adds that the predominantly Jewish community (in the U.S.) and particularly its younger members 'are distancing themselves from Israel' and the same can be said of in assessing domestic attitudes in

The Israeli argument, and the substance of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's reasoning, is guarantee of a continued Israeli control over the majority of West Bank land, water, internal and external movement and transportation, and overriding security. This, in effect, is a recipe for preventing the creation of a normal Palestinian state. The American way out of it is a two-state solution whose small print shall be a de-militarised Palestine guaranteed by a de-facto U.S.-Israeli alliance.

#### The players

The respective requirements of the affected or interested parties to this long-standing dispute, in the light of the experience of October 7, can thus be summed up:

Palestinians: recognition of their existence as a state along with rights as a state under international law and in terms of the Palestinian

Non-Paper of June 12, 2002; Israel: retention of the acquired territory. 'The Palestinians would be given all the powers to govern themselves but none of the powers that could threaten Israel. Put simply, the solution is self-government for the Palestinians with vital

security powers retained by Israel.' The United States: A two-state solution with a de-militarised Gaza, a Saudi normalisation with Israel, a role for the moderate Arab countries in rebuilding Gaza, and in keeping Iran isolated.

In the last week of February, Thomas Friedman wrote about 'the increasingly rapid erosion of Israel's standing among friendly nations' and if [U.S. President Joe] Biden is not careful, America's global standing will plummet right along with Israel's.'

Arab states: A revitalised Palestinian state, devoid of radical elements after the experience of the Arab Spring, and a benefiting from the experience of Egypt and Jordan and of the governments party to the Abraham Accords. Some of may not be averse to American suggestions of an Arab Mandate.

One needs to be an optimist, even a 'panglossian', to consider these to be realisable.

## Permanent status

Palestine should be granted full-member status of the UN for a start

s concerns about a conflict, by design or miscalculation, between Israel and Iran grow stronger news of the United Na tions Security Council resolution on granting Palestine full-member status at the UN, that was vetoed by the United States, has not received the attention it should have. The resolution, proposed by Algeria, was one more step at the world body to attempt to make good on the promise made in 1947, when the UN General Assembly originally adopted its resolution partitioning the then-mandated Palestine into two states, one Jewish and one Arab. Only Israel became a full member of the UN in 1949. The "Question of Palestine" has been tossed around for decades, and even though the state of Palestine received permanent observer status in 2012, and temporary powers of a full member during its tenure as Chair of the G-77 and China grouping, in 2019, it has not been recognised as a full member so far. In vetoing Thursday's UNSC resolution, that was supported by 12 of 15 UNSC members, the U.S. said that it believed Palestine should not be granted the membership through the UN process, but through "direct negotiations between the parties". The Israeli Ambassador added that to give Palestine full member status at this time, six months after the October 7 terror attacks by Hamas, would be "the vilest reward for the vilest crimes". It could also be argued that this is precisely the time to recognise Palestine's long-denied right – in the aftermath of October 7, Israel has bombed Palestinians both in the Gaza Strip and the West Bank indiscriminately. That it has continued its operations despite a UNSC ceasefire resolution that even the U.S. signed on, and now threatens yet another offensive on Rafah, shows the dire need for the Palestinian state to have a much stronger voice on the multilateral stage.

The U.S. must seriously reconsider such blanket protection for the Israeli position on all issues. The contention that Palestine could only be a state through "dialogue between the parties" has a flaw: it is Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu who declared in January that he would never accept a Palestinian state, and intended to retain "full Israeli security control over all the territory west of Jordan". A Palestine in the UN fold would also ensure that the new state would be bound by the obligations of all UN members. It is a gross injustice to all Palestinians to conflate them with terrorist acts perpetrated by Hamas – refusing to make a distinction between combatants and noncombatants only further marginalises the pain of all victims of violence. At a time when the international order is fracturing, the U.S., as a global leader, must endeavour to build, not break consensus in order to favour one country. To do so is to run counter to the UN's basic principle: sovereign equality of all, following instead the more primitive dictum that "might is right".

ith 970 million Indians in the process of exercising their franchise in the ongoing general election, what do scientists look for in the polls? Who do they want to vote for, and what are the fundamental issues they want to see their elected representatives resolve and implement?

There are five fundamental issues that scientists want the new government to solve and their elected representatives to pay urgent attention to.

#### **Increase spending**

First, an increase in the nation's gross domestic expenditure on research and development (currently below 0.7% of GDP), both from the government exchequer and private players (who contribute less than 40% of the current spending). Government spending on research and development should increase by at least 50% year-over-year in the next five years, accounting for nearly 4% of GDP at the end of the incoming government's term. How can the private sector spending on research and development go up? One such avenue is contributing to the recently established Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF), where the private sector is expected to contribute ₹36,000 crore over five

Although a legislative route to facilitate this is envisioned, the incoming government needs to implement a more detailed plan and establish mechanisms akin to escrow accounts guaranteeing this funding. Increased funding will require raising the skilled scientific workforce to spend the money judiciously, and in time, including bringing new and nurturing existing

human resources. Second, public sector institutions' physical and intellectual infrastructure, such as universities and research institutions, must be improved. Modernising science laboratories in undergraduate colleges, State and central universities, and specialised research institutions is badly required. Providing a better

Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi infrastructure for students and scientists to stay and practise their trade is also needed. Upgrading infrastructure will not only require hiring more quality teachers and researchers to fill the sanctioned positions but also doubling that number effectively over the next five years. However, hiring more people to practise competitive science will only help if we have robust and unbiased system to bring the best.

#### Focus on merit

Third, making hiring in educational and research institutions to a globally accepted standard that is transparent, fast and free from any influence. The criteria for selection should be strictly based on merit, with a competent committee capable of choosing the right person for the right job free from any outside influence. It should be at the most six months from the time of application to the time of providing the appointment letters. There are established global norms for hiring quality teachers and scientists, and we must follow the same process.

Fourth, a robust science grant management system to facilitate research will be required, one with less red tape in grant submission, one that makes faster and timely grant and student fellowship disbursal, one that demands no hard copy submission, and one that gives autonomy to individual scientists on how and what they want to spend on for their research. A robust system and an increased workforce are needed to allow various departments within science ministries to spend their allocated budget before the end of each financial year and streamline fund disbursal to scientists in time.

Effective spending at the level of scientists also means providing flexibility to purchase from places other than the government's e-marketplace (which is mandated now and forces scientists to buy, at times, lower quality, sub-par "Made in India" products due to low overall price) and providing flexibility to scientists to deviate from the general financial rules, if required. The money is well spent when scientists purchase what they need for their research over the cheapest available products. This can be done while making scientists accountable for the spending.

#### **Ensure freedom**

Finally, the last but the most critical implementation that scientists look forward to is the freedom to speak and write on their subjects based on evidence and which is free from interference. Academia without a flourishing start-up ecosystem will not produce innovation for the masses. Although successive governments have done a great deal to promote innovation and entrepreneurship on Indian campuses, the true spirit of innovation will come when the incoming government provides full autonomy to individual scientists to take leave to form companies, have flexibility in hiring the right scientific staff in their laboratories without excessive paperwork and administrative processes, and the freedom to spend money on where they deem fit and to travel to national and international conferences. While doing so, scientists need to be accountable for the quality of their science rather than merely following the processes, for the quality of the products/solutions that come out of their laboratories (those who work on applied science subjects) and for the quality of knowledge that they create and impart to younger minds.

For India to aspire to be the second largest economy by 2050, the incoming government must improve the ease of doing science and provide scientists the complete freedom to think and implement, away from excessive bureaucratic and administrative processes and paperwork. While supporting our researchers in creating wealth and jobs for society through innovation and entrepreneurship, it is vitally important that the incoming government also invests in fundamental science and knowledge creation. One cannot exist without the other. Scientists, although small in number, form an essential electoral block that can influence decision-making for the larger public good.

# The battle over Adivasi identity

The BJP-led Union government is making several efforts to "reclaim" the lost stories of Adivasi resistance movements in order to build a nationalistic tribal identity. Believing that the Adivasi identity is being appropriated by the Sangh Parivar, the indigenous communities of Rajasthan and Jharkhand are attempting to counter these narratives, reports Abhinay Lakshman

> n the tribal belt of Udaipur, Banswara, and Dungarpur in the southernmost tip of Rajasthan, small signboards dot the dusty highways which lead into settlements of the Bhil Adivasi people. The signboards, mostly painted by hand and often featuring a drawing of the 16th century tribal icon, Rana Punja Bhil, mark the people in the settlements as belonging to the "Adivasi Parivar".

> "The Adivasi Parivar is what we call the larger ideology under which we are trying to awaken the conscience of our people here," says Amit Kharadi, 27, a worker of the Bharat Adivasi Party (BAP), which was formed by MLA Rajkumar Roat in September 2023. As he drives his white SUV across rural Udaipur, Kharadi points to home after home with the signboard. "We are not putting these up and neither do we tell them to. The people here have started doing it themselves in the last few years," he says.



The BAP, which rose out of the demand for a separate Bhil State for the Bhil Adivasi people, is on a mission to "take control" of the narrative around Adivasi identity, explains senior party leader Bhanwarlal Parmar. Its emergence, Par-

mar says, was partly a response to the histories of Adivasi communities coming under attack from the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS)-affiliated Akhil Bharatiya Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram and its federated outfits for decades.

Now, narratives on Adivasi identity created by the Sangh Parivar are increasingly merging with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led Union government's efforts to reclaim the lost stories of Adivasi resistance movements in order to build a nationalistic Adivasi identity, explain political workers and party leaders. The Union government has let the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST) take the lead in directing this project. The aim is to replace current literature on Adivasi histories, communities, and resistance movements that originated from sources within colonial establishments with literature that is created by the indigenous people about their own communities. The BAP has termed this act an appropriation of their identity.

Kharadi, 27, who had unsuccessfully fought the Assembly elections in Rajasthan in November 2023, credited the "Adivasi Parivar" thinking for the 40,000 votes he secured. It was his first contest for public office and he barely had resources.


"It will take time. But people are realising what is happening with the histories of their community. No matter how much our community tries to progress, our footsteps are being wiped away behind our backs. The moment we look back, we see the very existence of our history being denied," he says.

But these signboards that declare "Adivasi Parivars" across the Bhil belt of southern Rajasthan are coming up against the messaging of the BJP's campaign for tribal voters. The BJP is using the iconography of leaders such as warrior-social reformers Punja Bhil and Govind Guru to play up its government's efforts to recognise and honour "deliberately forgotten" heroes from Adivasi communities who fought "outside" forces.

"What the BJP and the RSS are doing is nothing short of offering us lollipops," says Kharadi. "Why else are they still calling us Vanvasi (forest dwellers) and Janjati (tribal people)? What is this resistance to calling us Adivasi? Our identity is not just linked to jal (water), jungle, zameen (land); it is also linked to time. We have been on these lands from time immemorial, predating the Hinduism they claim we have been a part of. Have you seen what they have done with the sto-

A tool for the BJP Last year, on November 15, which marked tribal icon Birsa Munda's birth anniversary, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, and Madhya Pradesh were in the thick of Assembly election campaigning. These States are home to over 30% of India's Scheduled Tribe population. During campaigning, Prime Minister Narendra Modi attended an event to commemorate Birsa Munda's birth anniversary at Ulihatu, the tribal leader's birthplace in Jharkhand. After inaugurating several government projects, the Prime Minister rose to address the crowd. "It is this nation's misfortune that ever since Independence, our tribal heroes who have fought in this country's freedom struggle have not been given their due. I am happy that on the occasion of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (an initiative of the Government of India to commemorate 75 years of Independence), we have got the opportunity to bring the stories of their courage and valour to all of you," he said.

Modi spoke of the contributions of "Adivasi warriors" to saving "this land" and proceeded to list out the names of leaders including Birsa Munda, Tilka Manjhi, Rani Durgavati, and Alluri Sitarama Raju. He also made it a point to mention the sacrifice of Govind Guru at the Mangarh massacre, which occurred in 1913 in the Mangarh hills of Rajasthan. Just days before Modi's remarks, the BJP's Scheduled Tribe Morcha had posted a photo of Govind Guru on X (formerly Twitter) along with a short description of his struggle. The illustration and text were identical to the one published by the NCST a year ago in a book. Titled Contributions of Tribal Leaders in the Freedom Struggle, this book, compiled by the Akhil Bharatiya Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram, contained information on 50 leaders who led Adivasi movements.

The book and its contents have already become an indispensable tool for the BJP in its project to situate Adivasis as people who were "equal partners" in India's polity until British rule, after which they started getting left behind, much like other communities in the country, in terms of social and economic progress.

The BJP Scheduled Tribe Morcha's post described Govind Guru as the leader of "one of the most efficient movements against British rule in India". It showed him wearing a white kurta with a rudraksh mala (beads considered holy) around his neck. For 20 years, he had fought against British rule and wanted to establish self-rule, it said. British forces had massacred thousands of his Bhil followers at Mangarh when they had gathered for a "Sump Sabha," it added.

In addition to the date of the massacre contradicting scholarly work on the Bhil Revolt in the early 20th Century and the Mangarh massacre, the reason why Govind Guru ended up at the Mangarh fort was left out in this description. According to Vijay Kumar Vashishth's work on the movement published in the Proceedings of the Indian History Congress, the Ruler of the Idar kingdom had, a month before the massacre, tried to arrest Govind Guru in a bid to subdue his rising influence among the Bhils of Banswara, Dungarpur, and Sunth States because of his preaching.

His teachings, Vashishth's work asserts, was based on an appreciation of rationality, a tendency to shun superstition, and monotheism, among other principles. Govind Guru preached a religion that involved praying at Dhunis (firepits). Followers of this religion wore a rudraksh around their neck and carried iron tongs. Special wor-

ship took place on Sundays. He also "taught them to consider themselves as equal to the higher Hindu castes of Rajputs and Brahmins who were even declared to be inferior in such respect as keeping their women in degrading position," Vashishth's work concludes.

"This is what I am talking about," exclaims Jitendra Meena, national spokesperson for BAP and Assistant Professor of History, Delhi University. "Just because Govindgiri borrowed from whatever was around and wore a Rudraksh, it is not correct to use an image portraying him in that manner while also erasing the fact that a large battle he was fighting was one against the social structure of caste they were being subjected to under the then upper caste rulers. It is crucial to highlight that he was fighting to break out of everything that was restricting the community and create a new social order."

Meena, an Adivasi researcher and a member of the Indian History Congress and the Rajasthan History Congress, has turned the BAP's ideology of reclaiming their identities into a personal project to counter the narratives being set by the government. He has started work on picking apart stories being promoted by the government on at least a dozen Adivasi leaders.

"There are so many tribal reformers who were resisting attacks from all quarters economically, socially, culturally - from increased contact with landlords and rulers as a result of colonising administrations expanding their reach, to the expansion of Christian missionaries and ideas of different forms of Hinduism and Islam invading their discourse," he says. Some might have picked up elements from each other, but the effort everywhere was to establish something new," he says.

#### Fighting against misrepresentations

About 1,400 kilometres from Udaipur, in Jharkhand's Murma, Sarna thinker and spiritual leader Bandhan Tigga has been fighting the Akhil Bharatiya Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram for at least a decade. "Just like Sarna is the distinct religion of Adivasis existing outside of and predating any other religion, the reform movements like that of Birsa Munda's must be seen in the same lens. They were attempts to create a social order that was exclusive to the Adivasi communities. That is what the Birsaite agitation attempted," he says.

Every time delegates of the Vanvasi Kalyan Ashrams build networks in the remote tribal villages of Jharkhand, their campaigns to build Hindu temples is almost always accompanied with indoctrination, Tigga says.

Handu Bhagat, a worker of the Kendriya Sarna Samiti in Jharkhand's Gumla district, has been observing the Sangh Parivar's work in his district for at least a decade now. "They will first try to convince us that Hindu rituals and Adivasi rituals are similar just because some aspects might correlate. Then they will try to distort the stories of leaders like Birsa Munda to drive home their point. In the process, they alienate our people from their roots," Bhagat says, pointing to villages like Sugakatta, where the Vanvasi Kalyan Kendra, another federated outfit of the Sangh Parivar, has built a Hanuman temple and where people no longer see any difference between the traditional Adivasi religion of Sarna and Hinduism.

Jharkhand-based writer and journalist Jacinta Kerketta echoes the argument that every time leaders from the tribal community are honoured, they are shown fighting the British and the Mughals. However, their dissatisfaction with the Hindu landlords and moneylenders working for the British is not depicted.

"The army of landlords that the British had created in the tribal areas to increase revenue used to collect taxes forcibly. To pay the taxes, the tribal people had to take loans from moneylenders. Moneylenders used to exploit them. In this way, the struggle of the tribal heroes was against Hindu landlords, moneylenders, and the British rule at the same time," Kerketta says, citing the representation of the Hul movement of the Santhal people. "Sido, Kanhu, Chand, and Bhairav (all brothers) converted the dissatisfaction arising from landlords and moneylenders into a widespread movement. The Hul started with the killing of a police inspector who was taking the village head as hostage. Later, the British sent their army and thousands of tribal people were killed in this movement," she adds.

Ranendra Kumar, an author in Jharkhand, dismisses the use of the NCST's book for studying any actual history of Adivasi rebellions. "It is introductory information at best. Most Adivasi resistance movements began as a direct response to the everyday oppression they faced at the hands of upper caste landlords and local rulers, who had incentives to collaborate with colonial administrations in order to maintain their hegemony in the social structure," explains Kumar, who is also the Director of the Ram Dayal Munda Tribal Welfare Research Institute in Ranchi.

"Erasing their resistance to caste structures would definitely be misleading," he continues. He adds that even though the resistance was a direct response to this, it had, on many occasions, taken on the British administration directly. "There is evidence of leaders like Birsa Munda recognising the political role of the British Empire in the sociocultural battles he was fighting in Jharkhand and framing his fight as such," he says. "Erasing either part of this history would be dishonest and untrue."

Kerketta says, "The tribal people are victims of an oppressive system, irrespective of the government. Even after independence, they have been the victims of internal colonisation."

# Forests a national asset and major contributor to financial wealth: SC

<u>The judgment comes at a pivotal time</u> when the controversial Forest Conservation (Amendment) Act of 2023 has attracted widespread criticism; court says concepts of carbon credit and green accounting to evaluate national wealth now a reality

he Supreme Court has asserted in a judgment that forests in India are a national asset and a major contributor to the nation's financial wealth.

"It is the spirit of the forest that moves the earth," a Bench headed by Justice M.M. Sundresh observed in a judgment based on an appeal filed by the State of Telangana against a High Court decision "graciously gifting" forest land to a private person. The State's forest officials had made matters worse by filing conflicting affidavits in court. The apex court ordered ₹5 lakh in costs from both the State government and the private persons. The State was asked to open an enquiry against its own forest officials.

The judgment has come at a pivotal time when the

controversial Forest (Conservation) Amendment Act (FCAA) 2023, has attracted widespread criticism. The FCAA is accused of giving a free hand to States to regularise encroachments in protected forests and determine diversions of forestlands. The Act has been criticised for paving the way for the commercial exploitation of forests.

The court said concepts of carbon credit and green accounting to evaluate a nation's wealth had become a reality. "A country with excess forest cover would be in a position to sell its excess carbon credit to the one in deficit. This in turn underlines the significance of forests in contri-

buting to the financial wealth of a country," the court noted.

#### A major sink

The judgment said India's forests serve as a major sink of carbon dioxide (CO2). The value of mitigation has put a conservative \$5 per tonne of CO2 locked in forests, this huge sink of about 24,000 mt of CO2 is worth \$120 billion, or ₹6 lakh crores.

The court quoted from a 2009 report of the Ministry of Environment and Forests titled 'India's Forest and Tree Cover: Contribution as a Carbon Sink', which said that from "1995 to 2005, the carbon stocks stored in our forests and trees have increased from 6,245 million tonnes (mt) to 6,662 mt, registering an annual increment of 38 mt of carbon or 138 mt of CO2 equivalent".

Justice Sundresh highlighted the protective role of forests against climate change. It referred to a 2022-2023 report of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on the macroeconomic impact of climate change and changing patterns of rainfall. These factors could cost the economy 2.8% of its GDP and depress the liv-

of its population by 2050. "India could lose anywhere around 3% to 10% of its GDP annually by the year 2100 due to climate change," the judgment noted from the RBI document.

"The report of the RBI presents a very disturbing scenario. The report clearly suggests the enormous potential impact of climate change on society, leading to serious job losses in every sector. # India delivers first batch of BrahMos supersonic missiles to Philippines

India delivered the first batch of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles to the Philippines on Friday. In January 2022, the Philippines concluded a \$375-million deal with India for three batteries of a shore-based, anti-ship variant of the BrahMos becoming the first export customer for the joint venture missile between India and Russia.

The first batch was delivered aboard a transport aircraft of the Indian Air Force which landed in the Philippines on Friday afternoon. Specifics of the delivery made were not immediately available. The Philippines is acquiring the systems under the Horizon 2 of the Revised Armed Forces of the Philippines Modernisation Program-

The delivery comes amid the showdown between the Philippines and China in the South China Sea and will significantly

augment the defensive posture of the Philippines armed forces once the systems are operationalised

During his visit to the Philippines in March, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar in a meeting with the Secretary of National Defence of the Philippines Gilberto C. Teodoro, Jr. reaffirmed India's commitment to upholding a rules-based international order and promoting peace and security in the Indo-Pacific region.

In January 2022, then

Philippines Defence Secretary Delfin N. Lorenzana, who signed the contract said, "As the world's fastest supersonic cruise missiles, the BrahMos missiles will provide deterrence against any attempt to undermine our sovereignty and sovereign rights, especially in the West Philippine Sea."

The contract includes the delivery of three missile batteries, training for operators and maintainers as well as the necessary Integrated Logistics Support package. The coastal defence regiment of the Philippine Marines will be the primary user of the missile systems.

From January 23 to February 11, 2023, 21 Philippine Navy personnel were trained in the operations and maintenance of the systems in Nagpur and were awarded interim missile badges by the Indian Navy chief, Admiral R. Hari Kumar.

As reported earlier, several countries have expressed interest in acquiring BrahMos systems and discussions are in advanced stages with Indonesia and Thailand, among others.

BrahMos is a joint venture between the DRDO and Russia's NPO Mashinostroyeniya and the missile derives its name from Brahmaputra and Moskva rivers. The missile is capable of being launched from land, sea, sub-sea and air against surface and seabased targets and has been long inducted by the Indian armed forces.

# initiate 'appropriate action' against Nestle

Centre asks FSSAI to

The Consumer Affairs Ministry on Friday asked the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) to initiate "appropriate action" against the Nestle group for allegedly selling baby products with high sugar content in India.

The Ministry initiated this action following a report that said that Nestle's Cerelac products sold in India contained 2.7 grams of added sugar per serving, while the products sold in countries such as Germany, Switzerland, France, and the United Kingdom did not contain added sugar.

#### 'Serious concerns'

"High sugar content in baby products raises serious concerns about the potential implications for the health and safety of children in our country. The health and well-being of our citizens, especially inThe WHO has for several years warned against the presence of high sugar content in baby food products

fants and young children, is of paramount importance, and any deviation from safety standards could lead to serious health concerns," the letter to FSSAI noted.

Arun Gupta from the Breastfeeding Promotion Network of India said that India needs to review its food safety laws and ensure that they are implemented in a strict manner. "Any laxity in the laws will ensure that the health of the citizens and in this case vulnerable infants gets compromised," he said.

The World Health Organization (WHO) has for several years now warned against the presence of high sugar content in baby food products.

# Fossils of huge prehistoric snake found in Kutch mine

Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Roorkee have reported the discovery of fossils of one of the largest snakes that ever existed and likely lived 47 million years ago during a period called the Middle Eocene. The fossils were found in Kutch, Gujarat, and the reptile, named Vasuki Indicus, could have been anywhere between 10 metres and 15 metres long, or as big as a modernday school bus.

It belonged to the nowextinct Madtsoiidae snake family but represents a unique lineage from India, the authors note.

Professor Sunil Bajpai and post-doctoral researcher Debajit Datta at the IIT-Roorkee stumbled upon 27 pieces of a "partial, well preserved" vertebral column of the snake at the Panandhro Lignite Mine in Kutch.

The discovery, the authors report in the peer-reviewed journal, *Nature Scientific Reports*, could improve understanding of how the Madtsoiidae species evolved in different kinds of climate, as well as the factors that contributed to large body sizes. One of the causative factors is held to be high temperatures in the tropical climate of that time.

Vasuki Indicus existed at a time when the earth looked quite different from today, and Africa, India and South America were one, conjoined landmass. It likely had a cylindrical body, hinting at a robust and powerful build, and was as big as Titanoboa, a massive snake that once roamed the earth and is reportedly the longest ever known, said a press statement from IIT-Roorkee.

"This discovery is signif-

standing the ancient ecosystems of India but also for unravelling the evolutionary history of snakes on the Indian subcontinent...," Dr. Bajpai said in a statement.

## Congress, INDIA bloc have been against development: Modi

Alleging that the Congress and the Opposition Indian National Developmental, Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) bloc had always been "antidevelopment" and "antifarmer", Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday blamed the Congress 'misrule' for having caused woe to farmers for decades.

Addressing an election rally in Wardha in Maharashtra's Vidarbha region, Mr. Modi said past governments had been responsible for successive irrigation crises that had plagued farmers in Wardha and Amravati districts.

"The Congress has always been anti-farmer and anti-development. A stone [for a project] laid in a family's name remained unfinished for generations, causing suffering in Vidarbha under the Congress rule. Today, our government prioritises Vidarbha's needs, with CM Eknath Shinde and [Deputy CMs] Devendra Fadnavis and Ajit Pawar committed to serving the public," he said.

Stating that voting for the Congress and the IN-DIA bloc was "futile", Mr. Modi claimed that the Congress had already admitted defeat and hence was resorting to threats of causing chaos after the Lok Sabha election.

"Their inclination towards Constitutional suppression and emergency echoes past tactics. However, the nation desires a resolute and stable government... this election is the one to fulfil the dream of a 'Viksit' Bharat and self-reliant India," Mr. Modi said.

Mr. Modi was campaigning for the BJP's Ramdas Tadas, the incumbent Wardha MP and *Mahayuti* candidate. Wardha goes to polls in the second phase on April 26.

# framework for anganwadis Maitri Porecha The curriculum helps who did not receive any

NEW DELHI

For the first time, the Union government has released a curriculum advisable to be taught to children aged three to six years, thus giving an impetus to pre-school learning in 14 lakh anganwadis across the country.

The Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD) has released the National Curriculum for Early Childhood Care and Education 2024 titled 'Aadharshila', on the lines of the National Education Policy 2020 and the National Curriculum Framework. Aadharshila (translated as foundation stone) is a detailed 48-week curriculum meant for learning in the age group of three to six years in anganwadis.

There are 14 lakh anganwadis in India which serve as nodal points in villages for the health and nutrition needs of pregnant The curriculum helps to develop skills which will help a child easily transition into Grade 1

mothers and children.

"Concern in the policy is that children are going up school ladder without learning to read and write [which may lead them to lack in achieving age-appropriate learning levels like math and language skills]," said Professor Venita Kaul, former NCERT official and member of the internal committee that designed the curriculum.

Prof. Kaul said longitudinal research which followed 42,000 Indian children up to primary grades for about five years indicated that children who have received early childhood education are expected to do much better in school and are also psychosocially better adapted than peers who did not receive any formal education before six years of age.

The curriculum includes a weekly play calendar with four weeks of initiation which includes academic activities. The next 36 weeks are spent on exploring, free play, conversation, creation and appreciation, and reflection that involves various activities, including storytelling, singing rhymes, arts and crafts.

The last eight weeks are spent reinforcing learnings of previous weeks and observation of kids' performance. Activities and timetable are segregated age-wise with detailed requirements of materials needed.The curriculum helps in developing listening skills, vocabulary building, boosting imagination, following instructions, social development, and developing self-esteem, which will help a child easily transition into Grade 1.

# Election turns into sparkling celebration in Udhampur

he Udhampur Lok Sabha constituency in Jammu and Kashmir witnessed a massive participation of voters from all sections of society on Friday as it recorded a 68.27% voter turnout by 11.30 p.m., election officials said. This is the first Lok Sabha election since the Centre split the erstwhile State into two Union Territories of J&K and Ladakh, and scrapped its special constitutional position in 2019.

The Udhampur constituency consists of five districts and 18 Assembly segments.

The highlight of the polling was scores of newly-weds appearing in shimmering clothes at the polling booths and posing for selfies. Equally enthusiastic were first-time voters and persons with disability, whose movements were aided with specially designed polling booths with ramps and wheelchairs.

Rakesh Thakur and Shardha Devi from Bunjwah in Kishtwar district came to cast votes on their wedding day. It's an honour to participate in the polling and elect the one who could become our voice in Parliament, the couple said.

Out of the total 16.23 lakh voters in Udhampur, 7.77 lakh are women. As many as 84,468 people are in the 18-19 age group.

An excited bunch of first-time voters said they preferred governance over ideological issues. "It's the first time I have come to vote. My vote is for good governance, prosperity and progress," Junaid Rathore, a resident of Banihal, said.

#### Assembly seat-wise figures

Of the 18 Assembly segments, Kathua recorded the highest 75.44% voter turnout. It is the hometown of Congress candidate Chaudhary Lal Singh. The hometown of BJP candidate Jitendra Singh registered 73.28% in Udhampur West and 73.26% in Udhampur East.

The Muslim-majority Assembly segments of Banihal saw 59.04%, Bhaderwah 63.01%, Doda 68.14%, Doda West 69.36%, Kishtwar 65.44% and Ramban 66.71%. The fate of the Congress candidate, who is also supported by the National Conference (NC) and the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), depends on these segments. Voters in these areas came out despite wet weather both in the plains as well as in the upper reaches.

# Scuffles, protests mar polling in three Bengal constituencies

The polls were largely peaceful with over 80.55% of the voters exercising their franchise across constituencies till 6 p.m., says EC; voter sustained injuries in his eye while coming out of polling booth in Sitalkuchi; crude bombs recovered

poradic incidents of scuffles between supporters of political parties, recovery of crude bombs and angry protests against MLAs were witnessed during polling for the first phase of the Lok Sabha election in West Bengal on Friday.

Elections were held to the three seats of Jalpaiguri, Alipurduar and Cooch Behar in the State, and the Election Commission (EC) said voting was largely peaceful with over 80.55% people exercising their franchise across the three seats till 6 p.m.

The turnout in Cooch Behar was 81.46%, while that in Jalpaiguri was 82.15% and in Alipurduar 77.84%.

The Cooch Behar constituency, where the EC had deployed 112 companies of Central armed police forces, was rife with allegations from political parties against each other. A voter sustained injuries in his eye in Sitalkuchi when he was coming out after voting. A BJP supporter at Sitalkuchi said that he was attacked with a sickle on the way to vote.

There were reports of crude bombs being placed

outside the house of a BJP booth president. Along with Sitalkuchi, there were reports of violence at Chandmari and Mathabhanga in Cooch Behar, where supporters of the BJP and the Trinamool Congress came face to face.

Videos aired by local television channels showed supporters of the two parties throwing stones at some places and engaging in pushing and shoving. Allegations were levelled against BJP supporters at Bhetaguri in Dinhata block, by Trinamool Congress supporters. They alleged that the BJP's Cooch Behar candidate, Nisith Pramanik, was behind the attacks. Mr. Pramanik, who won the seat in 2019 with a margin of over 50,000 votes is pitted against the Trinamool candidate, Jagadish Chandra

Basunia.

Responding to the allegations of the Trinamool,
Mr. Pramanik said that pe-

ople were resisting the ruling party.

Clashes, protests

A group of BJP supporters raised angry slogans at State Minister Udayan Guha at Dinhata. The crowd, mostly women, tried to gherao Mr. Guha.

Reacting to the incident, Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Nisith Pramanik said, "The Trinamool Congress wants to implement Sandeshkhali model across the State. He [Udayan Guha] got what he deserved."

BJP MLAs Sikha Chattopadhyay from Dabgram Phulbari and Baren Chandra Barman also faced protests and slogans from supporters of the ruling party when they were visiting polling booths in their respective constituencies. When the police tried to arrest the BJP MLA Sikha Chattopadhyay at Siliguri, the BJP supporters clashed with the police.

'Political bias'

Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, who was campaigning at Hariharpara in Murshidabad district, raised allegations of political bias against the Central forces. "I am not against Central forces but this is the first time that they [BJP] are using Central forces as their cadres," Ms. Banerjee said. She raised questions on why only Central forces were used in Cooch Behar and the State police were not deployed.

In a related development, the EC suspended the officer-in-charge of two police stations – Shaktipur and Beldanga of Murshidabad district – citing that they "failed to contain and prevent repeated communal violence in the jurisdiction".

## Cong. asks EC to take note of 'one issue' raised by BJP

The Congress on Friday accused the BJP of using "one particular issue" on social media to attract voters, and urged the Election Commission (EC) to take note of it.

"The BJP is using one particular issue on social media as an appeal to voters. This is a flagrant and blatant violation of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, the Election Commission's Model Code of Conduct, and also of numerous judgments of the Supreme Court," Congress general secretary (communication) Jairam

Ramesh said in a post on X.

Mr. Ramesh did not specify which "the issue" was but other informed leaders, who did not want to be quoted, said that the BJP has been using the matter of Ram Temple to seek votes.

The Congress has neither officially identified the issue nor lodged any complaint with the EC.

On Friday, the official X handle of the BJP's Bihar unit put out a post that read, "If you are going to vote, remember this. Who built the temple for Lord Pam?"

"We hope that the @ECISVEEP will take immediate note and put a stop to such appeals," Mr. Ramesh tweeted.

# Bihar records turnout of 48.8% in four seats that voted in first phase

A provisional voter turnout of 48.88% was recorded in the four constituencies of Bihar that went to the polls in the first phase of the Lok Sabha election on Friday.

The four seats are Gaya, Jamui, Nawada, and Aurangabad. Former Chief Minister and Hindustani Awam Morcha (Secular) leader Jitan Ram Manjhi is in the fray in Gaya against Kumar Sarvajeet of the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD).

In another key contest, Arun Bharti, brother-inGaya recorded a voter turnout of 49.51%, Aurangabad 51.56%, Jamui 51.02%, and Nawada 43.79%

law of Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) chief Chirag Paswan, is up against RJD candidate Archana Ravidas in Jamui.

In Nawada, Vivek Thakur of the BJP is locked in a direct contest with the RJD's Shravan Kushwaha, while Sushil Kumar Singh of the BJP is contesting against RJD's Abhay Kushwaha in Aurangabad. Gaya recorded a voter turnout of 49.51%, Aurangabad 51.56%, Jamui 51.02%, and Nawada 43.79%, as per provisional data at 11.30

Voters boycotted polling at seven booths in protest against lack of civic amenities. Twelve people were taken into preventive detention in Gaya and 20 in Nawada. Voting in 14 Naxalism-affected Assembly segments took place till 4 p.m.

Chief Electoral Officer H.R. Srinivas said, "In comparison to the 2019 Lok Sabha election, the voter turnout is 5% less. But the figure is provisional." The voter turnout in these four seats in the 2019 Lok Sabha election was 53.47%.

Asked about the first phase of voting in Bihar, RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav said, "Based on the feedback we are getting, we are winning all four seats."

Senior BJP leader and Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Choudhary said, "NDA is winning all four seats by a huge margin. So their claim of winning all seats is nothing but daydream"

# Shompen cast their vote for the first time

#### Assam MP files nomination after court faults ST certificate

Assam MP Naba Kumar Sarania on Friday filed his nomination from the Kokrajhar Lok Sabha seat, a day after the Gauhati High Court upheld an order dismissing his status as a Scheduled Tribe (Plains). Kokrajhar is one of the two Lok Sabha constituencies in Assam reserved for the Scheduled Tribes. The other is Diphu. "I respect the court's verdict, though it was not in my favour. We have already initiated steps to approach the court again," Mr. Sarania said. A single-judge Bench of Justice S.K. Medhi on Thursday dismissed his petition and declared him ineligible for contesting from any constituency reserved for the STs.

#### Assam CM vows citizenship to Bengali Hindus, scholarship

After "Modi ka guarantee", the voters in Assam has been showered with "Mama ka warranty". Mama, meaning maternal uncle, is a moniker for Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma. On Thursday, the Chief Minister added his warranty to the Prime Minister's guarantee for Bengali Hindus to get citizenship and scholarship for women students among other pledges made during an election rally in Udharbond under the Silchar Lok Sabha constituency. The BJP has fielded Transport Minister Parimal Suklabaidya from the constituency. He also promised monthly cash benefits under a State government scheme for 26 lakh families in Assam.

#### After joining BJP, Chhindwara Mayor seeks votes for Cong.

Less than three weeks after joining the BJP in Madhya Pradesh, Chhindwara Mayor Vikram Ahake asked people to vote for Congress candidate Nakul Nath. In a video message on social media, Mr. Ahake said he was feeling "suffocated" in the BJP. "Today, I am going to say something important without any pressure. hhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai has dismissed allegations that the shooting of 29 Naxals in Kanker on April 16 was a "fake" encounter. He says that the fact that such a big group of Naxals came together on the eve of election, clearly showed that they were planning to stall the polls. The Chief Minister urges the Naxals to choose a path of developand progress. Excerpts:

Three months ago, the BJP got a historic verdict in the **Chhattisgarh Assembly** polls. Today, you are facing the Lok Sabha election, which will also, in a way, test your government's



performance in these months. What are your expectations?

We got a historic mandate in the 2023 election, winning 54 seats and an over 46% vote share. This was our highest tally in any Assembly election so far in the State. People put their trust in "Modi's guarantee". And within two days of taking oath, we were active in implementing all "Modi's guarantees". We have been working towards clearing all the backlogs in terms of bonuses for farmers, clearing the decks to deliver 18 lakh houses under the Pradhan Mantri Yojana, Gramin Awas

which the previous government didn't do. And many such welfare schemes that we had promised like Mahatari Vandana Yojana for giving women ₹12,000 per year or Ram Lalla Darshan Yojana for taking pilgrims to Ayodhya have already been rolled out.

All this will impact the electoral choice of the people, the voters have complete trust in BJP and Prime Minister Narendra Modi. We are going to win all 11 seats.

Last week, in an encounter with security forces, 29 Naxals were killed in Kanker. What will be the electoral

#### implication of this encounter?

Those killed in the encounter include at least two who had a prize money of ₹20 lakh on their heads and another who had a prize money of ₹10 lakh. This is the first time our security forces have had such a big success. The Congress claimed this was a "fake encounter". They had made such claims about surgical strikes too. The fact that such a big group of Naxals came together on the eve of election, clearly shows that they were planning to stall the polls. When Congress was in power, Naxals believed their own government was ruling. We have always taken a strong stance against them.

But is your government prepared for talks with the Naxals?

It is not as if we want violence. We are ready for talks to arrive at a peaceful solution. We have appealed many times, asking them to choose the path of development and progress instead.

How do you respond to the growing fear that the BJP will scrap the Constitution and with it reservation for **Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes will** also go?

The Opposition is clearly desperate in the face of their certain defeat. This is why they are running this very deliberate campaign claiming that the "Constitution is in danger" and that "reservation" will be scrapped. This is a measure to mislead the electorate. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has clarified repeatedly that reservation will not be revoked.

The BJP has been welcoming everyone with open arms, many of whom have a long list of corruption cases against them. Doesn't this dilute your attack on the Opposition on corruption?

Those who want to preserve their self-respect are leaving the Congress for

The BJP is a party of workers and it has a democratic structure where office-holders are changed every three months. It is only here that an ordinary worker like me can aspire to become the Chief Minister of the State and a teaseller's son can go on to become the Prime Minister.

the world are in bad condition. Many nations are going bankrupt. A neighbouring nation of ours that was the supplier of atank (terror) is now struggling for the supply of atta (flour). In such conditions, our India is developing at the fastest pace in the world," Mr. Modi said, asking people if they felt proud of India.

#### Two-phase polling

The Prime Minister told the gathering that India was "being praised" across the world because of "your one vote".

While six seats of Madhya Pradesh voted in the

first phase on Friday, elections in Damoh, Khajuraho, Rewa, Satna, Tikamgarh and Hoshangabad will be held in phase two on April 26. Mr. Modi also said that many countries in the world were facing war or a threat of war, and that India needs a strong BIP-led government to protect it.

Mr. Modi also hit out at the INDIA coalition accusing it of creating "hurdles" in the procurement of the Rafale fighter jets for the Indian Air Force. "I want to tell you the reality of the INDI Alliance. For decades, the Congress kept the Indian defence sector weak. These people used to see their benefit in buying arms for the armed forces. The entire nation has seen how these people tried to prevent our Air Force from getting the Rafale fighter

jets," he said. From the Damoh seat, the BJP has fielded former MLA Rahul Lodhi, who exited the Congress and joined the BJP in March 2020 soon after Jyotiraditya Scindia, now a Union Minister, led a rebellion against Kamal Nath-led Congress government. He, however, lost the Assembly byelection. The Congress has fielded former MLA Tarwar Singh Lodhi from the seat, dominated by Lodhi voters.

The BIP has nominated its State unit president V.D. Sharma from Khajuraho.

At a rally in Amroha in Ittar Pradesh. without naming Congress leader Rahul Gandhi and SP president Akhilesh Yadav, Mr. Modi alleged that the "duo carry with them a box of appeasement, corruption, and dynasty politics", and accused them of attacking people's faith.

Mr. Modi said Amroha MP Danish Ali had problems in chanting "Bharat Mata ki Jai". "Will a person, who cannot accept 'Bharat Mata ki Jai', look good in Parliament? Should such a person be allowed entry into the Indian Parliament?" he asked.

# 'Conditions not ripe for easing restrictive monetary stance'

Downward pressure on inflation must be maintained until a better balance of risks becomes evident, MPC minutes cite RBI's Patra as saving

rice stability has to be restored in order to ensure that the rising growth trajectory in the economy is sustained and economic conditions are not yet ripe to ease the restrictive monetary stance, RBI Deputy Governor Michael Debabrata Patra emphasised at the April 3-5 meeting of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), the minutes released on Friday show.

Observing that recent inflation prints and high frequency data on salient food prices indicated that food inflation risks remained elevated, Dr. Patra said, "A relatively shallow and short-lived winter trough is giving way to a build-up of price momentum as summer sets in, with forecasts of rising temperatures up to May 2024.

Official retail inflation data for March released last week showed food price inflation remained sticky at 8.52%, barely slower than February's 8.66% as price gains quickened in cereals and meat.

dline with the target," he underlined that headline inflation could consequently be expected to remain in the upper reaches of the RBI's 2%-6% tolerance band until favourable base effects came into play in the second quarter of 2024-25

"Conditions are not yet in place for any let-up in the restrictive stance of monetary policy. Downward pressure on inflation must be maintained until a better balance of risks becomes evident and the layers of uncertainty clouding the near-term clear away," Dr. Patra emphasised.

Crucially, he underlined that while domestic demand was expanding and the investment outlook was improving, "a stronger revival in private consumption and in corporate sales growth" would be contingent on greater confidence that inflation was declining on a durable basis.

Governor Shaktikanta Das too stressed the importance of staying unwaveringly focussed on ensuring durable price stability.

#### 'Spillover risk'

"Success in the disinflation process should not distract us from the vulnerability of the inflation trajectory to the frequent incidences of supply side shocks, especially to food inflation due to adverse weather events and other factors. Overlapping food price shocks... may also result in spillovers to core inflation," Mr. Das underlined.

However, external member Jayanth R. Varma, the sole voice of dissent on the six-member MPC, voted to cut the policy repo rate by 25 basis points, arguing that the real interest rate was currently excessively high and imposed costs on the economy's growth momentum.

# Wipro's Q4 net slides 8%, revenue declines by 4.2%

The Hindu Bureau BENGALURU

Wipro on Friday reported a vear-on-vear decline in fourth-quarter net profit and revenue and termed FY24 "a challenging year for the industry."

India's fourth biggest tech-firm recorded a consolidated Q4 net profit of ₹2,835 crore, an 8% slide against ₹3,074 crore in the corresponding period last year. Revenue from operations slid by 4.2% YoY to ₹22,208 crore, from ₹23,190 crore in the same period a year ago.

Wipro's IT services revenue stood at \$2.65 billion, a rise of 0.1% QoQ and a slide of 6.4% YoY. During FY24, the company witnessed total bookings of \$14.9 billion of which large deals accounted for \$4.6 billion, a YoY increase of 17.4%.

Wipro's new CEO Srini Pallia said, "FY24 proved to be a challenging year for the industry, and the macroeconomic environment remained uncertain. But I am optimistic about the opportunities that ahead."

Speaking to the media, Pallia said Wipro was on the cusp of a major technological shift as artificial intelligence was transforming clients' needs as they sought to harness its powfor competitive advantage.

Aparna Iyer, Chief Financial Officer, said the company expanded margins by 40 basis points during the quarter resulting in



earnings per share growth of 5.2% QoQ in Q4 and by 50 basis points for the full year FY24.

"Capco (Wipro's consulting arm) is seeing green shoots, growth is expected to bounce back as we see early signs of stability," Ms. Iyer said. Capco grew 6.6% sequentially. Ms. Iyer added "We expect the market to rebound in the second half of FY25."

#### **Growth guidance**

Wipro forecast IT services revenue to range between \$2.6 billion to \$2.67 billion in the current quarter signalling a sequential decline of 1.5% to a growth of 0.5% constant currency

Sanjeev Hota, Head of Research, Sharekhan by BNP Paribas said, "The quarterly numbers are a mixed bag. However, weaker than expected guidance continues to disappoint the market. The sudden change in leadership brings an additional element of uncertainty in the near term before potential turnaround in the medium to longer term."





# Raisi makes no mention of explosions heard in Iran

President says Tehran showed 'our will of steel' when it launched an attack on Israel; Army chief says Friday's explosions were caused by 'the firing of anti-aircraft systems on a suspicious object'

ran's President Ebrahim Raisi on Friday hailed Tehran's unprecedented retaliatory attack on Israel almost a week ago but did not mention explosions heard in his country's central region.

# Africa's ballooning debt crisis needs a political fix, contend experts

Ghana's women vendors and hawkers are hard to miss. Attired in bright colours and bold prints, they walk swiftly on capital Accra's streets, bearing baskets with various items on their heads, as infants wrapped in cloth carriers sit clasping their shoulders. As key contributors to the country's informal economy, the women make a fine balancing act look easy.

Their labour, like scores of fellow Ghanians', is crucial not only for finding incomes for their families, but also for helping rebuild the country's fragile national economy. In December 2022, Ghana defaulted on most of its \$30 billion foreign debt, as its economy crashed. The government is currently grappling with creditors to restructure its debt.

Ghana, like several other African countries, is neck-deep in debt and stifled by its repayment schedule. Addressing the Paris Club in June last year, African Development Bank Group President Akinwumi A. Adesina said external outstanding debt service payments for 16 African countries rose to \$22.3 billion in 2023, significantly burdening government re-

#### **Debt and distress**

For the median sub-Saharan African country, the loan interest to revenue ratio has doubled in the past decade to 11 % - a rate almost four times higher than in advanced economies, according to a 2023 International Monetary Fund publication.

To reflect on the growing incidence of countries getting trapped in a cycle of debt and distress, eco-

nomists and policy experts from different parts of the world converged at a recent international conference on the 'African debt crisis' in the coastal city of

Organised by the International Development Economics Associates (IDEAs) network in late March, the conference flagged both common features and distinct challenges of debtdistressed countries across Africa, Asia, and Latin America. Speakers sought substantial reform of the international financial architecture that, they argued, unfairly burdened the Global South.

They mulled a more active role for the UN in negotiating debt treatment - including crucial haircuts on the principal amount owed through a comparable system monitored by a transparent, multilateral body.

Senior Nigerian academic Adebayo Olukoshi contended that the relationship between creditors and debtor nations reproduces the dynamic of dominance and subordination in the post-colonial

"Driven by international agencies and powerful actors, the narratives of 'fastest growing economy' and 'emerging markets' pushed many African governments into indiscriminate borrowing," he noted, pointing to loans that invariably fuel consumption. "Cabals" comprising local elite, lawyers, and think tanks paid little attention to development outcomes of the high-interest loans,

he said. Noted Malaysian economist Jomo Kwame Sundaram cited the U.S. Federal Reserve's decision to hike interest rates aggressively since 2022 as one of the chief reasons for the crisis facing the Global South.

#### **Predatory nature**

"In terms of the damage done to a number of economies, it was far more serious in Africa," he said. "Low-income countries are increasingly borrowing from private creditors. Why? Because rich countries won't make affordable credit available," he said, pointing to the apparently predatory nature of private credit, that rarely gets attention amid the "propaganda around Chinese debt".

The "battle of narratives" on Africa's debt problem came into sharp focus at the forum. Zambian political economist Grieve Chelwa argued that the premise that the current crisis is solely a problem of governance and corruption needs to be squarely challenged, for the problem of debt is structural.

"The current [debt] problem cannot be reduced to financial mismanagement. That analysis will only lead to a repetition of the crisis," he said.

Zambia has opted for a comprehensive debt treatment plan with its official creditors under the G20 Common Framework. Zambia's approach is a test case, and the government is yet to firm up a debt relief plan even after protracted negotiations. The deal with private creditors, too, drags on.

#### **Common Framework**

Although the Paris Club endorsed the G20 Common Framework, the initiative has not been very productive, according to José Antonio Ocampo, economist and former Minister of Finance and Public Credit, Colombia. "The push now is for an expanded role of multilateral banks and international cooperation on taxation," he pointed out.

Until the architecture is reformed, indebted countries will invariably resort to more loans on similar terms and "structural adjustment programmes" that enable them. Two decades of structural adjustment programmes show they kill growth, rather than reducing countries' external debt stock, contended Senegalese development economist Ndongo Samba Sylla.

"The lack of monetary sovereignty is linked to the global system. The international financial architecture is telling our countries we won't give you good prices or cheap credit," he

# Hainan Free Trade Port construction has gained momentum, says China

n September 30, 2023, Tokyo Olympics silver medallist Mirabai Chanu suffered a right thigh injury on the competition platform in Hangzhou and left the arena grimacing in pain. Her dream of landing a medal in the Asian Games remained

Injuries have troubled the 29-year-old in the last few years and the one in Hangzhou agonisingly kept her from lifting weights for several months with less than a year left for the Paris Olympics.

On April 1, Mirabai returned to register a total (184kg to finish an overall 12th) in the Phuket World Cup, the last Olympic qualifying event. The aggregate was way below her capability, but it delighted the champion lifter.

Since she has all but secured a quota spot in the Paris Olympics because of her second place in the rankings, Mirabai is now concentrating on increasing her strength and aggregate in order to corner the rare glory of winning two consecutive Olympic medals.

With North Korea's Ri Song Gum, the world record holder in the women's 49kg with 221kg, not eligible to compete in Paris because her country has not complied with the anti-doping regulations, China's Olympic champion Hou Zhihui leads the pack with her 217kg recorded in Phuket.

The challenge will be stiffer for Mirabai as other competitors - including Thailand's Surodchana Khambao, USA's Jourdan Elizabeth Delacruz and Romania's Mihaela-Valentina Cambei - are capable of aggregating around 200kg.

It's more of a tactical battle for Mirabai and her coach Vijay Sharma, who have to ensure that she adds around 20kg to her total in about 15 weeks

without risking injury.

With some crucial weeks awaiting her, Mirabai shared her recent experience of returning to competition and her aim for Paris. Excerpts:

#### How tough was it to recover from the injury after the disappointing performance in the **Asian Games?**

It was one of the toughest phases of my career. Obviously there was a lot on my mind as it was the second Asian Games where I missed out on a medal. But then I kept thinking about preparing and looking for areas to improve. What helped me during this time was my constant communication with Vijay sir and my efforts to keep myself relaxed. My family also played an important role in my rehabilitation process. Thanks to their support, I now feel fit, strong and confident to perform better.

#### Can you describe the process of telling yourself to forget the past and look forward to the Paris Olympics?

The initial days were difficult, both mentally and physically. But Vijay sir made sure that I did not think about the Paris Olympics and kept me focused on the recovery process. My mother came to visit me. It felt good and kept me happy. All these helped me stay relaxed and recover fast. We are continuing our training without stretch-

#### When was the first time you lifted after the Asian Games? How big was the relief when you got a total in Phuket?

The wait was long. I started training only in the last week of January and I felt like a rookie when I started. It was a challenging period as I had to rebuild my strength and endurance from scratch. The World Cup in Phuket was my first competition in six months. I lifted 191kg in the Asian

Games before getting injured. Aggregating 184kg was a huge relief and a confidence booster.

#### Your lower back injury in 2018 was quite frustrating for you. Has the experience of recovering from it made you more positive

Injury is always frustrating no matter how many times you experience it. But yes, the past experience has definitely made me more resilient and positive. With the right medical care, rehabilitation and support system, it is possible to deal with injuries and come back stronger. Thankfully I have had great support from my coach, family and the federation, who have helped me stay positive and channel my energy well.

#### In the last few years, you have been troubled by different injuries. How do you still wear a smile and return to the punishing training schedule?

As an athlete, to miss your training for treatment is not an ideal situation. But one thing I have learned over the years is that one should never ignore one's injuries or try to compete while nursing them, or else the results will be far more

As far as getting back to the training schedule is concerned, a lot of credit goes to the excellent support system I have... Finally, what keeps me going is the love of my fans and the responsibility to represent my country and make it proud.

#### Do you take care to prevent injuries while training these days or go as per the schedule without thinking too much?

Vijay sir and I are doing things slowly at the moment. We have a few months and I am still not on my full load. With each training session, fitness and strength-wise I am feeling better. I am trying to stay focused on my goal and not think much

about the injury. Instead, I am focusing on the positives. I trust Vijay sir's expertise and follow the training schedule while giving my 100

#### What kind of total can get you a medal in the Olympics and how do you plan to reach there? Is a 90kg snatch still a possibility?

There is tough competition in my weight category, but I believe if I lift more than 200kg then the medal is within my reach. I have lifted 203kg and 205kg before. Vijay sir and I are confident that the medal is achievable if my training progresses as planned. The key will be to build my strength steadily for the Olympics. Definitely, a 90kg snatch remains a possibility. It requires consistent effort and focused training.

#### Was your preparation for the Tokyo Olympics different to how it is now, before

Each Olympic cycle brings its own set of challenges and opportunities. How I trained for Rio 2016 was completely different from my preparation for Tokyo 2020. We have incorporated the lessons and experiences from past events in order to improve my technique and perform better in Paris. I am taking it one day at a time. The focus is on regaining my 100 percent lifting fitness and working on specific areas. As we get closer to Paris 2024, our training will get modified to suit our needs.

#### As an Olympic medallist, do you feel the pressure of expectations?

Obviously, there is pressure. But it is a good kind of pressure, which motivates me. The advantage is the experience of [winning] the medal. Expectation and stress come with it. I have learned to deal with it. All I need is the blessings of everyone to perform at my best on the given day.

hat do you inherit from a parent who has tasted athletic success? The genes, certainly, as well as the opportunity for early immersion in sport and the access to top-level

But along with these gifts come curses, perhaps the most challenging of which are the expectations of being the child of an elite athlete. And when your father is a two-time Olympic and two-time World champion, both the gifts and curses are multiplied manyfold.

#### Awe and certainty

So when 21-year-old Mykolas Alekna broke a world record in the discus throw that had stood since 1986, the initial awe began to slowly share space with the feeling that this was hardly unexpected. After all, Mykolas' father, Virgilijus, is one of discus' all-time greats. He stood on the top step of an Olympic podium in Sydney (2000) and Athens (2004). Alekna senior also won gold at the World Championships in Paris (2003) and Helsinki (2005).


at the low-key event in the US Midwest dedicated only to throwing field events and formed a part of a series of six 70m-plus throws by the Lithuanian. Competing on a weekend that was blessed with perfect throwing conditions, Alekna launched the discus and pointed at it as it flew through the air, knowing he had uncorked a special one.

In addition to breaking the world record, the throw bumped his father to third on the all-time list. Virgilijus Alekna recorded a best of 73.88m in 2000.

"It's really hard to grasp yet," the new

world record holder told Lithuanian public media outlet LRT.lt. "It was a very good competition with all the conditions for a world record - strong winds, warm weather. I managed to make a technical throw. I'm still in a bit of shock, I'm very happy. Of course, the world record is not my goal – the Olympic gold is the goal for the season."

In an interview with Sports Illustrated, Alekna said he texted his father and the response was typical. "He just said good job. A man of few words, just like me."

cessful at 21 is exceptional. His early mastery is all the more remarkable when you consider that he did not start until he was 16 when he decided to join his older brother, Martynas, also a discus thrower, at a local sports club.

"Before that I used to do football, I used to do high jump," Alekna told World Athletics. "I was a striker. I was pretty good when I was young. But I grew a lot, my feet got bigger. I was slower and that's when I transitioned to discus. I was pretty late, I suppose. My parents only wanted me to do sports. It didn't matter what sports, just to do something. I have always had an interest in discus throw, so I was able to tame this sport quickly."

Alekna has long arms, wide shoulders, and is very flexible, which is perfect for the discus. Although 6'5" tall, the lean Alekna is not one of the bigger men in the discipline. His father is 6'7" and weighed 130 kg in his prime. Olympic champion Daniel Stahl is 6'7" as well and weighs 155 kg, while World champion Kristjan Ceh stands at a towering 6'9"!

"I wouldn't say I'm strong," he told Track and Field News. "I mean, especially professional discus throwers are way stronger than I am. I don't focus on the weightroom that much because I think that discus technique is way more important than lifting. At least it works for me."

Another thing that works for Alekna is the unparalleled experience of his father. "I was able to learn from his mistakes and not my own. This is what led to the rapid jump of the results, because I didn't have to make my own mistakes," he said.

#### A move that paid off

Indeed, his decision to leave Lithuania and study in the USA was informed by his father's experience. "My dad did a few training camps here and he really liked it," said Alekna. "He said that the training conditions and facilities in the US are way better than in Lithuania, and I could get a good education here. He always wanted me to come here and I wanted to come here as well."

Both father and son explored a range of options before settling on the University of California – the training methodology was similar to the one Alekna followed in Lithuania. The move has paid off spectacularly, with the 21-year-old now eyeing a medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics.

"I'm hungry and I want those medals," said Alekna. "They will never be enough, especially when I've felt that taste. That hunger doesn't go away and only grows. If I manage to avoid injuries and train as hard as I do, there will be even more titles in the future. I want to be stable in the most important competitions as it is consistency that brings medals."

It won't come easy, for the competition is tight. With Stahl, Ceh, improving Samoan Alex Rose and Olympic, World and European bronze medallist Lukas Weisshaidinger performing at a high level, the men's discus is one of the hardest track and field events to medal in.

But Alekna has a champion's obsessive intensiv – he says the only time his head isn't filled with discus thoughts is when he goes fishing. Besides, he has the advantage of chasing an extraordinary benchmark; even if he comes up short, he will have been very successful.

"My father is my big idol," said Alekna. "He has shown by his example that steady work brings results. He always taught me that if you start something, you cannot stop. He's legendary, I want to be like him one day. Maybe even be better than him? We will see what happens."

## Preparing for third Olympics at 34, Ashwini in no mood to slow down

Ashwini Ponnappa has been around for a long while now but the 34-yearold has no plans of slowing down. Preparing for her third Olympics in a sport as demanding as badminton can be gruelling. To do so in doubles, with a partner almost 15 years younger, is unheard of. Ashwini isn't bothered.

"There is no Olympic medal yet, it's a dream to be there and I am grateful that I have an opportunity to give it a shot at this point of my career. (But) there are quite a few (empty) slots that can be filled (in the medal cabinet)," she said in an interaction with The Hindu on Friday.

Ashwini missed the Tokyo Olympics but with Tanisha Crasto, is the highestranked Indian women's doubles pair in the world and on top of the race to the World Tour Finals.

Having burst into the limelight after winning a historic gold at the 2010 Com-

monwealth Games in front of home crowds (with Jwala Gutta) for her maiden senior international title, it's been an eventful career for Ashwini.

"It's been quite a journey, having started alongside Jwala who was already an established player then. I think I got lucky because partnering with her meant that I got to play in the big league at a very young age," she added.

The longevity has not been without challenges but a bout of dengue in 2016 triggered a complete turnaround in her training ethos and methods. "Even
